- **I'm just telling you what I see otherwise, the votes won't come to you.**
- **When I click on my name in the upper right hand corner, it says account settings email preferences**
- **Can you log out and log back in?**

- **Okay. Did you join the meeting?**
- **Oh yeah where do I do that at?**
- **You first log in and the window should come up showing that and you have to hit join meeting And you just joined. Good. Okay.**
- **We're trying a I have it shows up to where I wanna leave the meeting.**

- There was a request by Attorney Megan Carollo to take agenda item nine earlier in the meeting, we have an interpreter for agenda item one, but if there's a motion we can put agenda item nine into the second spot.
- Anybody wish to make a motion?
- I'll make a motion. Is there a second? Who seconded? Okay.
- Okay and approval of the minutes.
- Move to approve.
- I'll second.
- All right, we can take a voice vote to approve that one.
- All in favor say aye.
- Aye.
- Those opposed say nothing.
- Okay, excellent.
- Motion passes let's move on to regular business. Item one the appeal of Por Ye Yang requesting the bocce 1100 North Van Buren Avenue, Apartment one. And Mr. Yang, you're appearing by way of an interpreter. Is that correct?
- Yeah.

- Madam interpreter we need a response.
- that he was appearing with an interpreter.
- [Sonia] yes.
- And let's see And before we again, Mr. Oh, something's wrong. Before we begin Mr. Yang, I want to let you know that before you have the right to have your treatment history addressed in private session, do you wish to do that in private or is public Okay.
- [Sonia] In public is, it is fine too.
- And just for the record madam interpreter your name?
- And what language are you interpreting?
- Okay, thank you. And let's see. It appears to sell Mr. Yang was last year before the board June 10th, 2020. And you were denied because you did not provide proof of completion of your sex offender treatment. Is that correct?
- [Sonia] Correct.
- Okay And it appears as though since you were the last time you were before the board you submitted a report or letter from Mr. Jim Drake. Is that correct?
- And I'm sorry go ahead. Interpreter?
- [Sonia] He just said yes.
- Okay. Okay, let's see. And the letters or documents from Mr. Drake stated in part that Mr. Yang self reported to the court regarding his sex offense and he was referred to family services and that you admitted that you had a problems with alcohol, is that correct?
- [Sonia] Yes, correct.
- Does anybody have any questions?
- I guess I'm kinda confused what the original motion was. I mean it says one was approved one was denied. You denied or were there? I'm sure he provided the documentation.
- Right that was at the last in June he didn't have any documentation for treatment and so he was denied until he brought the treatment.
- Okay.
- Just how I remember it.
- Okay.
- [Sonia] Yes.

- Does anybody have any questions about the documentation provided to the board from Mr. Yang?
- I have a question about the self reporting? Because in one place you sounded like the police were called and then there was a long period of time between you know the offense and the conviction. What is the question?
- My question is is to clarify the self reporting part.
- I think you need because we have an interpreter you have to ask a more direct question. So the interpreter can translate that.
- Okay. Did Mr. Yang report the incident or did Mr. Yang report the incidents and who did he report it to?
- [Sonia] You mean the situation the incident.
- Yes. Which incident that clarification.
- The sexual offense.
- [Sonia] No I haven't reported to anybody for whatever but they just came and arrest me.
- Arrested you for what?
- [Sonia] Well because of the assault charge that I have. They arrested me.
- Are you talking about the sexual assault or different . Are you talking about the sexual assault?
- [Sonia] Yes they're sexual assault.
- Okay. And just so I'm clear because you were charged in Brown County and you were convicted in Brown County. in a 2011 case for first degree sexual assault on a minor who was under the age of 13, okay.
- So that's where the confusion is about you self reporting because the court already knew that you committed this crime and in fact you pled guilty or no contest. Isn't that correct?
- [Sonia] Yes sir.
- Did the court order you to complete sex offender treatment?
- [Sonia] Yeah, they did order and I did pick the form.
- Thank you. Does anyone have any additional questions?
- I guess I just kind of want to make a clarification here, because I think I'm confused between what Fay asked and what you asked. It seems to me that Fay is asking about this self reporting which I'm assuming she's reading that from the Family services treatment summary, but Melissa you make it sound like he reported to the courts that he did that. Am I missing something?

- That... Okay, my understanding in the court system here is that you will to self report to family services, you either self report or to take sex offender treatment, or the court orders you to do it.

- Okay, and that. You could be right but what this report, if you read this entirely, the doctor is saying that he's self-reporting that because he does not have documentation of the actual criminal complaint. So everything that is in that summary is based on what Mr. Yang is telling him, that's the self reporting.

- Okay.

- Okay, I just want to make that clear.

- That makes complete sense.

- Yes, thank you, that helps me.

- Okay. So, which I find troubling because if the therapist did not have the underlying documentation from the case file in his own solely relying on the statements of Mr. Yang, I, that doesn't seem to be necessarily a complete treatment because people who are convicted need to be confronted and admit to their crimes that they committed in court, that they admitted in court to doing or were found guilty of via trial. So regardless that's what the documents say.

- Then the fourth paragraph Mr. Drake does address that, that this was based on Mr. Yang self report duty not receiving any court report describing a sexual offense with his stepsister. I indicated that I would include this in the report. And if for some reason his self report does not correlate with some materials related to the court based on victim statements or the nature of the sexual offense I would have been base my recommendations and of course I would have to further assess and evaluate. So he addressed that.

- Right, so because we don't have I mean, we really don't know.

- But according to the labs, I mean last meeting, but it appears that when we questioned the Green Bay police Officer, what Mr. Yang reported is exactly what happened. There were no discrepancies here or again, am I missing something?

- Not from my recollection.

- Okay.

- I mean is the officer online can you tell us if that's what happened?

- He's on I just unmuted him.

- And for clarification let's please refrain from discussing or identifying the relationship or the names of the victim to the appellant or the applicant.

- Right Commander Ebel are you on the call?

- You hear me now?

- Yep.

- Okay, so as far as the disclosure went to reporting, it was a mandatory reporter who would report it the two narratives from the victim and the suspect in this case Mr. Yang as it, are pretty similar.

- Okay, thank you. Any further questions for the Commander? Does anybody else have any additional concerns or statements or comments or questions? I will say that for me, my concern is if I remember correctly, because I prepared some of these cases a while back after Deanna sent them out is that alcohol was involved. If I remember and he there was a breakup that Mr. That Mr. Yang said was the precipitating force in all this and my concern is that since the state is bad, go back. We have recent cases one from 2020. One from 2019, I believe. Let me double check cases that involve alcohol continuous use of alcohol, such as operating while intoxicated. We have a 2020 case involved damage to property. I believe that's a completed case now. And in any event that's my concern. That we have continued abuse of alcohol. So, and that was one of the factors that caused, according to Ms. Jean, him to commit the crime. And I don't. And if I remember correctly from the last time that Jean was here his family is not allowing him, is not supporting him any longer. His brother I believe was here but that's, I don't see that there's anyone here ready to speak on his behalf so that's my concern is his lack of support. And let's see, I think there was something else. I don't believe Mr. Yang has a job or maybe he did get a job recently. Mr. Yang, did you receive, do you have employment now?

- [Sonia] Yes, I found my job.

- Where is the job?

- Okay, and how long have you been working there?

- [Sonia] Almost two months.

- Okay. And is there, do you have any interaction or communication with your family since the last time you were?

- [Sonia] I am working. I don't have a place to live.

- I'm sorry.

- [Sonia] I am working and I do not have a place to live.

- Okay, do you have any, do they have any contact with his family?

- [Sonia] I do call my dad occasionally

- [Sonia] I do call him it's just occasionally.

- Thank you. Does anyone else have any questions or any concerns? Okay, hearing nothing does anyone wish to make a motion?

- Do we have anyone speaking either for against?

- I didn't see anyone with good.

- I just wanted to check.
- Thank you. Any motion?
- I make a motion to approve Mr. Yang to address specific 1100 North Van Burey Avenue.
- Is there a second?
- I'll second.
- Right you should have the vote. Motion passes four to one.
- Okay, Mr. Yang, you've been approved to the address that you requested and would you like the documentation letter sent to that address?
- [Sonia] Yes, please mail it to me. I don't have a place to live so yeah. I wanted to go there. Please send that information to me.
- Okay, well you've been granted permission to live there.
- [Sonia] Thank you to all of you guys.
- Thank you.
- Thank you. Okay, the next individual is Ignacio Vallarta requesting to move to 2409 Manitowoc Road.
- Yes.
- And I believe Mr. Vallarta you have an attorney with you as well.
- Yes I do.
- Okay, just before we proceed please do not refer to your, the victim at, by name or by relationship to you. So don't say for example, sister, mother, daughter, whatever, for others. In addition to that you have the right to have your treatment discussed in private or in public. How do you wish to proceed?
- Public
- Oh no, oh, no. No, thank you very much.
- [Sonia] I'm going to dismiss myself. My pleasure, bye bye.
- Bye bye.
- And Mr. Vallarta what is the name of your attorney?
- Megan.

- Last name please.
- Caroloo Okay, and can you spell that?
- She's right here next to me.
- It's C-A-R-O-L-O-O.
- And how do you spell Megan?
- It's M-E-G-A-N.
- Okay, thank you.
- Yep.
- And let's see, Mr. Vallarta you are requesting to move to, let's see if I can buy, a 2409 Manitowoc Road as was previously stated. And could you tell us briefly or tell us about your.
- I'm a sex offender technically, Girlfriend was underage and she got .
- Okay, and what exactly was the crime? What are the facts behind the crime? And again please don't discuss the relationship so that your victim is identified.
- It's all good. Oh, I met her at a club. We were dating her family knew about it. Her mom back that up.
- Please don't. Okay.
- Oh, I'm sorry.
- Yeah.
- Somebody will back it up too. She was under age. I was older not I mean when she was 14 and I was 19 at the time she was, got pregnant, had my first daughter with her back in 2010.
- Okay. And how old was she when she had the baby?
- 15.
- Okay.
- You say you met her at a club?
- Yes.
- What kind of club?
- It was there was a Mexican club that used to that was open here at the pier which used to be called Baluka but it's not open anymore.

- Okay. And let's see, Commander. Is that description of the facts the same as what you have in your report or in the complaint?
- Yes. You're talking to me?
- Nope. Commander Ebel.
- Sorry.
- That's okay.
- Melissa he may not have anything cause Mr. Vallarta has come in front of the board before. So he, this isn't his first time so Paul Commander Ebel may not have his information in front of them.
- Okay. All righty. Does anyone have any questions?
- Is it your wife, fiancé, girlfriend, who is buying the house?
- My girlfriend, my fiancé.
- Okay.
- We bought the property already. She has it.
- And you're just requesting to move in with her.
- Correct. and my daughter.
- Is this the same daughter or a different daughter.
- Different daughter.
- Okay.
- Does anyone have any questions about treatment?
- I would just like to say, I don't really have anything to say. He has been before the board several occasions, so I don't need to hear really anything.
- Okay. All right. Then someone, does anyone have a motion?
- Attorney wants to speak.
- I'm sorry, speak.
- I'm not sure if some members of the board got it. His girlfriend was going to be here today if she put, but I was not able to get off of work. I did just send a letter from her, but add that to what has spoken on his behalf.

- Thank you.
- I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Vallarta to move to 2209 Manitowoc road address specific.
- Do we have a second?
- I will second.
- Right you should have the vote. motion passes unanimously.
- Okay, Mr. Vallarta, you've been approved to live at that address on Manitowoc Road. What would you like the documentation sent? To your current address that we have, or the one on Manitowoc Road.
- Manitowoc Road please.
- And thank you.
- Thank you.
- Thank you for accommodating me.
- No worries, thank you. Okay, now the, just so everything, once I'm aware on the agenda original items number two, and number three the two applicants are requesting to reside together at that location. Okay. So let's Mr. Brian Blodgett.
- Yeah.
- Okay one moment. Oops. Okay, Mr. Blodgett as I stated before please, when we're discussing these that's about your crime, please do not mention the victim or anyone by name,
- Okay.
- Not describe them as according to relationship to them, whether it was brother, sister, aunt and uncle, what have you. And the other question and our question I have for you is for you, is do you wish to discuss this, your treatment in public or in private session?
- Public is fine.
- Okay. And you were requesting to move to 332 South Chestnut Avenue in Green Bay?
- That is correct, yes.
- Okay.
- And could you please tell us about your underlying offense underlying sex offense?
- Yes. So it was a first degree sexual assault of a child under the age of 13.
- And how old were you at that time?

- Approximately 28.
- Sorry.
- No, that's okay
- I met this person when he was approximately 10 years old through a program here in town. He had moved in and out of Green Bay Area on several times. He came back when he was 13. And that's when the assault started.
- What kind of programs?
- It was the Big Brothers program.
- And can you tell us exactly were you his big brother?
- Yes, that's correct.
- Okay.
- And can you tell us what happened?
- Yeah, I'm sorry. He was having sex education classes in school and we were talking about it different things. And which led to masturbation with each other.
- Was this on one occasion or more than one occasion?
- That would be more than one.
- Does anyone else have any questions for Mr. Blodgett?
- How did it come to light? And did she go to the police? What happened?
- That is correct, yeah. After about, I think it was about nine years later, he did go to the police.
- And did you admit your guilt right away?
- No, not at first. That was by recommendation of my lawyer.
- So is that you eventually put guilty or no contest or did, were you convicted by a trial?
- I was convicted by a trial.
- Okay. And what was your sentence, I'm sorry.
- 21 years.
- Go ahead I'm sorry I cut you off.
- I was 21 years of which I served 14 years and 11 months.

- Is the remainder on extended supervision?
- Yes it is.
- So that means you'll be off supervision when?
- Approximately three and a half years in January of 2025, I believe it is.
- Okay.
- And Commander Ebel is Mr. Blodgett's discussion or statement of the facts the same as what you have before you and a police report?
- What I have before me if you can hear me.
- Yeah.
- Okay, what I have before me in the criminal complaint was that it was a multiple times and it involves more than just masturbation also involves oral sex. And it was over several years.
- Approximately how many years does it occur Mr. Blodgett?
- It started in August of 94 to August of 96.
- Okay, thank you.
- Why did it stop?
- Why did it stop? Because he moved out of the area again.
- Any questions or additional questions.
- So you're saying you had treatment while you were in prison and you completed treatment after in the community?
- That is correct.
- Can you tell us please, Mr. Blodgett? You're well, you're asking to basically move in with your partner, Mr. McGown and how long have you known each other?
- It will be exactly a year on Saturday, this Saturday.
- And how is it that you happen to meet?
- Through a mutual friend from the TLP when Shawn was living there.
- Okay. Now what type of treatment have you received? I'm showing that you well you're attending treatment now, but you haven't been receiving, receiving treatment since approximately in March, is that correct?

- Yes, because of the **COVID** cases the meetings were canceled.
- Okay, so just to be clear you did or did not complete sex offender treatment while in custody?
- Yes, I did. That was through a new Lisbon Correctional Institute.
- And that was **SLT2**?
- Yes, correct.
- So what are you taking right now? What are you involved with?
- It's still **SLT2**. I felt I didn't get that much out of the group in prison, just because of the setting and everything else that I had mentioned more to talk about. So talking with Kimberly Shelter, my **PO**, I volunteered to go through a group again.
- Okay. And are you working now?
- I am.
- Okay, and how long, where are you working?
- I am currently a plan facilitator. It's in Denmark.
- Okay, and how long have you been working there?
- Since August of last year. I mean, if I can add,
- Go ahead I'm sorry.
- I started out as a temporary employment through seek and so they hired me early and I passed through the ranks to a plan facilitator now.
- Any idea when you're going to resume your treatment?
- We had talks with my parole officer Kim. She mentioned that she thought I was done with Pablo two hangar. I emailed her earlier this week asking for clarification or proof of that I finished it and I have not received anything from her. Other people from the group that I do talk to said they have regularly been in meetings with him. He has not contacted me at all. So I'm assuming that I am through with it but I have no proof of that.
- Is that something you want to continue?
- I am willing to, yes.
- Okay.
- So I guess the answer to my question would be, no, you don't want to continue, but if you were asked to continue you would?
- No, I've talked to my **PO** about going out to other groups as well after this one has finished.

- Okay, what kind of groups?
- I'm not really sure, whatever is available to me, at my disposal. I've been talking to Kimberly about it on several occasions.
- And would that be sex offender groups or some other different types of groups?
- Sex offender will be fine, but you know, I don't know what's out there to be honest, but yes I am willing to participate.
- Any other questions?
- When did you get released from prison?
- It would have been December 11th of 2018.
- And where have you resided that whole time?
- For two months I was at the TLP on Shannon Avenue. And since February of '19 I have been living at the Arena Motel.
- Okay. Any other questions? Mr. Blodgett in my experience and this is only for me, I haven't encountered a situation in which there were two individuals who are sex offenders who wish to reside together at the same location. And it appears as though you and Mr. McGowan had the same support network. Is that correct?
- Yes it is. Between my sister, a family friend and Shawn's dad and the rest of my family who live out of town. But I have my two sisters here they are, would like to share information as well.
- Okay now what happens if, well, first of all, have you ever resided together before?
- At this point no. Because that's not allowed at the Arena Motel, but because Shawn is considered homeless, he does live with my sister.
- Where does your sister reside?
- In Alloway.
- And you said you've been together for a year?
- Yes, that is correct. Yeah, it will be a year this Saturday.
- Anything else anyone? And as Steve said I believe you have people who wish to speak on your behalf, is that correct?
- Yes, I have my sister Barbara that would like to speak.
- And Deanna or Rachel is Barbara listed or.
- I just need a first and last name and a home address.

- Oh, he's on mute let me try unmute him.
- Mr. Blodgett you're on mute.
- Okay, hi.
- Yes, thank you. And can you tell us your first and last name please? And spell them?
- Barbara Burkart.
- B-U-R-K-A-R-T.
- And your address please?
- 2680 Beaumont Street.
- And is that in the city of Green Bay?
- Village of Allouez.
- Village of Allouez, thank you. And you wish to speak on behalf of your brother, Mr. Blodgett?
- Yes, Brian's been home with us for about a year and a half now. He's been in a stable relationship with Shawn for a year. Shawn has been staying here six nights out of seven. Brian is a third shift plant manager So he drops Shawn out here on his way to work and picks him up again in the morning. We've been doing that for a lot of months now, which is kind of been a good thing. 'Cause we've got to know Shawn very well also and Shawn's dad and we call it our quirky little family because that's exactly us. Brian has stayed in the Arena for a long time and he's got a solid job, no debt, great credit reference. And this would be like a stepping stone for them before home ownership again, Brian used to own his home. So that's something that he's working towards. And I guess that's about it unless you've got some questions.
- So they, the board members have questions? Okay, I, nobody seems to have any questions for you. Thank you very much, Mrs. Burkart. is there anyone else who's here to speak on your behalf, Mr. Blodgett?
- No, the other person Cherry will speak for Shawn.
- Okay, thank you. Okay, does anyone wish to make a motion?
- I move to approve. Address specific.
- Is there a second?
- Is that 332 South Chestnut Avenue?
- Just to, just to clarify the address on the record?
- I think, I think so. It says we're at the correct address.
- That's where he applied for yes.

- Yes it is correct.

- Is there a second? There is no second, that motion fails. Does anybody else have a motion they'd like to make? I will make a motion to approve address specific for a period of four months and at four months date, I ask that you return Mr. Blodgett just to make sure everything is going well, because my concern is that you can be in a relationship with someone for over a year, but unless and until you live together, that's when rubber meets the road so just be, and that would be my concern. Is there a second?

- I will second that.

- You should have the vote. Motion passes unanimously.

- Okay, Mr. Blodgett you've been approved to reside at 332 South Chestnut Avenue. You'll receive some documentation in the mail. What address would you like that sent to, the 332 South Chestnut Avenue address?

- No, if I could have it sent to the 2684 Beaumont, the apartment actually is not ready to move into yet. It's been under construction and because of COVID all that other stuff it's going to be maybe another month yet before it's ready.

- Okay. And he will have to return in four months and I would like to see how you're doing. And if you'd like to bring or provide our department, any additional documentation regarding your job or anything like that anything you want us to know about, please provide it to a law department prior to your next hearing date okay.

- Very good, thank you for your time.

- Thank you. Okay, one moment. Okay next to speak before the board is Mr. McGowan, Shawn McGowan. Mr. McGowan I'm not sure if you've listened before, but I just want to repeat that when you discuss the facts behind your sex offense, please do not refer to the victim by his or her first name. Do not refer to that person by their relationship to you, cousin, niece and nephew what have you, and can you tell us right now whether or not you have wished to get your treatment in person or in private session.

- In person is fine, please.

- okay.

- Alright, I'm sorry in public, I'm sorry.

- Yes, in public is fine yeah thank you.

- Okay.

- And as we stated during Mr. Blodgetts hearing, you wish to move to 332 South Chestnut Avenue in Green Bay, is that correct?

- Yes, ma'am that's correct.

- Okay. And can you tell us please about your specific offense?

- Yes ma'am. I was charged and convicted of child enticement in 2007.
- Okay. And how old was the victim at that time?
- Six years old.
- And how old were you at that time?
- 27.
- Thank you.
- And can you tell us how the incident or the sex offense was brought to the attention of the police department?
- Yes ma'am the, am I allowed to say the victim?
- Sure.
- Okay. The victim made mention to her family of a sexual assault and the family in turn notified police and authorities regarding this.
- Okay, can you tell us, was this a one time incident or was this continued activity?
- A one time incident.
- And what happened?
- This was a sexual trauma and the sexual assault to my victim.
- Factually what happened?
- Okay. With use of a sex toy while the victim was visiting me at my house for a weekend in Green Bay, Brown County.
- What is the victim the victim was six? Was the victim asleep? What, what were the facts surrounding the use of the sex toy.
- Okay. The victim was awake. This was in the bathroom of my apartment where I assaulted her using a sex toy.
- And you said that the victim was in the bathroom, correct?
- Oh, that's correct yes.
- Were you bathing with her? Was she using the toilet? Can you tell us a little bit more?
- Oh, I'm sorry. No, she was in the bathroom and I went in there after.

- And did, with regard to the, your conviction, was this a jury trial or did you plead guilty or no contest?
- I believe I plead guilty.
- Okay.
- And approximately how much time left between the offense and you pleading guilty?
- I believe I was in County jail during my trial for about 10, 11 months. And it would start from the beginning where my attorney advised me to.
- Oh, that's not what I mean.
- I'm sorry.
- How much time lapsed between the incident in which the sex offense occurred and you being arrested?
- Oh, it was just within a matter of days. Less than a week actually. I believe it was about four days.
- Okay.
- Does anybody have any questions?
- Yes, could you explain to me what you were thinking and why you did this?
- I was just thinking of myself and my own personal gratification at the time. I have no excuse for my actions of what I did. I wish I hadn't thought that way. I wish I hadn't reacted that way or responded in such that fashion. And I feel very bad about what I did.
- Does anyone else.
- Go ahead I'm sorry Renee.
- Could we hear from officer Ebel just to Commander Ebel?
- He's muted I'm waiting for him to unmute.
- Can you hear me?
- We can hear you.
- Yes.
- Okay, yeah, exactly how he said it happened is how the, the event took place.
- Mr. McGowan.

- I have a question for,
- Sure.
- am I seeing this right originally the charge was first degree sexual assault of a child though.
- Let me look at, I don't know if I have the charge in history in your, what we referred about the case. Yes, that is correct. It was originally first degree sexual assault.
- Yes, we have referred to first degree sexual assault to the district attorney's office.
- Okay.
- Can you describe the treatment that you had
- Unfortunately, I wasn't able to retrieve or receive treatment while I was in on Correctional Institution or Ash Correctional Institution. It wasn't made available to me at the time because of my duration or my time remaining there. However, I am currently in treatment with Dr. Jim Drake of family services and where we gather to, you know, to help me accept and understand responsibility for my actions and their consequences to others, to reconcile how my thoughts can lead to words or feelings or actions and just how they can affect others. Those close to me even though it's distant from me and I'm learning a lot about understanding how my actions affect others, I'm learning a great deal about how empathy works and it's a process but I'm learning every day more and more about myself and how I can better myself and be better towards other people.
- So what I read was that you started treatment in September of 2015 is that correct?
- That is correct, yes ma'am.
- And but you then you've been taking, are participating in telehealth during COVID.
- Oh, I'm with Dr. Jim Drake. We've been communicating over the phone. I talk to him once a week. We talked for about 50 minutes to an hour. I'm doing that regularly. I'm currently on my prescribed medications. I'm taking those regularly as well too.
- And what type of medi-- is that prescribed as part of your treatment?
- No, unfortunately that is not part of my treatment. These are other medications for other issues.
- Okay, thank you. Let's see.
- I have a question. So prior to COVID were you participating in a group with Dr. Drake?
- I was participating with Dr. Jim Drake when I went for treatment and counseling sessions. We thought it would be more beneficial to me to have one-on-one. Also, if I may add to please, may I.
- Sure.

- My partner Brian Blodgette, who was just on with you. He also joins me with Dr. Drake in our sections sessions as a, for couples therapy to help keep us open, transparent and understanding of each other's needs and wants.

- Well, go ahead.

- We have your letter from Dr. Drake here. And he mentioned that you appear to be starting to make progress. We're looking at ownership dynamics related to your overall abusive behaviors towards your victim. Can you elaborate on exactly what that means?

- Yes. At first about my crime I wasn't accepting it. I wasn't understanding, I wasn't holding any responsibility towards myself regarding that I was blaming others rather than myself, for putting myself in a position of my own device. And now I am learning that nobody put myself in this position but me, I need to take ownership and recognize how I put myself into this that this is what I brought on to me. And as a result, I've hurt other people with this.

- Have you talked to your parole agent about when you're going to start your sex offender treatment?

- That hasn't been brought up yet. As far as like when to start a sex offender treatment, I'm currently working with Jim Drake right now, and we're kind of working our way more and more into addressing my sexual offense and how to learn from it and you know work with it and just make myself a better person so I don't re-offend.

- And what about group?

- I'm currently not in any group right now. I am looking forward to starting a group. I want to talk to Jim Drake some more about that once we're settled with our treatment and our counseling. And I'd like to find out some of his recommendations or my probation officer Myrtle Adamski what she has as far as recommendations go. I'm very open and receptive to any treatment or any group therapy. I just want to learn from my mistakes and make myself a better person. I don't want to hurt anybody.

- Can I just ask you on, on the form that you had to fill out under asking for treatment under sex offender you wrote none, but then you are seeing Jim Drake.

- Right? I didn't know if that was actual sex offender treatment because it's not an actual group. So I wasn't sure what to put down. I didn't want to put any misleading information on there. So I just put none of them there goes, because I'm just in there for counseling and you know other treatment. I didn't want to put anything misleading on there or you know misrepresent myself in any way. I apologize if that's how it came across.

- Are you working right now?

- I'm not working right now. Unfortunately I've been in a car accident some years ago and I'm currently in physical therapy. I'm seeing a chiropractor regularly, and I have surgeries scheduled for my shoulder, my neck and my spine coming up. So I'm going to be, you know, out of work for a little bit. I am still currently doing job research, career building skills and I'm currently enrolled with Forward Service Corporation, Food Share employment training. And so far I had successfully completed a 120 hour call center professional job skills training. I have an 80 hour CLT mid-level logistics technician certified through the manufacturing skills standards council

I've completed job skills essential and workplace essential since my release. And I currently engage every Thursday from 10:00 AM until 11:00 AM with food serve without foreign service corporation and food share employment training for motivational workshops, job training, and further education for employment.

- Does anyone else have any additional questions for Mr. McGowan or any concerns? I will tell you that. Well, first of all, is there anyone there to speak on your behalf?

- Yes, yes ma'am. If I may please may I pass the computer?

- Sure of course.

- Thank you.

- Hello?

- Hi. Yes, could you tell us your full name and tell us where you reside.

- Terri Trembl.

- And can you spell that please?

- T-R-E-M-L.

- You froze up for a minute could you repeat that please?

- Terri is T-E-R-R-I Trembl T-R-E-M-L.

- Okay, and what would you like to inform us about?

- Well, Mark and I are roommates and I just got to know Shawn on one of his sponsors. We have no problem with any drugs or alcohol, or he's always helping whenever he can and needs to get ready to get out there to job field.

- Does anyone have any questions for Mrs. Trembl or Ms. Trembl? Thank you very much, Ms. Trembl.

- You're welcome. Thank you.

- Mr. McGowan do you have anyone else that wishes to speak on your behalf?

- No, no, ma'am.

- Okay Thank you. I will tell you my concern.

- Yes ma'am.

- Is that you have not had any sex offender treatment at all.

- Okay.

- And I understand that you are in individual sessions with Mr. Drake but that's not the same necessarily as having a group treatment where people hold each other, offenders keep each other accountable or hold each other accountable, and adding to that is when you have the burden of not necessarily a new relationship but a new relationship and what you're living with one another when you haven't done that before, that's a concern. And the fact that even though you both started out in a place where you were in denial about what you had done.

- Yes Ma'am.

- And that is something that you're still working through. So those are my concerns.

- If I may say something please.

- Sure.

- Brian Blodgett is probably my biggest support system and my biggest support network. I made stay at the sister's house six nights out of the week here in Alloway but one night every week, I stayed with Brian at his place, but during the daytime, I'm with Brian at his place. And we spend a lot of our time together very deeply, very intimately. We talked about everything together and we even discussed what we're going through, what we're learning any of our trials or tribulations. And he helps me with my accountability for my actions and my crime. He's opened my eyes in the past year to understanding and accepting responsibility of my crime, my actions and their consequences.

- You froze up there for a second.

- Oh I'm sorry.

- No, that's not your fault.

- But like I was saying, Brian's been very supportive and helping me with, you know, accepting responsibility and taking accountability for my crime, my actions and how it's affected others. I'm sorry my computer keeps freezing. I think there's something with my wifi connection.

- It happens. Does anyone else have any comments or questions or concerns? Okay, would anyone like to propose a motion?

- I want to make a motion to deny Mr. McGowan to 332-

- Three 32 South Chestnut?

- Yes.

- Is there a second?

- I will second.

- I wanna be sure, so, this is for denial,

- Correct a vote against means denial. Rachel, you're not, you're muted.

- Motion passes three to two.
- Okay, thank you. Okay, Mr. McGowan you've been denied. Your request to move to 332 South Chestnut has been denied. However, that doesn't mean you can't apply again. Okay, and. Yeah. Okay.
- Okay. When could I reapply, please?
- Anytime.
- There has to be a change of circumstances.
- Oh, I'm sorry. Change of circumstances. So I would say based on some of the comments that I made, I don't know if anyone else wishes for additional commentary but if you take anything that I said, but that would probably constitute a change in circumstances.
- Okay. Thank you very much for your time and your consideration. I appreciate everything.
- Thank you very much. Good luck.
- Thank you.
- One moment, please.
- Hello?
- Yes, one moment please. The next, next step is Curtis Brabbs. Mr. Brabbs, are you there?
- [Brabbs] Yeah.
- Okay, one moment please. Okay, Mr. Brabbs you are requesting to move to 1950 Fiesta Lane, Green Bay.
- [Brabbs] Yes,
- The last time, the last time you were before the board, we granted you. Okay this is a 90 day return I believe.
- It's a 30 day.
- No.
- Oh sorry it's a 30 day.
- Right. I remember I recall. And then you provided proof to the law department to Deanna. She sent that to him, correct? Hello?
- [Brabbs] Hello?
- Yes, Mr. Brabbs.

- [Brabbs] Yeah.
- Okay so you provided proof of your treatment to the law department, correct?
- [Brabbs] Yeah, it was, everything was faxed in.
- Okay. Okay. Hello?
- [Brabbs] Hello?
- Yes. Just so we're all clear in the events things come up, you're asked additional questions because some members of the board may not have been here during your last hearing. If the conversation or the discussion goes to start on to the area of your crime, please do not mention the victim's name or your relationship to that victim and if we go into discussing your treatment, would you like to discuss that in public or in private session?
- [Brabbs] Private.
- Private session?
- [Brabbs] or, yeah, public it don't matter.
- Public? Whatever you like.
- [Brabbs] Yeah of course public it's okay.
- Okay. Let's see. And let's see we're doing this again. Oh, so the letter that was dated and the assessment that we received the most recent one's dated August of this year and that you are progressing well. Does anybody have any questions for Mr. Brabbs? No question. How about, okay. That being said, does anybody, is there anybody that you want to speak on your behalf?
- No.
- Okay. And so does anyone have any motions make? I'll make a motion to approve address specific to 1950 Fiesta Lane.
- Should have the vote. Motion passes unanimously.
- Okay, Mr. Brabbs you have been approved to reside at 1950 Fiesta Lane. Would you like to documentation sent you at that address?
- Yes
- Your approval? Okay.
- Yup.
- Okay, well, thank you very much.
- Thank you guys. Bye.

- Byebye. Next, the next step. Appellant is Steven Fischer. Mr. Fischer, are you on the line?
- [Fischer] Yes.
- Okay, one moment.
- Sorry I'm currently at work right now at the same time.
- Okay. Okay, Mr. Fischer For a brief review if we discuss the facts of the underlying criminal offense, please do not state the name of your victim nor tell us about the relationship you had to that victim. For example, don't mention our state that the person was your brother or sister or aunt or uncle is okay. And also with regard to your treatment, would you like to discuss that in private session or in public session?
- Public is fine.
- Okay. Now I just want to make sure I understand. It appears as though you were previously approved to live at 1426 Eliza Street, correct?
- Yes.
- And am I reading this right? And that you are asking to be approved again to the same address?
- No, it's actually 1427 Eliza Street It's the house that is right across the street from us.
- Okay. Okay, so. Yeah, so cause for some reason that information was blocked out on your application.
- I don't know.
- Oh Melissa.
- Yes.
- It's typed above versus age relationship of those you plan to live with. I tried to highlight it and it wouldn't let me highlight it in Adobe
- Okay. Okay. All right. Quick question. Does, do any of the board members wish to hear about The underlying facts of the criminal offense? The sex offense?
- I don't need to.
- No.
- Okay, and does anyone have any questions for Mr. Fischer about his treatment?
- No.
- No? Okay, so would anyone like to make a motion?
- I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Fischer to 1427 Eliza street address specific.

- Is there a second?
- I second.
- Should have the vote. Motion passes four to zero to one.
- Huh?
- I have to abstain Steven I think you understand why I have to abstain, right?
- No, I'm not exactly sure.
- I was your principal.
- For East High School?
- Yes.
- Yeah. Growing up I didn't really I wasn't in the best of mind, I'm all better now.
- You look better.
- Well, that says something that the principal remembers you. Okay, well. That's good. So Mr. Fischer, you've been approved to 1427 Eliza Street. Would you like that the approval documents sent to you at that address or your current address?
- Send it to the 1426 Eliza.
- Okay. Oh, we finally are settling on the house. I think they're going to try between the 24th and the 28th of August.
- Okay. I'm sorry.
- We're buying the house.
- Okay. Alrighty, well, that's it. Thank you very much.
- Yep, thank you.
- Okay.
- Oh, right next up. Just can somebody, as a heads up take over for momentarily for me? I can start with Mr. Daniel Hebb. Can I have a volunteer?
- Sure.
- Thank you. Mr. Hebb are you there?
- [Hebb] Yes.

- Okay And Mr. Hebb I'm just going to tell you or remind you if we discussed the facts of your case, please do not mention the victim's name nor mention your relationship to that person for example, please don't say whether that person is your brother, your sister, your child what have you, and if we discussed the facts of the your treatment, would you like to discuss that in a public session or private session?

- Public will be okay.

- Okay, and just I want to be sure I understand this. It appears as though you're requesting to change apartments at 521 South Oakland from apartment three to apartment one.

- Correct.

- Okay. All right, based on that information would anybody like to ask any questions Mr. Hebb?

- No.

- Okay. And would anybody like to ask any questions about Mr. Hebb's treatment?

- No And just so it's clear, Mr. Hebb has already been before the board previously for the specifics straight to adjust just a different apartment number. And would anyone like to make a motion?

- I'll make the motion to approve Mr. Hebb address specific 521 Oakland department one.

- Is there a second?

- I'll second. You should have the vote. It's waiting for Renee's vote.

- I don't have it.

- Okay. Motion passes unanimously.

- Okay, Mr. Hebb you've been approved to change apartments in your building. Would you like the approval documentation sent to the your address at apartment one or apartment three?

- Apartment three for now I didn't change my mailing address yet.

- Okay. All right, thank you very much.

- Thank you.

- Okay. Okay, and next up board is Cody DeGrave.

- Hello?

- Hello. Okay, let's just degrade. I don't know if you've been listening to the other hearings, but if we just, excuse me, discuss the facts of the underlying offense. Please be sure not to mention the victim's name or your relationship to that person. In addition to that, would you like to talk about your treatment plan or your treatment in public session or private?

- Public is fine.

- Okay. And it also appears that you were last before the board on April 11th, 2018, if that's okay. And you wish to move from.

- From 2636 Hazelwood lane.

- Yeah, yeah. To 884 Shannon Avenue, correct?

- Correct.

- Is Hazelwood Lane in Green Bay?

- Yeah. How did you get from where we approved you in Vanderbrack to Hazelwood without coming to see us?

- Well, my probation officer, I said, I told my probation officer I said, well, I got to put in. 'Cause she knows I live here and I told her, I had to put in to put in here. She said, my PO told me she said, no, you don't need, she was, you were already for a 2636 Hazelwood Lane. You don't need to do it again.

- I am showing that he was approved to reside at 2636 Hazelwood lane back in 2017.

- Right, and that's that I was gonna ask, I was gonna ask my PO for the papers to go in front of you she said, no, you don't need to do that again. You were already approved that address.

- Yeah, that's true.

- Okay.

- And.

- Go ahead.

- And the new address that I'm going to live at my sister's house. And actually the only reason I have to move is because the father of my stepdaughter, I've been with this woman for 13 years and he hasn't been around in 10 years and he wants to start problems. And so he contacted my PO, which had no problem with me living here with the kids and made a big deal and said, I don't want him around my daughter. So there's nothing that the probation officers can do is she said I can't, she goes, "Oh, you can't stay there anymore." So I have to, now I have to move out of my home and go live with my sister until I'm off probation.

- And when does your probation end?

- Another a year, a year and a half, two years or something like that.

- Okay. Okay, with regards to the underlying offense, does anyone have any questions? No. I know that you picked up a new case in 2019. Is that correct?

- That's correct, I was, I was at the time I was at Vincent drive smoking marijuana at the time and I was there to go see my probation officer. So I ended up absconding from my probation

officer. And during that time, Sor could send me some papers in the mail and I had never sent, I didn't send the papers back to them and they, and I, then they charged me for it.

- Okay. Okay, and that was a middle counter?

- No, no, that was no. That was actually that's a past case.

- Okay.

- That all stemmed around, my drug addiction back then too. I had went through several drug treatments.

- Okay. And I'm showing you in 2019, it was to provide information as well.

- That's what I was referring to.

- Okay. Okay, that was in 2019 How long were you considered a, did not report?

- Like three yeah three weeks or something or a month or something? Couple months I, I don't remember if it was not long.

- Okay. And then the of that was the best of moveable property.

- Yeah. So I was in jail for 14 months on all of that. And during that time they charged me with that, with that felony.

- Okay. Well they didn't charge. I was, yeah. They didn't charge me for quite a long time.

- Alrighty. Let's see. And are you working now?

- I'm not yet, I pour concrete, then everything's kind of been pretty slow and the fields that I do they work in.

- Does anyone have any question? And does anyone have any questions about Mr. DeGrave's treatment?

- I have a question about, so you, are you in rehab? Have you done any relapse work?

- Yes, I've done after care and I've completed it all on my probation. So I don't have any, she doesn't, I don't have to, I'm not in any groups sharing or nothing like that and years ago I seen Jim Drake, but they decided that I didn't need that anymore. So I've been doing pretty good, you know, I do pretty well. I got a good family you know I've been with the same woman for 13 years. She's got a good career. So I just, everything was pretty well.

- All right, and is there anyone here to, to speak on your behalf?

- Jeremiah. Hello?

- And could you tell us what your name is and spell it please?

- Kristen, K-R-I-S-T-I-N Broghagen B-R-O-G-H-A-G-E-N

- Okay, and your address please? 2636 Hazel Oak Lane.
- Okay. And what would you like for us to know?
- What, just everything that he said. He went through his treatment and as far as I'm concerned, he's been sober since summer of 2018. So I think things are good.
- Okay. Alrighty. Does any, is there anyone else that is going to speak on your behalf?
- No.
- Okay Would anyone like to make a motion?
- Yeah. So I'll move that we approve Mr. DeGrave to 884 Shannon Avenue
- I'll second that motion now.
- You should have that vote. Motion passes unanimously.
- Okay, Mr. DeGrave you've been approved to move to 884 Shannon Avenue in Green Bay Would you like the approval documents sent to you or would you like them sent to at that address or are the Hazel Lane address.
- I guess you'll send to the Hazel Lane address.
- Alrighty, well, do you have a question?
- No, that's it.
- Okay, well thank you very much. Okay, Heidi, would you, could you just take over please?
- Sure, thank you. Next, we're going to hear the appeal of Gerald McCormack. Gerald, can you hear us? He needs to unmute, I just tried to unmute him.
- Gerald, do you hear us now?
- [Gerald] Yeah, I hear you.
- Okay, so you are requesting to move to 2224 Imperial lane. Is that correct?
- Yes I am.
- Okay. And let me get there. You were last before the board in March of 2018, living at 2224 Imperial Lane, apartment number two. Is that correct?
- Yes ma'am.
- Okay. And basically you're just asking to move to a different apartment.
- Yes ma'am.

- What happened when you became homeless?
- Yes ma'am because I have got, I got a having sex without reporting to my probation officer.
- What, what happened?
- I have sex without reporting it to my probation officer.
- You had sex?
- Yeah, what I'm saying now, without reporting it to my probation officer. I report anytime I have sex to my probation officer, but that time I didn't report it. So I did 10 months in jail for it.
- And when did you get out?
- I got out May no, March 31st. Then I lived there the TLP for two months.
- And why didn't you report it?
- What you saying?
- Why didn't you report it to your parole officer if you were supposed to?
- It wasn't a plan for me to have sex, it was a female I got into and I went over and picked her up that night and then we have sex, but it was nothing that I was planning on doing it. I graduated that day so I, you know, went to my brother, graduated like nine o'clock at night. I got home from the graduation. Then she called me knowing her and her boyfriend got into it so she told me pick her up and yet I want to pick her up. - Do you have to report it beforehand or after.
- Before.
- You have to report to your PO that you're going to have sex?
- Yes.
- I never heard of that. Okay.
- I did 10 months in jail for it.
- Okay. Okay, so you have been before Melissa do you still need me to take over.
- Yes. you just want to finish in case.
- So you have been to the before, after a couple different times. Do, does anyone on the board want to hear him repeat his criminal history of sexual history or his treatment? I know some of you probably weren't around when this happened the first time.

- I'm fine.
- Okay. Does anyone want to make a motion already?
- Is she available to speak for him?
- Well my daughter is here right here.
- How old is she? Does she want to speak on your behalf?
- Yes, I'm 26.
- Okay, ma'am you just need to state your name and spell your last name and your address for the record please?
- Okay, my name is Kavonna, that's K-A-V as in Victor, O-N-N-A. Last name McCormick and I reside at 929 Division Street in Green Bay.
- Okay, well what do you have to say?
- I just want to say that yeah, he may have some rough patches in the beginning, but my father he's very dependable for me and my brothers and I've moved out here because I started to get closer to my father and I think that, you know, since it's just the apartment change is still the same building that he should be able to stay there. And that, we would really appreciate that.
- Okay. Anybody have any questions for her?
- No.
- Okay.
- Besides having sex without approval have you had any other troubles?
- No, no. Well, I don't drink, I don't smoke. I don't do anything.
- I'll make a motion unless somebody else has questions. I'll make a motion to approve address specific to 224 Imperial Lane, apartment number one in Green Bay.
- Second that.
- Should have the vote. Motion passes unanimously.
- Okay, Mr. McCormick you're approved to move to that address you know, if you move, you need to contact us again. I do want us to mail that to the new apartment.
- Yes ma'am.
- Okay. Thank you.
- Thank you, have a good day all of you.

- Thank you.
- Okay. It looks like we're done there. Do we have any thing that we need to talk about?
- I'm not sure if the minutes from last month's meeting were approved at the beginning of the meeting.
- Oh, okay. We'll go back and does anyone want to make a motion to approve the minutes from the July 8th meeting?
- Almost.
- Second.
- Okay. All in favor?
- [Many] Aye.
- I'll just mark that as a all yes.
- Okay.
- Okay, does anyone have anything that they want to talk about?
- I do. I'm sorry. So I'm kind of curious about the rules or what kind of brings us up is a fact that you abstained from the vote because you were the principal to that person. Was that just like, I guess I'm just curious, like how long ago was that? Is there a rule that we have to abstain from certain things? Because you knew.
- I was aware of the incident at the time and I just believed it was better to abstain. I had too much firsthand information on that incident.
- Okay. And I guess that was my, thank you because I was kind of nervous like, you know, I know a lot of these offenders from both of my jobs that I had and I'm wondering if I should have been abstaining from some of those votes, but that makes it clear for me.
- Yeah, I know there have been a number of them that I too have known from having had their principal or knowing their families or that sort of thing. But in this situation I read, I remember that one and I thought it best that I just abstain.
- Okay, no, I appreciate that.
- Yeah, it would have been the fairest thing for Steven.
- Okay.
- If anyone who has a conflict of interest that would require a personal stake in the outcome of the vote, if that ever comes up you should absolutely abstain. If there's a situation where you're not comfortable placing a vote, you have the option to abstain as well.
- Okay.

- Kind of like an appearance of impropriety erring on the side of caution yeah.
- Okay. Does anyone have anything else they would like to talk about?
