- Green Bay Sexual Residency Board for July 10th, 2019. Roll call is Dean Gerondale.
- Don't we just click the button?
- Let's click the button, I guess. How we doin' that? I don't think so.
- I think he does our names and then, check twice.
- Do we have to.
- I don't see you, I've got Dean, Heidi, and Kathy all present and voting. So.
- Yeah. 'Kay, next on topic issue is approval of agenda, prior agenda. Minutes?
- I'll make a motion to approve the agenda.
- I'll second that.
- Motion carries, unanimously.
- Next up, approval of minutes. Prior month.
- I'll make a motion to approve.
- I'll second that, even though I wasn't here.
- Motion passes, unanimously.
- Okay, our first appeal is for Chester Kusiak.
- Yeah.

- Kusiak, could you up, forward, please? 'Kay, Mr. Kusiak, you're looking to, you can sit down.
- Oh.
- Looking to move to 1263 Reber Street?
- [Chester] Yes.
- Okay, and you're already living there?
- [Chester] Yes.
- How long have you lived there?
- [Chester] For about a month.
- Okay, you know you're in violation of the ordinance, right?
- [Chester] My agent put me there.
- Doesn't make a difference.
- [Chester] Doesn't make a difference? Okay.
- Doesn't make any difference.
- [Chester] Okay.
- So, just wanna let you know that.
- [Chester] Okay.
- Okay, as we go through your case, I just wanna let you know, as we talked about your offenses, if you just refer to the person as the victim, not by proper name,
- [Chester] Yeah.
- or anything like that, okay?
- [Chester] Yep.
- So, it looks like you have two separate convictions, is that correct?
- [Chester] Yes.
- Okay, was it to the same victim?
- [Chester] Different.

- Different victims.
- [Chester] Yes.
- All right, can you tell me, did you know the victims prior to victimizing them, or not?
- [Chester] I knew 'em prior.
- Okay. Tell us what happened with the first victim, the one that was age 11.
- Yes, I started with her, at eight, when she was eight, and it lasted about 3 years.
- Okay. And what'd you do to her?
- I fondled her, I came down on her, a couple times.
- 'Kay and do you know how it came to light that you were offending this girl? She tell somebody?
- [Chester] Yeah, she finally told somebody.
- Okay, how about the second victim.
- [Chester] Same household, that was her brother.
- Okay.
- [Chester] And I started with him, when he was seven, in the same three year period.
- Okay, so, what made you do this, sir?
- [Chester] Lack of being lonely. You want somethin' real bad, like some type of animal, and want is, matter what, didn't make a difference what size or age of the person.
- 'Kay.
- How many years did you actually serve?
- [Chester] First one, a year in Huber. Second was five years in prison.
- Okay, and how long have you been out?
- [Chester] Just been three months, now, I think.
- Okay, and prior to living at this location, that you're asking us to approve, where were you, before?
- [Chester] At TLP.

- Okay. I'm reading some, well, first of all, if we wanna talk about your treatment programs, we can do that, either in public or private session. Which would you prefer?

- [Chester] Uh, public.

- Public's fine?

- [Chester] Yeah.

- Can we still talk about his charges?

- Sure, go 'head.

- I just have a question. It looks like, on the second offense, you were sentenced in 2008, for five years, so that would have got you out, in about 2013, but yet, you just said you got out three months ago.

- [Chester] Yeah, I was revoked.

- And what were you revoked for?

- [Chester] For lie detector test. I lied on the 'tector test, that I was with somebody on a school bus, I mean, not a school bus, a city bus, and I can't ride a city bus, right now, because of that.

- And how long did you go back for?

- [Chester] Three years.

- Was a minor that you were on the bus with, or just on the bus?

- [Chester] It was somebody in there teens.

- And you were with them?

- [Chester] No, they were on the bus, when I got there. He was on the bus, when I got there.

- And that's all that you did.

- [Chester] I grabbed his crotch.

- So, in terms of records that we have, for him, obviously, you got the two convictions, correct?

- Yes.

- Okay, do you have this incident he just described?

- I do not.

- You do not. Where did this occur, in Green Bay?
- [Chester] Yes, it was put on, from a lie detector test. I obmitted it, after the test was done.
- But you never were charged with anything?
- [Chester] Nope, wasn't charged for it.
- And that's why we don't have it.
- Okay.
- It's probably just through the probation parole agent.
- Okay. So, that takes us through 2016, right? If he was revoked for three years?
- Well it depends on how, if you got out in 2013, at what point did you get revoked, in what year?
- [Chester] Revocated, for this last time, I got revoked for was, 15, 2015.
- So, you were out for two years and 2015, you got revoked, went back for 3 years.
- [Chester] Yes.
- That puts us to 2018, but you said you've only been out for 3 months.
- [Chester] Yeah, I've been out since January, 22nd.
- Of 2019 or '18?
- [Chester] Yeah, '19.
- That's more than three months.
- That's more than three months, yeah.
- So, you spent, essentially, ballpark 5 months, in the TLP?
- [Chester] Right.
- 'Kay, so it looks like you started to see Dr. Drake, in February.
- [Chester] Right.
- All right, are you currently employed?
- [Chester] Right, yeah, right now, I just started today.

- With who?
- Cheesecake Heaven.
- Okay, and before that you weren't working for anybody?
- [Chester] I was temp services, different temp services.
- 'Kay.
- What do you do for Cheesecake Heaven?
- [Chester] Dishes.
- Did you fill out this form, sir, yourself or your parole agent?
- No, I filled out, myself.
- Why did you not fill out the bottom part of it, where it says, are you currently incarcerated, asking for crimes and years.
- I didn't understand the question.
- I'm sorry, 'cause I came in late, did you explain about why you've been at this address, already?
- I told him that he was in violation.
- Oh, okay.
- Yep. So, anymore questions on his convictions?
- No.
- I'm looking at the information Dr. Drake provided to us and one of the things he says, "It needs to further address his treatment goals "and take full ownership of his actions, "in order to address his lifestyle change." So, tell me why you're not takin' full ownership of the actions that you had, whether it's the revocations or the original convictions.
- [Chester] I'm pretty slow at some things, but I'm, wasn't ready to give it up, yet, the control in me, wasn't ready to give it up yet. I'm gradually working on that, slowly.
- Okay.
- It also says that you want to get help, in order not to re-offend and to hurt anyone, again. Do you have a fear of that?
- Yeah, I have a fear.

- Do you have triggers?
- Yes, I have a fear.
- But, then, how are you working on that?
- I'm 'voiding situations, if I come up to a, if I know there's a park there, I usually turn around and go another direction. I've been tryin' to find different directions when I walk or ride my bike, to avoid things like that.
- How long can you not ride the city bus?
- I think, long as I'm on probation.
- Okay, and how long are you on paper 'til?
- Last time I recall it 14 years left, 'cause I restart in .
- Are you on a ankle monitor?
- [Chester] Yes.
- So, then, how do you get around town?
- Bicycle or my roommate that I'm sharing the apartment, now, Anthony Shay, takes me place, where I need to go, 'cause, usually we end up going to the same place, like shopping, or something like that.
- When you got released, in 2013, did you receive any treatment at that time?
- [Chester] Yeah, I started some, just with Jim Drake.
- And how long did you go to his sessions, during that time?
- [Chester] Was three months, three, four months. It was a waste of time.
- And then, he graduated you?
- [Chester] No, I got revoked, later on.
- Sir, are you on any medication?
- [Chester] Yes.
- What do you take?
- I take buspirone for anxiety. I take a pill, I can't recall the name of it, but it's supposed to lower my libido. I'm up to 80 grams, already, on that one.

- Is that part of the terms of your parole, that you take that medication, or not?
- Yes, yes, and we are tryin' to get to the shot. Medicine in the shot, but I've been getting turned down, by a lot of the clinics. They didn't wanna offer it, so far.
- Okay. Tell us why you're a good risk for us to take and allow you to live here, in Green Bay.
- [Chester] I'm startin' to change a little at a time. I'm working with my agent more and I'm working with Jim Drake a little more each time. When I get, hopefully, get to especially stay there, Anthony Shea's been my mentor, 'cause he's been out for eight years and I discuss things with him and I don't wanna ruin that, so I'm tryin' to follow his lead, like the time he's been out. And he has been working very 'ssesful, so far. Even my agent, is pretty good, so far. I recently seen her yesterday. She gave me a praise, that she's proud of me of what, doing so far.
- Okay.
- How many days, a week, do you work at Cheesecake Factory?
- I just started, today.
- But, what is gonna be your schedule, part-time, two days a week?
- Full-time, or,
- Oh, full-time?
- Between full-time or part-time, but be almost every day of the week, except for one day off, if I recall. But, I'm gonna learn more about it.
- Days, evenings?
- I was gonna start, it's at noon, it starts at noon. Today, I went 'til three. And my first day, they said I could clean good, caught up, with the dishes, real fast. 'Cause I'm pretty good with the dishes.
- Any other questions, for him? Anybody wanna make a motion?
- I'm gonna make a motion to deny Mr. Kusiak 1263 Reber Street, Upper, address specific.
- Is there a second?
- I'll second that.
- Any discussions? Okay.
- And again, this is a motion to deny, so a yes is to deny, a no is to vote against the motion.
- Motion to deny passes, unanimously.

- Okay, sir, you've been denied to move to 1263 Reber Street, so you're gonna have to vacate that premise, and find some place else, all right?
- [Chester] Yeah.
- Okay, thank you.
- Yeah, one more question. Is there a possibility I could try again, later on?
- Absolutely.
- [Chester] While I'm outta there?
- Absolutely.
- [Chester] Okay, thank you.
- Next up, is Randy Schramke.
- I'll make a motion to deny Mr. Schramke the 2711 Humboldt Road, number 5, address specific, due to no-show.
- I second.
- Motion to deny passes, unanimously.
- Next is Mr. Christopher Klein. Okay, looking to move to 2420 Oakwood Drive, correct?
- [Christopher] Correct.
- Okay, we are here, back to see how you are doin'. Over the last 120 days. So, why don't you give us an update?
- [Christopher] I'm currently enrolled at NWTC, for graphic design, it's a bit challenging, but I'm tryin' to struggle through it.
- Okay, how long have you been in class?
- Since May 28th, I believe.
- Okay.
- It was my first day.
- All right, and from a standpoint, are you still employed?
- [Christopher] No.

- Okay, what happened?

- [Christopher] I was injured at work. So, it's kinda hard to get a job. I had surgery, I had a C6-C7 fuse, so, now I'm tryin' to find employment at some places, and everything else, is a little bit more challenging, 'cause I gotta disclose that I had the surgery, so, some employers don't wanna, necessarily, take the risk and employ me.

- Okay, so moving to this location, how are you gonna be able to pay for the location?

- [Christopher] I live with my girlfriend.

- 'Kay. So, is the idea to find employment, yet, while you're still goin' to school, or not?

- [Christopher] Yes. I'm tryin' to look at seein' if I can't get somethin' on campus, for a bistro or somethin'. Somethin', if possible.

- At NWTC?

- [Christopher] Yes.

- I didn't know they had on-campus. I'm behind on the times, didn't know that they had on-campus. That's good.

- All right, from a standpoint of how you're doin' emotionally, tell us how it's been, over the pass 90 days, 120 days, since, obviously, you said you've been back in school, you said you're a little stressed out about that. How's everything else going?

- Everything else is going pretty good, a lot better now and everything else, that school started and everything. Before, I was feelin' a little secluded from everybody and I couldn't really, well, I'm not really able to go barely anywhere, and everything, so, it's a little more challenging, so, now that I'm in school, and everything else, I'm startin' to get back to normal. I see people, so, it's nice.

- Were you dating the same girl, last time we talked or not?

- [Christopher] Yes.

- Okay, all right. Okay, any other questions for him?

- You said that, excuse me, you're kinda stressed at school? Is it the class itself or?

- Yeah, I'm takin' Photoshop and Illustrator fundamentals and the Illustrator is an online class, so it's basically, teach yourself, and I struggle with that a little bit, so, I got a tutor, now, to try to help catch up.

- Okay.

- I reached out to all the help aides, I guess, at NWTC for student disabilities. For a tutor, checkin' out their laptop and everything.

- Okay. And you haven't been in any trouble?
- Nope. You had asked for a copy, I guess, of my medical. I had gotten this from my lawyer, for my workman's comp, and this is all my medical, that's on it.
- Okay, could I take a peak? Thank you.
- And I believe I dropped off, you requested my acceptance letter for school. I believe I dropped it off.
- Yup, we got it.
- [Christopher] But, if not, I printed off my one, from my e-mail.
- So back in September. Does anyone else wanna see this?
- Are you done with physical therapy, already?
- Yes.
- Okay, you can have it back. All right, does anyone wanna make a motion?
- No 'til the speaker.
- Oh, there's a speaker? Ma'am, why don't you come on up, just state your name and your address, for us.
- [Mae] It's Mae Cornelius.
- Okay.
- [Mae] 2420 Oakwood Drive. That's my house, I'm the girlfriend, I own the house. If you wanted any questions, I just put up the request, just in case, you had any questions for me.
- Well, I mean, how's he doin'?
- [Mae] He's doin' good, struggling in school. He has, like he said, reached out to the advisors. I work at NWTC, as well, so I try to help guiding him along, with different things. He's really changed a lot, being able to engage outside the house, instead of just with us, he's actually able to participate in conversations. I'm a very active person and I'm always playing sports and doin' different events, so he has to drop me off and hear the stories, so it is. But, he's a great helper, around the house. You can't fix, he fixes the stuff and cuts the grass, and things that I really can't do.
- Okay. All right, appreciate it, thank you.
- [Mae] Yes, thanks.
- Does anybody wanna make a motion, in regards to Mr. Klein?

- I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Klein to 2420 Oakwood Drive, address specific.
- Is there a second?
- I'll second that.
- Motion to approve passes, three to one.
- Okay, sir, you've been approved to move to that address and we'll send that information right there to that address.
- [Christopher] Okay.
- All right, thank you.
- Thank you.
- Next up is Mr. Chong Vue.
- That's for my-- Did I make a copy of this, already?
- Yeah, I didn't realize.
- I have it, it's in the packet.
- Oh, okay.
- So, you were asking for his employment, or last time, for the last 90 day, or just 'cause it was a temporary?
- I think we wanted to know that he completed treatment.
- Okay.
- Which we didn't have any documentation.
- Okay.
- The first time.
- Okay, so, how much longer do you have in treatment?
- [Chong] I'm not sure, yet. I just started with him, 'cause my current class, the Aftercare got switched over to a new provider.
- To accept into a contract.
- [Chong] Yeah.

- Okay.
- And they didn't give you a timeline. Is this a group or is it one-on-one?
- [Chong] It's a group, yeah.
- Okay, does anybody have any direct questions for him, since, it looks like we had to change in terms of. Go ahead.
- [Chong] Employed full-time, now.
- You are?
- [Chong] Yes.
- Where at? And how long you been there?
- From May 3rd, until now.
- Okay.
- Where's that?
- [Chong] It's close to the air--
- No, I mean the name of it?
- [Chong] Oh, Pioneer Meadows.
- Oh, okay.
- And how long have you been there?
- [Chong] May 3rd, well, I been there longer.
- Sorry, you did say that, May. Okay.
- Through temp agency. Oh, the first time I saw you guys.
- Okay.
- Okay, I'm gonna make a motion to approve Mr. Vue to 3191 Windland Drive, for a term of another additional 90 days, so he'll get the chance to get through a larger chunk of his class and we can get some additional background on how he's doing.
- I'll second.
- Motion to approve for 90 days passes, unanimously.

- Okay, sir, you've been approved to continue living at the current residence. The reason why we wanna ask you back is, next time, I'd like to see a little bit more detail on how your class is goin', since you switched and have a chance to not get through it, so as you go through the class, ask the provider to give you just a little more information, next time, because if things go really well, then, we'll probably make it a permanent move for ya, okay? All right, we'll send that information to that location, okay?

- [Chong] Okay, thank you.

- Next up is Mr. Wade. Okay, sir, it looks like you're here for a review, from the past 90 days. I was not here, so you guys can tell me what you're exactly looking for.

- I looked back at the minutes and it just said to come back in to check in with him, that's all it said.

- Okay.

- How are things going?

- [Kristopher] Great, my job has been going great. I've been working at Port City Bakery, for about 6 months now. I've been moved into a higher position. I do mixing, now. I work the third shift, so that takes up a lot of my week. I see a counselor and take medication for bipolar disorder. It keeps me leveled out. I've been staying with my mother, just going to work, tryin' to dig myself out of debt and took a big chunk outta that and later on this month, I should be finishing up my court obligations, so, hopefully, that'll be taken care of and I can move on into another step, in my probation period.

- So, what are your court obligations?

- [Kristopher] There were fines attached to my convictions and I wanted to clear those out, before I go up on my own. The creditors were the first to go and now it's the court obligations.

- So, are you in any class, right now, or not?

- [Kristopher] I am not enrolled, currently. I just see a therapist, because I'm on the low end of the

- Spectrum?

- criteria, yeah.

- How often do you see your therapist?

- [Kristopher] Once every three months, just to talk over how things are goin' and if the medication is effecting me, negatively or positively.

- Okay, does anybody have any more questions for him?

- I do. You said you have the next step. Next step, what is that?

- [Kristopher] Well, I plan on moving out of my mother's house, eventually, and being out on my own, again. Having to figure out where I'm going to be, 'cause I want to live somewhere close to work and I'm on the ankle monitor, so that is gonna be another obligation that I have to attend to. I guess, there's fees attached to that, so I wanna line up all my ducks before I,
- Move forward?
- [Kristopher] move forward, yeah.
- Okay. All right, any more questions for him?
- Nope, do not have any more.
- Anybody wanna make a motion point?
- I'm gonna make a motion to approve Kristopher Wade to 3117 Tobermory Drive, address specific.
- Okay, is there a second?
- I'll second that.
- Motion to approve, passes unanimously.
- Okay, sir, we'll be sending that information directly to that location and you won't need to see us, unless you move to a new location, all right?
- [Kristopher] Thank you, sir, I hope I'll be doing that in the future.
- All right, thanks. Mr. Santos? All right, thank you. So, last time you were here, we asked for some documentation relating to your class.
- [George S.] Mm hmm.
- Just take a moment to review it here. Sir, this isn't anything related to you being in a class. This is, basically, the things that you had to commit to, in terms of, when you were released.
- [George S.] Oh, because, that's what my PO gave me. Yeah
- unless I'm missing something.
- [George S.] I thought that he looked where I could go. You know, for a class or something.
- You're supposed to bring proof of enrollment, that you're attending a class.
- [George S.] He gave me that.
- I understand that, but we were very specific in saying, you said you were attending a sex offender class, right?

- [George S.] Yeah.
- And that's what we wanted, documentation that you were actually attending that class.
- No, all that is is a sex offender registry board.
- That's what I thought.
- [George S.] I can get it, I'm gonna be again, on the 16th, again.
- So, when you're going to the class, are you actually going to a class?
- [George S.] Not right now. They took me out. My PO took me out, because he said I supposed to go to a Hispanic one.
- Right, that's what we talked about last time.
- [George S.] And I told him that. Well, come back on the 16th.
- Of July, come back this month?
- [George S.] Yes, from this month.
- Your PO said that?
- [George S.] Yeah. Come and see me on the 16th. Because, I told him that I needed to have this and I needed to be registered, I mean, on a class and I told him the Mexican, whatever and he said, "Come back on the 16th, I'll let you know." Okay, so I gotta go back on the 16th, at 9:30, I mean, at 1 o'clock.
- Why did he take you out of the class?
- Because he needed to go to a Spanish one, he couldn't make sense of the English class, so they wanted to do a sex offender class that was in Spanish.
- Got it.
- [George S.] Yeah, so he told me to come back on the 16th and he would let me know where I go.
- Okay, here's my thoughts. I'm just talkin' out loud, to the board here, is that, the 17th is a week from today, right? So, I'm willin' to, if he brings in documentation here, to the city office, that he's registered in a sex offender training class, by the 17th, I think, we ought to give him 90 days to be in the class and come back, but if he says he's not registered, by the 17th, then it's would be denied. Is that reasonable? Basically, I don't wanna deny him right now, and wait another month and kick him out of his place, so long as he's registered in a class.
- I'm gonna be honest with you. I think it's going to be very difficult to find a sex offender class,

- That's what I thought.
- that's Hispanic. My thought is, he probably needs to see some kind of a therapist, that would be specializing in sex offender treatment.
- That speaks Spanish.
- Exactly, you know, like a, do you have insurance? Health insurance?
- [George S.] Yes, Medicaid.
- I think you would have more luck with that,
- And on the medication.
- than finding a class.
- So, we could make a motion, class or therapist.
- [George S.] Whatever, I go.
- Spanish treatment, or something.
- Does everyone think that's, to give him 'til the 17th, after he sees?
- I think so, I don't think he should wait, though, just in case, there probably isn't going to be a Spanish speaking class. He should be lookin' at therapists.
- I guess, my point is, his PO, if he's using his PO to help him on this, we gave him 30 days to address it, already.
- That's true.
- [George S.] Yep, I got the letter right here.
- So, I don't know how long we should give him, more to get it addressed, is my question to everybody. I'm basically saying his PO knew for 30 days, then he or she should have found him, like she said, if he can't find a class, you've gotta go to Jim Drake or somebody.
- That's true, no excuse, but I think his parole officer is the one that messed up here. I mean, they've been livin' there for a long time.
- Right, I agree with you.
- Well, yeah, but it just doesn't seem fair, that he would have to move, but.
- But, when did you see your PO?

- [George S.] Honey?
- So, if he sees the PO, he said on the 16th
- I mean, it might be a once a month thing.
- Right.
- When I met with Mr. Santos, at the municipal court, on June 18th, he said that he was meeting with his PO, the next day, which would have been June 19th.
- [Board Members] Oh.
- Can I ask why you met with him?
- For a citation for violating the sex offender, residency violation.
- Yeah, I'm gonna pay that money on August, you gave me 'til August 2nd or 17th.
- But that's why we were meeting.
- Yeah, I'm gonna pay it on August 3rd, I get my money.
- That's fine, that's not the purpose of this meeting.
- [George S.] Well, anyways.
- So, the thing about it is, back in April is when you first saw us, okay?
- 60 days.
- Yeah, so we gave him 60 days and then nothing happened, in June and here we are in July.
- [George S.] Here, he'll give you that letter.
- I just think it's going to be almost impossible, for him to meet with his PO, on the 16th, and the PO to set something up and have him provide us documentation, already, by the 17th. I just think that's impossible.
- Okay, so what would you suggest.
- I guess we could do another 30 days. First, he's gotta find a therapist or class that's gonna be Hispanic speaking, which, again, I don't think is an overwhelming amount, here in Green Bay, or Brown County, and then, if there is somebody available, to try to set up an appointment. I mean, to get into a regular therapist, sometimes, you're lookin' at months, because they're so limited.
- Yep. Is that the card of your

- PO.
- PO? Rather than guessing, should we just try to see if we can call him, real quick? See if he picks up?
- Can't hurt.
- Okay, can I have your card?
- I have a feeling he's probably gonna be done, for the day.
- Calling his cell.
- Oh, good.
- A lot of the new ones, that's all they have.
- Cells?
- Yeah.
- [George J.] Hi, you've reached George Jimenez, with probation Green Bay. I'm unable to answer the phone.
- Okay. Well, does anybody wanna make a motion here?
- Well, I think what we have to do, before I make a motion, I just wanna talk.
- Sure.
- We have to give him time to see his parole and figure out if there is anything that he can go to.
- [George S.] Yeah.
- Okay.
- And so, he's gonna see his parole officer, in the next week, so.
- So, I guess, a question for you is, I'm just kinda talkin' out loud, here. Either, one, the parole officer needs to recommend to him a place he can go for counseling or for a direct therapist and then we need documentation of that.
- But, the PO knows what he has to do.
- What he has to do, okay? So long as he provides that to us, the next day, that's doable, in terms of the parole officer saying, 'hey, I'm gonna look for him, over the next 30 days, 'either, for a direct therapist or a group, okay.' Then, let's grant him 60 days, to find somebody?
- Yeah.

- At least find somebody.
- He brings proof that he has an appointment scheduled with the therapist.
- Okay, all right.
- Sir?
- [George S.] Yes, sir.
- Before we even make this motion, I wanna keep it very, very clear and I want you to repeat it, to make sure you understand, because I know you have difficulty in understanding English. What we're looking for, after you see your parole officer, is a letter from him, stating that he's gonna look for a class for you to find or a therapist, within the next 60 days. That letter needs to be signed by him and returned to the city office, here. And we'll give you 'til the 18th, July 18th.
- [George S.] To bring it here?
- To bring the letter.
- [George S.] And I give it to who?
- You can give it to this young man or this young lady, over here, in the law office.
- He works over there by the court.
- I'm over there a couple mornings, but I have an office down on the second floor.
- You have to come here.
- To the law department.
- To the law department.
- [George S.] I don't know, where it's at. Like it's in here?
- Second floor.
- [George S.] Oh, second floor? I'll go next week.
- Okay, so, I want you to--
- Do you want me to repeat that in Spanish to him?
- Could you?
- So, that way, he'll understand a little better.

- Sure.
- 60 days?
- Yes, 60 days and we'll put him back for 60 days, so long as he brings that letter in. So, if we don't receive the letter, by the 18th, from the probation officer, then, you're gonna be asked to leave that location.
- [George S.] Okay, good.
- If we receive it, then you have 60 days to come back and tell us.
- [George S.] For another hearing.
- For another hearing.
- [George S.] Okay.
- And call us if your enrolled.
- [George S.] Excuse me, yeah, make sure to send me that notice. Right, right, you know.
- We'll send you a notice, but you need to make sure,
- [George S.] I'll bring it.
- when you talk to your patrol agent, you got two days to get that letter back here, okay? All right, understand?
- [George S.] Maybe on the 16th, he could give it to me.
- If he gives it to you on the 16th, bring it on the 16th.
- [George S.] Or I can bring it back on the next board.
- [Board Members] No.
- [George S.] No, I'll bring it, I'll bring it with me.
- July 18th, no later.
- [George S.] July 18th, I'll be here.
- Okay.
- [George S.] Or downstairs.
- Downstairs, yep.

- [George S.] I just give it to anybody?
- The law office.
- Oh, you're gonna be over there?
- Yeah, we work down in the law office.
- [George S.] I'll look for you.
- All right, so, I'm gonna make a motion to approve Mr. Santos, for an additional 60 days at 1713 Amy Street, so long as, by the 18th of July, he returns to the law office that his parole officer is searching for a class or a specific therapist for him to see, over the next 60 days. Does anyone wanna second that motion?
- I'll second that motion.
- Motion to approve, with the conditions stated, passes, three to one.
- Okay, so you have until July 18th, okay? All right.
- [George S.] Okay, thank you.
- Sir, are you Hector?
- Yes, ma'am.
- Does she understand what we're asking for, also?
- I already explained to her that before the 18th, he has to come in with a document from his lawyer, parole, showing that he had already put into some classes.
- Okay, thank you.
- We'll also reach out to the PO, just to.
- Okay.
- Oh, good.
- Thank you.
- Next up is Mr. Fish.
- Hello.
- Hi.

- Take a seat.
- Okay, Mr. Fish, we're here to do a review, over the past 90 days. I wasn't at this meeting, so I don't know what, specifically, they were looking for, the April meeting.
- [Woman] I looked back at that minutes, as well, and it's just a check-in.
- Okay. All right, so, how things goin'?
- [Ryan] Very well, actually. I'm still working with SEEK Careers and Staffing. When I was last here, I was working with Sofidel, it's a paper converting place. Our work's kind of lacked there, so SEEK moved me over to Green Bay Converting. I'm still doing that, full-time, into gear, making napkins and paper and things. I'm doin' third shift, there. I'm in AODA treatment and sex offender treatment, with Hanger. Both of those classes, I do on Tuesdays. I do those during the day and then I go and have work on third shift, on Tuesday nights. Other than that, things have been going well.
- No issues with the law or anything like that?
- [Ryan] No.
- Okay.
- Good.
- All right, is there any other questions, for him?
- I don't have any.
- Does anybody wanna make a motion, then?
- I make a motion to approve Mr. Fish, address specific, 334 South Chestnut.
- I'll second.
- Motion passes, three to one.
- Okay, sir, you've been approved to permanently stay at 334 South Chestnut Street, address specific. If you do move, you have to come back to the board, okay?
- [Ryan] Okay, thank you, very much.
- Thank you.
- [Ryan] Have a good one.
- Mr. Schultz. Okay, so it looks like you had to change classes too, is that right?
- [Robert] Yes.

- Okay. So, how many, between this new organization and the other organization, how many classes have you attended, ballpark?

- [Robert] Just in the last year, alone, 14.

- 14?

- [Robert] Yeah, because I did 12 with the other class and today was my second class at the new one.

- Okay.

- 'Cause they meet every other Wednesday.

- Is it okay if we talk about, in public, about your treatment program?

- [Robert] You sure can.

- Great. Tell me the one or two things that you've learned, so far, that are most important to you, in not re-offending.

- [Robert] Just, back when I committed my offenses, I didn't know or care about what my triggers were and, as I've gone through in group, I've started to realize that everything plays in part, 'cause, when I went and came in front of you guys, last time, I told you about the ATR, I went into, I told you the reason why I got the ATR and I didn't realize, when I was committing my parole violations, to get my ATR, that viewing porn could lead back to a cycle of me re-offending and as I took the ATR and the new class, when I got out, I told myself, hold on, this all has a familiar pattern of when I committed my offense, back then, because I was bored, lonely, just not caring. Not only am I doing this here, but I'm also seeing a private counselor, now, to help with the depression and the anxiety of when I do get bored, just havin' to get up and be sporadic and do what I can, so I learned to calm myself down, a little bit, and just take steps, not just try to be out there, doing whatever, whenever, 'cause that has not gotten me anywhere, so far.

- So, are you able to, is there anybody that you're hangin' around with, in terms of, friendships you've made or anything, just some people that you can talk to?

- [Robert] There's only two people that I rely on and I've known them for 14, 15 years, now. One is my daughter's mother, even though we're not dating, we're still the best friends, she helps me when I have a problem, I help her when she has a problem. She'll always be there for me. She might not always agree with the things that I do, but she'll always try to help me and point me in the right direction. Another one is my friend Dale Hyde. He's the one that ultimately came out to my PO and actually wrote the statement on everything that I did, that actually got me the ATR, that I got last year and, I'm not gonna lie, I was mad when I first heard that he did it, but then I actually stopped and thought about it. I'm like, you know what? He is a true friend, because he told me straight out, not gonna lie for you, not gonna cover for you, so, when I got out, me and him talked, he's like, I expected you get out and be man. I'm like, you know what? I can't be mad at you for you doin' exactly what you told me to do, so. But, yeah, I only got two friends that I talk to .

- Okay, are you still, currently employed, or not?

- [Robert] Yes, I've been workin' at RGL Logistics, since October, last year.
- Okay. Other questions, anybody may have for him. Are you on any medication?
- [Robert] No, I'm not.
- Okay, all right.
- I do, like I said, I do see a counselor for depression, but he doesn't think that I need to be put on any medication. It's really that I need someone outside, an outside source, to talk to every now and again, just get things off my mind.
- Okay. All right, if there's not anymore questions, anybody wanna make a motion?
- Can I just ask him, we denied him in March, to live at this address, is that correct?
- That's what it looks like.
- But he's been living there.
- [Robert] Since I last moved here, since I last came here, I moved to the Economy Inn, back there, back to the Village Inn.
- Just hopping around.
- [Robert] Yes, it's just been, kind of, a back and forth thing. I talked to my PO about comin' in front of you guys and, up until I got this group here, since.
- No, it says, appeal by Robert Schultz, move to 118 Monroe Avenue, oh yeah, to deny.
- Moved by board, to deny.
- Motion carried, yep.
- [Robert] Remember, I was denied, 'cause I didn't have the paperwork for the group I was going to. Any main reason you guys denied me, and you said, without me bringing the paperwork, showing that I was in group shows responsibility.
- Now, is this a month to month, there?
- [Robert] Week to week.
- Week to week.
- Yep, you pay every week there.
- Okay.

- Okay, does anybody wanna make a motion.
- I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Schultz to 119 North Monroe, room 205, address specific.
- I second.
- Motion passes, unanimously.
- Okay, sir, you've been approved to move to 119 North Monroe Ave., address specific. That will be sent there, okay?
- [Robert] All right.
- Please, stick with your treatment, I think it will continue to help you.
- [Robert] Yeah I got 'til October 30th on papers, 'cause I'm tryin' to make it last a whole month. Thank you.
- Make it a lifetime, in terms of watching what you're doing.
- [Robert] Oh, yes, definitely.
- Okay.
- [Robert] Thank you, again.
- I can't figure out how that address is 119, it's on the even side of the street. I don't know.
- I just noticed those.
- Mr. Sanchez.
- Right here.
- That makes no sense.
- There any chance we bring up the file?
- Thank you for helping us out.
- Yes.
- [Hector] You're welcome. I just saw you, right here, goin'.
- Okay, lookin' to move. 225 Berwyn Street, Berwyn Avenue, sorry.
- [Hector] Correct.

- Reason for the move?

- [Hector] Well, where I live right now, I live with my girlfriend's mother's daughter, she was here the last time I was here, to move where I am now, so now that me and her are seein' each other, for the past year, now, we thought we'd take another step and I think it's the best for me and, not only that, it's for both of us and everything seems to be just like a should be, all in it's parts, right?

- Okay.

- [Hector] So, I'd like to see if I could move with Mrs. Lee Yazi and that's about all I got to say.

- All right, anybody have any questions for him?

- [Hector] I'm still employed at the same place, American Foods, I work six days in the week, nine and a half hours, 10 hours a day. I only have Sundays off, while ago, so, other than that, that's all I wanted to see, you guys will approve to move with Mrs. Lee Yazi.

- Okay. Does anybody have any questions for him? Does anybody wanna make a motion?

- I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Sanchez, address specific, 225 Berwyn Avenue.

- I'll second that.

- Still waiting on a vote, there it is. Motion passes, unanimously.

- Congratulations, sir, keep up the good work, and good luck in your new home.

- Thank you very much, sir.

- Yep. Mr. Hickey?

- Good afternoon.

- Good afternoon.

- Are you okay?

- Oh, I've got a list of medical problems, about five pages long, I don't think of it as abnormal.

- All right, here.

- So, have we not seen you, since 2015?

- That's correct, I've been living at 1130 Meacham, I've been care-taking, for the woman there, which has been going well, although lately, it's gotten kind of untenable, because there's not a lot I can do physically, anymore and she wants to move into an assisted living facility, so it's kind of one of those things, where we have to part ways.

- Okay. So, are you able to work anymore or not, based on your condition?
- [Matthew] I've been disable for about two years. Before that, my previous job, I was head cook and assistant head bartender.
- Okay, so, how are you taking care of yourself.
- [Matthew] I have four doctors, in terms of, with all my medical conditions. That's basically a lot of meds checks with them, 'cause when you're on that many medications, they have to coordinate, to make sure there's no interactions. I try to stay inside when it's hot and humid, cold and humid, 'cause it really effects, I have fibro myalgia and two bad shoulders. Today is not fun for me.
- No, my question was more, how are you going to pay for this location?
- [Matthew] Oh, well, with my social security. I also got lucky, the reason I found this location was, my former boss, from the restaurant said, I know you've been having a hard time finding a place to live and he said, our upstairs location just came open and he said, it's yours if you want it and he quoted me a ridiculously low price, because we've known each other for 10 years.
- So, you get disability?
- [Matthew] Yes, ma'am.
- Okay, how long have you been on disability.
- [Matthew] Well, it takes a while to get it, but I've been disabled for two years. I just started getting it last year.
- So, you would have got back pay from how long it took you to apply.
- [Matthew] You get back pay, but only for a certain number, they changed the rules recently.
- Yeah, okay.
- [Matthew] You used to get full back pay and now, it's much shorter period of time.
- Mm 'kay.
- [Matthew] And, like I said, Verne, the gentleman that owns the building, he's been incredibly supportive of me moving there. My probation officer has been incredibly supportive. She Google mapped everything, she told me, "I have no problem with the location."
- It looked like, when you were here, in 2015, the person you were taking care of was your girlfriend's mother.
- [Matthew] Yes.
- Are you still?

- [Matthew] My former girlfriend.
- Okay, so you're not with her anymore.
- [Matthew] That's correct.
- Okay, is there any other questions for him?
- Have any?
- I do not.
- All right, does anybody wanna make a motion?
- I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Hickey to, address specific 1021 Lincoln Street, Green Bay, Wisconsin.
- Is there a second?
- I'll second.
- Little kitten that popped back in.
- Did it come through, for me?
- Yeah.
- Okay.
- Motion passes, three to one.
- Okay, sir, you've been approved to move to that location. We will send you a notice for that. Anything else you need?
- No, sir, thank you for your time.
- All right, thank you.
- Have a good one.
- [Woman] Do you want the notice sent to the new address?
- Yeah, that's fine, because he's, basically, ready to have me move in, as soon as I am able to find a mover.
- [Woman] Okay.
- All right, thank you for your time.

- All right, our next meeting is August 14th, at 4:00 p.m. Is there anything else, that anybody would like to talk about?
- Is it possible, it just seems like, I used to be able to, when it was all on paper, I could look back to see why we voted or what? Now, we just get this whole, they showed up and I don't know why or.
- I think at our last meeting, one of the things we talked about was, within the notes, we wanna make sure we write why they're coming back, in other words, specific, we said, hey, bring this, bring that.
- [Woman] Well, I'm putting that in the letters, to bring this, bring that, whatever we're telling them to bring.
- Which is in the packet.
- [Woman] And it will show up in the minutes.
- The letter that we send them.
- [Woman] The letter I sent them tells them, if you decided to tell them to bring documentation, it's in the letter, please bring documentation of treatment or please bring documentation of proof of employment.
- Proof of employment.
- But, I think what we're talking is.
- But, will we see in that, where it says, they showed up here April, 2019.
- [Woman] Oh.
- So, you put a quick note that says,
- What we're lookin' for.
- bring the documentation back.
- [Woman] I could put it in this, yeah.
- Just a quick half a sentence.
- Just so we have it, 'cause you can't even go back to.
- [Woman] Yeah, I can start putting that in the meeting notes.
- Yeah.
- Yeah, 'cause I don't ever read that letter you send them, I didn't know you were putting that in there.

- [Woman] Yeah, I'm putting it in the letter, because we had a couple that came back and said, well, I didn't know.
- Right, I know.
- Oh, yeah, I guess, I'm not lookin' at that, either.
- [Woman] And I had the letter that said, bring documentation, and he was sayin', no, I didn't.
- Yeah.
- [Woman] Yep, I can start adding that in,
- To the meeting notes.
- the meeting notes.
- And I apologize, I thought the meeting was at 4:30, I was coming early, to review, and I was like, ooh, we're all here.
- Can we get a motion to adjourn, so.
- Sure, I'll make a motion to adjourn.
- I second.
- Okay, can I mark all as yes?
- Yes, please.
- You must have been bored, today, because it was almost the same for everyone.
