- You good?

- Yeah we're starting now. Okay I'm going to bring into order the meeting of the Green Bay Area sex offenders' residency board for March the 13th, we'll start off with a quick roll call, we have Renee here, Kathy Cremer is not, Melissa Chesloc is here, Ed Dorff is here, along with myself. Okay, we just need a motion to approve today's agenda.

- So moved.

- Second.
- Motion passes unanimously.
- Alright. Next is our approval of the minutes of our previous meeting, is that right?
- No.
- From February the 20th. Yeah, February the 20th.
- Move to approve.
- Seconded.
- Motion passes, three yes, one abstain.
- Okay, we're gonna start with our first appeal, Harley Cantrell. Mr Cantrell? I am going to make a motion to deny Mr Cantrell, to, I believe it was... 814 North Broadway.
- 814th North Broadway.
- Second.
- Motion to deny passes unanimously.
- Next up is the appeal of Tammy DeBeck. Tammy why don't you come up please.
- May I sit?
- Yeah please, right here. Just a second okay Tammy. You're looking to move to 1730 Boggart. Or Badger Street I'm sorry, apartment number two.
- Yes.
- Okay, I will let you know we are going to go through today, we're going to go through your case. Going to, what actually happened. We ask that you refer to the person as the victim. In this case don't refer to them by personal name, or affiliation, or initials or anything like that. The next thing we are going to go over is, any treatment programs you may have had. You have the right to do that here in public session, or a private session, which would you prefer?
- Public session.
- Okay, any questions before we start?
- No.
- Okay great, okay so it looks like your offense was back in 2015.
- Yes.
- With a seven year old, tell me what happened.

- I ended up messing with someone that I shouldn't have been messing with, and I ended up putting the victim in my room, to watch us have oral sex and regular sex.
- So you had this seven year old watch while you had sex with somebody else?
- Yes.
- Okay, and did that person participate at all other than watching?
- No.
- Okay, and how did it come about that this was discovered?
- I ended up calling the police to confess.
- So you called on yourself?
- Yes.
- So tell me, what was going through your mind? Why did this even occur in the first place? Obviously you felt some guilt after it was done, 'cause you called the police.
- Right, I felt remorse, I wanted to have my own sexual perverse sick mind body whatever fulfilled, and it didn't matter the age what the victim was, so I grabbed the closest victim to me, and put him in the room.
- Just for the purpose of having him watch?
- Just for the purpose of having him watch.
- So you served three years in prison for this?
- I did.
- Okay, does anybody have anymore questions on the case itself? Is that what it says in the case file?
- Pretty accurate.
- Okay, is this a one time event?
- It happened two different times.
- Okay.
- Same victim?
- Same Victim, one happened in December of 14, and other incident happened in February of 15.
- Okay.
- And then I called the police the next day.
- So, when were you released?

- February 19th.
- Okay.
- Who do you intend to live with?
- Myself.
- Yourself, okay do you have a job already, or what's...
- I do.
- Who are you working for?
- I work through AHEAD Staffing they go through Silent Partners over in Denmark.
- And who are you working for right now, what company?
- I work through AHEAD, they go through Silent Partners.
- Oh okay.
- In Denmark-
- Oh okay, okay I'm sorry, okay.
- I have a question, in your appeal file you say I feel like he may turn out to be a sex offender also when he grows up. Is this, I don't know how to ask it, are you gonna try to help him get treatment, or is there any contact?
- I can't have any contact with him. I can't have any contact with any child under the age of 18. Unless its approved.
- Okay, I can't ask it the way I want because I don'tokay thank you.
- Are you on a bracelet right now?
- I'm on a GPS bracelet.
- GPS bracelet okay, if there isn't anymore questions, we can talk a little bit more about your treatment program. So, at this point you went through some anger management training you said right?
- I have.
- Okay but you don't have any documentation for that?
- This was prior to 1998 and 2003.
- Okay, so when you were in prison is there a reason why you didn't get any sex offender training to talk about some of the feelings you had that remained of this?

- I went through SOT, sex offender treatment, twice and failed. The first time was for having contact with my... I wouldn't call him my victim, I don't know if he isn't my victim or not, but it was somebody related to me. I don't know if I can say it.

- So, I guess what my question is, so you were in prison for three years, my question is, you know if you were in SOT training and you're in prison how could you meet a minor I guess. That's my question.

- Through the mail, I was writing.

- Through the mail, okay.

- I was writing a minor that, I'm not supposed to have contact with a minor whether its writing or in person and stuff. I chose to write.

- Okay.

- To the person who was your victim, or just a minor?

- We'll just say a minor.

- Okay. So you were kicked out of SO2 training?

- I was kicked out 'cause I admitted to my mistake, the second times was because I had a prison girlfriend, and I admitted to that too.

- Since you been out have you gone to, or signed up to any sex offender training?

- I have an evaluation coming up.

- When is that?

- I believe on the 29th. I find out more information from my probation officer on Friday.

- And when were you released again on the 20 what of February?

- 19th of February.

- The 19th of February. So you were released directly onto the street or not to like the ATTIC or any kind of place else?

- The ATTIC is for men only.

- Okay.

- So I was directly on the streets.

- Okay, so where you been spending your nights?

- Well, the first week I stayed over at the Village Inn, and then I been staying, off and on, over at my friends house.

- Okay.

- Just so that I am clear are you waiting for to be accepted into other SO2 program or?
- I am.
- Okay.
- I'm getting the evaluation for it.
- Did you ever end up completely any SO2 training while you were incarcerated.
- I went partially through.
- Okay.
- Like, almost completely done.
- So, I guess a question, that springs to my mind is, I'm assuming you knew that in both instances you were breaking the rules, right?
- I did.
- So, why did you do it?
- I did it because I wanted to have a girlfriend, and I did it because I wanted to have contact with my boy.
- Okay, do you regret it?
- I do, very much.
- Why?
- I could have completed it, but because of my own stupidity I chose not to.
- Do you have any impulses to contact him now? As you did in prison.
- No.
- When you contacted him, how far were you into your sentence?
- I would say, like one and a half, I was halfway through.
- Okay, do you have any information on those particular incidences or not?
- No I only have the DOC.
- Okay.
- Okay, I guess the question I have is, so why should we let you live in the city right now? Because this is what I am kinda seeing okay, Obviously, what you did with the victim was reprehensible and you obviously felt that way yourself the second time you did it and that's why you spent the time in prison. But at the same time it seems that you've had issues with staying on track because obviously you broke the rules not once but twice that got you kicked out of SO2 training. SOT training sorry. So, you know, why should we give you this chance when you've had chances to, kinda, learn from your mistakes but you decided that to still break the rules, I

guess is my question, and the fact that you haven't had the chance to get evaluated yet, and to know where you're actually sitting in your rehab, you know for this type of offense. Tell me why we should give you this chance?

- Because I'm actually ready now. I'm ready to take care of me.

- I have a quick question, in your application you wrote that you lived in Green Bay your entire life, except between 2003-2011. Where were you?

- In Du Pere, east Du Pere, and then one year was in like 2011, I stayed in west Du Pere.

- Can you talk to us about the community ties and support you have listed here. You've mentioned a couple of family names and some friend names, is it possibly circles of support so, who do you have to help you out right now?

- I have my mum and my sister as my support, and then my two best friends, my closest friends that are here.

- There here today? Okay.

- And how long have you known your friends who are here on your behalf.

- Nearly ten years.

- Okay. And do they live...where do they live in general? I don't need to know specifically.

- They live by Lincoln. They've been a great help to me.

- In what ways?

- In every way, in every way they've given me a place to stay on their couch for no more than ten days, food support, you know, emotional support, they've just been a great support system for me.

- And why do you say possibly Circles of Support? You don't know anything about them, why is that a possibility?

- Well, I mean, I know they're my support system.

- Circles of supporters?

- No, I haven't done, I filled out an application for them.

- Okay, that's okay, yeah. So you're just waiting to hear

- Yeah right.

- if they'll accept the application?

- Right, anymore question for her?

- May I, just for a moment?

- Go ahead sure.

- Thanks
- I was just guna ask if anyone wanted to speak either for against her.
- Oh okay sorry, go ahead.
- So, does anybody want to speak either for her or against her in her application?
- I do.
- Mam, why don't you come on up. I just need your name and address for the record.
- Susan Krause, 812 Lincoln,
- 812 Lincoln? You go ahead.
- Can you spell your last name please.
- K-R-A-U-S-E.
- Thank you.
- Go ahead.
- Today, this morning, I went and filled out the paperwork for to be... whats that word?
- Chaperone.
- Chaperone, that's the word I was thinking, to be her chaperone, I work at a place for over 15 years, I have nothing that, I have done bad to show for, I work really hard, I've stayed at Macdonalds in West Du Pere for over 15 years, I've been with my other half for about the same, also, so. She's actually done really good, the only thing left to do is doing what we're doing right now. She did almost everything, except for what she said, to that one class.
- You mean Circles of Support?
- Yes.
- She's talking about the treatment.
- Oh the treatment, okay, okay.
- I've been out since February 19th and I have done everything expect for the SFT program which I have an evaluation for coming up and finding a place and I have done this all within less than a month.
- Yep.
- That's huge for me.
- Well, for anybodyher PO was saying, somebody being... some doing stuff for nine months or longer, I'm like whoa.
- Is there anything else you would like to say on her behalf?

- I am proud of what she has accomplished in the last month.
- Okay. So you knew her prior to this incident?
- Yes.
- Why do you think she did what she did?
- I would say impulse, sometimes we all have that inkling, whatever, but we all learn from our mistakes, and I think she is smart.
- Okay, thank you for your time. Is there anybody else? Sir, won't you come on up. Can I just have your name and address.
- Michael Horn, 812 Lincoln Street, Green Bay.
- Go ahead.
- I am just pretty much echoing pretty much everything Sue has said about the progress she has made. She got the job and she's been working hard doing it, and she's been hitting her marks as far as I've been told.
- Okay. Does anybody else have any questions for him? Okay, thank you for your time. Is there anybody else? I think you had another question.
- Oh no, I'm fine, I just needed to review something else.
- Okay, does anyone have anymore questions or thoughts, before I ask for a motion. Okay, does anybody wana make a motion in regards to this appeal, for Miss DeBeck.
- I will, I will move to grant her appeal to move to 1730 Badger Street Apartment 2.
- Address specific?
- Address specific, thank you.
- Is there a second? Okay motion fails. Is there another motion anybody would like to make?
- Yes, motion to grant the appeal at address specific, with a return for, in 120 days to check her status. I'm concerned with the fact that you haven't completed the SO2 training at this time, and you had two other opportunities to complete it and you weren't able to do that, so that's my primary concern, for public safety reasons, therefore I would... yeah that was the motion.
- Okay, is there a second to that motion?
- I'll second it.
- Okay, we have a motion to approve her to 1730 Badger Street Apartment 2, address specific for a term of 120 days at which time she will have to come back and show us the progress she's made in terms of getting through the SO-2 training, SOT training sorry.
- I thought it was approved but I have to...

- No, no we're voting right now.

- Okay, my bad.

- Motion fails with a two to two vote.

- Okay, so right now the motion failed, that would have allowed you residency for 120 days, because its a tie we don't have an odd number here today. Is there any discussion anybody would like to make, prior to potentially asking for another motion, if not then we'll go forward. You know, my thought is this isn't totally against your motion, I thought 120 days was a little bit long, I guess my thought process are, definitely for sure wanted to see the evaluation. I'm concerned that this was definitely an impulse thing she did and she had two other impulses while she was incarcerated. So now I am worrying about another impulse occurring. Without even an evaluation, I'm really struggling with granting her any access at this time.

- Miss DeBeck when is your evaluation?

- I believe its going to be like the 29th.

- Of?

- Of March.

- Of March okay, and do you know when, if you are approved, to start the SOT training program? Do you know how soon after the evaluation you would begin?

- No I won't have that information until Friday.

- Who took the evaluation?

- Pardon me?

- Who is doing the evaluation?

- I have no idea, my probation officer hasn't talked to me about it yet.

- Okay.

- He slightly mentioned when I went and saw him.

- Okay. What's your thought?

- Well I agree, I thought 120 days was too long, and I also do have concerns with the impulse. But I don't know, write the evaluation and then it could be how long before you get into treatment, we don't know that.

- Right.

- Okay, I'll make another motion, to approve the appeal, for address specific, for a period of 90 days, alright not at 90 so...

- 60.

- 60.

- Put 60, If we have 60 she should have time to have the evaluation we should be able to get a report out, a report back, as far as what that is and how far you are with the treatment and so you would need to comeback with that.

- Are you also able to get any reports of your records of SOT-2 in prison, are you able to get, even though you didn't complete it.

- I'm not sure.

- Okay, so we have a new motion on the table, for 1730 Badger Street at apartment 2, address specific. With a return of 60 days, is there a second?

- Yes second.

- Okay, lets go ahead and vote.

- Motion passes three to one.

- Okay, Miss DeBeck you've been approved to move to 1730 Badger Street, apartment 2, address specific. You'll be getting a notice sent to that location. You'll have to come back in our May meeting. If you fail to report you would automatically be declined. In the meantime you also should bring to us that evaluation, and any documentation that would prove that you're either scheduled to get into classes or you're already going through classes.

- Okay.

- Okay, if you don't bring those, you know we would have to revoke for you to stay there longer at that particular point.

- Okay.

- Alright, understand?

- Yeah.

- Okay.

- Thank you.

- Next up is a Nathan Schely?

- Schei.

- Schei, sorry about that.

- Ah, its okay I'm used to it. How are you guys doing today?

- Good.

- Good, how are you?

- I'm not too bad.

- Okay, so last time we saw you was in November, and you were looking at 120 days we gave you, and you're back here to tell us how its been going the last 120 days.

- Pretty good.

- You still employed?

- Yes.

- Same place?

- Yep.

- Again, just to refresh, if you want to talk about your treatment program you can do that either in public or private session.

- Publics good.

- Okay, do you have any update on that?

- Yeah right here.

- So we got a letter here from family services dated March the 12th, from James Drake.

- You said pretty good what's going on, but its not great.

- Honestly, I kinds been struggling to adjust a little bit.

- In what ways?

- Just from prison, mostly socially, just kinda, working and going home mostly. I kinda, I didn't really realize how, I hate to say institutionalized I was, but I did ten years in prison, so its just kinda, I kinda have a fear of going out and being about people so much, kinda trying to work on that, but other than that works going good.

- Okay.

- How much time do you spend with your family?

- I've been going to see them, probably about once a month on weekends.

- Okay, is there anybody else that you're spending time with?

- Recently I've been in contact with my, when I say my ex-wife but wife 'cause we're still married. We kinda reestablished some ties a little bit.

- Okay, is that a good thing or a bad thing?

- Time will tell I guess, I think its positive for the most part. We still have definite feelings for each other and that kind of thing. Where it leads its too early to tell really.

- Sure, understand that.

- Sir, are you... this says your a member of a celebration church, are you getting a chance to practice any of your faith or not, is that helping?

- Yeah, it helps. I need to try to be more outgoing when there, but I guess, I still gotta struggle in social situations a little bit.

- How often do you see Mr Drake.

- Once every other week.

- In a group or by yourself.

- By myself.

- And do you like working with him or not.

- Yeah, actually I do.

- Okay.

- He kinda gives me an outlet, somebody to talk to that, I mean talk to my wife but certain things you don't want to talk to your wife about. I talk to my parents, certain things you don't want to talk to your parents about, he's like the one place I can go and talk about everything, and I know its kind of a safe place.

- Okay.

- Excuse me, is there a waiver as far as discussing mental health treatment?

- Yeah I asked him.

- Okay.

- Yep.

- Are you involved with any other counseling or group activities or anything like that?

- I've been going to NA.

- Okay.

- Once a week?

- Yeah.

- Okay. Any other questions for him?

- Have you gotten in any other trouble that we don't know about?

- No.

- Okay, anybody wana make a motion?

- Motion to approve the application, address specific.

- 1115 Cherry Street?
- Yes.
- Is there a second.
- I'll second.
- Motion passes three to one.
- Okay sir, you've been approved to 1115 Cherry Street, address specific, if you do move you have to come back in front of us if you move within the city limits of Green Bay. We'll send that over to that location.
- Alright, thank you guys.
- Yep.
- Have a good day.
- Next up is Mr Klein. Bringing your stuff here, just give me a sec. Okay, so we're back here after the 120 days, so how have things been going?
- Fairly good.
- Fairly good?
- Yeah.
- Still employed?
- No I'm not.
- Okay, what happened?
- I injured myself, I had to go to have neck surgery.
- Okay.
- So, during this time, I'm trying to take this time to go to school.
- So where do you go to school?
- NWTC.
- For what may I ask?
- Graphic design.
- Okay, how long you been enrolled?
- I haven't, I just enrolling for the summer classes.

- Okay, so a quick question for you, since you were injured how have you been able to to pay for your, you know, where you're living.
- I help my neighbor, swept all her driveway out,
- Okay.
- It brings in a little bit, not a whole lot, its on my girlfriend.
- Okay. And do you know how long you're guna be be laid up where you can't work?
- I gotta start my physical therapy, I just had surgery not that long ago.
- Okay.
- So I start physical therapy, which is, I believe is Friday I have and appointment .
- Alright.
- to start physical therapy through that. As far as me going out to try and find a job or something, I don't know if that's guna be something I'm guna be able to do. If not I'm guna have to try and get on SSI or something.
- Okay. Does anybody else have anymore questions for him with regards to his status? Usually, when we do 120 days we say what you need to bring back.
- Right, that's what I have on here. Let me, I'm checking for it, let me see.
- [Mae Cornelius] Can I come up and say something?
- Hang on a second. Mr Klein if you want to talk about your treatment program, can we do that in public or private session, which would you prefer?
- Public.
- So are you doing any treatment programs right now?
- No.
- Okay.
- I finished my treatment back in 2005.
- Okay. Okay. Does anybody else have any other question for him, before I ask for, the lady to come on up. Okay mam, would you like to come on up. I just need your name and address please. You can sit right here.
- My name is Mae Cornelius, M-A-E C-O-R-N-E-L-I-U-S. I'm at 2420 Oakland Drive.
- Okay, go ahead.
- The last meeting you had said it was for 120 days just to see how things were going and to verify that it would still be the same that my feelings would be the same about the situation as well as his There has not been any change, he continues to be an asset in the household, helping me with regular household things. I

can't do everything, he continues to help with everything, laundry, shoveling, I've never shoveled my driveway, and it's been one heck of a year.

- Yeah.

- Yeah.

- So, how's been his attitude and emotional state?

- It's been okay, we have had some setbacks, with the move, with him changing Venues, with him changing probation officers, there has been a lot of changes with her rules, she has not been as friendly as the previous one, I would say. She has taken away some of his liberties that he had prior to that and it has been frustrating.

- What can I ask?

- Going to festivals, to go grocery shopping, because there is a childcare place in there, and my understanding was, that with his charge, he would still be able to perform these types of things, and under his last probation officer he was able to do a number of things and the new probation officer does not allow those same things. But besides that, that's been the only thing. He gets frustrated that he can't work, that's being in that situation.

- Any issues with straight up anger.

- No.

- Okay, any other questions for him? Okay, I'm gonna make a motion to approve Mr Klein, at 2420 Oakwood Drive, for another 120 days, at which time I would like to see him back in to see how things are going again from an emotional standpoint. See if he's able to get through his issues with his neck, and see if he is actually enrolled in school, and started that process. Is there a second to that motion?

- I'll second that motion.

- Motion passes three to one.

- Okay sir, you've been approved for another 120 days, when you come back we definitely want to see, how things are continuing to go, from an anger management standpoint see if you're able to get reemployed, if not, if you're going to go to school we'd have to see your application that you've been accepted to go to NWTC, okay?

- Yeah.

- Alright, thank you. Mr Schultz?

- Hi.

- Just reading your notes here, just give us a second. Okay, I'm looking at the last notes here, and it didn't say we asked him back.

- Well, isn't it too be absent?

- I think this is...

- Oh A different application, okay I apologize. Does anybody want to re-review his case? Okay, if not, I guess the question is, is why you looking to move?

- Well, me and my girlfriend kinda broke up.
- Okay.
- And it's her apartment.
- Okay.
- Which is why I'm living where I am right now. Also, in the process of me and her breaking up I got put on a ATR at Racine correctional institution.
- I'm sorry I can't hear you.
- I got put on an ATR at Racine correctional institution, for violations of my probation.
- What were the violations?
- I had internet access, having my daughters and spending time without a proper chaperone, me and my girlfriend at the time we stayed in places like the Tundra Lodge, different hotels like that, where they had parks for..
- Kids.
- Kids, so that's a violation of my probation.
- How long were you revoked for?
- I did a 72 day section.
- And when was this?
- From May, beginning of May, until I got released on September 5th.
- Of this year?
- Of 2018, correct.
- Okay, I'm sorry, yes 2018.
- So when did you move to Monroe?
- About two months ago 'cause my time I was staying at the TLP when I got released, and my time lapsed at the TLP and my probation officer told me to move to a hotel and two weeks into me staying there my PO comes to me and tells me that I was just informed that even though its a hotel you still have to put in the paperwork for it, even tho its a temporary basis, I didn't have anywhere to go state didn't have to get in there
- Are you employed sir?
- Yes I am.
- Where are you employed?

- I work through Personnel Connections, and they have me working at RGL logistics and I've been there since October.

- Why did you break again all the rules?

- I just got too relaxed, with the... I have a new probation officer now, my old PO gave me some leniency with the internet, which was really good because my girlfriend at the time was on seizure so he gave me permission to look up any pill doctor was prescribing to her to see what the side effects were, and I just took that there as it was okay he gave me permission to do this here, So I went out and bought an Xbox One, I had internet access with that there, and I was watching movies, porn, the good thing, the problem with my daughter is, I hardly get to spend much time with her, so any time I got with her, whether it was me by myself, or with a chaperone I took advantage of it. So I could gradually see my daughter. The hotel things was just, was just one thing that we did, just to get out of the house, spending some time to ourselves away from my girlfriends house.

- Okay, anymore questions for him? Does anybody want to speak for or against him? Sir do you want to come on up. Can I just have your name and address.

- My name is Roy Deruiter, my address is 1079 Butternut lane.

- Okay. I'm at Circles of Support and he comes intermittently, I gotta say that you know, I saw a change see he started coming, I haven't seen him in a little bit but, I still recognize a change as a kind of a calm down. You know, I'm no doctor or anything, I'm just going by what I observe, he was a lot more stressed when he first came in, in the group he was attending consistently for you know, I'd say about a month or so. And now its like intermittently.

- Okay.

- So.

- OK, thank you very much.

- Okay, does anybody have anymore questions for him?

- I do, why have you not been attending Circles of Support consistently?

- A lot has to do with my work schedule, and a lot has to do with the weather we've been having, because I don't have my own vehicle. So I rely alot on public transportation or walking. And a lot lately its either been too cold or like snowing.

- Why didn't you notify them?

- I don't have any of their numbers to notify them. I did, when I spoke with my probation officer, I let her know that and I just assumed she would relay the messages to Roy.

- Do you have a telephone?

- I do.

- Did you ask your probation officer for their information, so you could contact Circles of Support.

- No, I did not.

- Okay, does anybody want to make a motion?
- Also, can I just say...
- Oh sure, go ahead.
- I also am doing aftercare every Monday, at I guess it would be ATTIC up here. And that's supposed to be for only 20 weeks. I will probably keep attending that until.
- Do you have any documentation that you are attending?
- She said she was going to give me a letter, it just have slipped her mind to write the letter for me.
- Okay, and my question is, why didn't you ask her for the letter.
- I did, but she had things going on with other clients as well that she was taking care of at the same time.
- But you're the one who needs the letter.
- Correct.
- And its like with Circles of Support, you're the one who needs to stay in contact with them, so you can go and be with them. What my concern is, you don't take initiative, to do these things, do you see what I'm saying?
- Okay.
- Alright, anybody want to make a motion? With regards to Mr Schultz.
- I'm guna make a motion to deny Mr Schultz, to 119 North Monroe, is there a second?
- Second.
- So, so if you're saying yes, means you're denying him. Just so we vote correctly. If you say no that means you're against that motion. I just wana make sure we understand how to vote.
- Motion to deny passes unanimously.
- Okay, so you been denied to move to 119 North Monroe. It doesn't mean you can't come back at a future time, to have a look at another location. I think the big thing here, to be honest with you, is that you had a good thing going and you made choices to, that allowed you to get revoked, in terms of breaking the rules, and in terms of, when you got back out, there was certain things you need to get back into a correct state whether it's through Circles of Support, or through, you know, Aftercare, and you know, right now, at least for me, I didn't see that at this particular point, so, right thank you for your time. Next up is Mr Kohel.
- Okay. So you're looking to move to 1315 North Walnut correct?
- Correct.
- Alright, and last time your were at 1730 Badger Street, correct?
- Correct.

- Why you looking to move?
- Mainly because, I've got a lot going for me right now with the positives.
- Good.
- I moved in with my sister, after my release I was at the ATTIC, and then I moved in with her and then she is a caregiver, for a disabled veteran
- Okay.
- and he had suggested that she move out with him in Fond du Lac.
- Okay.
- So, I had to spoken to my landlord and asked about me taking over the lease and I explained my situation to him, my offense to him and he was okay with it.
- Okay.
- He said as long as we don't have any problems. And I said okay, but since, I've been there two years now. Once with my sister, one year with my sister, and then a year by myself, and I've had no incidences. I've been living here...I got a sponsor through NA, his names Chris, I talk to him regularly.
- Okay.
- I completed IOP with KDN Options. I obtained full-time employment at Services Plus. My full-time benefits are eligible in April. I'm attending Pro Social Companions Group, also with the Options program.
- Okay.
- I'm enrolled in UN monitoring. I meet with an individual counselor once a week. And I have a budget, I obtained a checking and savings account, and my...
- So...
- Oh excuse me.
- No, go ahead, I'm sorry.
- My counslers are both helping me with past trauma as well as my emotional state now. Just to make sure I still on track.
- Okay, it looks like he had some issues in 2014/15, why don't you tell me a little about what happened there.
- 2014/15.
- Identity theft.
- So it looks like your were convicted
- Identity theft.

- of identity theft.
- Okay, I was living with my nephew at the time, and he was getting ready to go move with his mother up on the Stockbridge Reservation, so I was about to be homeless, and I made a bad decision and cashed some cheques.
- Okay, but you just told me before that your were living on 1530 Badger Street the whole time until this point or when you got back you were living with your sister, but then you were actually living with your nephew for a while.
- That was after I had gotten on for the cheques.
- You moved in with your sister after the cheques?
- Yes.
- Okay.
- At what street address was that, with your sister, Badger?
- No, that was my nephews place.
- Okay, and what was the address what is the address for your sister? Where you were living for that period of time.
- Walnut street, 1315.
- 1315?
- Yes.
- Okay, and how long have you been at that address?
- Two years.
- From what time to what time? Can you just give a rough year year?
- From 16 until now.
- Okay, so you never came back to ask to move to Walnut Street?
- No, that situation was temporary and then I talked to the landlord and he approved it, so I was going to come back in and get you guys approval.
- But you lived there for two years.
- Correct.
- That's not temporary. Okay. Where are you employed again right now?
- Services Plus, full time. So, I guess what's running through my mind is, you've spent, after you were convicted of identity theft, okay, and you came back here, and you're living on Walnut Street right? Okay, for two years,

and now you want to move to this location. So, I guess my first question is, why are you here today? Because you lived some place for two years without coming in front of us, so why are you choosing to come now?

- If I may?

- Go on.

- Its just for clarification purposes. You were living with your sister at your current address, correct?

- Yes.

- And your landlord agreed to put the lease now in your name?

- Correct.

- Okay, when was the lease first put into your name?

- A year ago.

- A year ago, okay, so what's caused you to come before the board now after residing at this address for a year?

- Just the fact, I got good things going for me and I don't wana lose any kind of support, or how would I say it, positive things that I have had happen in my life right now.

- So are you still on paper?

- Yes I am.

- Sure it wasn't that your PO found out you were living here without coming in front of the board?

- No.

- that brought you here? See I got some unknowns here.

- Me too

- You know from a standpoint of, you've been honest, in regards to, you forged cheques, and then you came back to Green Bay, and you're living on Walnut. Okay, so you're here, I get that, okay, but I'm struggling with why you're really here, I'm struggling with you're explanation.

- Okay.

- So.

- I'm here because I want the boards approval to live at this residence because it is in the City of Green Bay.

- I understand that, I understand that, but I'm just trying to understand, You'd be way a very rare person, after living some place illegally and to come in front of the board and say now I want to live here legally. So, without somebody pushing you in that direction, whether its the parole officer, whether its the landlord saying you, hey you got to get approval before I can sign the lease for you. Again, I'm just trying to get to the the truth, I'm not judging you at this point for that fact you lived there prior to coming before board. I'm just trying to

understand what truly brought you here today. If it was just you, and that's what you're saying, You're pretty big rarity.

- Okay.

- Okay, so.

- It is, now you put it like that, it is my probation's supervisor that's pushing for your approval.

- Okay, again I'm just trying to get to what brought you here today.

- Correct.

- How long you on paper for yet?

- Three years.

- Three more years?

- Yes.

- Okay.

- And I also have some group completions.

- I don't think, unless anybody wants to see that? I mean it was proven last time he was here.

- Right, it's okay.

- Heres where I'm at everybody, in going forward with this. So, I would like to see some documentation from his parole officer that, that parole officer actually sent him here, and I would also like some proof of employment. To ensure you actually are employed.

- Okay.

- Because, I wana make sure that, one, Alana did said him here, two, that he is actually employed. So, we can try to get some truth to this, so he just handed to me some drug testing, he went through drug testing for his employment it looks like. Let's try to find a date here. Three six, Three Six.

- While he's looking at that, where did you live before Walnut Street?

- I was in the ATTIC.

- And that was three years ago?

- Yes.

- So, I would still like to, I mean he shows that, as of March the 6th he went for a drug test. But you know, I would like to bring him back and give him conditional approval for 30 days, and see those two pieces of information to prove that he is telling the truth.

- [Amber Teele] Can I speak? Let me just finish, I just want to get some thoughts, if people think that's a good idea, a bad idea?

- Do you think the parole office will do that?
- Well if he wants him to live here he would.
- That's true.
- If they don't that's between him and the parole officer.
- Some are touchy about that.
- I'm just saying, I want proof the parole officer told him to come here, that's all I'm saying.
- What's is...
- Go on.
- I'm just putting it... He admitted that it was the supervisor who wanted him to come, he admitted that wasn't just his idea.
- It started off just his idea.
- Right, but what I'm saying is, he admitted it.
- Right.
- And before, that it wasn't his idea, the fact he is here now, I don't see why it would be relevant to have documentation that it was the parole agent, or supervisor who told him to come. I just don't see the relevance in it, the fact is, he is here now, he admitted that he wasn't telling the full truth before us. So, I just don't see the relevance in that request. And, we know that parole probation they won't sign these documents.
- Well, all I am asking, again, I understand where you're coming from, what's relevant, my thought from a relevant standpoint is, I'm trying to make sure he's following up on this because in the beginning he didn't tell us the truth. So, I could say either yes okay, after me questioning him further, we got the truth, but the question is do we have the whole truth? I don't know. And so when someone lies to me, you know, I start to second guess everything, so, you know, on the other hand what really annoys me is obviously this landlord who knew he was a sex offender, and obviously let him stay there without getting approval, that's one thing, that's the landlords issue, not his issue. Obviously.
- I mean quite honestly, we didn't know what the landlord knew, what the person knew, or when they knew it.
- That's right, you're right, you're 100% correct.
- So, we have a documentation now, and what it comes down to, the only thing that would be relevant to me is proof of your employment.
- Is it a big deal if I still ask for it? From the parole officer.
- I mean that's up to you.
- Okay, right.

- I hear what you're saying, I too don't know what the relevance is until you say you want to verify that now. This second story is in fact the truth. Why didn't you just say it right up front?

- I'm nervous, I'm just nervous, I don't know, I have been up in front of this board before, You know, and every time its just, I just get...

- The last time you were approved.

- And I noticed you had everything written down, you were going verbatim, why did you write everything down?

- Its just better for me to write things down, so I can keep track of everything, this planner is very

- Okay.

- helpful to me.

- Okay, but you wrote it down and it looked like you have a narrative so you have everything written down, what was the purpose of writing it down, were you going to give it to us or were you just going to rely on it?

- I was relying on it actually because I don't want to come into this board unprepared. So, I wrote stuff, notes down, so that when questions were asked I would have at least somewhat of an idea.

- Okay. I mean again I would.

- Its not guna hurt.

- Its not guna hurt anything.

- Its not guna hurt no.

- If it makes you feel more comfortable that way, we've got verification that second time too we got the right story.

- Oh before you make a motion can she speak?

- Oh definitely, I was just going to say if there's anymore questions.

- Okay, why don't come on up mam. Just have your name address please.

- Yes, my name is Amber Teele, 424 South Meadow Avenue, Suite 210.

- Okay, go ahead.

- Can you spell your last name.

- T-E-E-L-E.

- Thank you.

- So, I am one of his counselors over at Options, we have been working together at this point, probably since September or October, I am mostly the one who did your follow up assessment, to come back into services. And not only did he complete our Intensive Outpatient Services he also completed aftercare. He is currently

in my pro social group and I am the one doing UN monitoring with him, and I have seen nothing but positive changes in Tony since he's been in options. He comes consistently to appointments, he calls for clarification on things that he has questions on, he calls to verify appointments, the writing stuff down was actually an exercise that we did together

- Okay.

- so that, really feeling fully prepared because we are working on a lot of trauma things that have been happening, so a part of that has come up as, some very high anxiety, I hope you don't mind me saying that,

- No, no.

- So, just high anxiety in different situations, but I can also confirm in meetings, that I have had with him and his probation officer together, the three of us meeting together, that you've talked about, and she's talked about, his current employment, he talks about it a lot, he talks about very often how proud he is of his employment, I have seen his badge for his employment on almost every appointment that we've attended. And I'm truly very proud of the positive changes that I've seen. We haven't had any issues across the board at Options with him in treatment. And he has been there for a while. IOP is not an easy thing to complete. Aftercare is not an easy thing to complete, because of the time frame that it can take. So I just think that is very commendable for him.

- Alright.

- Can you address any, or enlighten us at all, about his living situation and the address?

- I can confirm that that's the address he's at right now. I've been there on home visits.

- And, do you have any information, in conversation with the probation or parole agent about coming before the board to...

- The only conversation that we had had was on February 14th where we had talked about that this board meeting was coming up he had received notification of it, and just kind of, okay, what are our next steps as far as being our support for you. So that's the information that I have.

- Thank you.

- Okay, appreciate it thank you.

- You're welcome.

- Okay, I would like to make a motion for Mr Kohel, address specific to allow him to move to 1315, is that?

- East Walnut.

- East Walnut I'm sorry, East Walnut Street. For a term of 30 days in which after he would come back, and give us proof of employment for this last 30 days, and that he has some sort of letter from his parole officer that he was asked to come here to get into compliance with the cities ordinance. Is there a second?

- I'll second it.

- Motion passes unanimously.

- Okay, so Mr Kohel you've been approved to stay at 1315 East Walnut Street, you're gonna have to come back to our next meeting and provide those two pieces of documentation, okay?

- Okay, same time every?
- Four o'clock yeah.
- Thank you.
- Second Wednesday of every month and you'll get notice of that.
- I'll come back, okay thank you.
- Mr Stewart?
- Hello.
- Hello.
- Hi.
- Okay, before we get started, we asked you back specifically to talk about your medical programs, you have the right to do it in public or private sessions.
- Public.
- Okay, right why don't you give us an update.
- Well, I tried scheduling three appointments for Dr Tan in a row but they only let me schedule one, so this is my next appointment with Dr Tan.
- Okay.
- Then I asked to get a referral for counseling from Dr Tan but he doesn't do that so I had go to Bellin Health, to see a physician and he referred me to a psychiatrist and a therapist.
- Okay. I go to the therapist weekly up from the old line its only like three months. I had one meeting with the other psychiatrist, he's doing, he's testing, he's doing psychiatric testing on me, I have another appointment next month for more testing, and he said he might want to do an IQ test on me as well. But I've made every single therapy meeting,
- What do you think about it?
- Its great.
- Is it? The therapist is super nice, and he has given me a lot of knowledge about my own disorders, he's actually borrowed me a book about schizophrenia, so I have been reading that, its pretty interesting,
- So are you feeling, I guess, less alone?
- Yeah. I feel like I have someone I can tell everything to, you know, about like hallucinations starting from when I was a child, you know, until now, and all the paranoias I have, Well, that's what we are working on right now, is paranoia. Then we're guna work on like self hate issues, and some of the other issues, right now we're working on paranoia, its real nice to have that hour every week just to tell him about things that have been bothering me for my entire life. Its, I like it.

- Good, have you, from a standpoint, that has translated into, when you're with other people that you're a little bit more comfortable?

- Yeah, for sure.

- Good.

- Because with them I know I have the knowledge that I can explain, you know, what is going on in my head, because people with schizophrenic disorders, mine is schizoaffective which is a depressive type, which is pretty bad, but I can understand now like why they think what I say is completely weird because people without this disorder, they think different to people with this disorder. Logic with my disorder, makes no sense to people without the disorder. So, now I can explain that to people, and they are a lot more understanding.

- Good, anybody else have any more questions for him?

- The last time you were here your medication was soon to be

- Yeah.

- How's that going, how you keeping...

- Yeah.

- Have you got any rules on your prescriptions.

- Yes I do, I actually called the Brown County Mental Health yesterday to see if I could get a prescription change off Risperdal, because Risperdal is making me sleep, when I don't wana sleep, Ill sleep three times a day, and then go to sleep in the evening, I just can't stop myself form sleeping when I'm on it. So, I talked to his assistant yesterday, he hasn't gotten back to me yet, I have to talk to his assistant and his assistant relays the information to him and he gives it back to his assistant who give it to me so. My prescriptions get renewed every time I see Dr Tan, so.

- Are you on meds besides Risperdal?

- I'm on, ketoconazol shampoo, which is a topical one obviously, that's pretty much it.

- And what about working, are you working right now Payton?

- I actually had a, I'm working with Curative as a job developer I finally got, you know, the guy from the DVR finally got all my information over to Curative so I actually met with him today at one o'clock, and we're working on my finishing my resume and cover letter than after that we are going to do interview skills and then start applying to jobs, I meeting with him again next week on Wednesday, its going to be a weekly thing.

- So where do you stay mostly?

- Mostly at 2713 Humboldt Road, number 5, but then I've been going over to my friend Tyler's house, my friend Joe's house, and my friend Tyler's mothers house.

- And that's where your father lives on Humboldt.

- Yes.

- Okay, any more questions for him? Okay, I'd like to make a motion to approve him, address specific to 2713 Humboldt Street, Humboldt Road.
- Dean I think there was someone who wanted to speak for him.
- Oh.
- Go ahead.
- Sure come on up. Thanks for...I gone put my head down. My name is Roy Deruiter, address 1079 Butternut Lane.
- Okay, thank you.
- He consistently comes to Circles, just from my observations see a lot of improvement, settling down, he contributes, helps other people, from his knowledge of what he knows, you know like, where to get help, where to get help from, you know, he's a good part of the group.
- Good, I'm seeing a change in you as well, I mean I think this time more than anytime I've seen you, a little bit more assertive, more confident in yourself, that's things are going better for ya, you're getting more into, you know, socially back into, you know, life for yourself and your medications has really kinda stabilized ya, and then so I'm feeling pretty good, personally, about the change I've seen in you.
- Thank you.
- And Peyton I've know you a long time.
- Yeah.
- This is the most affect I've ever seen in you.
- Yeah.
- I'm impressed.
- I'm slowly learning how to not have a flat out affect.
- So, its an everyday thing its guna have to be for ya. I think us asking you to see a psychologist, hopefully that has really helped ya.
- Yeah, and its give me confidence.
- Give you some more confidence. So, again id like to make motion to allow him to stay permanently at 2713 Humboldt Road apartment number 5, address specific, is there second?
- Second.
- I think its 15.
- 15?
- Okay, sorry that was a typo.

- 2715?
- 2713.
- Apartment 5.
- Oh apartment 5, okay.
- Sorry, its my fault.
- Okay. Address specific, is there a second?
- Seconded.
- Motion passes unanimously.
- Great, congratulations.
- Say hi to your dad, and McKenzie and Joy for me, when you see them next time.
- Yeah.
- McKenzie actually lives in Seattle now.
- She does?
- Yeah.
- Okay.
- But I will say hi to all three.
- Okay.
- Mr Bishop?
- Sir, you're currently living at Van Buren right? 118 South?
- Yeah.
- Van Buren.
- And how long have you been living there?
- Since I originally got off my sanction in October.
- Okay.
- Why are you coming to us now?
- I've been going in and out of PO's and I got the paperwork done from the landlord, and finally brought it over.

- What were your last PO holds for?
- Me and my daughter mum been conflicting and she called them and told them and that was the evidence that got me locked up.
- Okay, I'm just check a little bit more information. If somebody else has more questions they can go on ahead.
- A lot of your criminal activity has been like within, the last two years, 2017 in particular, right?
- Yes.
- So what was going on that that was such a rough year?
- To be honest it wasn't really a rough year. I made a decision 'cause my daughters mom came to me, and she was stressing about the money situation, and when a proposition came to me, I took it.
- Are you working now?
- Yes.
- Where are you working?
- I work for US Tech Force.
- What do you do for em.
- Pallets, I make pallets over at the pier.
- Okay, how long have you had the job?
- Just got it two weeks ago.
- Sorry.
- And are you going to be living by yourself at that address?
- No, I'm actually staying with my mum.
- Okay, and that's mums address?
- Yes that's my mums address.
- Oh okay, got it.
- She couldn't come because her husband had surgery on his knee and she taking care of him at the moment.
- Okay.
- How come you don't list that on your PO form? You don't, where it says "who do you plan to live with" you have it blank.
- I still wrote it on there as my mums address, I just wrote a different date.

- No, its says "who do you plan to live with". You say you're living with your mum?
- Yeah.
- But on the PO form we ask age relationship of those you plan to live with and you left that blank. You didn't put your mum down.
- Yeah, I really don't know how to fill that out to be honest.
- Okay.
- That's why I messed up with my last board meeting, because I filled out all the paperwork and didn't send the other part to the landlord.
- Did someone help you fill this form out,
- My PO ring me, she explained me how to do it, and we ended up getting in contact with the landlord and he came and we filled out this part, I filled out my part and brought it straight down.
- Okay.
- Anyone have anymore questions for him? Anybody would like to speak either for or against him? Mam, come on up. Can I have your name and address please.
- Cassandra Harris, 1857 Western Avenue, Green Bay, Wisconsin.
- Go ahead mam.
- This is my nephew, I've known him for his entire life, he's like my second baby, and with my daughter there's like five six months apart to the day.
- Five months.
- Five months apart to the day. It's unfortunate, the situation that leads him to have to see you guys. I wish it wouldn't have never happened, I've seen a lot of changes within my nephew, I've actually been one of his bigger supporters, he calls me his mom, although I'm his aunt.
- Yeah.
- Job interviews, like basically anywhere he needs to go, I take him, shopping, whatever.
- How's he going to do living alone?
- Excuse me?
- How is he going to do living with his mum do you think?
- Oh they get along just fine, its just that, with my sister. Okay, my sister has foot surgery now, well foot issues, so, walking around is really like hard for her, she had like some rods put in and then they had to take them out because it was messed up. They get along really well, there's a lot of times that she couldn't make it to the school meetings and stuff like that, I would be the one stepping in going parents teachers conference because she has two other children, and the age groups that they are in, if she couldn't, if they have like a meeting for one or the other child, she wouldn't be able to go, so I would step in.

- Okay.
- Yeah, but they get along just fine.
- Okay, any other questions for her?
- No I don't have anything.
- Okay. Well I think one of the big things for me, to be honest with you is that I think, Mr Bishop, that you know that, in terms of not re-offending, I think its important to have a good home life. It's important to have a job that you can go to and stay kinda balanced. So, I'm going to make a motion to approve you to 118 South Van Buren Street for a period of 60 days, address specific, but you have to comeback to us and prove that you have consistent employment over the next 60 days, to kinda make sure you're on the right track or stay on the right track.
- Quick question sorry.
- Go ahead.
- I should have asked this before, are you undergoing any type of treatment right now or seeing a therapist or anything?
- A therapist me and my PO had just set-up. Because my last PO, I got really frustrated because the allegations that was brought against me was so serious, and I know that I didn't do it, and I felt like it was going to take me away from my daughter. So, I was kinda getting ready to revoke myself.
- Sorry, getting ready to what?
- Revoke.
- Oh okay.
- And when she came to me and talked to me and took my statement she asked me if I needed to talk to anybody. Which me and Bridie we kinda pretty close her being the supervisor, I pretty much talked to her and my auntie about everything So, she asked me if I wanted to talk to anybody, and I told her yes so we have a meeting set-up to go talk to somebody.
- When is that appointment?
- That is next week.
- Okay.
- Alright so I've made a motion for 118 South Van Buren for a term of 60 days, is there a second?
- Second.
- The computer is not responding.
- How much did the city pay for this system again?
- It happens.

- I'm recovering the webpage.
- Oh. I would also be interested, I would like for you to bring in proof from your, of attendance with seeing your therapist.
- Okay.
- Okay.
- Does it have to be in here.
- I don't think it has to be on there, we would just like to see it, bring that to it.
- We're waiting for our ballots to come up on here. That's why we're sat here not saying anything.
- I just had an error on the website that's all.
- As everybody stares you down.
- Yeah.
- Its coming.
- One minute to go.
- He's a lawyer not a tech.
- Ah that's right.
- Your ballots should be up.
- There we go.
- Motion passes three to one.
- Okay sir, you've been approved to move to 118 South Van Buren Street, for a term of 60 days, at which time you have to come back and provide, for sure, documentation on continuous employment, as well, as any information that would help your case, also what she specifically asked for in terms of seeing a therapist okay.
- Yes sir.
- Alright. Last up is Mr Randy Schramke, is that right?
- Yes sir.
- Okay, looks like you're looking to move from 2625 Humboldt Road, 2621?
- Correct.
- Why do you looking to move?
- \$300 cheaper.

- Okay. When we last saw you, So, it was for 437 South Monroe Avenue, back in 2016. So, you were living at this other location which wasn't Monore, is that correct?
- Probably Shawano Avenue PLP.
- Well, this says no, 2625 Humboldt Road.
- 2625 is where I live now.
- Right, but the last time we had seen you was in 2016, was for a different address not 2625 Humboldt Road.
- Meaning that you didn't come in to get approved to reside at your current address.
- 2625 Humboldt Road is where I've been staying for the last 18 months, its a motel, a Tower Motel.
- Right, but that's within the city limits of Green Bay, you still would've needed to come in front of us. 'cause that's still within the city limits.
- That's why I'm here today, my parole officer said I had to come in front of you.
- Okay. How long you on parole for yet.
- April 2023.
- Sir, do you work?
- I'm on disability.
- Disability.
- Gulf War veteran.
- What do you do with your days sir?
- What am I doing today?
- No, what do you do with your days?
- Pretty much plan 'em around with my parole officer, Jean Delain.
- Her our relationship is a very very good one. She's more than a parole officer, she's like my psychologist, she's everything, she knows I don't have family in town here. So, our relationship has become very very close. She gives me professional advice all the time, tells me where I can go, where I cannot go. And I really need that in my life, somebody to talk to,
- Okay. Is there any other questions for him?
- Back in, let me see, when we would have saw you, 2015 you were going to Circles of Support, do you still go to Circles of Support? Do you have anything to do with them anymore?
- Oh yes, I do, as a matter of fact, there's a gentleman through their group that picks me up, 'cause I have epilepsy, I don't drive.

- Okay, it looks like you've had no other incidences since 2000, since this original incident so, anybody what to make a motion with regards to this change of address? Anybody?
- I will move to approve, address specific,
- 2721 Humboldt Road, apartment 3?
- Thank you.
- Is there a second? I'll second it.
- Motion passes three to one.
- Okay sir, you've been approved to move to that location. It's very important that if you choose to move again, that you come in front of us prior to moving to any new location. I think the board was very generous in approving this location as you've seen before we're not too keen on people living in places that wasn't approved by the board of the city ordinance.
- I understand that sir. Last winter, for quite some time, I lived along the railroad tracks on Western Avenue, I was homeless and because I'm a sex offender, there's a lot of shelters around here would not let me in the door.
- Yep, I understand that.
- They would tell me, if you come in we'll call the Sheriff's Department. We'll give you a place to live. So, I was sleeping along the railroad tracks, on Western Avenue for quite some time, until I think I got turned in by a train engineer or conductor because I got really really cold one night, and rainy so I built a little fire, I dug a hole in the ground for this little fire, but those trains sit up so high they can see down and see the little fire, because it wasn't more than 30 minutes after that, the Sheriff's Department came with the Fire Department and they moved me along.
- Okay.
- Right to the jail
- Alright, thanks for your time.
- Thank you.
- Thank you very much.
- Alright our next ...
- Will I get a notice?
- You'll get a notice sent to that location.
- Okay, can Miss Jean Delain, my PO also get a notice.
- Yeah, we copy in probation agents.
- Thank you very much.

- Alright, there's nothing else on the agenda. Our next meeting is April 10th at 4pm. Can I have a motion for adjournment.
- So moved.
- Second.
- We're never delayed on that one.
- That's always the big one.
- Hello Ed, how you feeling, alright man?
- Hey nice to see you.
- See you.
- Okay, I sent it through to vote.
- Anybody votes no, they're guna have a big problem.
- Can you take an oral 'cause I already...
- Yep.
- So did I.
- Oh my gosh.
- Are you both voting yes?
- Yes.
- Do you just wana stick around for any reason?
- Is there any way we can have more information on previous visits, its seems like some times there is and sometimes there is no setup.
