VERBATIM MINUTES

Hearing's to order for June 10th, 2020, of this Sex Offender Residency Board. Could I have everybody announce their attendance? This is Melissa Cheslock.

- Renee Keehan.

- Fay, you have to...

- Fay Boerschinger.

- Okay.

- Welcome.

- And it appears we have quorum per Ms. Maes, and the first item is approval of the minutes. Can I get a motion?

- I make a motion to approve the minutes.

- I second.

- Minute count.

- All in favor. Are we gonna do it electronically, Rachel?

- Right now I'm only seeing Renee logged in so I'll have to register the other two of you as present and voting--

- You know what, I was signed on beforehand so let me log out and re-log in, so that'll help out. We're going to be voting on the minutes, which has moved, yes, the minutes from last month by Ms. Keehan and I second it.

- So the agenda was first?

- I'm sorry, the agenda, I apologize.

- Right, here comes the vote. Just need your vote, Renee.

- It didn't come up.

- Okay.

- Oh, here it is.

- All right, motion passes unanimously.

- And next, approval of the minutes from the last meeting. If somebody would make a motion to approve the minutes.
- I'll make a motion to approve those minutes from May 13th.
- And I will second.
- Right, you should have the vote.
- I was not there so I will abstain, is that appropriate?
- That is, it'll pop up.
- That would be fine. We would still have a majority of the quorum, so. All right, motion passes.
- Okay, next, we will begin with our first appellant, who is mister, I'm sorry, let me scroll down. Yang, I believe. Is Mr. Yang on the line?
- Let me unmute him, there we go.
- [Pahoua] Yes.
- And just for the record, Madame Interpreter, could you please tell everyone what language you are interpreting?
- [Pahoua] Yes, the language is Hmong, H-M-O-N-G.
- Thank you, and your name?
- [Pahoua] Pahoua, P-A-H-O-U-A.
- Okay, and are you permitted to give your last name?
- [Pahoua] Yes, L-Y-G-H-A-O.
- Rachel, are we good on that? Okay, got it. Okay, Mr. Yang, it appears as though you are applying to move to 516 North Maple Avenue, and that's in the city of Green Bay.
- [Pahoua] Yes, that is correct.
- And paperwork, you did not give your current address. Could you please tell us what that is?
- [Pahoua] It is actually the 516 North Maple.
- Okay, and how long have you been residing at that address?
- [Pahoua] Since May 8th, I found the place, but then I needed to have the approval first.

- Okay, and it appears as though this is your first time before the board, is that correct?
- [Pahoua] Yes, this is the first time.
- Okay, now, before I begin, I wanna let you know that we will be asking you about your treatment or your underlying sex offense. Before we get into the specifics of your treatment, and this applies to everyone who is on our video. You have the right to have that discussed in public, okay?
- [Pahoua] It shouldn't be a problem.
- Okay, so you agree to speak about your treatment in public?
- [Pahoua] Yes, uh-huh.
- Is that a yes?
- [Pahoua] Yes.
- Thank you, okay, and with regards to, oh, please correct me if I'm out of order in what I'm supposed to be doing, Rachel, please. Okay, Mr. Yang, could you please tell us about the offense, the underlying sex offense? Please, do not mention the name of the victim, do not talk about your relationship to the victim. For example, please don't say my sister, my cousin, whatever, just refer to that person as a victim.
- Do you understand that, Mr. Yang?
- [Pahoua] Yes.
- Okay, thank you. Okay, so could you please describe to us your underlying sex offense?
- [Pahoua] Back in 2011, I have touched a private part of a child of 10 year old, and then I was in trouble and I was in jail.
- And when you say private parts, what do you mean?
- [Pahoua] I touched her vagina.
- Okay, and with regard to that offense, can you please tell us how law enforcement was notified that you did this?
- [Pahoua] That person went to school and was writing into a letter of some sort and the teacher saw it and then they called the police officer.
- Okay, and let's see, who was on, Lieutenant VanEgeren. I'm sorry if I mispronounced your last name. Does that seem to comport with what was in the police reports?
- [VanEgeren] Yes, that's what we have here in the report.

- Okay, and Mr. Yang, how old were you when this occurred?
- [Pahoua] At the time I was 23.
- Okay, thank you. Does anybody have any further questions about the underlying sex offense?
- I do, was this a one time offense or multiple?
- [Pahoua] Just the one time.
- Anyone else have any additional questions, Fay?
- No.
- Okay, and what was your sentence, Mr. Yang?
- [Pahoua] It was two years in prison and 10 years for supervision.
- And is that your understanding, Lieutenant?
- [VanEgeren] Yes, that's correct.
- Okay, I had a little bit of confusion. Mr. Yang, were there any violations of your probation as a result of this charge?
- [Pahoua] No, I did all the condition that required of me. It's just that when I got out, I couldn't find a place to stay.
- Okay, when were released?
- [Pahoua] March of 2019.
- You were released on the sex offense 2019?
- [Pahoua] Yes.
- Okay, but you were convicted March 2012, correct?
- [Pahoua] What do you mean? That was in the past, the previous one?
- Okay, you said that you were just released on the sex offense, the sexual assault of a child in 2019. Correct?
- [Por] Uh-huh.
- [Pahoua] And I was telling him to answer with a yes or a no and not just a uh-huh.
- Thank you so much. Okay, so was that a yes?

- [Pahoua] Yes.

- Okay. Okay, it's showing in your criminal history that we were provided that, let's see, where are we? You were also arrested on, one, two. Excuse me, two OWIs, is that correct?

- [Pahoua] Yes, that is correct.

- And were you ordered to serve any time in jail or prison because of those OWIs?

- [Pahoua] One I was not actually in jail, the other one, I did time for about six month.

- Okay, let me explain what my confusion is, Mr. Yang. If you were arrested in 2012 and ordered to spend two years in state prison, even if you did all of your time, you should have been released in 2014. Go ahead, I'm sorry.

- [Pahoua] I was arrested in 2012, but I was released, actually, in 2013, but then three years after, I had my OWI, so my release was revoked. I went back in in 2016, did two years, but then one year was because I am not naturalized, so I was in the road to go to deportation for about a year and I was just released last year.

- Thank you for that clarification. And as part of your sentence for your OWI, and it looks like you were ordered to complete AODA treatment. I'm sorry, I said that wrong. That you were supposed to submit to an AODA assessment.

- [Pahoua] Yes, that is correct.

- [Pahoua] Yes, I have an appointment coming up in June 25 at 9:00 a.m. for a treatment.

- Okay.

- Have you had no treatment since? Is this gonna be your first?

- [Pahoua] Yes, I have been in 2013 when I was released. Court ordered it, I went and there was still family services.

- [Pahoua] And after the treatment, I did get a paper and I give it and forward it to the court.

- Rachel, did we get that? I don't have it, I didn't see any treatment.

- It sounds like he said he forwarded it to the court to show that it was completed. I don't know what Deanna received.

- [Pahoua] Yes, forwarded it to court and when I talked to them I did ask them for a copy as well. Once I receive it, if you need a copy, I can forward it to you.

- Okay, so you have a copy of that completion of treatment?

- [Pahoua] I'm sorry?

- Does he have a copy, his own copy, of completing that treatment?
- [Pahoua] That's correct, I do now have it.
- Okay.
- And is this for sex offender treatment or alcohol treatment?
- Or drugs.
- Or drugs, yes.
- [Pahoua] The one that he has completed?
- Correct.
- Yes.
- [Pahoua] And that was for the sexual assault.
- Was that for sex offender treatment or was it for alcohol or drug treatment, the certificate?
- [Pahoua] It was the sex offender.
- Okay, did you complete any drug treatment or alcohol treatment?
- [Pahoua] For the alcohol, yes, I went there twice. And also that was to get my drivers license back, so I did go twice.
- Do you have proof, a certificate, that shows you completed that drug or alcohol treatment?
- [Pahoua] I did at some point, but when I took it to the DMV and give it to them, they just kept it, and then they gave me my drivers license.
- Okay, Renee, do you have any more questions?
- How long have you lived in Green Bay?
- [Pahoua] I came in Green Bay in 2005 and I've been here since then, about 15 years.
- On the packet that you filled out, you don't list any family, work, church friends or other support, what do you have as far as support?
- [Pahoua] Yes, I do have support from my dad, step mother and brother.
- Where do they live?
- [Pahoua] They also do live here in Green Bay.

- Do they live at the Maple Street address?
- [Pahoua] No, in a different address. Since this incident, I cannot live with them.
- Which incident?
- [Pahoua] Since the sex offender, sexual assault, because they still have--
- Oh, that's okay, please don't, just say because of the sexual assault, that's fine.
- [Pahoua] Okay.
- Are you working?
- [Pahoua] Yes, I am.
- Where?
- [Pahoua] I work at Tufco.
- Where is that?
- [Pahoua] It's in Green Bay but it's closer to De Pere.
- Uh, let's see.
- [Pahoua] T-U-F-C-O, that's how it's spelt.
- Texaco?
- [Pahoua] T-U-F, as in find, C-O.
- Okay. Mr. Yang, it shows in the paperwork that you have an open criminal case here in Brown County, is that accurate?
- [Pahoua] Not as far as I know, and that's the only thing that I have right now.
- Okay, in the paperwork it's showing there was a, you were arrested for criminal damage to property when you were living at 1427 Division Street, and again, this was on April 4th, 2020. Does that ring a bell?
- [Pahoua] Yes, but I thought it was already closed because I already went to court for that.
- Okay, it appears, based on the information we have, that case is not closed. I can't give you, none of us can give you legal advice, but based on the paperwork that I've read, and please, Rachel, correct me if I'm wrong, but it looks as though that case is still open.
- Melissa, are you looking at 20CM541?

- Yes.
- I do see that that's closed.
- Okay, thank you.
- [Pahoua] Okay.
- Who will you be living with on Maple Street?
- [Pahoua] I'll be living by myself. Prior to finding this place, I was living at the hotel and motel only.
- Mr. Yang, regarding your underlying sex offense, were you under the influence of alcohol or drugs? Or had you taken any before committing that offense?
- [Pahoua] No, nothing at all.
- Does anyone else have any more questions for Mr. Yang? Fay?
- Was he babysitting for this person, or what were the circumstances under which it happened?
- [Pahoua] No, we just live all in the house.
- Mr. Yang, when was the last time you attended drug treatment, drug or alcohol treatment?
- [Pahoua] It was probably around at the end of 2013, beginning of 2014.
- Okay. And when was the last time you received any treatment for this sex offense?
- [Pahoua] Towards the end of 2014, beginning of 2015, then I get in trouble, then I went to jail in 2016.
- Okay. And what was the sentence, Rachel, if you know for Mr. Yang's most recent offense for the criminal damage to property?
- For the criminal damage to property, sentence was, looks like costs, a forfeiture, and 10 days jail with Huber and good time served.
- Okay, no probation?
- Not attached to that misdemeanor, criminal damage to property, no.
- Okay, all right, anyone else have any additional questions or follow up?
- I do not.
- Renee, no.

- No.
- Fay?
- No.
- Okay, at this time, does anybody have a motion they'd like to make?
- Is there anyone wanting to speak?
- Oh, speakers, I don't see any, are there? Mr. Yang, is anyone going to speak on your behalf?
- [Pahoua] No, it's just me today.
- Okay, okay, hearing that there aren't any speakers on behalf of Mr. Yang, does anybody wish to make a motion?
- I'm gonna make a motion to deny Mr. Yang, address specific, 516 North Maple Avenue.
- What... My thoughts are, would be since he's in there already, well let me, if I may ask a question of Mr. Yang. Mr. Yang, did anybody help you complete the application to have this hearing today?
- [Pahoua] Yes, one of my brothers helped me fill out that application, and this house, how I found it was I asked my PO and he gave me that address and that landlord, and that's how I found this place.
- And just FYI for the rest of the board, there will be two other people want to also live on North Maple coming up, so they possible could be both approved today if my motion is denied.
- Okay. Okay, there's a pending motion by Ms. Keehan. Motion to deny, is there a second?
- I second.
- Motion passes.
- I haven't sent it for a vote.
- Okay, no, I mean, yes, yes, sorry.
- Fay, did the vote pop up for you?
- No.
- Do you wanna do a voice vote then? Whether you're voting to approve the motion to deny or not?
- Approve to deny.
- Okay.

- Now it just came.
- Yeah, oh, there it is, okay. Fay, you voice voted one way and you voted on the computer a different way, so the motion is to deny. Are you voting yes to deny or no to not deny?
- I'm voting yes to deny, sorry.
- Okay, I can change your vote. All right, so the motion passes two to one.
- Okay, Mr. Yang, your appeal to reside at the Maple Street address has been denied. However, if you wish to submit another appeal to reside at that address or any other address, I would suggest that you provide copies of all paperwork that we mentioned. So proof of completing any treatment, proof that you're working, things like that, okay?
- [Pahoua] Okay, sounds good.
- Okay, thank you.
- [Pahoua] Okay, thank you.
- Okay, the next person up before the board--
- [Pahoua] Can he just hang up now, or?
- Yes. The next person before the board is Derek VanRoy.
- Melissa, he sent an email to Deanna withdrawing his application, so could I get a motion on that one?
- Motion to deny?
- Second.
- That'll be it. All right, the vote's coming.
- And, yes, motion to deny is so it can be taken off the calendar and Mr. VanRoy can reapply.
- Motion passes unanimously.
- Okay, next individual up is Dustin Andre. Dustin Andre, are you on the line? You have to unmute.
- [Dustin] Yes, I am here.
- Okay, sorry about that. Okay, just to give you. We are going to, at one point in time, ask you about your treatment for the underlying sex offense, is that something you wish to talk about in public, or do you wish to have us discuss that in a private session?
- [Dustin] I can do it freely, that's fine.

- Okay, and in addition to that, with the regards to the underlying sex offense, when you tell us about that, please do not mention a victim's name, your relationship to that victim, for example, your brother, sister, mother, father, anything like that, just refer to that individual as the victim, okay?

- [Dustin] I just had one question, this is like a second or third hearing of, I had to bring some paperwork to prove--

- Okay, I see that, I apologize. Yes, I'm sorry. Okay, you've already done all that, so this is a 30-day return for treatment information and it was to be released, you needed to sign something so that information would be received from the board.

- [Dustin] I emailed Deanna back and she does have the two document and letters from my agent and from the Bellin Hospital that you guys should have in your packet, or should be able to view.

- I do not have that. The last document that I received regarding your treatment was dated...

- [Dustin] And I just emailed her before the meeting started and she did email me the other day advising me that she did attach it to your guys' packet, so there are two letters showing my sex offender treatment and my current AODA treatment.

- Renee, do you have that?

- There's one from the Wisconsin Department of Corrections. It's from a Brooke Cleman, probation and parole agent, saying that she was able to find that he did complete the sex offender treatment.

- And is there anything from the mental health clinician, or anything?

- Let's see, in this letter it says, through a family services, he did attend and complete sex offender treatment 2005 through 2006, is all I'm seeing on that.

- And I'm also showing that you were to provide proof of your AODA treatment and your progress. Did you provide proof of that?

- [Dustin] Yes, mam, I did, I just emailed it before this meeting started, to Deanna, and she said thank you and she forwarded it to you guys. This is my second week of 16 weeks of aftercare.

- Does anybody have that?

- Deanna says that she emailed it, she just emailed a copy to me showing the Bellin Health record. I can read it for the board if you'd like.

- That'd be fine with me, yes.

- Okay, so it says, dear Dustin, and it's dated April 27th, 2020. Dear Dustin, per our telephone session on April 21st, 2020, you have been referred to relapse prevention programming, beginning June 1st, 2020. This is a 16-week program that meets weekly as a group for two hours each session. Your therapist will be Brittany Larscheid, LCSW CSAC. Please note that there is not currently a

release on file for your probation officer. Please feel free to use this letter as needed to provide treatment recommendation updates.

- Is everyone, Renee or Fay, are you satisfied with that information?

- I am.

- I am.

- Okay. That being said, does anybody have a motion they'd like to make?

- I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Andre to the 128 12th Avenue address specific.

- I will second.

- You should have the vote. Motion passes unanimously.

- Okay, Mr. Andre, you have been approved to reside at the address that you requested on 12th Avenue.

- [Dustin] Okay.

- No date limitation, that's address specific. Do you have any questions?

- [Dustin] Thank you. No, thank you.

- Okay.

- Okay, bye.

- Okay. All right, before the board is Joshua Doran. Is Joshua Doran here?

- Yep, I will unmute him. There we go, he should be unmuted.

- [Joshua] Hello.

- Hi, Mr. Doran. It appears this is your, you were last here in May, and you were actually supposed to have a 60-day return, but it's been 30 days.

- [Joshua] That is correct.

- Okay, and you were supposed to provide us with proof of attendance with your treatment provider. Before I get into that, I just wanna ask you whether or not you're okay with us discussing your treatment in public or do you wanna discuss that in private?

- [Joshua] It's fine, public is fine.

- Okay, and it also appears as though you're actually requesting for a different address because the apartment on Chestnut is still not ready for you, is that correct?
- [Joshua] That is correct.
- Okay. And did you provide us with something regarding the treatment with your provider?
- [Joshua] Yes, Deanna should've included in my packet a letter from stating that, due to the COVID, group sessions aren't going on right now until further notice.
- Okay, let's see. And the apartment on Walnut, is that available to you?
- [Joshua] Yes, it is.
- And it's move-in ready?
- [Joshua] Yes, it is.
- Okay. Does anybody have any questions for Mr. Doran?
- I do, I'm just curious, do you travel to Milwaukee weekly or do they have it up here also?
- [Joshua] They have it up here also. I think that's like their parent company, and then they have licensed therapists through them throughout the state, I believe. Maybe northeast and southeast Wisconsin.
- Okay.
- [Joshua] I'm not sure, but yeah, we have it on the east side off the university.
- All right. That's all from me.
- [Melissa] Excuse me one second, I had an accident here.
- Oh.
- Don't wanna mix water with the electricity here. Okay. Live in person. Okay, does anybody else have any additional questions or concerns they'd like to address?
- None.
- No.
- Okay, and is there anybody here to speak on your behalf, Mr. Doran?
- [Joshua] No, there isn't.
- Okay, would anybody like to make a motion?

- I will make a motion to approve address specific, 1014 East Walnut Street, Mr. Doran.
- Is that with a return date or without a return date, because due to COVID, Mr. Doran was not able to comply with our request to get a document from the treatment provider.
- Well, he did provide the treatment letter, but he's not been able to go because of COVID, but he had been going in good faith up until then.
- Okay.
- I guess I'm okay with that, but if you're not, then deny it.
- No, no, no, I just want clarification.
- Yep, okay.
- And is there a second?
- I will second.
- Okay.
- All right, you should have the vote. Motion passes unanimously.
- Okay, Mr. Doran, you are approved to reside at the 1014 East Walnut Street address, and only that specific address. And do you have any questions?
- [Joshua] No, thanks, that should be it and thank you.
- Okay, thank you.
- [Joshua] All right, have a good night, bye.
- You too. Next on the calendar before the court is Dillon Wendricks. Is Dillon Wendricks on the line?
- [Dillon] Yeah, I'm here, can you hear me?
- Yes, I sure can. Okay, Mr. Wendricks, it appears as though you were last here before the board on March 11th, 2020, and the board granted you a 90-day approval to the address of 428 South Maple Street, and you were to provide us with proof of your continued employment and continued treatment attendance. Is that your understanding?
- [Dillon] Correct.
- Okay, and with regard to your continued treatment attendance, do you wish to discuss that in private or is public okay with you?

- [Dillon] Public's fine.
- Okay. And, let's see. Does anybody have any questions about proof of Mr. Wendricks' employment and/or treatment?
- Do we have proof of his employment?
- Yeah. I was wrong last time, so wanna make sure.
- I see treatment, but I didn't see the employment.
- [Dillon] I have procured the last 90 days of my pay stubs 'cause I am still working. I just have no idea how to get them in front of you guys. It's in my hand right now, I just didn't know how to get them to you.
- Okay, do you have the ability to, are you on your phone or are you on a computer?
- [Dillon] This is my mother's phone, this is my mother's phone.
- Okay, so that means we can't see it even if you, okay.
- [Dillon] I mean, can you see it?
- If you put it before the screen, maybe.
- Your video's not turned on, Dillon.
- [Woman] Oh, how do you do that?
- [Dillon] Oh, start video, got it. How about now?
- No.
- No.
- Here, I can try to turn the video on. There we go.
- There we go.
- Hey, cool. So I have pay stubs for 4g Plastering, I don't know if you can see that.
- Yeah, just hold it still.
- [Dillon] Sorry.
- That's okay.
- And we need the camera closer because we can't see anything, much closer.

- The dates.

- [Dillon] The dates, where the hell are the dates on the payslip? Pay period would be right there, 6/1/2020.

- Okay, what we need you to do is hold the paper steady. We need whoever's holding the camera to show the location of where you're pointing with regard to the dates, your name. Okay, now we need to actually get closer enough to see it. Can you see, I can't see that.

- I can see it.

- Yep, I can see it.

- Okay, perfect.

- [Dillon] You guys can see it? That's up here on the top left, that's 4g Plastering. Pay period dates would be 6/1/2020 to 6/7/2020.

- Okay.

- [Dillon] And there's like quite a few of them here.

- Well, that shows us that you're, right now, are employed, so that's fine with me.

- Okay, and does anyone have any questions or concerns?

- No.

- I do not have any.

- Okay, would someone like to make a motion?

- Melissa, there's someone here to speak on his behalf.

- Oh, okay, thank you.

- John Nemick is here.

- Okay.

- [Woman] Who's that?

- Mr. Nemick, if you could turn your mute off.

- I'll do that for him.

- Okay.

- I'm trying to do that. It's not unmuting.
- Mr. Nemick, can you unmute? There we go.
- Yep, here.
- Could you please give us your address where you reside?
- I'm not here for this gentleman, but I certainly will, it's 985--
- Oh, that's okay, if you're not here for Mr. Wendricks then we'll just--
- No, I'm just waiting for my guy, I'll go back on mute.
- Okay, is there anybody here to speak on behalf of or speak about Mr. Dillon Wendricks?
- Not here, not with me, not today.
- Okay. So hearing that that no one's present to speak on behalf of or against Mr. Wendricks, does anyone have a motion?
- Just for everyone to be aware, he would be moving into . Possibility of another gentleman moving into 426 North Maple, just for that.
- I'm on South Maple. I don't know if that's important.
- Oh, that is important. I'm sorry, I had that as North Maple.
- 428 South Maple.
- Okay, thank you.
- There is a gentleman that is trying to move in to the same building, 426, but it's South as well.
- No worries, we're just, you're before us right now.
- Okay.
- Okay, well, um. I will make a motion to approve Mr. Wendricks to 428 South Maple.
- And I will second.
- Address specific also, sorry.
- All right, you should have the vote. Motion passes unanimously.
- Okay, Mr. Wendricks, you've been granted approval by the board to move to 428 South Maple Avenue, Green Bay, address specific.

- Thank you very much.
- Do you have any questions?
- Sure, do you have any--
- No.
- Okay, take care.
- Thank you, you too.
- Okay, next is Bruce Verhaagh. Is there a Bruce Verhaagh on the line? Is anybody who's calling in Bruce Verhaagh.
- [Bruce] Hello, hello?
- Yes, is this Bruce Verhaagh?
- Yes, can you hear me?
- Is this, uh, excuse me, Bruce Verhaagh.
- [Bruce] Yes, this is Bruce Verhaagh, Bruce Verhaagh.
- Verhaagh, I apologize for mispronouncing your name. Mr. Verhaagh, it appears as though you were last before the board on December 11th, 2019, and at that time you were granted six-month approval to move to 1331 Division Street, and that the reason you're back before the board today is to submit proof from your therapist that you are complying with court orders. Is that your under--
- Yes.
- Okay.
- [Bruce] My understanding is about aftercare. That's my understanding.
- That's fine, that's basically what I was saying. Aftercare or continued, um, seeing your therapist. And the last document that I saw in the packet was dated June 4th, 2019. Did anybody on the board see something that was more recent?
- No. Let me check.
- Okay.
- No.
- Okay. Mr. Nemick, are you the therapist?

- No, I am a therapist, but I don't see Bruce in that capacity,
- Okay, Mr. Verhaagh, are we okay to speak about your treatment in public or in private, what would you prefer?
- [Bruce] Public's fine.
- Okay, Mr. Nemick, do you think you could give us some updates about Mr. Verhaagh?
- Well, I can tell you certain that I'm not his therapist. I lead a meditation group here in Green Bay. Bruce contacted me about a year and a half ago and he was looking for some place to do meditation and we've gotten to know each other. Since then, we've had private conversations, partly in my role as a meditation leader and partly as my role, my training, as a psychotherapist. Pretty difficult to see him because he lives out in the country and doesn't drive. Just to continue, I have absolutely no concerns about him, he's done everything I've asked him to do. He's taken a leadership role in a certain capacity for our group, gets along really well with everyone. Only a couple of people in our group know, and those of us who do have made very sure that we, so to speak, keep an eye on him and make sure he's not alone with other people. I'm really pleased, he's a nice addition to our group, very friendly, very open, very bright. I am sitting here because I'd like to him make the next step back into the world.
- Fay or Renee, do you have any questions for Mr. Nemick?
- None for Mr. Nemick.
- No.
- Oh, and Mr. Nemick, if you could please state your address.
- My home address?
- Rachel, professional?
- It should be the home address for people who are addressing the board.
- Okay.
- 985 North Broadway, De Pere, Wisconsin, 54115.
- Thank you.
- Thank you. Now, Mr. Verhaagh, do you live at 1331 Division Street in Green Bay?
- [Bruce] Well, um, do I live there like right now, presently?
- Yes.

- [Bruce] Well, right now I am on supervised released, and I am awaiting discharge. I'll be going either the 27th or the 28th, but right now I am living on supervised release in 2111 North New Franken Road, New Franken, Wisconsin.

- Okay, so once you're released, do you plan on moving to the Division Street address?

- [Bruce] Yes, yes, I can, I would really like to.

- Is that where your father lives?

- [Bruce] Yes.

- Okay.

- Okay, now I understand. Okay, does anyone any questions or concerns?

- What is with, I notice in the court records, you're going back in July, like for a telephone conference.

- [Bruce] I know nothing about that. In July. Oh, are you talking about court?

- Yes.

- Yes, court.

- [Bruce] Well, to my knowledge, my attorney told me that I'll be going to court June, either 27th or the 28th.

- For what?

- [Bruce] For, um, well. Asking if I can get discharged off of Chapter 9 .

- Okay, okay, thank you.

- Got it. Fay, do you have any questions or concerns?

- No.

- Okay. Is there anyone else on the line who is going to speak regarding, let's see, Mr. Verhaagh? No one else, does anybody wish to put forth a motion?

- I will make a motion to approve Mr. Verhaagh, address specific, 1331 Division Street, for 90 days. Yes, 90 days, to come back to show us what the court has said, what the judge has said.

- I will second.

- All right, you should have the vote. Motion passes unanimously.

- Okay, Mr. Verhaagh, depending upon what the court does, whether or not the court says you remain on supervised release, regardless, you're approved to move to the new Division Street address, okay?

- [Bruce] Um, thank you.

- You're very welcome, have a great day.

- [Bruce] You too, bye.

- Okay, bye-bye.

- Thank you, all.

- Thank you. Next is the appeal for Andrew Rochon. Is that correct, Mr. Rochon? You're still on mute.

- Yep, that's correct, thank you.

- Okay, and Mr. Rochon, let's see, you are here... Okay, this is a new appeal. You're requesting to move to a new address. You're previously approved to 1730 Badger Lane back in 2011, is that correct?

- Yes.

- And you are now requesting to move to 814 Mather Street, Green Bay.

- Yes.

- Okay, mister, uh...

- Rochon.

- Rochon, I'm sorry, I had a blank. Couple of things, when we get to the point of talking about your treatment, would you--

- Public is fine.

- Okay, let me finish what I'm saying, then you can answer, okay? Prefer to have that addressed in private or public?

- Public is fine.

- Okay, and with regard to the underlying sex offense, just so you know, please do not refer to that person by their first name and please do not refer to that person based on their relationship to you, like brother, sister, mother, father. Just simply refer to that person as the victim, okay?

- Yep.

- Okay, and let's see here. With regard to the underlying offense, sex offense, could you please tell us what that was about?

- Sure, it's not around anymore, there was a file sharing website called LimeWire. It was kind of like, I don't know if you remember what Napster was, but it was kind of like that, and I downloaded a picture of an underage, a nude underaged girl.

- Okay, and what was your sentence for that?

- Four years of probation. And I believe there was a 30-day jail time also.

- Okay, and let's see. Does anybody have any questions about the underlying sex offense?

- I do not have any.

- No.

- Okay, and let me ask you this, was this a direct move from the 1730 Badger Lane address to the Mather Street address, is that what you're seeking?

- No, I moved to 704 and 1/2 Desnoyer Street in Kaukauna. About four years ago, three and a half, four years ago.

- Okay, and are you requesting to move back to Green Bay from Kaukauna?

- Yes.

- Okay, and in the paperwork that you submitted, you didn't list any work. Could you tell us about that?

- I'm sorry, I must've missed that section or something, but I'm employed at Progressive Converting. It's a paper converter in Appleton, I've been there a little over two and a half years, it'll be three years in November.

- Okay.

- Now, it looks like you're hoping to purchase this home, is that correct?

- Yes, mam. We're scheduled to close on the 22nd if everything goes okay here.

- Okay.

- I have a question, it says here for alcohol, you completed AODA counseling after a second OUI as a condition to get can't remember who it was through, was this, oh, go ahead.

- Okay, just to give you what I can give you on that, I had the typical assessment that they give you, you know, after you get an OWI, and the assessor just recommended like a standard class, I think it was a four-week class. And I believe it was at the Fox Valley Tech in Oshkosh.

- Okay. Can I just ask where you grew up.
- Kaukauna.
- Okay.
- Yeah, well my dad always lived in Green Bay and my mom lives in, well, Little Chute first when I was a toddler and then we moved to Kaukauna from Little Chute when I was in third grade, and then my dad has always lived in Green Bay. Well, he lives in De Pere, but as I was growing up he lived in Green Bay. So I would be up here every other weekend.
- Okay, any other questions regarding his request to move to Mather Street?
- I do not have any.
- No.
- Okay, one question, it looks like you, when I say recent, you had a 2016 arrest for possession of drug paraphernalia, is that correct?
- Yes.
- And that was '16, and prior to that you had an OWI and it was a refusal, correct?
- No.
- No, it wasn't a refusal, okay. And with regard to the 2016 arrest up here in Brown County, were you ordered to undergo the assessment again for AODA?
- No, no.
- Okay, did you complete any treatment?
- Not related to that incident.
- Okay, any other questions? No, okay, does anyone have a motion to make? Oh, I'm sorry, do you have anybody here to speak on your behalf?
- No.
- Okay, all righty, does anybody have any motion to make?
- I move to approve the move to 814 Mather.
- I will second.
- Is that motion address specific?

- Oh, yeah. Is that a yes, Fay?
- Yes.
- Okay.
- And, Renee, you still second it?
- Yes.
- You should have the vote.
- I do not have it yet. Oh.
- Motion passes unanimously.
- Okay, Mr. Rochon, you've been approved to 814 Mather Street, Green Bay, address specific.
- Thank you very much.
- Okay, thank you.
- Have a good day.
- You too. All right, next before the board is Sandra Plansky. Miss Plansky, are you here?
- [Sandra] I'm here.
- Okay, are you on video or telephone?
- [Sandra] I'm on my phone.
- Okay, and let's see, Miss Plansky, you were last before the board on March 11th of this year, and your request to move to the Hartung address was denied. And you are here before the board with another appeal to reside at the Hartung address, and I guess, let's see, 627 Hartung, is that correct?
- [Sandra] That is correct, yes.
- I'm sorry?
- [Sandra] That is correct, yes.
- Okay, we're having difficulty hearing you, okay, just so you know. Now, I believe at the last hearing we discussed the underlying facts, however, we have a new board member so this board member may choose to ask you questions about that offense. And make sure, please, that you don't state the individual's names or your relationship to those individuals. Please just simply refer to them as victims. And also, do you wish to discuss your treatment in private or in public?

- [Sandra] Public is fine.
- Just gonna say, I read the information , so for her to go over that again for me.
- Okay. So I can see you were denied because you had no proof that you obtained any treatment, and you had no independent recollection about anything about your underlying, is that correct? Hello?
- She's muted.
- Miss Plansky, you're muted, you need to unmute your phone.
- There we go.
- [Sandra] Okay, sorry.
- That's okay.
- [Sandra] I accidentally hit the button with my face, I apologize. First of all, I'd like to apologize for not being honest last time I was there.
- Miss Plansky, I can't really hear you, you're going in and out. It might be you just have a bad connection.
- [Sandra] It's possible, yes.
- Okay, can you restate what you were saying?
- [Sandra] Okay, first of all, I'd like to apologize for not being honest last time I was there. It's been very difficult for me to talk about .
- I'm not getting anything.
- Looks like she just dropped.
- Okay. Okay, so, what do we do now?
- No, she's back.
- Okay, Miss Plansky, are you back?
- It might take a moment to reconnect.
- Sure, hello?
- [Sandra] Okay, yes.
- We dropped, the line was dropped, so we didn't hear anything you just said.

- [Sandra] Okay, . First of all I'd like to apologize for not being honest .
- Miss Plansky, can you move to another location in your house where you might have a better connection?
- [Sandra] Sure.
- And we lost her.
- It's, yeah, plus it's raining heavily outside, so maybe that's part of the problem. Okay, should we just
- Oh, she's logged back in.
- Oh, okay. Miss Plansky, are you there?
- [Sandra] I'm here, can you hear me? Hello?
- Oh, we can hear you.
- [Sandra] All right, yay, good. Let me try this one more time . Get to this. I'm so sorry we're having this problem, and again, I'd like to apologize for not being honest with you last time I was there . And I still have trouble speaking about it, about the offense, and inappropriate touching with a child.
- Okay.
- Do you remember it?
- I didn't understand that.
- [Sandra] I remember pieces of it, but because of the time lapse, not everything that happened.
- Miss Plansky, we're having a real difficult time hearing you, you're going in and out and it's gargled. Let's see, Rachel, do you have any suggestions?
- I mean, we've got torrential downpours right now. I mean, if she's on a cell phone it's--
- It's not gonna work. Do you have a landline, Miss Plansky, that you could call from?
- [Sandra] I do have a .
- Could we put her to the end of the agenda and see if it clears up, or?
- She actually is off right now. Okay, what I'm going to suggest is that we take a brief recess regarding this hearing if that's, oh, here she is, Miss Plansky? Miss Plansky, are you there? Okay, well then, what I suggest is that we take a brief recess with regards to this appeal and at the end, maybe we can figure out something else that we can do. Maybe we'll have to put it over til next month's meeting, or hearing, okay? Miss Plansky, can you hear us? You're muted. Okay, unless, yeah. Will that be okay, Rachel?

- Yeah, I mean, we can go on to the next agenda item and revisit this one at the end of the meeting. Hopefully the rain slows down a little bit and maybe we can get a better connection. I don't know if she's on the computer or on a phone. The background indicates that she's on a computer, it doesn't have the little phone icon behind her, so I'm not sure what the issue is.
- Okay, all right, moving on.
- Is that her?
- No, I don't think so 'cause it says muted. Okay, moving on to the next person who's on the agenda, appeal of Haisan Williams. Mr. Williams, are you there? I saw you earlier.
- I am.
- Hi, Mr. Williams.
- Hello.
- Hi, let's see. So the last time you were before the board was back on November 9th, 2016, and you were approved to move to 827 North Broadway Street in Green Bay, is that correct?
- Yes, mam.
- Okay, so, again, let me just tell you that if we ask you or you talk about the underlying sex offense, that you do not discuss your relationship to the victim. Don't mention his or her name, just refer to that individual as a victim. And with regard to treatment, if you're questioned about that, would that be something you wanna discuss in public or private?
- Public is fine.
- Okay. So, let's see. So are you still residing at 827 North Broadway?
- Yes.
- Okay, and what is the reason for the move?
- We have another property and we don't necessarily want to move, I wanna know if moving is an option and in order to even explore that option, I need approval from the board. As I understand it, my approval here is permanent.
- Yes.
- And I wanted to just have another address as an option, we own two separate properties, and wanted, again, to know if I'd be approved to move there so that we could make some arrangements, accommodations, towards that end.
- My understanding is that you can be approved to live at one or the other address, not both.

- Okay.

- Is that correct, Rachel?

- I mean, the board can approve multiple addresses. It just has to be address specific.

- Okay, so are you--

- Okay.

- Go ahead.

- I'm sorry, could I ask a question about the address specific caveat? Because right now, we need to know if it's possible for me to live there, and if I were to decide to move there, I would obviously have to report as SORRB, so would I have to come back to the board to get an approval for an address specific location, or could the 827 North Broadway and the 229 Oxford addresses be considered both legitimate residencies?

- I mean, the board can put forth whatever motion it chooses to. If you're approved for an address, you don't get unapproved, so if you have approval for either or both address, that would continue on regardless of where you decide to purchase or sign a lease, or what you register with SORRB. The board's approval would continue.

- I understand, thank you.

- Okay, I have a question.

- Yes.

- Not for you, I'm sorry, for Rachel. To be approved, anybody that we've approved to live at a different address, and now they move to a new address, they can move back to that old address without coming back to see us?

- Correct.

- Oh, I did not know that.

- We've had people who have tried to move back into former apartments. Unless it's the exact same unit, they still have to come back, but if they're moving back to the exact same address, they're approved.

- Thank you.

- Okay, I did not know that.

- Fun fact for the day.

- Okay, so are you, Mr. Williams, are you seeking to be approved to reside at that 229 Oxford Street address?
- Yes.
- Okay. Okay, so does anybody have any questions for Mr. Williams?
- Are you still employed?
- Yes, mam.
- And you've not been in any trouble since we last saw you?
- Yes, I have, my parole was revoked in 2018.
- Why?
- For a rule violation, I had contact with a minor.
- And why did you have contact with the minor?
- It was incidental contact. I knocked on the door, the minor answered the door, and that was the contact that I was revoked for.
- How was that discovered?
- Through a friend, her friend, the person who lived there reported it to an agent.
- Okay.
- Mr. Williams, did you have any violations since you--
- No.
- Okay. And you still see Mr. Drake, Jim Drake, on and off.
- I've been discharged but I see him for aftercare.
- Okay. And according to the documents that you submitted, you last saw him March 13th of this year.
- I'm sorry?
- The last time you saw him was March 13th of this year, is that correct?
- Yes, yes, mam.
- Okay. Let's see. Anything else, anyone?

- Nothing.
- Okay, does anybody have a motion they'd like to make? Oh, I was gonna ask you, who do you work for?
- I work for New Wave International Cargo and I work for MPJ Trucking.
- MPJ, okay.
- Well I will make a motion to approve Mr. Williams, address specific, 229 Oxford Avenue.
- I second.
- I'm sorry, who seconded that one?
- Fay.
- Okay, thank you. And you should have the vote.
- I do not.
- I do not.
- Neither do I.
- Motion passes unanimously.
- Okay, Mr. Williams, you are approved to reside at, so it's clear, both 827 North Broadway and 229 Oxford Street, both in Green Bay.
- Thank you.
- Okay, take care.
- Mm-hm, bye-bye.
- Bye. Let's see. Next we have Anthony Shea on the agenda. Mr. Shea, are you still there?
- [Anthony] I'm on, yeah.
- Okay, Mr. Shea, it looks as though you were last here before the board on June 13th, 2018, and you were approved to reside at 1263 Reber Street, correct?
- [Anthony] Correct.
- Okay, and just so we're clear, we have a new board member who may be interested in asking you questions about the underlying sex offense or any other criminal offenses you may have committed. So if that is the case, please be sure to refer to the individual in the sex offense as your victim, not

their name and definitely not your relationship to them. In addition to that, are you all right speaking about treatment, if that is brought up, in public or would you like to discuss that in private?

- [Anthony] Public will work.

- Okay, so, it lists your current address as the Village Motel, correct?

- [Anthony] Correct.

- Okay, and why did you leave the Reber Street address?

- [Anthony] Reber Street, I had was December 5th of 2019, I got locked up and sent to an ATR down in Racine Correctional Institution. And that was a 77-day program. I started that program around Christmas time and got out of there, graduated the program and got out again on March 11th, and returned to Green Bay on March 11th.

- And where have you been residing since that time?

- [Anthony] Oh, oh, pretty much, and for a little while I was at the TLP.

- Okay, and so you were arrested on a new offense or on a violation?

- [Anthony] No, it was a rule violation. The rule violation was unapproved contact with a minor. I was living upstairs, I lived at Reber Street in the upper apartment, the lower apartment had a mother, father and a small child, they was 10 years old, and on occasion, this child would say hi to me and I'd say hi back to him. I reported to my PO the contact, but I didn't report all of the contact. There was probably about five incidents of contact and I reported like three, so I was given an ATR, but as a rule violation.

- And can you, for those of us who don't know, what's an ATR?

- An ATR is just, it's called an alternative to revocation. They revoke you, but instead of revocation, they give you an alternative. The alternative in my case was a 77-day program down at Racine Correctional Institution. I didn't get the copy of the certificate in my packet, but I completed 65 hours of treatment of the program down there, graduated March 11th, and it was really helpful and really beneficial to do that program.

- In what way?

- Well it helped me, it was pretty much sex offender treatment and like a refresher course, but it helped me to learn, it helped me to become more aware of my cycle and different things, like the cycle, and what else? I had to do like an extensive relapse prevention plan that I wrote out. And what really helped me was they had us write a letter to the victim and then a letter from the victim to me and that was a good experience for me 'cause it helped me to understand the hurt I caused my victims. The letters weren't mailed to the victim, it was just an exercise we did, but it helped to increase my empathy for my victims.

- And--

- It really...

- No, I'm sorry, go ahead, I didn't mean to cut you off.

- [Anthony] Oh, I'm sorry, first I was confused about why I had to go to this ATR, and there was a little confusion, but after it was all said and done, I was happy my PO sent me to the ATR. I even thanked her when I got back for sending there 'cause it was such a blessing, it was such a benefit to be there at that program.

- Are you receiving any follow-up treatment?

- [Anthony] Before the ATR, I was seeing Jim Drake at Family Services. I have resumed treatment with Jim Drake, there's a letter in my packet. I meet with him every week on the phone.

- Okay.

- [Anthony] Usually on Mondays, we meet every week on the phone. But he said we're gonna start up face-to-face, I'll be going to see him in the office again, but I continue to see him every week.

- Okay.

- In his letter, I'm sorry, Melissa.

- No, no, it's fine.

- In his letter he said you have learned to be more transparent with your support system and is fully aware of the consequences if he doesn't. Who is your support system?

- [Anthony] My support system would be my mother, my two sisters who live an hour away. Also my support involves my probation officer, my therapist. And the transparent thing is I've been pretty transparent with my agent and my therapist, but there's a lapse in judgment when I didn't report all of the contact with the minor. I wasn't 100% transparent with him. I've learned that even a rule that you might not think is important, is important, you know? That's right, the therapist, they called it a seemingly unimportant decision.

- Okay, any other questions? Oh, my concern is, what about work? What are you doing for work right now?

- [Anthony] Work, I started a new job May 19th at TNT Crust, it's full-time, third shift, and I've been there since May 19th and , get paid so I'll be able to afford apartments and stuff, and a delivery driver. Previous to that, I was working at Cheese Cake Heaven, but due to the corona they were shut down and I didn't wanna wait. And the hours and the pay weren't that great or guaranteed there so I got another job, a better paying job with benefits.

- And what is the name of that company again, I'm sorry?

- [Anthony] TNT Crust.

- T as in Tom, M as in Mary, T as in Tom?
- [Anthony] N as in naughty, T-N-T, like dynamite, TNT.
- Got it, okay.
- [Anthony] Crust.
- Okay.
- [Anthony] They have two plants. I usually work on Cedar Street plant, third shift as a sanitation, kind of like housekeeping.
- Okay, does anyone have any additional questions for Mr. Shea?
- No.
- Okay, and is there anyone here speaking on your behalf?
- [Anthony] No, not today.
- Okay, does anyone have a motion to make?
- I move to recommend for the specific address of 426 South Maple.
- Okay, so motion to approve address specific to the Maple Street address, is that--
- Yes.
- Thank you, okay.
- I will second.
- Right, you should have the vote. Motion passes unanimously.
- So, Mr. Shea, you are free to move to that address, 426 South Maple Avenue, is that Maple Avenue or Maple Street, Green Bay?
- [Anthony] It's Avenue.
- Okay.
- [Anthony] Maple Avenue, yeah.
- Okay, do you have any questions?
- [Anthony] No, thank you all for your consideration.

- Okay, take care.
- [Anthony] Bye-bye.
- Bye-bye. Okay, and next on the agenda is Daniel Konshak. Mr. Konshak, you're requesting to move to 1313 St George Street, Green Bay? Hello? Mr. Konshak, are you there?
- [Daniel] I'm trying to--
- There he is.
- Here we go.
- Okay, one second, I'm having a little, Renee, do you wanna lead this one? I'm having a little bit of trouble toggling through right now.
- Sure, okay, hold on a second. I'm also very slow on my little iPad here. So, Mr. Konshak, you want to move to 1313 St George? Hello?
- Mr. Konshak, are you there? I'm gonna try muting and unmuting him. Mr. Konshak, are you there?
- [Daniel] Hello, yeah, I'm here now. I had trouble unmuting it.
- Okay.
- Continue, Melissa, are you--
- Yeah, go ahead.
- Okay, so you want to move to 1313 St George Street?
- [Daniel] Correct.
- Okay, and we do have a new board member so if we do go over your offense, please don't name or a relationship.
- [Daniel] Okay.
- And if we talk about your treatment, can we do that in public or private?
- [Daniel] Public is fine.
- Okay. So, let's see, we last saw you April of 2019.
- [Daniel] Correct.
- And so why are you moving?

- [Daniel] Pardon?

- Why are you moving, why would you like to move?

- [Daniel] Oh, okay, right now I got an offer in on a house and the house is at 1313 St Georges, the house I'm trying to buy. And the current owner approved by the board before he'll finish signing the acceptance, so I need to get the board's approval to move that offer.

- Okay, and are you buying this house ?

- [Daniel] Myself, I'll be living there by myself. It's about five or six blocks away from where I am right now.

- Okay. Let's see, we have a letter from Terry Roberts with Circles of Support, are you still involved with them?

- [Daniel] Yes.

- Okay.

- Do I have a motion, is there any other questions or do I have a motion from anyone?

- I think, one question here, okay, now I found it. Question regarding work, are you working?

- [Daniel] Yes, I've been at American Foods Group since September of '18. So it'll be just about two years.

- Okay.

- Questions?

- None from me.

- No.

- Do I have a motion?

- I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Konshak, address to, let me get the address again, 13. Let's see, I'm gonna say the wrong address.

- [Daniel] 1313 St George.

- St. George, yeah, I almost said Division. 1313 St George Street, Green Bay, address specific. And you still are approved to reside at the 1241 and 1/2 Ceder Street address, so if for whatever reason, escrow falls through, then you can still remain at Ceder Street.

- [Daniel] Okay, thank you.

- Wait we have to--

- Oh, gosh, I didn't take--

- You don't even have a second yet.

- Oh!

- I second.

- Okay, Fay seconds it.

- I apologize.
- All right, now you should have the vote.
- Oops.
- Motion passes unanimously.
- Okay, Mr. Konshak, I was a little bit ahead of myself before, but you are approved to that address and if escrow falls through you can stay at Ceder Street, okay?
- [Daniel] Okay, thank you.
- Thank you, may I just have one second?
- [Daniel] Pardon?
- You may have multiple.
- Are we going to try and get Miss Plansky back, or?
- I think so.
- Okay.
- Hi.
- Miss Plansky, are you there?
- [Sandra] I'm here.
- Okay.
- Miss Plansky, you're using the web-based app. Is there anyway that you could call in? Your message is all garbled. Could you call in on the phone number? We can't understand anything you're saying. Let me give you the phone number to call in. The phone number, oh, there she goes.
- Okay, so, I'm showing Barbara Dorff. Barbara, are you there? Barbara's, um.
- [Barbara] Yes, this is Alderwoman Dorff, I was just checking in. My meeting's supposed to start at five, I was just checking to see how far along you are.
- Okay.
- We're on the last agenda item.
- [Barbara] Okay, that's great, so I'll just, uh, yeah, I was kind of trying to weigh it to let everybody know, so thank you, for calling on me, and I'm going to leave you now.

- Okay.
- [Barbara] Okay.
- Sandra, are you back?
- [Sandra] I'm back.
- Are you there, Sandra?
- [Sandra] Yes, I am.
- Okay, I'm going to give you a phone number. We can't hear you when you're coming in through the web address. Can you call us back at 312-626-6799? Again, that's 312-626-6799. It'll ask for a password, the password is 593509. Again, that's 593509. 'Cause we can't hear you--
- [Sandra] Okay, I'll just do that.
- Okay, thank you. We'll get this figured out.
- Looks like she's back on the line. Thunder and lightening. Oh. Yep, heard that.
- I'm glad I didn't water my flowers this morning.
- Me too. I was thinking about it.
- Someone must have.
- Why it's raining, yeah.
- Or washed their car.
- Left the car outside. Free wash. Rachel, is she still on?
- She's still on through the web application, but she may be still trying to call in by phone.
- Got it.
- If she calls in it'll have that phone icon behind her name.
- Oh, okie-dokie.
- You must see something totally different than I do 'cause I don't see any of that.
- Mr. Konshak had, I think he had the phone. Or, no, he didn't, I think he just turned the video off.
- Yeah, instead of having the name across the middle of the box, it would have the phone and then it would show the phone number where the name populates in the lower part.

- But none of us are doing that right now.
- No, no. Okay, she dropped, let's see if she calls in. We've only got four minutes before the next meeting's supposed to start.
- Okay. My suggestion, if this is appropriate right now, is to have her just...
- Postponed til next month?
- She's not currently approved.
- She's not approved to that address.
- And she's been living there for years.
- Six years.
- I mean, we could just hold it over to the next meeting.
- Okay, just add it to the agenda and--
- Deanna, are you okay with that? Can you unmute?
- [Deanna] That's fine, I can put her on for July.
- Okay.
- I'll let everybody know.
- Oh, hold on, hold on, phone number just joined.
- [Deanna] That looks like a phone number for Sandra, that looks like the number that matches--
- All right, Sandra, are you there?
- [Sandra] I'm here.
- Oh, we can hear you much better.
- [Sandra] Oh, I'm so glad.
- Okay, Miss Plansky, we are in a bit of a pickle right now. We have to be off of Zoom 'cause there's another city meeting, there are other city meetings that need to use the Zoom at five, and I have a feeling that we won't be able to conclude your hearing on time. With that being said, could we put yours over, your meeting over until July?
- [Sandra] Absolutely, that's fine, whatever it takes for you.

- Okay, do we need a motion on that?
- Yeah, we need a motion to hold it until the next meeting.
- Okay.
- I make a motion to hold Miss Plansky over til the July meeting, I don't know the date.
- July 8th.
- Until the July 8th meeting.
- I will second.
- [Sandra] Yes. That's fine. Hello?
- Yep, we're just taking a vote.
- [Sandra] Okay, sorry. Thought I lost you, just wanna make sure I hadn't.
- I can't back up my vote right now, but I say yes.
- Okay.
- Yes.
- Yes from me, it's not coming through.
- Deanna, do you have to send Miss Plansky another letter? Miss Plansky, all I can suggest is that everything that we discussed last time, you provide proof of those certificates, et cetera, okay?
- [Sandra] Okay, because my agent was supposed, I believe she emailed you the information about my treatment.
- Yes.
- [Sandra] Because I did speak with her about that.
- Okay.
- [Sandra] And she was supposed to email you the information.
- Okay, so I guess adjourn the meeting, or--
- Yeah, we would need a motion to adjourn.
- Motion, I make, so moved?

- Before we adjourn, can I just say for the resignation of Kathy De Cremer being done, can I just acknowledge her. Thank you for her service for all the years she was on the board.

- Absolutely.

- Okay, thank you.

- So, Melissa, you had the motion to adjourn?

- Motion to adjourn.

- And who seconded?

- Second.

- Okay.

- I vote yes.

- Yes.

- All right, mark all as yes. All right, motion passes unanimously.
