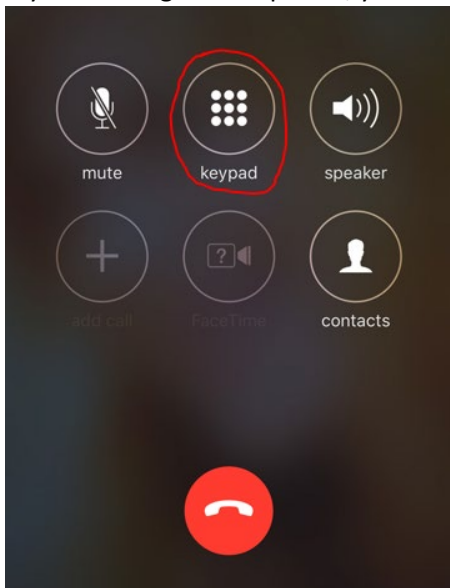

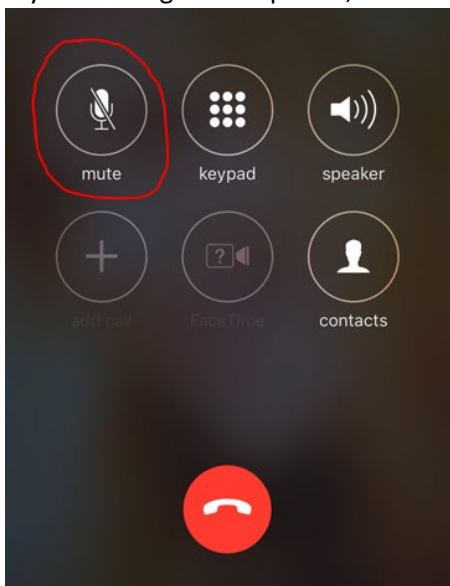
1. Wisconsin Open Meetings Law still applies
 - a. Persons interested in speaking to an item must give their name and address
 - b. Committee/Commission/Board members will still follow *Roberts Rules of Order*
2. All zoom meetings will have a password in the instructions. Please enter when prompted.
3. Please log into the Zoom meeting 10 minutes before the meeting starts to ensure proper technology is working.
 - a. If you are a Board Member, please log into [CivicClerk](#) with a computer, laptop, or tablet device.
4. Once you are in the meeting please mute yourselves.
 - a. You may unmute yourself when you are called upon to speak.
5. Waiting room
 - a. When you call in, all callers/participants will be placed in a “waiting room.”
 - b. Persons on the agenda will be admitted to the meeting, and then once the item is concluded, the host will permanently mute you from the meeting (you can still hear the meeting).
6. Using Zoom with a tablet or computer
 - a. Tablet—you will be asked to sign in. Download the app either with the Apple Store or the Play Store
 - b. Computer—you will be asked to sign in. You may download the app or click on the link to open Zoom in your browser.
7. Registering
 - a. The host may ask you to register for the meeting. A registration link will be sent to you along with the invite. You’ll receive another email confirming that you’re registered for the meeting.
 - b. If you’re using a phone, your registration will still be tied to an email.
8. Raising your hand
 - a. Committee members—you can either use CivicClerk and request to speak or you can “raise your hand” in the zoom meeting (you’d need to use a computer or tablet) to let the host know you’d like to speak. You can also un-mute yourselves and start speaking.
 - b. Persons on the agenda—you can “raise your hand” but you’d need to use a computer. You will be allowed to speak, per Wisconsin Open Meetings Rules, once the committee has “opened the floor for interested parties to speak.” Once the committee is finished with your agenda item, the host will mute you permanently, unless the committee opens the floor again.
9. What devices should I use?
 - a. Smart phone (please see more detailed instructions on page 3)
 - b. Land line
 - c. Tablet—well in advance of the meeting, please download the Zoom Meeting app before you join a meeting by using either the Apple Store or the Play Store. You will be asked to input your name, thus identifying you for the meeting. You’ll also be asked to verify your email.
 - d. Computer—well in advance of the meeting, please download the Zoom Meeting app, but you can also click on a link to open the Zoom Meeting in your browser. You will be asked to input your name, thus identifying you for the meeting.
 - e. For tablet and computer users—if you download the app you will be asked to verify your email.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 19-20

**AN ORDINANCE
CREATING SECTION 9.17,
GREEN BAY MUNICIPAL CODE,
RELATING TO RESPONSIBLE BIDDER CRITERIA**

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN BAY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 9.17, Green Bay Municipal Code, is hereby created to read:

Sec. 9.17. Responsible Bidder Criteria

- (1) *Purpose.* Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 66.0901 and 62.15, all public works contracts, including any contract for the construction, execution, repair, remodeling, or improvement of any public work or building, or for the furnishing of supplies or material of any kind, where the estimated cost of such work will exceed \$25,000, shall be let by contract to the lowest responsible bidder. What constitutes a “responsible bidder” is a determination that requires the exercise of discretion by the City and its departments, officials, and/or employees under reasonably consistent responsible bidder criteria, as provided in this ordinance.
- (2) *Definitions.*
 - (a) *Contractor.* A person, corporation, partnership, or any other business entity that performs work on a public works contract as a general contractor, prime contractor, or subcontractor at any tier.
 - (b) *Class A Registered Apprenticeship Program.* An apprenticeship program that is currently registered with either a State or federal governmental entity and that has a graduated apprentices to journeyman job classification system process as well as a bona fide training program.
 - (c) *Public Works Contract.* Any contract for the construction, execution, repair, remodeling, or improvement of any public work or building, or for the furnishing of supplies or material of any kind, where the estimated cost of such work will exceed \$25,000.
- (3) *Responsible Bidder Criteria.* In order to be considered a responsible bidder by the City for purposes of being awarded a public works contract, all of the following criteria must be met:
 - (a) The contractor must maintain a permanent place of business.

- (b) The contractor must be authorized to do business in the State of Wisconsin.
- (c) The contractor and any agent, partner, employee, and/or officer of the contractor must not be debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, or declared ineligible from contracting with any unit of federal, state, or local government.
- (d) The contractor must be in compliance with the provisions of Section 2000e of Chapter 21, Title 42 of the United States Code, and Federal Executive Order No. 11246, as amended by Executive Order No. 11375 (known as the Equal Opportunity Employer provisions).
- (e) The contractor must have adequate and appropriate:
 - 1. General liability insurance;
 - 2. Automobile insurance, except when a licensed motor vehicle is not used in the performance of the contract; and
 - 3. Workers' compensation and unemployment insurance, except when the contractor does not have employees.
- (f) For all projects undertaken within the past five (5) years in any jurisdiction in which state or federal prevailing wage laws apply, the contractor must have complied with all provisions of such laws. This provision is intended to include projects that are federally funded or otherwise subject to federal Davis-Bacon-related laws.
- (g) If determined to be appropriate in the discretion of the Director of the Department of Public Works at the time a Request for Bids or Request for Quotes is issued where the public works contract exceeds two million dollars, the contractor must participate in a Class A Registered Apprenticeship Program.
- (h) The contractor must have a written substance abuse prevention program that meets the requirements of Wis. Stat. § 103.503.
- (i) The contractor must have, and diligently maintain, a written safety program.
- (j) The employees who will perform work on the project for the contractor must be properly classified as employees or independent contractors under all applicable laws.
- (k) If the contractor has been the subject of any order or judgment from any state or federal agency or court concerning an employment practice, the contractor must provide copies of the investigation, order, or judgment for the City to

consider as a factor in determining whether the contractor is a responsible bidder. The contractor may be disqualified for failing to provide the required documentation.

- (l) The contractor's employees who will perform work on the project must be covered under a current worker's compensation policy and must be properly classified under such policy.
 - (m) The contractor must be in compliance with all laws regarding health insurance coverage for employees.
 - (n) The contractor must possess all applicable professional and trade licenses required for performing the public works contract.
 - (o) The contractor must have adequate financial resources to complete the public works contract, and to complete all other work the bidder is presently under contract to complete.
 - (p) The contractor must be bondable for the terms of the proposed public works contract.
- (4) *No restriction on discretion.* If information is discovered or comes into the possession of the City or a City department, official, and/or employee responsible for awarding the public works contract, and if such information calls into question the contractor's abilities or competence to faithfully and responsibly comply with the terms of a public works contract, and such information is considered to be both credible and verifiable, then that information shall be considered in determining whether the contractor is a responsible bidder.

SECTION 2. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect on and after its passage and publication.
