- That law department at this time is recommending non renewal on this license. There has been a number of issues that have occurred at this location. I will let him speak to those in greater detail. But there have been a number of issues with disorderly, maintaining disorderly, selling alcohol to minors, over, having intoxicated people.

- Over serving.

- Yes. And so there's just been a number of issues with this property, there's been opportunities for correction and those haven't been met well. And there have been a number of citations that have resulted on this property as well. So law cannot recommend renewal at this time.

- [Officer] The Police Department objects as well. In front of me there's just approximately 34 reports and these are just reports that we wrote paper to, not the number of calls we've been there. Over the past year, some basic things on this renewal application, it states that he hasn't been convicted of any ordinances of any county or municipality. When in fact, in June of last year, he was convicted of a disorderly house and allowing underage people on premise so he lied on his application. Last summer they had a security company and entertainment company that wasn't the best. We pulled them in, talked to them to try and work with 'em to try and solve the problem. The problem really wasn't solved so then we had a nuisance abatement meeting with the actual owners of the building to work with. Mark Oak who was leasing it, that didn't seem to solve the problem. The State ATF had to come in and cease and destroy over \$2,000 worth of liquor that was illegally purchased. It was not purchased through a distributor. I believe some of the receipts were from

Whitman's, Walmart, various other places where they weren't purchased either alcohol properly. The state did give 'em a warning for that since they cease and destroyed quite a large dollar amount of liquor. We have had problems open after hours when I used to be on night shift, one of the first nights they were open, it was 3:30 in the morning and they're still open serving. We've had numerous underage drinkers there, drug sales on premise, we've worked with other bars that have had issues and the other bars work with us and they don't have issues. We've devoted an exorbitant amount of time, resources and money trying to get El Presidente to work with them to solve all the issues. And it seems no matter what we do, it doesn't work or they aren't willing to do that. Officer Rigger here is one of the night shift officers from that district, if you have any questions, he could speak to you about all the issues that he's there, seen at night time. From what I've been told, every Friday and Saturday night, they pretty much park right downtown waiting. Because they know there's gonna be disturbances and fights. It hasn't been adjudicated but there was another huge one just this past weekend on multiple people out in the street so for all those reasons we're recommending non renewal of the license based on that we've worked with 'em. We've tried getting 'em in compliance. And it doesn't seem to work.

- And I'll pitch in now that a number of businesses on Washington Street have contacted me about this. And if they didn't speak up about, they would like to see the license non renewed. They expressed some very grave concerns and certainly wouldn't be unhappy if it wasn't non renewed. So there were a number of businesses that contacted me about this and most of 'em were very much against renewing that license. Washington Street has had its share of troubles. We've worked hard to clean it all up. And they're very concerned about slipping back into those ways, a lot of those businesses they're really proud of and happy to be where they are now. And they don't wanna regret having come downtown and now things got cleaned up and now we slide back. So that's from the businesses in the area. I'll save my comments for later if there's anyone here who cares to speak on this. No, okay, well then I certainly am not in favor of renewing that license either. So I'll make the motion to not renew.

- Okay. And there were, I'm trying to understand from staff the reason is that it was closed for year.

- It has been closed for a very long time.

- Okay.

- And the city is running out of liquor licenses. So at this point, we're just holding one in limbo.

- So to open up again, so basically they've lost the license because of the length of time.

- It's subject to replication or non renewal based on the fact that it has not been in operation.

- And I didn't know that, so.

- Yeah. So the option would be to just apply again for a new one, right, which unfortunately now comes with a price tag.

- So right now he is asking for the renewal of it. So that is what you guys are have in front of you. If it is not renewed, then yes. When he is ready to open the bar again, he would have to come back and reapply.

- [James] See, I did send the check in to pay for the license.

- Okay. What is the purpose of non renewing after a certain time? I mean, I thought after a certain time it was just gone. But it's still possible to renew after?

- [Officer] It was my interpretation that if you're not open for a certain amount, the city could go for the revoke the license and get the license back. Since we're at renewal time, I guess it's easier just to do the non renewal instead of filed a complaint to go for replication of the license since we're at this time of year that the non renewal is an easier path to take.

- Right, right. So if they didn't show up, it would just be non renewed and we would be giving it back in. But since they are here, is there any reason from past experience that we're aware of that there was an issue with this bar or anything?

- I'm not sure that there's an issue with the bar itself. It's more just having the liquor licenses attached to facilities that are not actually in operation.

- Operation, right, right and you are going to get it back in operation, that's the plan?

- Yes.

- Can you give us a time frame on that?

- [James] I'd say probably two months.

- Two months.

- So when you say you're thinking about it, how firm is that?

- [James] Well it is for sale, I have it for sale also. So I'm sure that it'll be open in two months.

- If we did renew this and it wasn't open in two months, we'd then have to go through the process of revoking it.

- Correct.

- Is there a way to approve it with a contingency?

- No, we've never been able to do it before.

- We can do that at the initial application. But at this point it's already been established.

- [James] If you want to say somethin', say somethin'.

- I'm just waiting.

- Okay.

- I don't know. If the, if we had followed procedures, you probably would've lost the license already. But you would've known that and could've appealed it. Right.

- And we've had a license since 1972 when my parents owned the bar.

- Okay.

- Quick question for James.

- Certainly.

- James, you think you'd have it open in 60 days? Would it be running in 60 days?

- Yes.

- Okay. I think he's gonna have it running. If it's gonna be going in 60 days, I would say if they've had the license that many years, I would say give him a chance, my thought.

- If your getting it up and running contingent at all on its sale?

- It's still for sale, yes.

- Right, but you'll get it up and running even if it doesn't sell?

- Correct.

- Any other questions?

- Can I just say something?

- Please state your name and address.

- Oh yeah, Sadig Huseynov, 3415 Hilltop Way, Apartment 24, Green Bay, Wisconsin, 54301. I'm his neighbor, I'm also close friend. But the reason that it was put for sale. It was health condition at that time. But he seems to be getting approved to get out. So as you can tell, he's up and running faster than me. We're hoping that because of that, he's actually considering about the fact that okay, I wanna actually keep going instead of being forced that I should sell it because of my health condition, so. And it's actually approving him to get out.

- [James] And actually the city did a nasty to me. Because they made an offer on my property. Because they wanna put the trail through there. Because it'll finish up the trail behind East High, come past me, but then when they got to the Golden House, they said they weren't gonna sell either. And we know that all the houses from my bar heading north, the city bought up all those houses already. So I don't know for what reason or for whatever but I think it's for to end the trail. Because I think when it gets to Proctor and Gamble, that would connect everything.

- Right and then they're hopin' to, well that's a whole other.

- Well they gave me a price. And then I gave them a price. And then they tucked it in, they didn't do anything.

- Okay.

- Of course. This is when Mayor Schmitt was in too.

- Right, well I mean, I don't think the city's doin' ya a nasty, the city was interested in acquiring property, made an offer, you didn't like it. And that's your option and I don't think the city's trying to, we don't have any designs to force you out or anything like that, that certainly is the not the issue here.

- Well, I knew that they were gonna tear down my building.

- Right, if they would've bought it.

- Right.

- Right.

- [James] But the land from me next to the river belongs to Darryl Gray.

- Oh. So maybe that's.

- He owns like a little patch over there like it was involved with it from years ago when WGR was there and they had their old junk store, that was part of the junk store. So when he got it from WG and R, that was all included in there. So they he put up barricades and everything else.

- Okay, well it's good to know that there are medical reasons played a role and the gap here why you weren't open and so on. Thanks for imparting that, that's good to know. Anything else from anyone? Anything else you care to add?

- No.

- Okay. Thank you very much, yup, please come up and state your name and address. Make sure you fill out that form or paper.

- [Don] I'll use the cardboard if that's okay. Don, 840.

- Such a yard boy.

- [Don] I don't come here to speak very much for people during these meetings. But I do come to all the meetings. And I've been Tavern President for a couple years now. So if I were to speak on the integrity of somebody, it'd be that man right there. I've only known him for a short time. But he's been nothing but generous and helpful to the Tavern and this community. His business has been opened for 46 years before he closed it down for health problems. If he says he's gonna have it up and running in 60 days, I totally believe that he'll do that and wants to do that so I just wanted to throw that out there that he's a good guy. And he's a guy that will get it done if he says he's gonna get it done, so thanks.

- Thank you.

- Thanks.

- Anyone else care to speak on this?

- Motion to close the floor.

- Motion to close the floor by Alder Stevens.

- So, law department has a number of concerns about this property. But none of them rise to the level of anything that would be subjected to non renewal. And so at this time we're not going to object. But I think it is important for you guys to be aware of what's going on so that if there are additional issues, those are on record so I'll let you address those but again, there's no objection at this time.

- [Officer] Confetti's is not an establishment that's open weekly or whatever. They seem to be open every 30 days. They open up periodically. The last time they opened up there was an event there where we heard there was a fight there. We were never notified of it. It was the one time they were open. It was the same entertainment company that used to be at El Presidente was over at Confetti's running an event. So we're concerned that the problem from El Presidente might make their way over to Confetti's. They did have an event scheduled where they were gonna offer tattoos, I don't know if they were gonna be free but they had an event for tattoos which would've been some serious health code violations. That same event, I believe they were gonna allow minors in the bar, they were gonna go dry until 11 o'clock and allow minors in the bar. This event didn't occur, I don't know why it got canceled but it was something that was publicized that we were aware of and that we were gonna take enforcement action. Our community police officer Shoney Carlson and Solomon Harris work that area quite a bit. They'd be able to fill you in anymore if you had anymore questions about Confetti's.

- Question.

- So at this point I guess the few things that you mentioned there, they actually didn't occur?

- [Officer] The fight did occur. These other events didn't occur. Our concern is the entertainment company that seems to advertise for 'em is one that whenever they hold an event, it always seems there's fights goin' on, drugs, overserving going on so we were concerned about that. Yes, these events didn't happen but I believe they were open two weeks ago and from what I've been told, there was a disturbance inside the bar that we were not made aware of. I realize bars have the right to do that. But we also knew the entertainment company that put on the event was one that we've had issues where they don't call us because they don't wanna lose, in my opinion, working at that bar to make money. So we're just concerned that this might escalate. So yes, it doesn't rise to the level of non renewal. It's just, we're concerned.

- Okay, so are there any violations on that property right now?

- [Officer] Do you know of any, none right now, no.

- Anybody here?

- Yeah. Is there anybody here to talk on?

- Motion to open the floor.

- Second.

- Well, I can't see him.

- I seconded so, all in favor.

- All in favor.

- Aye.

- [Man] Are we asked to sign in somewhere?

- Yup.

- And if you could state your name and your address for the record.

- [Daniel] Sure, Daniel Hakes. The address is 8720 Halfswitch Road Antigo, Wisconsin. I'm the owner of the license or the agent on it. And then I also I have a couple of people that work for me here today.

- Michael Weber, 813 Posey Court, Howard, 54313. I've worked for Dan for about 10 years at Confetti's.

- Let's get everyone in.

- [Scott] Scott Vandisten, 2410 Hampton Avenue. I currently am working with Dan.

- Okay.

- The reason we come up here is that I know a couple weeks ago Scott had met with the two officers and about three weeks ago we canceled this group, we had 'em in how many weeks, four weeks maybe.

- Three weeks.

- [Dan] And we realized that they were mischief. So we got rid of 'em, so that's why these events didn't happen, nothin's happened for the last three weeks with them, so. You have something to add, Scott?

- [Scott] With the fight, I broke it up. When I walked the guy out, there was an officer sitting out front so I assumed somebody called.

- [Dan] That was broke up within five minutes. So there was no realistic way we would've called the police and waste tax payer's money while he was breaking it up and it wasn't an all out brawl. It was a bunch of arguing but they were there in that particular case and he mentioned it to the officers that were there, so immediately when we were there, bringin' 'em outside. No reason to call them unless they were walkin' down the road and fighting so continue it on the streets.

- [Scott] But that entertainment company is no longer.

- [Dan] And they were there with us for three or four weeks. That was it, they were obviously no good.

- [Scott] We don't even want 'em around.

- Sounds like we don't either.

- [Dan] It was a lot of money but we just got rid of 'em because of the mischief. It wasn't worth even fightin' for the money. Just got 'em out of there.

- Any questions?

- And currently you're open every, is there a rhyme or reason to when you open, how you open?

- [Dan] We open for events, we open for private parties. We open for anytime somebody wants us to open. It's not a specific every Saturday night that we open or every Friday night, we've got a concert comin' up next weekend, next weekend the 9th?

- No.

- Okay. Two weekends from now but anyways, so it's just something will come up or if there's birthday parties, we stay within the rules of the ordinance. We're aware of it.

- So you're operating more of less like a private event type of.

- An event facility.

- Event, okay, yeah.

- [Dan] We're working with some couple different non profit organizations to turn it over into a theater pretty soon in the city, so. Hopefully that'll happen quick though. It just depends on how fast they work on getting it together.

- Okay.

- All right.

- Now I missed staff's report. Is there any concerns that staff brought up that they need to address with?

- [Officer] Like I said, I'll take 'em at their word that they're not gonna use the entertainment company that we have concerns about.

- Oh, it's entertainment. That was the thing, okay.

- That causes the issues.

- And we are not objected to renewal at this time. We just wanted to make the committee aware of the concerns that we've seen.

- Yup, yup. Well, I will entertain, is there anything else you care to add, I will entertain a motion to close the floor. Get that entertain, motion by Alder Stevens.

- Second.

- Second by Alder Johnson. All in favor.

- Aye.

- Floor is now closed, gentlemen.

- Motion to approve.

- Motion to approve by Alder Vander Leest.

- Second.

- Second by Alder Stevens.

- All in favor.

- Aye.

- Opposed, okay, that passes unanimously, thank you.

- Informational.

- E, informational, my favorite part, liquor violation report from the Police Department for April 29th, 2019.

- [Officer] During this time we have no citations but we did issue one written warning for a disorderly house establishment, hopefully they got the message with that.

- Okay. Don't wanna mention, that's fine.

- [Officer] Would you like to know which one? I believe it was in the packet.

- Oh okay, yup, yup, all right. Any questions? Anything else?

- No.

- Thank you very much, I'll take a motion to receive and place on file. So moved by Alder Vander Leest, seconded by Alder Stevens, all in favor.

- Aye.

- Opposed. That passes unanimously. I think we should sing some songs before we adjourn.

- Move to adjourn.

- Motion to adjourn by Alder Johnson.

- Second.

- Second by Alder Vander Leest, all in favor.

- Aye.

- Opposed, that passes unanimously, we are outta here. Thank you gentlemen, appreciate it all. Thanks Vanessa.
