- Yeah, it's just a general question, wondering what kind of event, how it's gonna be secured? What kind of--
- OK. I know Jill's could not be here today. So, I just wanted to make sure that I heard that that might be true, I didn't know if it'd still be true. That's why I wanted to double-check. So, yes there is time, so I would take a motion to hold.

- Opposed? OK, the floor is now open. It means you can come up. Please fill out the form that's right there. And state your name and address for the record verbally, as well.
- [Anna] OK.
- Maybe before the meeting we could kinda ask around if anybody wants, just so we can get that stuff filled out before?
- That's a good idea.
- Thank you.
- [Anna] Thanks. OK, so my name's Anna Curio. So my father owns the business--
- And your address?
- [Anna] 917 Stewart Street.
- OK, thank you, yep.
- [Anna] So, our family wants to host an outdoor event. It's open for all Green Bay, the whole public. And what we're looking to do is have it outdoor music, sell food, and just have a fun event for the community.
- OK, just one second. For the record, alder Zima has joined us now. We're on D two. And we have, we're starting a new system, so if you have different. So you just get to play along. And we had some police, some questions for you from our police department.
- [Anna] Yes.
- I'm just seeing on your simple email that you plan on having a tent. So, where's the tent going to be located?
- [Father] And the sizes are west size and the other parking. You know, where the park?
- [Anna] It's, you know that, on North Urban, and then, he's also the owner of the ice cream shop. And there's--

- [Father] Yeah, I'm gonna put the tent, the thing and then the parking behind next to the
- It's right in the parking lot of 1905?
- [Father] Yeah, the parking lot.
- [Anna] The parking lot, it will be right on the parking lot of 1905.
- And will that tent have security and a fence around it?
- [Anna] So, we're open to suggestions, actually, we were talking about asking suggestions and then we also thought about hiring staff for crossing the street. Like, some safe guards, because there are two lots, and so we kinda have it.
- They're across from each other down the street? And that's I bet side on the same? They're across from each other on the street?
- [Father] Yeah, I got a parking in there, like, across the street.
- Across the street, OK.
- [Father] It goes through in that parking.
- Through it.
- Where Radisson.
- Is it the gravel lot to the south?
- [Father] But I think it's gonna be on this side, is pave.
- [Anna] Paved.
- [Father] Paved, yeah.
- [Anna] So, 1905 is paved. The gravel parking lot would be for the cars. But the event will be where the area's paved.
- Paved.
- [Anna] The paved parking.
- Just to the west of the building, probably.
- [Father] West of the building, yeah.
- OK. And then, I guess we're asking for your plan. You're asking us for suggestions, but we wanna know what kind of security that you have? How will you keep the alcohol contained in your event? How will you keep underage people from entering your event?
- [Anna] Yes.
- That type of thing.
- [Anna] Good question.

- [Father] Probably we will use the bracelet.
- [Anna] Yeah, and we are also hiring bouncers. That from.
- [Father] And who aren't drink and they gonna use the bracelet.
- [Anna] Yes, and we'll have to ask people to show their ID and then the people that receive the bracelets have shown their ID that they're of drinking age.
- So, at this point, no fencing? So, anyone can come and go as they please for the most part?
- [Father] No, I got for my place throw out one of those yellow fence. And then, by the side, by the sidewalk, whoever is gonna be listening to music, I'm gonna throw it tables. And everybody who's gonna drink, they gonna get a bracelet. And the thing is gonna be only with the food and the beer is gonna be.
- So, basically like, one place to get in and one place to leave?
- [Father] Yeah.
- Can I make a suggestion, or a motion? Why don't we, what I'd like to do is approve this, pending you sitting down with the police department and working out a plan.
- [Father] Yeah, wouldn't mind that, yeah.
- Right, so, I'm willing to make a motion to approve this pending the police department's approval of your plan. It's obvious you guys have a lot of questions. They've had a lot of experience. I think if the two of you can sit down, you'll be able to work something out that'll make everybody happy and make it a safe and fun event.
- [Anna] Yes, we're open to that, yep.
- Is that OK?
- Yeah, I just wanted to get something down. As long as you're willing to meet with us as a later time.
- [Anna] Yes, that's totally fine. He has it, for the most part, planned out. But it's kind of better if we laid it all out for you.
- Thanks.
- Yep.
- [Anna] That would be a good opportunity for us.
- Yep, yep, yep, yep, and if you can do that before Tuesday.
- [Anna] Before Tuesday?
- Mm hmm.
- [Father] Yeah, we can, we--
- Right so, today's Tuesday the 17th. Tuesday the 17th.
- I didn't mean this Tuesday coming, I'm sorry.

- [Anna] Tuesday the 17th?
- Yeah, a week from today.
- Wouldn't a week from today be Thursday?
- We could do tomorrow.
- [Anna] Do you wanna schedule something with us?
- No, 'cause it could still be on our agenda.
- OK.
- Yeah, that's fine. So, within a week.
- [Father] Then a week, OK.
- [Anna] We'll call ya.
- [Father] OK, thank you.
- [Anna] Thank you.
- Motion to close the floor.
- Motion in second.
- Motion to close the floor by alder Dorff, seconded by alder Galvin. All in favor?
- [Committee] I. Opposed? OK, that carries unanimously.
- So, I made a motion to approve pending approval by the Green Bay police department.
- Motion by alder Galvin.
- I'll second that.
- Second by alder Dorff, any discussion? All in favor?
- [Committee] I.
- Opposed? OK, that carries unanimously. So, meet with the police within the week. They'll notify us by next Tuesday when it would become final at the Council.
- [Anna] OK.
- So, and then you can be good.
- [Anna] Thank you very much.
- Thank you.

- Law department has no objections.
- We have no objections either. They went through the security fine in November of 2017, so it's fairly fresh.
- OK.
- I just have a question for the police department: Have we done any compliance checks yet? And if so, what were their results?
- I know that they weren't ones that failed. I can't recall if--
- OK, that's good. I'd like to motion to approve.
- Second.
- Motion by alder Galvin to approve, seconded by alder Dorff. Any discussion? All in favor?
- [Committee] I.
- Opposed? That carries unanimously. OK.
- Oh. OK. Alright, next item: Consideration with possible action on an application for a Class B Liquor License by Cheryl Knoll, Cheri's Place at LLC, or Cheri's Place LLC, at 704 Bellevue St.
- Staff?
- Law department has no objections.
- And the police doesn't have any objection either.
- Do you concur?
- I concur.
- Can I ask a question on legal order, if she's here?
- Is the owner? Yep, OK.
- Motion to open the floor.
- Motion to open the floor by alder Galvin.
- Second.
- Second by alder Dorff. All in favor?
- [Committee] I. Opposed? OK, that goes unanimously. If you could also fill out the form? And then state your name and address. You can do that now, we can talk, and you can fill it out after.
- [Cheri] OK, Cheri Knoll. And my home address: 1171 South Betreum Court, De Pere.
- OK, thank you.

- Is your establishment on the corner of Bellevue and--
- [Cheri] Cass street.
- Cass street, OK, it's been empty for, it's almost across the street from Cranky Pats?
- [Cheri] Correct, and it's been vacant for approximately 10 months.
- Oh, is that all? Okay, I thought it was longer than that.
- [Cheri] But the gentleman didn't have the business open for very long.
- OK, alright, thank you.
- That was it?
- It's pretty simple.
- Uh, huh. I don't know if I'm gonna allow that. I want something a little more than that.
- Motion to approve.
- Five.
- Motion by alder Zima to approve.
- Return to regular--
- Oh, we gotta close the floor yeah, motion by alder Zima to return to order.
- Second.
- Second by alder Dorff. All in favor?
- [Committee] I.
- Opposed? OK, we're now back amongst ourselves.
- Motion to approve.
- Motion to approve by alder Zima.
- Second.
- Second by alder Dorff, all in, any discussions? All in favor?
- [Committee] I.
- Opposed? That carries unanimously. Thank you very much.
- [Cheri] Thank you.
- One moment, alright. Next item: For consideration with possible action regarding General Ordinance No. 3-18 relating to exotic and excessive animal permits, which was referred to committee from the April 2nd City Council meeting.

- OK. There was some language cleaned up here.
- Mm hmm.
- It is my understanding there is no fee for exotic pets?
- Nope.
- No fee for exotic pets.
- And no fee for the access permit. So, that language was based on the concerns that you had brought to our attention.
- Mm hmm.
- That language was removed. And in addition, we removed the language regarding designation of residential lot. Making it strictly regulated based on dwelling household, or dwelling unit versus lot. And we made those changes, and that was it, I think.
- Well, thanks a lot for that.
- Mm hmm.
- Change on the lot.
- I appreciate it.
- You're very welcome.
- So as I understand that, with the change, the designation for the lot, if you had a four-plex, or somebody took an old home and turned it into four apartments--
- Yup.
- They could conceivably have three dogs in each unit, then, now?
- If the humane officer so approves that. So, it's still pending the humane officer's review and approval. So if she feels that the space doesn't fit the size of the dogs or the number of the dogs then she won't approve that permit. But just to make it consistent--
- Mm hmm.
- 'Cause we thought there would be some difficulties when there are multiple-dwelling units on one residential lot. And then, how would you choose which family gets to have how many dogs? This way, it's open to everybody, however, it would be pending the review of officer Mabis.
- OK.
- I thought we used a dart board?
- And as to the exotic pets.
- Mm hmm.
- Whereas before, ordinance said we couldn't have anything that wasn't native to the state of Wisconsin.

- Mm hmm.
- We now allow this, but they have to get a permit, right? A license?
- That I'm not sure of. The changes that we're doing here were just for the access. Oh, no, so it would be for exotic.
- Right.
- So, I believe that's up to yes, officer Mabis.
- Alright.
- As to whether she would approve it or not.
- And, so it's up to her to determine if this is an animal that we want in the city limits or not?
- Correct.
- And it's solely up to her?
- In--
- Well they can appeal.
- Right, they can appeal if she denies it. And in accordance with state law and with local ordinances.
- Or we could deny it at committee level or at Council level?
- Correct.
- I just remember going into an apartment and finding a 15 foot boa constrictor in a closet.
- Right, mm hmm.
- It was an unpleasant experience.
- Mm hmm.
- Really?
- Yeah. So--
- And if that person didn't have a permit, then they would have been cited. So this is just--
- Sure.
- This applies to people who actually voluntarily get in contact with the clerk's office and obtain the permit.
- OK. But we're not gonna go out and hunt down people with the exotics--
- Right.
- Or anything else like that?

- Right.
- OK. Alright, thank you.
- Mm hmm.
- I don't know if you should use that term hunt down exotic.
- Hunt down, yes, you're correct. Seek them out.
- Move to approve the ordinance.
- Move to approve the ordinance by alder Dorff.
- I'll second that.
- Seconded by alder Galvin. Any other discussion? All in favor?
- [Committee] I.
- Opposed? That carries unanimously.
- Alright, the next item looks to be: The Liquor Violation Report from March 26th of 2018. That was the Protection and Welfare meeting that was canceled. So we're just entering the Liquor Violation Reports from that prior meeting.
- And there'll be no reports for, that dealt with on the one after the date.
- OK, yep. And, well.
- Mm hmm.
- There's still some stuff to report?
- There's nothing to report. For the report from March 26th.
- Right.
- We do have a separate report for the 19th.
- Right, right.
- As a separate agenda.
- Yep, yep.
- Mm hmm.
- OK, so can I ask a question about the--
- The one that didn't get reported? That there's not. That' over on the account.
- We're on the March 26th report, not the April 9th report.
- OK.

- Would you like to move in, make a motion?
- Well, if there's enough, oh, do we need to receive--
- To receive and place on file.
- Oh, OK. So, move for, alder Zima makes motion to receive and place on file.
- Second.
- Second by alder Dorff. All in favor?
- [Committee] I.
- Opposed? OK, that motion carries unanimously.
- OK. And then, make that lock out.
- Motion to adjourn?
- No, no, we got--
- One more item.
- Got one more item.
- So, the Liquor Violation Reports from the police department from April 9th--
- April 9th.
- Move to receive the policing account.
- Ah, well, we've got a question first.
- Type of, date of, on the last page, date of violation, Justin Jokee, simple battery. Is he an employee of the tavern?
- This will, I didn't redo this one. This one that occurred on previous meetings. We only go back since the last Protection and Welfare committee meeting, going forward, so this would of been reported back then.
- Well, this is why I'm confused. It said on the one before, the police report for March 26th, I wanted to talk about this incident that took place on March 24th with Dennis Vaughn.
- Well, if it wasn't part of that report, though.
- What report is it part of? The one for April 9th?
- The one we're on right now.
- That's a typo, that actually was on March 26th. That was on--
- How do we keep getting these typos on dates of occurrence?
- Could ask the records personnel?

- Why don't we look into that? OK, so, Jokey was him and before Dennis Vaughn. This took place at the Lion's Den then, I take it?
- It did, yes, absolutely. I can give you some of the specifics. It's still in litigation and the District Attorney's Office.
- I understand, but is this one of these cases and, Joanne, I'll address this to you, is this one of those cases that we if he has a bartender's license or something like that, can we move to have it removed? Or do we have to wait till it's renewed in the end of June?
- If the charge is for such that would violate our liquor laws, then that would be either ordinances or state liquor laws, then that would be a basis upon which to go to revocation of the person's operator's license correct.
- So this isn't necessarily a violation of the liquor law?
- It may not be if it's not like, a felony conviction or sale to underage persons, disorderly house.
- OK.
- Well, it hasn't been adjudicated yet, so.
- Yeah.
- Well, we don't have to wait till it's adjudicated.
- No.
- Of course you do.
- We don't have to wait?
- You can move to revoke based on allegations or based on charges.
- We've always been able to do that.
- You don't have to wait for a conviction.
- Well, I would wanna wait some more.
- Or, so you cut a deal on another case. Say he cut a deal on another case. And they dismiss this as a favor to him because he cooperated, then we wouldn't be able to do anything about it?
- Well.
- Well?
- That's still waiting till after adjudication. I'm not saying we shouldn't take the allegations into--
- If it took two years to adjudicate this case?
- Right.
- Could potentially. It all depends on--
- OK.

- I'm just talking from experience.
- I'm not, and I was unaware. So, I guess it's possible then.
- I don't think you'd have to renew it.
- Yeah, come June for sure, yeah.
- You wouldn't have to wait for middle and time--
- Right, if we think it rise to the level that it's serious enough.
- Right.
- If it's more than two months, you'd go through a fast judicial hearing or something.
- Well, maybe if it happened--
- I guess it all depends on what the detail were that were involved with it. And there's very little here other than he's been charged with it. Was he attempting do deal? Was there something else going on? I mean, you know?
- Mm hmm.
- And there's, you don't know.
- I have a basis of what took place there, and that it wasn't that case at all. He was taking a break in his car when the police officer happened to stop by and found him and his friend in the vehicle doing illicit activity.
- OK, and is he the owner or the bar tender?
- He was an employee.
- An employee? OK, and under their stipulation agreement, the licensee or employees of a license assumptions prohibited from being under the influence of an intoxicating or controlled substance or combination of that. Do you know if he violated that?
- I believe the details state the interior of the vehicle smelled strongly of marijuana.
- Well, I guess what I'm asking is, did he violate his stipulation agreement? Which would be another citation ... For the business.
- I'd have to read, look up the details.
- 'Cause these are the things I think we want, if they sign it. And again, they don't have to sign if they don't want to. Like, in this one. But these are the things that we wanna make sure these people that are distributing a drug to people are sober and not under the influence of an intoxicants or other drugs or anything else like that. That's kinda what we have that here for. So, I guess I would ask the police department to check into that and report back to the committee.
- That a motion?
- That's a motion.
- Second.

- OK, motion by alder Galvin, second by alder Dorff. All in favor?
- [Committee] I.
- Opposed? OK, that motion carries.
- Is there any license in violation for that with my commission? This is not a tavern.
- Yeah.
- He was an employee that was in the parking lot.
- An employee of the.
- What was that for? You don't need a license involved, do you?
- Wait, Lion's Den.
- That's a tavern.
- Yeah.
- Yeah, it's a tavern.
- Oh, it is a tavern?
- Yep.
- Oh, OK. I thought the Lion's Den was.
- Yeah.
- Something else.
- So did I.
- I corrected myself. The Lion's Den I thought was an old bookstore.
- Mm hmm.
- This is a little bit further south from that location.
- OK.
- Right.
- We're good?
- We are at adjournment.
- What about, I meant to ask, it says on our agenda, Public Hearings, G.
- So, we've created a, like, a master template for all committee and Council agendas, for all of them to look alike. This committee doesn't necessarily have Public Hearings on items like, Distributive Services committee has Public Hearings on special assessments and things like that.

- OK.

- This committee doesn't have that. The public input usually happens whenever the agenda item is called. Whether it's a denial of an operator's license or a liquor license application. So, that doesn't necessarily apply to this committee, but to make it consistent within the system, that shows up on every agenda, even though there's nothing on there.

- OK, OK, that, that--

- OK.

- All I need to know. Okay, well then, before we adjourn I would just like to say that I'd like to thank alder Zima for his many years of service.

- Oh, my. You're very welcome, thank you so much.

- Well, in my rookie year I learned a few things from you as well as other alders, and I appreciate that.

- Well, service sometimes is just temporarily interrupted.

- Yep Yep, so, thank you very much. And I'll take a motion to adjourn.

- I move.

- Second.

- Motion by alder Zima, seconded by alder Dorff, all in favor?

- [Committee] I.

- Opposed? We are--

- Adjourned.

- Adjourned. That one kills me.
