Getting The Lead Out



Green Bay Water Utility progress in removing lead services – *as of May 30, 2018*

1. Public side (utility-owned) lead services

2. Private side (property owner-owned) lead services

- Since starting the program, we identified 217 private properties as having lead service

Getting The Lead Out



- These are being paid from funds we obtained from:
 - Initial DNR Safe Drinking Water funding of \$500,000;
 - Lambeau Field excess sales tax monies of \$300,000;
 - Additional DNR Safe Drinking Water funding of \$300,000 approved in December 2017
- 169 of these replacements are complete; 48 remain to be replaced
- We have homeowner agreements for 30 of the 48 (they are waiting to be replaced)
- We anticipate the funding noted above will cover the cost of all known private-side lead service replacements at this time
- We have 70 properties in the City for which we do not know the service material
 - We are making efforts to enter these properties to determine service material; an estimated 1 to 2 percent are anticipated to be lead
