VERBATIM MINUTES

It doesn't take it, my my, I don't know what I'm gonna do.

Okay, I'm going to bring to order the meeting of the Green Bay Sexual Offenders Residency Board for October the 10th. Just gonna start with roll call here. Renee Keehan here, Kathy De Cremer's here and Melissa, Chellac, Chellock, is here?

Cheslock.

Cheslock, sorry, and myself are here.

This one, here.

Okay. Next thing I wanna move to approval of agenda for this month's meeting.

Make a motion to approve that agenda.

I'll second that.

All in favor?

Aye.

Aye.

Aye.

So approved. We'll move next to the minutes of our August 8th meeting. Does anybody wanna make a motion to approve those minutes?

So moved.

Is there a second?

I'll second.

All in favor?

Aye.

Aye.

Aye, so approved. Am I going too fast?

As long as it's all unanimous, I can keep up.

Okay.

Alright, okay, our first appeal is for Mr. Rod Cox, which is on the telephone, so I'll get that started.

[Female] Okay, I'm going to be speaking during this, should I talk now or?

No, we'll call him.

[Female] Okay.

[Male] Winnebago Correctional, charge sergeant.

Yes, this is Dean Gerondale with the Green Bay Sexual Offenders Residency Board, I was looking for Mr. Rodney Cox, please.

[Male] I'll transfer you.

[Roddy] Hello, this is Roddy.

Roddy, this is Dean Gerondale, I'm chairman of the Green Bay Sexual Offenders Residency Board, I'm here to hear your appeal.

[Roddy] Yes, sir.

Okay, just wanna let you know, we are in a public session with our board, so as we get started with a couple things, we're gonna go over your case. We like to make sure you refer to the victim as the victim, don't refer to 'em by their proper name or as my cousin or my sister or anything like that, okay?

[Roddy] Great.

Alright, awesome, appreciate that. So it looks like you're looking to move to 635... Hearth, Hartening, street?

[Roddy] Hartung, H

G, Hartung street.

Thank you. When do you expect to be released, sir?

[Roddy] October 30th.

Okay. Alright, I'm looking at your particular case, it looks like you were convicted in 2010 of sexual assault, secondary sexual assault of a 13 year old, is that correct?

[Roddy] Yes, sir.

Alright can you tell me a little bit about what happened?

[Roddy] I had been out drinkin' and I had took pills, it came in about 4:00 in the morning, and a friend, my girlfriend, a friend's daughter was stayin' over, and she had a friend with her, and I had, like, the bedroom, and uh. First I had suspect, because like I normally do, when there was this young lady, a young girl, sittin' there, or layin' there asleep, and I went over and rubbed her back and went down and rubbed her buttocks, and she woke up and I ran out of the room, yeah. Then another, the other girl that had been stayin' with us for quite awhile, the next morning, this was like the same morning, but it was like 4:00 in the morning and 7:00 in the morning, they had knocked on me and my girlfriend's door, and wanted to know if Liv would take her home. And Liv said that I would and I got up and took 'em home and then she called back and told Liv, Liv was my girlfriend, what had happened. And, when she went over there, and told the girl, yeah, then the other girl was saying that I had tried to touch her breasts once when I gave her a hug. And then, by the time, that's what my girlfriend says, and then she said when they came out, they say, she said it happened several times. I got my attorney, told my attorney that I had never, and I'd never done that, and ended up allowing them to read it and my attorney said that it wasn't like, it wasn't pleading guilty, it would just allow them to consider it, take it into consideration, it sounded like. So I allowed them to read in that I was actually charged into a second, and somehow, it got read into a first, which, yeah, I'm still... But yeah, that's as far as what happened, that's what I did. I mean, I've taken responsibility for it. I've tried to better myself and understand what I did wrong as far as not drinking or doing drugs and I haven't since then. I mean, obviously I've been incarcerated most of the time, but from here out, I'm sober, complete. So I actually was revoked, because I was in a banquet area of the bar, it was actually the bar, but I tried to justify it by being in the banquet area, you know, to drink, and somebody had reported me, and on top of that, they actually gave me an ATR inside it, but then they decided to lift it, 'cause they got to talkin' to my, I'm going in farther than, I don't know, maybe more than you want, but I'm just tryin' to explain the whole thing of why I'm re

incarcerated. I didn't know if you wanted to know.

No, go ahead.

[Roddy] Yeah, so, I had recently, well with my P.O., I had had a pretty good relationship with my P.O., but I felt like my supervisor wasn't really, I don't know, she had given me a polygraph and tried to say that I failed in certain areas as far as like, moves and things. I just felt like, my appeal was complimented by how well, you know, she even said that I had never had the money to move. You know, I had gotten her stuff together 'cause I was going to school and workin', workin' out, doin' things, and being productive but, I felt like the supervisor was kinda tough on me. But anyway, I did revoke a main first, bein' in the bar, and then that same weekend, I had a conversation with my P.O. about goin' to pick up my daughter in Indiana, and she told me that, I still haven't been able to talk to her about it, 'cause she never really came up and talked to me after I was revoked, but she had told me that I did need a chaperone to be around my biological daughter, that I could actually bring and have custody of her, but when I went to pick her up in Indiana, that weekend, she told me, which is the same weekend that the guy had called and told my P.O. that I had been in the bar, when I went back to get my daughter, she said that I couldn't bring her back. She said, "We can't say that she can't come back, "but you can't bring her back." So that's exactly what happened. I mean, I made arrangements for somebody to bring her back to Wisconsin because, I mean, if she wants to see her relatives and all that, it made sense that she could come back but they didn't want her driving back with me and I understood that, but anyway, so that was the another part of the revocation, of why they revoked me. So they revoked me for two years and three months. And that was more of a misunderstanding, if anything. But so they hear that I was out, I got approved by the court, I lived on Lemon Street. And I was goin' and doin' agriculture and landscaping, I was doin' my own lawn care and landscaping business. And doin' actually real well. I'd just gotten, you know, caught up in tryin' to find activities to do. And I was playin' poker in the bar.

Okay.

[Roddy] You know, as far as re

offending, I put my family as just really like my mom like a Sunday. And one of the biggest able concerns of being more out of Winnebago is just, you know, I've been able to think about a lotta things. You know, my daughter's just bought that house on Hartung Street, and that could be a place to get started and, I'm actually working right now. I've been working, I'm at minimum security in Winnebago. They allow me to go work out in community custody. So, I've been workin' for six months. I've saved up some money, you know, I wouldn't mind bein' there for a few months helpin' her out, it's not my intention to really stay there for too long. But all of her friends, invade her privacy. So it's not, I'm sure she could, she would like to.

Okay. Does anybody have any questions for Mr. Cox?

I'd like to ask, this is Melissa Cheslock, I'm asking, there are some notes that I have read regarding your application. Regarding gambling?

[Roddy] I'm sorry, I can barely hear, but I did hear something about gambling? There's something in there about gambling

Yes, so

[Roddy] and that's what you're asking me?

About your girlfriend? Registering you to gamble in violation of one of your, um.

[Roddy] Oh, no, I've never been told that I couldn't. I mean, not that, I mean, yeah, it's not on my rules, or anything, about gambling that I, you know, as far as...

At a bar?

[Roddy] Pardon?

Gambling at a bar?

[Roddy] Yeah, I'm not supposed to be in the bar, definitely, I agree with that, yeah. I'm not supposed to be in the bar, but I'm just sayin' that was the reason I was in there, I don't drink. Again, it was a wrong reason to try to justify why it was okay to go in there, I guess, is all I'm sayin' is the reason that, you know, I know I'm not supposed to be in there even though I'm not drinking. And it was in the banquet area of it, too, so I'm assuming, you know, that's definitely why I'm thinkin', "Well, I'm not in the bar, "I'm not actually drinking." So, yeah, I mean, that's my mistake. I've, you know, I've taken responsibility for that. I shouldn't have been in there at all. But it was just, there was a poker tournament the guys play in that I used to play in a lot and that's why I was in there.

My concern is this. If you know you're not supposed to be anywhere where there's, where you're ordered not to be in bars or liquor stores, where they serve liquor, that you felt it was more important for you to play in the poker tournament, than to strictly adhere to the conditions that were given to you by your P.O.

[Roddy] No, I am not at all. No, not at all, it's not...

It's not what?

[Roddy] It's not okay, no I know. I don't think that it was okay at all. Like I said, the bar, it was actually outside of the bar, into another room, but again I shouldn't a even been there. It was at the Midway Best Western Hotel, and actually there was a room in the back that's there. And they do come in there, but yeah, I'm not trying to justify it at all. I shouldn't have been, that's why I got revoked. But I don't drink, everybody, I mean, I was never, was accused, the person that's even in there knows that, and seen me, knew that I wasn't drinking. But yeah, again, I shouldn't be in there. I was absolutely not takin' responsibility for that.

Another question, or?

No, that's...

Okay.

Anybody else? Okay, does anybody wanna make a motion in regards to Mr. Cox?

Is it, well it said you would run speak on his behalf.

Oh, yep, definitely. Anybody wanna speak on his behalf? Ma'am, come on up. Can you say your name, please?

[Melissa] Melissa Pierce.

Okay.

[Melissa] Do I just talk, or?

Yep, just speak, talk. Yep.

[Melissa] So, I'm his daughter.

Okay.

[Melissa] I'm 25, I own the home on Hartung Street.

Okay.

[Melissa] I just bought it, back in April. I live alone. I work at BayCare clinic here downtown, so, I, pretty, I have my life together, I would like to say. I don't drink, I, you know, pretty much go to work, and hang out at home, and play with my dogs, and I have a pretty relaxed, you know, life. I don't do a whole lot, so, I mean, for him, I think it's in his best interest to live with me. And I think it's in, you know, the state's best interest as well. I have a very good relationship with all of my neighbors, so, that's another positive thing.

Are they aware?

There's not very

Um, no, I haven't, I mean, if he were to be approved, then that would be something that I would mention. But I didn't really wanna go that far if, you know, he wasn't approved yet. But they're all, there's a old lady across the street, there's actually, I was looking at the registry map online and there's a sex offender that lives next door, as well, so I don't know, I didn't look into the regulations and everything as far as, how far from certain things, or whatever, and I assume that you guys can maybe, possibly override whatever those regulations are, but yeah.

Mhm.

[Melissa] Long story short, I mean, my neighborhood is mainly all elderly people. I don't really see children outside, and playing, I mean, even if there were, I don't think it would be an issue, because I don't think that he will re offend, I mean, there's no, if I did think that, I wouldn't allow him to live with me. I wouldn't, I would say, "Well, good luck" you know?

Mhm.

Mhm.

[Melissa] So I do feel strongly that he has improved his lifestyle, and I think, being with me at my home, that that will kinda make him, I guess, he'd be more likely to abide by all of his rules and things if he was, you know, living with me. We have a very close relationship.

Okay.

[Melissa] But, again, if I felt that he was a threat to society in any way, I would not allow him to live at my house

Okay.

But, yeah, that's pretty

Alright, thank you

for your time.

much it.

[Melissa] No problem, thank you.

Um, I have a question about the work.

[Melissa] Me?

Oh, no,

Him.

I'm sorry, I'm sorry, I apologize. Now, where's that located?

What is it you're currently doing?

[Roddy] Oh, the Camel support, I'm working. I work at Tom's Millwork, I'm told by my P.O., that I'm able to keep that job, and obviously, it's gonna be a transportation thing, that, I mean, I have transportation up there. Transportation and everything, it's just, obviously I'm gonna be lookin' for something closer. But I like to stay busy, I wanna be productive, and I wanna work until I decline in health. So I will be looking, but at the same time, I'm tagging along still working there. And then I wanted to finish my service in the fall, well, not the fall, it would be actually in February.

Okay, but where is your, where located?

Camel Court.

[Roddy] Camel's Court.

Okay. I couldn't hear, okay.

Oh.

[Roddy] Just on the other side

That's okay.

[Roddy] It's gonna be a pretty good drive, so it's not somethin' that, you know, I mean, it's not like I've considered moving. I mean, it's not really, as far as the pay, it's not as good as I would probably be able to get somewhere else, so. But I am set up to where I can be productive right away, and I will be working, I'll take the week I get off on Tuesday, and then the following Monday, I'm gonna take care of some things that I need to take care of and then the following Monday, I was gonna report to work, and then, like I said, my intentions are to finish my school, and NWTC in February, to get my degree in horticulture, I'm halfway there.

Okay. Alright, is there anybody else that wants to speak? Either for or against this gentleman? Alright, does anybody wanna make a motion in regards to Mr. Cox? I'm gonna make a motion to approve Mr. Cox, at 635 Hartung Street, address specific. Is there a second?

I'll second that.

Any discussion?

There's this, brief discussion. Let's see, Mr. Cox, you mentioned something, in your statement recently, something to the effect that you did not plan to stay there very long with your daughter?

[Roddy] Well, I mean, I would, I just, you know, it's her house, she has her own life. I mean, I want to, I mean, hopefully I can find a place and be out on my own, you know, I mean I don't believe that I want to infringe and invade her, you know, her personal life any more than I have to be, with her age and everything. So, as long as that I'm able to be able to find a place to get out and be productive, I mean, that would be my goal in the long run. I

don't want to, you know what I mean, impose. As far as a long term, extended stay obviously. And then I guess that would depend on, you know, what the opportunity for me to be able to do that obviously.

Okay, thank you.

Alright. Okay, since we have a motion to approve, all in favor of that say aye. Aye.

Aye.

Opposed?

Are we gonna vote?

She doesn't have the

Oh! I'm so sorry!

That's the only reason why.

Okay. Opposed.

Okay. So the motion I guess became for what he's putting us up there.

Yeah. Kathy you supported, yes?

Yes.

Motion passed.

Okay, sir, you've been approved to move to 635 Hartung Street, address specific. We will send notification to that address, okay?

[Roddy] Yes, sir.

Alright, thank you.

[Roddy] Alright, I appreciate it, thank you so much.

Buh

bye.

[Roddy] Bye.

Next up is Mr. Christopher Klein, sir come on up. Okay, Mr. Klein, we're gonna hear your appeal to move to 2420 Oakwood Drive, correct?

[Christopher] Correct.

Alright, again, as we go over your case, just don't refer to a person by a personal name, just refer to the person as the victim if that's alright. Okay, so it looks like you were convicted in 2000. So, why don't you tell us what happened?

[Christopher] Back in 2000, I just turned 18. Met a girl at the Pony Park, at the roller skating rink. We started talkin' a while, or whatever, we started sayin' we wanted to start dating. Didn't ask her her age, didn't think about it, at the time. A couple days later, about maybe a week later or so, she had called me up askin' me if I wanted to go to a party in Bonduel, I had said yes. It was me, her... some guy that her friend ended up meeting, or not sure, but either way, the party was in Bonduel. Bonduel, we went there, we got there, we began to drink, we all got a little too much, had a little too much, we all got a little too drunk. Me and the girl that I started a relationship with went in the room, we had sex, and after that, we just continued to party, and continued to get drunk. The other girl, basically came onto me, and we ended up going in the bedroom and we had sex as well.

Okay, and so how did it come to light that you had sex with a fifteen
year
old?

[Christopher] I'm not exactly sure, how it came to light. I never, like, exactly notified about how it came to light or anything else like that. The story that I heard was that her friend had went and told her dad's girlfriend that she had went out and she had fun and everything else, whatever. And then, her dad's girlfriend told her dad, and her dad told the parents of the girl that I was in a relationship with. So, that's how it...

Okay. So in terms of how he's described this assault, is that accurate?

Yes, everything's accurate.

Okay. Okay, it looks like we've also, in terms of, prior, or additional convictions, you failed to register as a sex offender several times. Can you tell us why you failed to do that?

[Christopher] When I was younger, I just, when I got out, I was kinda, rebelling against it, because I didn't feel like I was... Should be categorized in that area, I guess.

Okay.

[Christopher] So I kinda rebelled against it, and refused and whatnot.

Hey mommy is that

showing a picture.

Okay.

That, okay, so that was 2006, but then why again in 2008?

[Christopher] Excuse me?

It was twice, that you didn't register, so

[Christopher] Right, the, the first one was a late one and everything, and I didn't do it, and everything else, so I got, basically warned, and everything else.

Oh, okay.

[Christopher] The second one was in 2008, I was dating a girl, and I basically just trashed everything back my whole life and everything else before her. And, that was that.

Why do you wanna move to the Green Bay area?

[Christopher] I work in Green Bay.

Okay. Where do you work at?

[Christopher] Wisconsin Building Supply.

And you're gonna live with a friend?

[Christopher] Yes.

How long have you known this friend?

[Christopher] For about six years.

Are you on paper yet?

[Christopher] Yes.

'Til when?

[Christopher] 2024, I believe.

For, for what?

[Christopher] Burglary.

Burglary, just the strangulation supplication in '15, what's that?

[Christopher] Me, my girlfriend and I, were livin' together, at the time, we got into a huge argument. She had said I choked her, and then took off, over by her mom's. Then we ended up getting back together, two weeks later. And then her parents ended up calling the police, reporting that I had choked her, two weeks prior to... Us gettin' back, us gettin' together.

Mhm.

[Christopher] So I ended up getting locked back up for revocation, and then charges were brought against me, I couldn't, I tried gettin' her to give a restatement. She said she would give a restatement, she came to the jail, she seen me, we wrote letters and everything else. But, she wouldn't give a restatement like she was, she was gonna say she was going to, but...

So then you were convicted of that?

[Christopher] Correct, it was all around compliant with my probation that I'm serving now.

Okay, how long you been out?

[Christopher] Since January, so nine months, or 10 months.

Okay. And you've had no other issues?

[Christopher] Nope. Only been doing good since I got out, I got a job right away. The week that I got released I had a job within a week. I just been doing good, just struggling on a place to stay. That's my only issue.

Okay. Other questions for him?

Where do your support people live?

[Christopher] I have some in Green Bay, I have some in Manitowoc, and I have some in Shano, and Cashino.

Okay, specifically, though, who's in Green Bay?

Mae, Cornelius, friend.

Okay.

[Christopher] I got little girl, family here in Green Bay and everything else.

Do they know about your prior convictions?

[Christopher] Some of 'em do.

How often do you see them?

[Christopher] Mae, I see almost every day. Family and everything, when I run into 'em at the store, or something like that. I mean, I don't, I have a huge family. So I don't know a lot of my family. I would like to actually get to know some of my family, so.

So what I'm, I guess my question is, when I say, or I'm thinking support people, to me that means somebody who you're in frequent contact with and who you know will support you, so.

[Christopher] Mae.

Okay, so is Miss Cornelius your only support person?

[Christopher] As of right now, yeah.

Okay.

Are you driving back and forth to work now from Shanno to here?

[Christopher] Yes, from Manitowoc.

From Manitowoc.

Here.

Okay, any other questions you have?

Are you working full

time?

Yes.

Is it full

time?

Where did you say you work at? I'm sorry.

[Christopher] Wisconsin Building Supply.

Okay.

[Christopher] Over on Moraine Terrace, I believe it is.

Okay. Alright, does anybody wanna

Just

Speak, go ahead.

Here in Green Bay?

[Christopher] Yes, ma'am.

Oh, I thought you were

He lives in Manitowoc, but he works in Green Bay.

I thought you were still working in Manitowoc.

Nope.

Okay.

Got it, alright.

So does anybody wanna speak, either for or against this gentleman?

[Mae] I would like to.

Come on up, ma'am. Could I just have you sit, and just tell me your name, and relationship with him?

My name is Mae, Cornelius.

Okay.

[Mae] I own the house at 2420 Oakwood. Like he said, we had been friends, off and on, but the last six months I myself have been going through some struggles and he's really helped me out with a lot of things. Been there for me, providing me rides, when I didn't have a car, making sure I had groceries, and that kinda thing. He's been a really good help. And then, also, you know, he was looking, I wanna return that favor, and so we were looking on the residency maps, and we noticed that my house is on the border of where he would be able to live, runs through my front yard. So if I lived across the street, he would be okay. We wouldn't have to be sitting here, but because, where the, it runs through the property, so.

Okay, tell me why you think he's a good candidate to live within the Green Bay area. Obviously he's continuing to have issues, along with his conviction for child sexual offending, he's had a lot of other issues.

[Mae] I think he's realized the error in his ways. He's changed, since when I first met him, and just been appreciative of the things that he does have now. Whereas, before, things weren't as well

kept, it seemed, I mean, to overlook things, whereas now, he's paying attention and making sure he's on top of, you know, even taking care of my things for me. So that I can, you know, be able to get to place to place.

Ma'am are you currently employed?

[Mae] Yes I am, I'm working at Kohl's.

Okay, alright.

[Mae] And I'm working on my MBA, as well.

Okay. Any other questions for her? Okay, thank you for your time.

[Mae] Thanks.

Alright, is there anybody else? Ma'am, come on up. Could I have your name, please?

[Gloria] Gloria Klein.

Alright, go ahead.

[Gloria] I'm Chris's mother, and I would like him to live with me, because I got a 40

year

old son that's living with me in a trailer house, and, I don't have the room for him to live with me, it would be better if he stayed in Green Bay.

Okay.

[Gloria] Because I don't have the room at my house for Chris to be living with me.

Okay.

[Gloria] And I would appreciate that he would be able to have this opportunity.

Alright, thank you. Alright, any other questions for him?

Nope.

Alright, does anybody wanna make a motion?

Dean?

Sure.

Even if he couldn't pass all that treatment, I would assume that's

If no one has a question on his treatment, then.

[Christopher] As far as my treatment, my treatment has all been

Right, well I mean, one of the things she was just saying is, if we ask to talk about your treatment programs, you have the right to either do it in public or private.

[Christopher] Okay.

And so, it just in this particular case, no one had a question on your treatment, so if we did, then we'd have the right to either go into private session or stay in public session, so. Does anybody have a question in relation to it? That they want to discuss?

No.

Okay, anybody wanna make a motion?

I'm gonna make a motion to approve Mr. Klein, address specific to 2420 Oakwood Drive, Green Bay.

Okay, is there a second? There is not a second, so the motion fails. Is there anybody else would like to make a motion?

I would like to make a motion that we approve the application, address specific, with a return date back here in 120 days. My concern is that, Mr. Klein, stated, basically, his only support person is Mae, Ms. Cornelius, and, it seems kind of, he doesn't have any other support people, I'm just concerned that, if he lives here, and if it doesn't work out, then where, because his mother, Mrs. Klein, already stated she couldn't have him there, at her home.

Okay, so that motion is to allow Mr. Klein to move to 2420 Oakwood Drive, address specific, for a term of 120 days at which time he'd have to come back. Is there a second to that motion?

I will second that motion.

Okay, ready to vote?

Motion passes on a three to one vote.

Okay, Mr. Klein, you've been approved to 2420 Oakwood Lane, Oakwood Drive, excuse me, address specific, you will have to come back for no more than 120 days, if you fail to show up, you will automatically be revoked at that location. So, where would you like the documents sent? To this new location?

[Christopher] Yes, please.

Okay, alright, thank you very much.

[Christopher] Thank you.

In regards to the next two appeals, Tod Bergemann and Payton Stewart, do we need to vote because they're not here? Or we just go past them?

They came in and monitor the draws, so.

Okay. The next person is Mr. Brandon Harrison. Alright, Mr. Harrison, we're here to hear your appeal to move to 1918 Oakwood Avenue, is that correct?

[Brandon] Oakdale.

Oakdale, sorry, Oakdale, that is correct, we wrote here. And you're currently homeless, sir?

[Brandon] Yes.

Alright, again, as we go over your case, just like refer to the person as the victim.

[Brandon] Yes.

And not by any proper name or surname, so. So why don't you tell us what happened in 2013?

[Brandon] 2013, I worked at a haunted house, and I was in the room, with, minors worked there as well.

Right.

[Brandon] And, I was in there with the victim, and she said that I had groped her inappropriately. And, I didn't know anything about these accusations, or that I was, that this came to light or anything, until a month later when I was arrested and revoked off of BS for the second degree reckless.

So, were you actually working?

[Brandon] Yes.

And so you were dressed up, like kinda like in a costume

Yes.

or somethin' like that? Okay. Alright, so this came four months later the charge came?

[Brandon] Yes.

Alright.

[Brandon] I was actually incarcerated already, I was facing revocation just on allegations of a felony crime.

Okay, what was that crime?

[Brandon] Second degree reckless endangering safety. That's what I was in, being revoked, for.

From.

[Brandon] And, with these new pending charges, I got, that's grounds for revocation.

Okay. Alright, so how long have you been out now?

[Brandon] Since July third.

And where have you been living?

[Brandon] I was at the TLP.

Okay.

[Brandon] And then, now, currently homeless on GPS.

You're on GPS for how long?

[Brandon] Until I get approved.

Until you get approved, okay.

[Brandon] My, this residence has been approved by the department of corrections. I just, I just need to see you guys.

Was your time just up at the TLP?

They had

Or why did you leave?

[Brandon] They had an SVN coming out, so they had to make room for 'em.

Okay, are you currently employed, sir?

[Brandon] Yes.

Where do you work?

[Brandon] I work through a service for staffing at Bay Valley Foods as a forklift operator.

Okay, how long have you had that job?

[Brandon] Two months.

Okay. Alright, in terms of what happened, is that how

The internal complaint states that this occurred at a residence in Howard?

[Brandon] That's, I thought you were talking about, originally why I was incarcerated. The actual, that right there was...

So, in regards to your sexual assault of an eight

year

old, that's

[Brandon] Okay, that's from, that's back in 2010, I think it would say in the report?

2007.

[Brandon] 2000, okay, I got confused when you said 2013.

Well, it says offense date, 11/1/13.

[Brandon] That's when I got arre

that's when this came to light.

When this assault came to light?

[Brandon] Yes.

But it happened back in 2007?

Yes, apparently the victim saw him when she visited the haunted house, and then disclosed.

Okay.

[Brandon] Yeah.

So, so let me take a step back, then.

Yeah.

I kinda thought that the assault happened at the haunted house?

[Brandon] That was right, yeah.

So it did happen at the haunted house, or it happened

No.

in a private residence?

[Brandon] There was two different...

Two different cases?

[Brandon] Cases. One guy dismissed it right away.

Were they the same victim?

[Brandon] No.

Okay.

Okay. So, why don't you tell us about each separate incident then?

[Brandon] Okay, well the one from 2007, I was 16 back then, and the victim said that I

How old was the victim?

[Brandon] I believe, you said she was eight.

Mhm.

Okay.

[Brandon] The victim said that I had, our families had been friends.

Okay.

[Brandon] And, our families visited quite frequently with each other. And, the victim said that I had brought her down into the basement, to the T.V. room, and felt on her inappropriately, nude, everything.

Did you do that?

[Brandon] I do not recall. It was a long time ago, and it's, I don't believe I did.

Okay, how 'bout the second one?

[Brandon] The second one... I would also like to state that I did plead Alford, to these cases.

Okay.

In your own best interests.

[Brandon] Yes.

Right, okay. But when the court takes your guilty plea?

[Brandon] That's, I, I

Well, not guilty, it's still considered a guilty plea.

[Brandon] Okay.

When you, that's how the court considers it. Whether you plead no contest, or not. So, you're admitting that the facts were true. The court will not take your plea unless they actually can get you to admit that, and because of the nature of the charges, and the seriousness of the charges, that has to be considered, because you're a registered sex offender.

[Brandon] Yes.

Okay. So what we're trying to find out is, what exactly did you plead guilty to? What did you do?

[Brandon] It was the 2007 one. The incident happened in 2007.

And where was that?

[Brandon] It was in a residence up in Howard.

Okay, and then the second incident.

[Brandon] Was in 2013 at Shadoware, at the Green Bay Fair.

At the haunted house?

Yes.

Okay. And there were two different victims?

[Brandon] Yes.

Okay.

And they were both eight?

[Brandon] No.

How old was the second one?

[Brandon] 15.

Okay, and how did, did you just, what did you grope her, or what was your charge?

[Brandon] Yeah, the charge was sexual contact, so.

Okay.

[Brandon] So that I groped her inappropriately, or outside of the clothing, or general area.

And that was, that happened several days afterward, you were charged that?

[Brandon] Almost a month.

Almost a month, okay.

[Brandon] That I was arrested first for that.

Okay, so, let's try to just, in terms of the facts, here, is that correct? Now that he's reexplained this?

Well, I, I have the information on the one. The complaint states it happened over a course of several years, starting in 2007, just before the victim turned eight, that he touched her vagina area 20

25 times over that time period, and touched her breast area approximately more than 50 times over that timeframe occurring five to six times a week, when he would come over.

Okay.

[Brandon] I would also like to to be known that, over that period of time, I was also in and out of jail multiple times. So it's, that I could not have been there, five to six times a week.

Okay, we're not talking about

Yes, yes, I understand that.

Yep.

Okay, so.

Okay. Does anybody have any more questions related to the conviction?

I have a conviction, now.

Okay, does anyone wanna talk about the treatment program?

Yes.

Yes.

[Brandon] Okay, I am currently

Okay, so wait a second, before you even start. You have the right to a private session, if we talk about this, or you have the right to just stay in public session, which would you prefer?

[Brandon] Treatment is considered medical, correct?

Yes, that's why you can go into private session.

[Brandon] Then I would prefer that it remain private.

Okay.

Okay.

No problem.

We need a motion to enter closed session.

Sure.

Some moved.

Just a second.

Do we have to read that?

Is there a second?

I'll second that.

All in favor, say aye.

Aye.

Aye.

Aye. Folks, we're gonna need everybody to leave, unless it's a family member related to him, and then that person can stay.

I think you want us to write?

Yeah.

Yeah.

I'm tryin' to see if that's even on here. If you can take that or more.

No, it went 250, and then quit, creepy at all.

I got it, don't worry.

Yeah.

Okay, we had an opportunity to speak with Mr. Harrison in regards to his treatment program. The board heard where he's currently at, in regards to that, and asked several different questions. So, is there any more general questions for him?

I have a question regarding your... Your mother is Nola Harrison?

[Brandon] Yes.

Okay, she wrote a letter and submitted it, acknowledging you're a sex offender.

[Brandon] Yes.

However, the property records, your mom is not the owner.

[Brandon] We are currently in the process of having the, I think it's the estate, estate, closed.

Okay, who's Marie Ayers?

[Brandon] My grandmother, she passed away.

Who's property did you damage in 2011?

[Brandon] I believe that was the Brown County Jail.

Oh, okay.

And with regard to the reckless endangerment charge, what was that about?

[Brandon] It's, gang affiliation, disagreement stuff back when I was 18, back when I was gang affiliated.

Okay. What, exactly, was the facts behind that?

[Brandon] Okay, he had, in my eyes, disrespected me and my sister, and I went after him with a knife.

Okay.

[Brandon] I showed up at his residence, knocked on his door, pulled a knife.

Okay.

Okay, any more questions for him directly?

I don't. Alright, does anybody wanna speak, either in favor or against him? Alright, is there a reason why your mom or you dad could not be here today?

[Brandon] My dad is currently working and my mom is disabled.

Okay. Okay, if no one has any more questions, does anybody wanna make a motion?

I'm making a motion to deny the applicant's request to move to the Oakdale Avenue address. I would be, feel more comfortable, and, as you already stated, Mister, I'm sorry I'm

[Brandon] Harrison.

Harrison, you have significant criminal history. And, you've had only four sessions so far. I would feel much more comfortable if you had more sessions under your belt, and I, not getting into your treatment, but, specifics, but, and the way you describe the offense, causes me concern.

Okay, is there a second to that motion?

I will second that.

Any discussion? I kind of agree as well. I don't think that, ultimately, you know, if you get through this class, then we would, at least, I would not consider you at this location. Right now, I'm just kinda at a point where, you haven't done enough yet to kinda see where you're at.

[Brandon] I literally have no support any places. I've lived my entire life at this house.

Yeah, I, I understand that. I think the other thing, too, is if you came back, you know, three or four, eight weeks from now, and had an update letter from Rebecca, too, to see where you're, actually how you're doing within the program, that would help us make a, a better decision, but, and I'm just telling you what my feeling is right now, not necessarily the feelings of the other board members, but, I mean, that's where I'm kinda at right now, so. Does anybody else have anything to say, or else we'll make, we'll vote?

I feel like, exactly as Dean said, you have a long ways to show us you have to, you would be a productive member of this community. I think you have a lengthy, as he admitted, background of problems.

I, I agree, but I do think it is good that he would be living with his mom and dad. Rather than homeless.

You know, I would,

Because somewhere, we could have him come back.

Right, and I would generally agree with you most instances, but, when I haven't had a chance to talk to the parents or, whether it's parents or, wherever you're living with, I don't know what that situation's like.

True.

So I consider that as well, in my thought process. That's why I asked the question, you know, is there a reason why none of them could show up today, because in absence of that, I have no idea what that, what that home life is like, you know, so.

[Brandon] Closest thing I can get to my mom being here is a call. Because my mom is currently disabled, she can't drive.

Okay.

How did you get here today?

[Brandon] I walked.

Okay. How far, and your father is?

[Brandon] He works at his shift, so he was gone already, by the time.

Okay, I agree with what Mr. Gerondale states. It is possible to get your dad here. It's just gonna take some coordination, on your part and his part, okay?

[Brandon] Okay.

So, with that said, we can go ahead and vote again for that motion.

Okay, so vote no, means?

You're against the motion.

Yeah, it's a vote to deny.

Okay, got it.

So, I mean, yeah.

Okayl just wanna make sure I know.

Motion to deny against this, three to one.

Okay, so here's what I think you gotta do. And I know it doesn't give you any, you know, consolation as to, you know, where you're at today, but you know, I would go ahead and reapply for our next meeting in November, if your father can make it that's great. In addition to that, if you do decide to do that, then come back with, have Rebecca write a letter as to how you're doing within that program. Those two things would go a long way, I think, in terms of potentially approving you next time you come in front of the board, okay?

[Brandon] Alright.

Alright, thank you. Mr. Robert Simmons. Okay, Mr. Simmons, we're here to hear your appeal to move to 330 South Quincy, apartment number three.

[Robert] Yeah, that's correct.

Okay, you're currently living at 1368 Y Street?

[Robert] No, I have been moved by other means.

Okay, why'd you have to move outta there?

[Robert] Because I was told I couldn't be there.

How long had you been living there prior to that?

[Woman] Braden, Braden, you wanna go in the hall?

[Robert] I guess, ever since you guys approved me for it.

Okay. Go back here in notes real quick and to see that.

Just want to point out the rest of the agenda has...

Okay, I just wanna go back to see when he was approved. Back in April of this year. Okay, alright, does anybody wanna ask any questions and, when we saw him back in April?

Can I have just one moment to check something in here.

Sure, go ahead, take your time.

So where have you been staying since then, since you've had to move out?

[Robert] I moved over there to the 330.

You have moved there?

Since April?

[Robert] Yeah, well, not since April, since the 15th of last month.

Okay.

Where are you working?

[Robert] For American Food.

It's a little slow.

Yeah, mine is very slow. So how's everything goin' otherwise for you?

[Robert] Well, I've been doin' pretty good, you know.

What do you do besides work?

[Robert] Sleep, pretty much. Because I work six days a week, I only have one day off, so.

Okay, thank you.

Alright, does anybody wanna make motion in regards to his appeal?

I'll make a motion.

I'll make a motion, to approve, Mr. Simmons at this specific 330 South Quincy Street, apartment three.

Is there a second?

I'll second.

Any discussion? Alright, let's go ahead and vote.

Motion passes, four to nothing.

Okay sir, you've been approved to stay at 330 South Quincy Avenue, apartment three address specific. Do you want that letter sent to that location?

[Robert] Yes, sir.

Alright, thank you very much!

[Robert] Alright, thanks again.

Kim Fellers.

She's a little bigger this time.

[Kim] Just a little!

Just give us a second, Kim, as we're just trying to get our things loaded here, I apologize.

[Kim] That's fine. She just grew just a little bit since she saw you guys last, but she's still quiet!

Somewhat.

[Kim] Somewhat, just the truck.

Somewhat.

Okay, welcome back.

[Kim] Hi.

So how's it been goin' for the last, since we saw you last time back in June?

[Girl] Mama, I wanna play.

[Kim] Amazing The apartment is just so

Mama! I wanna sit by you.

[Kim] awesome, that, did you tell them about the swimming pool there?

[Girl] I go swimming at my swimming pool.

Nice, k.

[Kim] She loves it.

So, tell us what's been goin' on the last 120 days with you.

[Kim] I've been doin' some counseling, at Family Services, I'm with Blanche, for the trauma that you guys wanted me to do. She's gonna do, there's a DPT class, but I don't have childcare for her, and there's no way that I can get help for childcare. We've been through everything to do that. So she's gonna do one

on

one DPT with me. Because my trauma is too extensive, from my childhood through adult. I did do DPT when I was in prison, they did, not a courts, but they had DPT sessions.

Okay.

[Kim] So.

So how often have you been able to see her?

[Kim] Weekly.

Weekly.

[Kim] Weekly, yes.

Okay.

So.

[Girl] Weekly!

[Kim] She's actually really good, counselor for me, my mom got sick, that's why my family's not here, she's in the hospital, she's got cancer. We were given three to six months for her to live, and then all of a sudden we found out that it's infection in her whole body, and she's only got the lymphoma cancer which is treatable. So, she's got six more weeks of chemo, she got a lymph that was taken out of her shoulder. She had one put in, and it caused an infection in her bloodstream that if I wouldn't have got to her to the hospital when I did, I would have waited a day or two longer, she would have died from the infection that was in her blood.

Okay.

[Kim] And that we didn't know, so, she, they're getting rid of the infection, and they're, you know, in the blood, so.

How's your job goin'?

[Kim] I don't have a job, this is my job.

Oh no!

I'm on SSI.

Alright, okay.

Regarding childcare, have you contacted anybody for resources like the YWCA?

[Kim] No, I didn't know. She does, for headstart, I did call that lady, and she is going to be mailing me an application in January, because she turns three next month. So she doesn't need the guidelines to start the, starting the

Pre

K program.

[Kim] Yeah, they're gonna send the application in January to get her in for next year, so she will be approved.

Yeah!

[Kim] You know.

I strongly urge you to contact the YWCA, they

[Kim] They do that?

They have child care there, yes.

[Kim] YWCA, that's, on Cherry, right?

That's the one on Cherry Station.

Madison.

[Kim] Right here?

It's over here, not the one right here.

[Kim] That's the one on Cherry Street, right?

No.

No.

[Kim] Or Madison?

Right there is the YMCA.

It's over here, Kim.

YWCA.

YW.

[Kim] Oh, by the police station.

Yep.

Okay. Yeah.

Yes.

[Kim] I'm at Hudson street.

Okay.

Uh, does anybody have any more questions for her?

I do not.

I do not.

[Girl] I do not.

Alright, does anybody wanna make a motion?

I'll make a motion to approve, Miss Fellers, address specific. What was that?

409 South Webster.

409 South Webster.

Okay, is there a second?

Seconded.

Alright, let's go ahead and vote.

[Girl] Mama see, like, cupcake I'm paint!

[Kim] Okay.

Motion passes, four to zero.

Okay, great, alright, thank you very much!

[Kim] Thank you guys.

We will send it to that

Is that permanent?

Yep, permanent, so you want that sent to ya at that location?

[Kim] Yes.

Okay, will do.

[Kim] Thank you.

Off the record.

[Kim] Yes?

You should just go to YWCA on your way home, before you leave here.

That's what I'm gonna do. Because I live right near that, so that's

Okay.

I want these to go by mama!

[Kim] So I'm gonna take...

[Child] Hey, I wanna go by mama!

Mama's comin', wait right there.

[Kim] And it's free?

They have different schedules, fee schedules.

[Kim] Oh, I didn't know that, thank you.

Okay, Christopher Poplin is next.

[Kim] Thank you very much.

Mhm.

[Christopher] I got some stuff for you.

Awesome, appreciate it, just let us, log your case back up here real quick.

[Christopher] Okay. Does, the lawyer need to be counted or no?

No.

[Christopher] Okay.

Thank you.

[Christopher] I just finished after care, but that is a letter before I did, see.

So we're just taking a chance to read what he's given us to in terms of... His treatment program, so again, if we talk about this sir, do you wanna do it in public session or in private?

[Christopher] It can be public.

Okay.

[Christopher] That's fine.

Alright.

[Christopher] The other letter's from my brother.

Did you say you're in aftercare now? Or you're also done with aftercare?

[Christopher] I just finished yesterday. I'm, it's really stress debating. He has to mail it from my old parole officer, Agnes, and it will go through Barbara, and then, but, yes, I am finished, okay. I can return, if I do, feel like I need it.

And how long have you been, were you in treatment?

[Christopher] Well, I mean, I did treatment in prison, and then when I got out, I did, I wanna say, seven to nine months with Tora Atkins.

Okay.

[Christopher] And then I went to Steve. And I would say, 16 months, maybe?

With him?

[Christopher] 14, 16 months?

Okay. Here you go, thank you.

Does anybody have any more questions for him?

Thank you.

I do not.

Okay, does anybody wanna make a motion?

Motion to approve the application, address specific.

1533 Morrow Street.

Correct.

Alright, is there a second?

I'll second.

Alright, let's go ahead and take a vote.

Motion passes, four to nothing.

Okay sir, you've been approved, permanent to 1533 Morrow Street, address specific. Address specific, excuse me. If you do move, you would have to come in front of us again.

[Christopher] Okay.

You want it sent there?

[Christopher] Yes.

Alright, thank you very much.

[Christopher] Just so I know, I will, I got this address for trauma therapy that I will be attending eventually but I'm switching jobs. So, when I get insurance from them, I will be attending.

Good, good for you.

[Christopher] Alright.

Thank you.

Mr. Douville, Michael Douville. Just a chance to look at this stuff, here.

[Michael] I brought the paperwork that you guys asked me to bring back this time.

Alright.

Thank you.

Okay, sir, can I have your documentation, please.

[Michael] Yeah, this is everything, from ACS, for completing that drug and alcohol program.

Okay.

[Michael] To get my transfer back here.

So again, just before we start, because this deals with your truant programs, we doin' it public or private?

That's fine.

Both?

Public's fine.

Public's fine, okay great. So I have several pieces of documentation here, in regards to certification from ATTIC Correctional Services thanking for change, managing co

occurring disorders, and a primary portion of communication and residential AODA Program. Anybody wanna take a look at the certificates?

Sure.

Kinda go ahead, and we also read, I gave us a bunch of ATTIC Correctional Services here.

You may have this back.

[Michael] Thank you.

Don't you dare!

Sorry.

Okay.

Okay.

Mhm.

Alright, is there anything else anybody would like to speak to him about?

Oh, this is good, sorry.

Yep.

Okay, anybody wanna make a motion?

I'll make a motion, to approve Mr. Douville, did I say that right?

[Michael] Mhm.

Address specific, 909 Waverly Place.

Okay, is there a second?

Second.

Dang it.

Sorry, I got kicked out, I'm back in.

Yeah, yours in the one I'm missing. Do you wanna give me a voice vote?

No.

No? Okay.

You ever wanna give us the results of a vote?

I was asking if you wanted to give me your voice vote, because yours didn't register.

Yeah, and I said no.

No, okay.

Now I know what you meant. That I'm not going to.

I was gonna joke that!

Motion passes, three to one.

Okay, sir, you've been approved to stay at 909 Waverly Place, address specific, if you do move then I need you to come in front of us again, alright? Thank you.

[Michael] Alright, thank you.

Next up is Mr. Alex Beard. Alright, dear. Just give me a second as it comes up, sorry.

Right now, we're in Green Valley, workin' on a farm out there, so I just learned, I guess they have a farm that's ran by robots.

I told them that, I do got a lawyer involved with it right now, my lawyer has a statement. My lawyer's actually on Quincy Ave, I don't remember his name, just talked to him once so far. I don't know where that case is even going, at this point. I mean, they gave me a bond, I cashed out. Because I have to get back out, take care of, I got three kids and a wife that I gotta take care of and, I'm the one that's makin' the money. But with that case, I don't know what's all going on with it, I was questioned to have my lawyer for settlement. They don't even know what they're talkin' about. And, I mean, I guess I still got charged. And I understand where they got it from. I mean, it's a theft

related case, and I have it on my records, back with the sex offense, so I can understand why they still arrested me. I mean, not wantin' to, they, I mean, they felt maybe I didn't cooperate, but I don't, I don't know. I mean, all I said was I didn't know what they were talkin' about, so, I went to the lawyer, and I got arrested for that, and like I said, I kind of understand why they could question me about that.

Also, another question I have is, you state you wanna move to 1735 10th Street, Green Bay.

I'm gonna go ahead and make a motion, to approve, Mr. Arcand, to 1735 10th Street, address specific.

or 10th Avenue?
