VERBATIM MINUTES

- Okay, all set.
- Okay, I'd like to bring to honor the meeting of the Green Bay Residents Sex Offenders Board for June 13th, roll call, everyone is here except Renee Keehan who was excused. First item on the agenda is to approve them the minutes.
- All sign the role call.
- Yeah, they all signed.
- Okay, okay.
- Next is the approval of the agenda. Someone has to make a motion.
- I'll make a motion to approve the agenda.
- Is there a second?
- Second.
- Alright. Everybody.
- I gotta send it for the mode.
- Oh you do, okay.
- Yup, you should all see it. Alright, unanimous passed.
- Next is the approval of the minutes of our previous meeting from May 9th, can I have a motion to approve the minutes.
- So moved.
- I'm sorry.
- So moved.
- Is there a second?
- I'll second that.
- Alright, should come through.
- Mine still says approval of the agenda, not the minutes.
- Mine does too.
- Okay. Thank you for catching that, alright.
- Okay, can we move on?
- Still waiting for two votes, there we go, saved. It passed, it was saved.
- Okay, first appeal we have today is of Kim Fellers requesting to move to 409 South Webster Avenue. Please come up. Okay, Kim just start things off here, we're using a new system.
- A new system?

- So you're looking to move to 409 South Webster, correct?
- Yes.
- Alright. With you and your two year old daughter.
- Right here.
- Okay. So what we're gonna do today is we're gonna go over your case and we're just gonna ask that when you go over it, you don't use a personal name of your victim, just refer to the person as the victim, okay. So looks like here back in 1996, you had first degree assault of a child, is that correct?
- That got dismissed. It was proven that I didn't do anything like that.
- But you had two counts of childhood prostitution.
- Yes, two child prostitution and two child enticements.
- Okay, okay so tell me a little bit about that particular case and what you were involved with at that time.
- I was 18, 19 and 20 years old. I was working for an escort service. And then my brother, well he's like a brother. He's not my real brother, his girlfriends started working for me underneath an escort service. And I was dating a man who how do I say, showed me how to do the prostitution myself.
- Okay.
- Like I said, I was very young. Looking for love in all the wrong places and I ended up hooking up with him and like I said, we started working underneath the escort services and there was two victims that were under the age of 18.
- And did you know that they were under the age of 18?
- I did but I didn't know the laws. Myself, I was only like 18, 19 and 20 so I didn't know and I had two children by the time I was 17.
- Okay.
- So I really didn't know what the laws were.
- And how much time did you end up serving?
- I did six months, six years the first time and then I did a year and then I just did my last 10 years straight and I've been without any kind of supervision, probation, parole, anything for four years, so.
- Okay, so you served 10 years for the prostitution or was there anything else?
- The child prostitution and two child enticements. Yeah, I did a total of 17 years in.
- All from the same two charges.
- Yeah, yeah, I had an extended supervision withheld sentence so that's what happened there.
- Okay, okay.
- Can I ask a question? In the paperwork it says that you were sentenced to six years, nine months, five.
- Eight years. It was eight years, nine months, five years withheld sentence probation.

- Did somebody, did you complete the paperwork yourself? Or did you have someone help you with it?
- I might've put six years, I meant to put eight years. But I did a total of six years my first time. Maybe I wrote it wrong.
- And when you went back, where was your probation violated, or parole violated, is that why you went back?
- Yeah, I had a dirty UA, I never reoffended. I never reoffended in the same.
- She failed a drug test.
- Yeah. I never reoffended in the same manner as prostitution or escorting or anything like that. I haven't done that since then.
- Are you currently employed, ma'am?
- I am on disability.
- Okay. So what do you do with your days? Besides take care of your daughter?
- I help take care of my mom, she's got dementia, the beginner stages of it so we've been taking, me and my sister have been taking care of her, taking my partner to appointments, going to my appointments, going to Rena's appointments, my mom's appointments. I'm in the community a lot. I take Rena to the lodge and stuff like that so she can have, enjoy other little kids and play and stuff and the domestic violence shelter is a support means for me if I need them, they will help me.
- Okay, when you were incarcerated, did you do any sex, excuse me, before we go onto any of your treatment programs, you have the right to do this either in public session or in private session, are you okay with staying in the public session?
- That's fine.
- Okay. So here it says it looks like you didn't do any sexual offender training, correct, when you were in prison?
- I did, I went to the SOT level two, I think it was, that they had there and because I was a girl was speaking and I have extensive sexual abuse in my past and what she was talking about, I just, tears were coming down my face, I didn't sigh out. I didn't make a noise but because I cried, I gave a negative response to her disclosure and I got kicked out.
- Okay. And so how long have you actually been out of prison?
- Four years.
- Four years, okay. And you've been on disability the whole time? Okay, so you haven't done any other type of, it looks like you did anger management.
- Yup, I did that in prison, parenting in prison, AODA, out patients out here and in there, I did that.
- Okay so over these past four years, what have you been doing?
- Just being a mom and trying to find a home.
- So I mean, I don't know how old your daughter is.
- She's two.
- She's two, so.

- I got pregnant pretty much right after I got out. And it's been really difficult to try to find somewhere to live, find a person who will rent to me 'cause as soon as they hear sex offender, they're like no. And it's hard, I need a roof over my baby's head. I did my time, I did every day of my time pretty much. I paid my price of a really bad choice that I made when I was teenager myself, ya know.

- So in terms of your disability, in terms of the rent you're gonna pay, that's gonna be enough to cover?

- Yeah, yeah.

- Okay. And just the two of you living together.

- Yup, it's just me, her and our cat.

- Okay, does anybody else have any other questions?

- Well I'd like to go back to your charges. You just stopped at you had two younger kids under the age. How long was it going on for, what was all happening?

- With the underage girls, it was only not even a year. It was only like a few months maybe but I was doing it before since I was 18, myself, I was prostituting myself out and stuff like that. And I was, like I said, I was with this man and he showed me how to prostitute. I did not know anything about it and I was very ashamed at first and he kind of like groomed me. Now I know what it is but back then I didn't really understand it, oh, this man loves me. I'll do anything to have him love me. And then he got physically abusive too. So then my adopted big brother moved in and his girlfriends that he was seeing, they wanted to work. And like I said, I didn't understand the age 'cause like I said, I was young myself and I didn't know the laws and I thought it was okay. 'Cause that was my mind frame back then. I'm gonna be 43 this summer and I don't think the same way anymore and I apologized to my victims. And I've seen my victims since then. And one of my victims has passed away. She was in prison with me and she was released and she had a drug addition really bad and she was out 10 days and died. And she left three children. And I feel responsible for that, you know.

- Okay, go ahead.

- Well then, so you hired these young girls and they did this for several months and then how did it get, how did the police get involved?

- One of the girls was sleeping with my boyfriend, I didn't know and she, he wouldn't leave me to be with her and so she went to the police and told what we were doing. So and that's the one who passed away.

- Now are you, you said that you were in the sex offender treatment program in prison but you were kicked out?

- Yeah.

- Have you had any other counseling for your past trauma?

- Yeah.

- Okay, can you just?

- I talked to, I have Dr Tan that I have at Brock Mental Health Center and I was talkin', I had my psychiatrist or psychologist Jody who I talk to.

- How often do you see either one of them?

- I see Dr Tan once a month, I haven't been to counseling for a while because I haven't been stable as a place to say, ya know. So I've been staying in hotels and my mom's and family and friends and stuff until I can find someone that can rent to me.

- How often, how much counseling did you do regarding your prior trauma and abuse?

- Since I was five years old.
- No, no, how long have you been going to counseling?
- Since I was five years old.
- Five years old, okay and what about counseling with regard to, regarding the girls that you recruited?
- I was doing counseling in prison, when I was in prison for that and I would talk to my psychologist, or my psychologist in prison and then groups and stuff like that, so yeah.
- What about your triggers?
- My triggers, I have, as far as triggers as for prostitution or?
- Any.
- I'm not that same person anymore. I would never do anything like that again. I don't have triggers when it comes to that for prostitution.
- Well. There's something that triggered you at one point in time for you to decide that it was okay to do that.
- That would be whoever my partner was at that point in time.
- Okay and he was able to convince you.
- Yup.
- Okay. So have you sought counseling regarding or group?
- Independent, yes, yup, I was did a group for co dependence and stuff like that when I was in Tachita. So yeah.
- I have a question. So you said you were in counseling since you were five. And through that, didn't it come up somewhere that I know that didn't happen yet, most recent, we're talking about didn't happen. But you didn't discover that kind of thing would be wrong with the counseling you had through the years until you were 15, 16, 17.
- Well, when I would go into counseling, they would have me talk about my sexual abuse a lot. And like what happened so it was like I was reliving it all the time when I had to go to counseling. So that's when I was younger and I hated goin' to counseling because it's like why do I just have to keep telling you the same things for different counselors because I was in 17 different foster homes from the age of five to 15. So I always was shuffling counselors and stuff so I'd have to keep telling my story, telling my story. And you get just like it doesn't phase you anymore when you tell your story of what happened. And the people that molested me when I was a child, either they died or I never told anybody until I was 28 years old.
- But knowing how you felt then, what did you feel anything with 15, 16, 17 year olds then, later, in later years?
- You mean for me?
- Yeah.
- No, I've never had a sexual attraction to younger people for myself, no. I didn't do sexual acts to them. So I don't have that kind of a sex offender.
- In terms of the characteristics of the case, is it described correctly?
- Yeah. That's correct with what I have.

- Okay.
- Where are you staying right now, it says homeless but you also have a mailing address, so?
- I have a mailing address for my mom's house but I've been staying in and out of Motels, like Motel 6, the Village Inn, my mom's, my partner's.
- For how long?
- For four years.
- For four years.
- And I have. I was staying at 1120 Elizabeth Street, row one, lot two, I own that trailer. And because of the resident ordinance, I got a fine and had to evacuate from my trailer and sell the trailer for dirt cheap.
- You mentioned two older children.
- 27 and 25.
- Where are they?
- One's in Texas and one's in right past the pier. She came back, she was livin' in Kentucky and she just came back about a year ago. I have relationships with them. When I went to prison, they were three and five. And I was back in my oldest daughter's life when she was 12 and Brooke when she was 16. My second one, she was 16. So we have a pretty good relationship. They call me a lot and want me to come visit 'em in Texas. And they forgive me for my past. They forgive me for making the choices I've made.
- Okay, does anyone else have any more questions?
- I just have one more, does your daughter go from place to place to place with you?
- Yes because I cannot find, I finally found somebody who will rent to me and everything's, the security deposit is made, the rent is made, it's not until the 15th. Our lease are already signed and everything. We're just waiting for you guys if you'll approve me to have a home for her. I mean, I understand, yeah I did a crime and I did my time. But my daughter's suffering now because of this ordinance. And I don't know what else I can do to make a stable environment for her because of my screw up when I was young. And I try to be the best mom I can be. She's well behaved, obviously, she's well mannered. And I'm trying to be a mom I couldn't be to my first two because of the choices that I made back then. And I can't make up to my children for being gone and the choices that I made but I can be a better person for them today and have them see me for who I am today and that's why we have such a close relationship.
- Kim, is her dad in her life at all?
- This one?
- Yeah.
- Child support?
- He doesn't have an address for them to serve him papers. They have his name, they have his social security number. They have his birthday, they have all that. But they closed the case because they can't physically serve him the papers, so.
- One quick question with regard to your continuing treatment, I see that you, we wrote down that you belong to Life Church or go to Life Church. Are you involved with any of their, any programming through their associate organization?

- I just started going to that church so I'm on, what's that program called?
- Growth Track.
- Growth Track is what we're looking to do and she just got baptized. But we're doing the Growth Track and we're more actively in the church.
- I wasn't necessarily getting into the church. I don't wanna get into religion or anything like that. What I'm looking at, they are affiliated with an organization that works with women and girls who have been in the life.
- That's that lady, Dawn.
- Yeah, Dawn.
- She works at the Exchange.
- I really wanna work with her. I so want her to know my story. I've always wanted to be an advocate for kids because of my crime and I wanted to be a speaker and help try to prevent this because sex trafficking is becoming so bad in this area and just the kids, if they're knowledgeable and know where I've been and know what I did, how I got the girls, if they see people comin' at 'em like that, they can go the other way, ya know. And I've been wanting to talk to her. So I'm gonna talk to.
- Okay, my concern is that you haven't been in counseling for a while and when you are talking about those issues again and being involved with someone who is not a mental health professional and talking about that, that you maybe have triggers about prior trauma and abuse so do you have that in mind, as far as, do you have appointments coming up?
- Yeah, I gotta call Dawn and talk to Dawn and see if.
- Well, I mean, your mental health professional.
- Oh yeah, I'm taking care of that, Dr Tan, at Brock Mental Health Center and stuff like that. So that's all covered.
- Okay.
- Yeah, that's, yeah.
- Okay, does anybody wanna speak on her behalf or against her moving to this location?
- I will.
- Come on up. And your name.
- Lisa Gould.
- Okay, go ahead.
- I'm her partner and I think that through the trials and tribulations that she's been through, I think she deserves a chance. I think she's, she shows remorse for the things that she's done, she takes very good care of this baby and she tries to do everything she's supposed to do to put a roof over that baby's head and she's been trying for four years.
- How long have you known her?
- Well, I was in prison with her.

- Okay.

- We've only been a couple for three, going on three, three and a half. But I was in prison with her, that's how I met her. But I think she should be given at least a shot. She's really been trying, she's trying to get back into the community and stuff. And she does go to her appointments. She does do counseling, if she can get this apartment, she'll be stable, she'll be able to make her appointments back, again for counseling to make sure that everything that she's supposed to do as needed. I just hope that you guys can give her a chance because I think that she's really earned that chance.

- Okay, appreciate it. Anybody else, okay.

- My sister's right here.

- Oh, go ahead. You wanna come up?

- Basically just what she said. That's the way I feel too exactly.

- Alright, so you think she's definitely on the right track in your opinion.

- Definitely, I'm her sister, so.

- Alright, okay appreciate it.

- We got mom here too.

- Yup, my mom's here.

- Okay. Go ahead.

- She's ready to be out in the community with her daughter and have her own place, I think it's really important that she has that. And she's been taking very good care of her.

- Okay, okay appreciate it, that's it. Alright, is there somebody that wants to make a motion in regards to Karen, Kim, sorry.

- Karen's the mom.

- You think that's crazy, my mom's identical twin and it's Karen and Sharon.

- Does anybody want to make a motion?

- I will make a motion to approve her to move into the address.

- 409 South Webster.

- Yeah okay, that address.

- It's apartment 308 too.

- Apartment 308 for a period of 60 days and at that time, I'd like to see her return back with, to see what she's accomplished and have documentations for counseling, things like that that you're involved in.

- And if I could add to that, when's her birthday, the little one?

- November fourth.

- She'll be three on November fourth?

- Yeah and that's my partner's birthday too.
- Okay, then I would like to add to that that when you come back in 60 days, you show us you've made contact with Headstart and I can get you information for that. There's a three year old Headstart program. She wouldn't be eligible until then, second semester but it'd be very very important to get her involved with that.
- Could you get me that information?
- Yup, yeah.
- Awesome, thank you.
- The only thing is I don't think you should be a part of.
- Not a part of the motion, I'll withdraw that. I'll get you that information anyway.
- Thank you though, thank you. Because she is so smart, I caught her in the corner counting to 10 by herself.
- She's adorable.
- Thank you.
- Okay. Is there a second to the motion?
- I second it.
- Okay. Can you put it up for a vote please? Have all the votes been counted?
- I'm waiting for one more vote.
- Technology, you gotta love it.
- Motion fails on a vote of three to two.
- Okay.
- Can I make a motion? That we approve Miss Fellers moving to the new address as stated in the application 409 South Webster Avenue, Green Bay and have her back within a period of 120 days?
- Yeah, we can make that motion if there's a second. Is there a second to that motion?
- I'll second it.
- Okay, we're up for a vote again.
- That motion passes on a vote of three to two.
- Okay, so here's where we're at. So you approved to move to this particular location 409 South Webster, you'll be asked to come back in 120 days and provide that additional documentation. If you do not show up, then you will be automatically denied going forward, okay. Alright, thank you.
- Thanks guys.
- Thank you very much. They'll send you that information.
- Yeah, you guys will send it to me in the mail.
- What do you want it sent to?

- Send it to 409. And then with the Headstart.
- What's the apartment look like?
- She's asking you for the apartment number.
- 308.
- Go play, mom, go play.
- We're gonna go play.
- Will you tell those people thank you for giving you a house?
- Can you tell 'em all thank you for giving you your home, say thank you.
- Thank you.
- Next up is Mr Anthony Shay.
- Thank you so much.
- That's the number, Sally Jansen, ask for Sally. Give her my name.
- Again, thank you guys very much for you time.
- If I could get her into something.
- No guarantees on that but give her a call now. And let her know when her birthday is and what have you and what you need to do to get on the list.
- She's so smart, so smart, thank you so much, thank you.
- Okay, Mr Shay.
- Good afternoon.
- Good afternoon. Give us a second to make sure we get everything up here. It takes a while for everything to come up here. Okay, it looks like you were last due in front of us in May of 2016, is that correct?
- Yes.
- Alright. First question I have for you is why you need to move?
- I need to move because the city of Green Bay's purchasing the house I rent right now. They're gonna tear it down and make way for a new boulevard on North Webster so I'm required to vacate.
- Okay, alright, so I noticed here there was nothing in your current offenses that you've had any issues with anything going forth the last time we talked to you. Is that correct?
- That's correct.
- Okay, does anybody have any direct questions of him other than the location or any other issues that you wanna speak to him about?
- Okay, then I'd like a motion in regards to his application in regards to his move to 1263 Rober Street upper.

- Reber.
- Reber, is there a motion?
- Motion to approve the applicants request to move to the Reber street address.
- Is there a second?
- I'll second that.
- Motion is passed unanimously.
- Good, okay so go ahead and you're approved to go to your new location, do you want that sent to your new location or at your old location?
- Yes, my new location.
- New location, okay. That's it.
- Thank you. You have a nice day, all of you have a nice day.
- Next on the agenda is Christopher Poplin.
- I received a call that he wants to be withdrawn.
- Okay.
- Yeah.
- So with withdrawing do we need to vote or not then, he withdrew?
- We do.
- Okay. So I'm making a motion to deny Christopher Poplin to move to 131 South Inida Street.
- Second.
- So this is a vote on whether to approve or deny, denying the address.
- So a yes means you're denying it, right?
- Correct.
- Okay. Just wanted to make sure everybody knew that.
- Yes we deny this case.
- Yes.
- Alright, motion passed unanimously.
- Alright, next item on the agenda is Randy Graham. Hey Randy, how things goin'?
- Pretty good.
- Before this agenda item is discussed, it has been brought to my attention that inspection has shut down that address.

- Exactly.
- It never received it's certificate of occupancy. And there were inspection violations so currently that address is not habitable.
- Right.
- So before we start then, is there a different address that you're looking to or what's the status of that address?
- Well, as of now, I'm homeless. But my apartment should come through today or tomorrow. I'm not sure whether he said today or tomorrow on West Webster.
- Okay. But right now, we can't, we don't have anything to vote on because we don't have an address, of course. So why don't, I'd like to make a motion to postpone till you can get a revised application for us.
- Yeah.
- And to our next meeting. Do we need to vote on that or not?
- Yeah, there's a motion to adjourn.
- Okay, I'd like to motion to adjourn Randy Graham's request to move to 311 South Jefferson Street.
- I'll second that, I lost my screen.
- So how soon, if I get the place tomorrow, what do I do, bring the papers?
- You just have to refile the paperwork on the front page and put the new address down.
- And drop it off.
- Well then, you'll be on our agenda for next month.
- Sure, that'd be good.
- I think as long as you follow up the complete application, you would have to redo a lot of things.
- I would.
- You have to get that, yes.
- You have to get the landlord's approval.
- Yeah, yeah.
- Landlord's approval and then along with this form again, the front page of the form.
- Sure, so I need to get that before I leave.
- You can get one down in the clerk's office.
- Sure, sounds good, awesome, okay, thanks.
- So in this particular case, yes means to just.
- Adjourn it.
- Adjourn it, okay.

- Kathy if you wanna just tell me, I can mark your vote down.
- Yes.
- Actually I don't have anything pop up in the window.
- I sent it, I can manually.
- Oh, I've got it, I've got it.
- So you should be able to just rejoin that meeting, yup.
- Okay.
- We're still waiting.
- We're still waiting.
- Kathy, do you want me to just manually enter your vote?
- Yeah.
- Okay.
- Are you voting yes or no to it?
- Yes.
