VERBATIM MINUTES

First, our previous Sexual Offenders' Meeting. So just first, I'd like to start off with a roll call. I believe everybody is here, is that correct?

- I see everybody present. I will reflect that in the minutes.

- Okay. Next is approval of the agenda for the October 21st meeting. Does anybody have any changes, deletions or adds?

- I don't know.

- If not, I'd like a motion to approve the agenda for today.

- Motion to approve.

- I'll second it, all in favor?

- I.

- I.

- Alright, I'll put that as a unanimous approval.

- Next up is the minutes from September the 9th. Does anybody have any comments, adds, or deletions they want to bring up? If not, I'd like a motion to approve the minutes from our September 9th meeting, please.

- I may have one or two approved on.

- Second it.

- Okay. All in favor.

- I

- Pause.

- All right, I would mark all as yes.

- All right, great. Alright, we're gonna start off with our first appeal of Oscar Munoz. Sir, are you a here today?

- Right here.

- Alright great. We're taking, you're looking to move to 1264 Crook Street, Oscar, is that correct?

- Yes.

- All right. As we get started, just wanna give you some, some points here. First is, as we talk about your case, we just make sure you refer to the people as a victim. Don't refer to them by name or surname, or if there was any any type of relationship prior. And then second of all, we do wanna talk about your, any of your treatment programs. You have the right to do that either in private session or in public session, which would you prefer?

- Either one's fine.

- So are you okay with public session then?

- Yes.

- Okay, so noted.

- All right, sir, it looks like you were convicted of possession of child pornography back in November of 2014. Is that correct?

- Yes.

- All right. Can you give me the circumstances and when you started watching child pornography and what led you to it?

- I had an inability to, to deal with depression and anxiety and, and it wasn't anything I was seeking. It just kind of, I ran into it. I mean, I couldn't cope with things and pornography was something that I used to cope with. I mean, aside from also like over eating and drinking, I just, it wasn't anything that I was seeking so.

- The question I asked sir is, at some point you did seek it out because you're convicted of having it. So, can you give me more I guess, what did you get out of it? What, what drew you to it versus the other type of pornography? Little more detail, please.

- Okay. As I stated, it wasn't anything I was really seeking. I was, it, I fell into it. It wasn't in the norm to it. I just happened to stumble upon it. And it was there available. I mean, it's not a, a proud moment for myself. I mean, I'm not.

- Okay.

- May I, may I.

- Go ahead.

- Mr. Munoz, you were charged with 10 individual counts of possession of child pornography. So that means you had at least 10 images 'cause that's how they charge. So, I understand when you say it wasn't something, did you say it wasn't something that you were seeking out, but you were looking at child pornography? But when you have 10 separate images, that's quite a bit. And it wasn't that you saw it once and decided I'll never go, I'm never gonna do this again. You've continued to have these images on your computer. You, when did you, when you realized that these were children depicted in these images, you kept them, correct?

- Yes.

- Okay. So the question is, why did you keep them?

- I had no control over my, let me just rephrase that. In the process of finding other media that I was looking for that kinda happened to find my possession. And there was just so many media files that I had that I couldn't go through all of them to, to individually pick them out and delete them and get rid of them. And it just, just stayed on my computer.

- Sir, how were you caught or did it become known that you had possession of pornography?

- I guess, a detective had happened to cross my IP service and they were sharing a file that I had on my computer.

- And then did someone just come to your residence and then asked to view your computer?

- No, I was stopped in the community and I guess they issued a search warrant for my residence, and they confiscated my computer.

- All right. Just a couple of things that are coming, you went through SOQ training, correct?

- Yes.

- Okay. One thing that concerns me here is is both Melissa and I asked several questions as to, you know, why this occurred, why you were drawn to it, and you kind of, you know, kind of shook your head. You weren't really sure. So my questions is, what did you get out of SOQ? 'Cause usually they go over this quite a bit in

regards to, you know, the reasons why a person starts this way, how to avoid it in the future. And none of that seemed to come up.

- Well, I got, I got a lot of things in class. I was given a lot of information that I can use now. And it was, it's still hard for me to actually express the feelings that I had at the time, and I'm learning to cope with things a lot better. And obviously I don't think pornography was any solution for any problem that I had in the past.

- When did you complete your FMT? Before I ask that, Mr. Munoz, wait, correct?

- Excuse me?

- Okay, I'm sorry. I missed that. Mr. Munoz, how, when did you complete your SO teacher two treatments?

- We completed in May of this year.

- Can I ask a few questions going on into other areas?

- Sure.

- Anybody else? Okay. Do you have a job lined up for your release?

- No.

- Okay. And where, it shows that your father Pedro is the individual who owns the property at 1264 Crooks Upper or 1264 Crooks, right?

- Yes.

- Okay, where does he live?

- He lives downstairs.

- And where does your mother live?

- She lives on Stewart Street.

- Okay, so approximately how far from 1264 Crooks does your mom live?

- I am not sure.

- Okay. And besides your mother and father, do you have any siblings in the area?

- My immediate family lives in Green Bay.

- And who are they? You can just say relationship, that's fine.

- I have a brother down there who lives in the area, and a sister and the two sisters. And then, we can go, I have four sisters that live in Green Bay.

- Okay, and have any of them come to visit you or contact you while you've been incarcerated?

- Yes.
- Okay, and the ones, how many of them have come to visit you?
- Two.
- Two of the four?
- Yes.
- Okay, and do all four of them know why, the reasons for you being in a prison?
- I believe so.
- Okay, did you discuss what happens with any of them?
- No.
- And you said you had a brother?
- Yes.
- And you said he lives at Green Bay, correct?
- He lives in the Pier.
- Oh, the Pier, I'm sorry. Did he come to visit you at all?
- He did for some time.
- Okay, and does he know why you were sent to State prison?
- Yes.
- Did you discuss that with him?
- Not really.
- Okay, but at some time you discussed the reason for you going to State prison?
- Briefly, I mean, I.
- I just wanna make sure I understand whether or not they know what your conviction is.
- Yes, they understand.
- Okay, and do they support you at once, are they willing to support you? Not necessarily financially but once you come back into the community?
- I'm sure they are.

- Have you asked them?

- I don't make too many phone calls here. I mean, I write letters. The main contact that I do have are with my father and my mother.

- Okay. And how do you plan on supporting yourself?

- I'm searching for a job. My dad had said that he might be able to get me a job at his place or my brother. He works for a company as well. That they might be able to get an application for me so I can try and see if I can work with them.

- Does your father own his own business?

- No.

- What about your brother?

- No.

- Okay. Let's see here. No further questions.

- I have a question. Mr. Munoz, on your application, you've indicated that you lived in Green Bay from 2000 to 2006. Your offense date was in November of 2014, and you were convicted in 2015. Where did you live from 2006 to 2014?

- In the Pier.

- Okay. Okay.

- Any other questions that anybody have?

- When you were talking earlier about the different media that you were viewing, you said other media. So, what other media were you looking at to get to the child pornography?

- I was done with the music, movies and pornography.

- Adult pornography?

- Yes.

- Did you rate your, your, your porn. I'm curious about the statement that you wrote on how this sexual crime affected your victim. I'm wondering if you could explain that to me. Do you have a point of view?

- I do not have any.

- Okay. Well, it said, "I feel this offense has disrupted these victims from the healing of the harm they suffered."

- Correct.

- Can you just explain that to me a little more?

- Well, obviously they have to go through a healing process for themselves, and by me viewing their images, I, in a sense revictimize them again. And, I now know that that's my victim in a sense, and I just hope that they can find the peace that they're looking for.
- Okay, thank you.
- I have a question. Lieutenant Danny Grant, is what he's telling us pretty accurate, or do you have more details as to what transpired?
- [Lieutenant] Yeah, what he's saying is accurate. So an undercover detective was able to download the child pornography from his computer to theirs. They used that to obtain a search warrant which was then served at his house to obtain his computer where they found these child pornography on it.
- Okay, any other questions?
- When are you being released?
- I am due November 10th.
- Do you know what you're going to be, if your parole agent is going to have you enroll in any additional sex offender treatment?
- I do not. I know that I completed my class and I was under the guidelines of more avid aftercare.
- Can you go on and explain what that's about?
- There are three colleges here and after you complete your program and there's a need for aftercare, they would recommend that to your agent. And I have not had a conversation with that, about that with my agent. So as far as I know, I am not scheduled to have any more aftercare, but in my own defense, I am gonna start seeking my own personal treatment and there'll be psychological or more so base treatment, I guess.
- Why is that? Why do you feel the need to, why do you want to seek additional treatment?
- I feel that I have, I mean, I guess, I just for me, for my own healing, I guess, after this. I always, I, I knew that I had to go find my own kind of treatment and obviously, and you know, I've been here, it's just as constitute to that that, that opportunity to do better for myself and enrolling in my, my own kind of treatment will benefit me.
- If we asked you to enroll in another additional sex offender class, would you do that?
- Yes.
- Okay. Any other questions? Alright, does anybody wanna make a motion? I'm gonna make a motion to deny Oscar Munoz to 1264 Crook Street. Are there a second?
- I'll second.
- All right, so with the motion to deny, yes voted to deny and no votes is to oppose the motion.
- Did you get my vote?

- I did. I'm just, I'm just waiting on Fay right now.
- It just comes up again.
- Motion passes four to one.
- All right, sir. You have been denied to, to move to the address that you specified. At this time, I deliver to preclude you from reapplying if your circumstances change in the future. Quote something different on your application you want us to review. Do you have any questions?
- No.
- All right, thank you. Next up is Mr. Jonathan Grossinger.
- He's on here. We just need him to unmute.
- [Jonathan] Can you, can you hear me?
- We can hear you.
- [Jonathan] Yeah, okay.
- All right, Mr. Grossinger, we're here to have your appeal where you wanna move to 2641 West Point Road in Green Bay, is that correct?
- [Jonathan] Correct.
- And you're currently living at 3107 Devoid Lane?
- [Jonathan] Yep.
- All right, how long have you lived there?
- [Jonathan] Well, I got out of prison about six months ago, and I've been here the whole time. I've lived here previously before that for, probably around 10 to 11 years.
- Okay, sir, as you know that you were, you were in violation of our ordinance.
- Oh Dean, that address is outside of the city limits.
- It is outside.
- Yes.
- Okay, I'm sorry. 99 or 98% of the city is, is you can't live there. So when I just saw the Green Bay address I assumed, so I apologize.
- [Jonathan] Oh, okay, yeah. It's actually on Howard I guess, so.

- Okay. So, sir, we're gonna go over your case again and again, just from standpoint refer to the person just say the victim or victims.

- [Jonathan] Sure.

- Their personal name, and then also want to talk about your treatment programs. You have the right to do either public or private session, which would you prefer?

- [Jonathan] Public's fine.

- All right, so tell us how your offense occurred, and what were you doing and how it was caught?

- [Jonathan] I, I was taking a lot of adderall at the time and I started looking at a lot of different kinds of pornography. And I downloaded a lot of different kinds and child pornography unfortunately was one of those kinds. I believe I had it on my computer for around three months and then I would, I was using my brother's internet at the time. So they came and raided his place and they didn't find anything, but he told the you know, the officers that I was using his internet. So then they come, came and questioned me when I was at work and then determined that they could have a search warrant to search my place. And then they, they found it on my hard drive.

- Okay. Can you tell us why you were drawn to child pornography?

- [Jonathan] Well, at the time I was, I was taking a lot of like drugs as I was saying, like a lot of adderall in particular. And I was, you know, just looking at a lot of different like adult pornography and, you know, like just kind of led me to that and, you know, that's why I downloaded it. It was just something, something different, I guess.

- Okay, so it looks like you had a little bit of drug training but nothing with sex offender training, correct?

- [Jonathan] Correct. When I got my compass examination done they classified me as SOI. They determined I didn't have to do anything while I was incarcerated, but after I got out, I would have to do some most likely one-on-one counseling. And which is, you know, I'm doing one-on-one counseling right now with my agent. And when I was incarcerated, when I was incarcerated, I did complete the ERP program which included some cognitive behavioral practices and like role-plays and behavior chains. And also, now I'm continuing you know, with the behavior change and the counseling with my agent and I'm like working on more cognitive practices and coping skills.

- Okay, are you currently employed, sir?

- [Jonathan] I am, I work at Stein Gardening Home. I'm a department lead there.

- Okay. Officer, does his account reconcile with the, with what you see?

- [Lieutenant] Yes, it does.

- All right. I'll welcome the questions, the rest of the rest of the floor.

- You said you were using adderall, were you using any other drugs?

- [Jonathan] I was smoking marijuana at the time and OxyContin once in a while, I was taking some OxyContin as well.

- And did you agree to public on your treatment?
- [Jonathan] I'm sorry, what was that?
- Yeah, yes he did.
- Okay. So the only home point you're having is with your agent?
- [Jonathan] Yes, I was told that was all that would be available for me right now. So that's what I'm doing.
- And how often is that?
- [Jonathan] Once every two weeks. I was going every week and then my agent put me back down to every other week. So it's once every two weeks now.
- I thought you were sentenced three years, but you served one year and 11 months. Can you explain that? How did that happen?
- [Jonathan] With the program I took when I was incarcerated is an earn release program, so what that means is after you complete the program, you get released out of prison but that extra time gets added to your probation time. So I'm still reading the rest of that time.
- Are you allowed any access to the internet now?
- [Jonathan] Nope. Only through agent approval I am.
- Let's see. Who would, who is over at West Point that you wanna move to, are you going to be living alone?
- [Jonathan] I will be living alone, but it's going to be in a duplex. And on the other side of the duplex, my brother lives there, and he did get approved as a chaperone through my agent. So she talked to him and everything and he is an approved chaperone. So he'll be living right next door to me.
- Now, go ahead, I'm sorry.
- [Jonathan] I'm sorry about that. I, I have lived there. I was living there before too, prior to my incarceration. Just wanna throw that in there.
- Now, with regards to the documentation that was submitted with your application, you put together, did you do anything, or was it all everything your mom had gathered?
- [Jonathan] I'm sorry, did I do anything?
- Did you gather together the, yes. So that we can take it into consideration when looking at your application.
- [Jonathan] As far as, as far as like, yeah.
- There's the transcript of your plea, there are all these letters of reference letters from your sentencing.
- [Jonathan] Sure.

- Yeah.

- [Jonathan] Yeah, my mother helped me with that.

- Okay. And have you ever discussed with any, with either of your parents exactly what you did?

- [Jonathan] Yes.

- And when was that? Is that recently since you've been released or was that before you were sentenced in State prison?

- [Jonathan] That was before I was sentenced. And she's here with, my mom is with me here with me right now too as well.

- Okay. And if I remember correctly, before you were sentenced to State prison you also work at the site.

- [Jonathan] Oh yeah. I worked there previously and, and they, they knew exactly why I went to prison and everything and they welcomed me back when I got released. And even the, I even got offered a promotion within a few months after getting out of prison so.

- Forgive me if you said this and I missed it, but you received drug treatment counseling while you were in prison?

- [Jonathan] Yes, I did complete the, the substance use disorder program which is part of the ERP.

- Okay. If we asked you to enroll and complete sex offender treatment, would you do that?

- [Jonathan] Yes.

- No other questions for me.

- All right, anybody else?

- Yes, when were you released?

- [Jonathan] It was April and it was late April of this year.

- So, my question is, you yourself don't feel that you need any sex offender treatment, but if we asked for it, you would do it? But you, not on your own.

- [Jonathan] I honestly, I don't really feel a problem with it. I, I think I have myself under control and that, you know, in that aspect, but if you wanted me to do it I would.

- Can I ask how long you were looking at the pornography?

- [Jonathan] It was just a brief period of a couple months.

- I mean, one of the things that kind of struck me in everything I was reading on this one is is that the judge tried to really make you understand that, you know, you weren't just watching child pornography, you were abusing children because that's what this is about.

- [Jonathan] Right.

- So, I'm trying to reconcile with what the judge said in the sentencing, you know, what he wanted to do versus what he had to statutorily, and your, your comments today. So I guess my feeling is this, where, where is the, how do you feel about abusing children?

- [Jonathan] I think it's horrible. I, I didn't realize at the time when you know, I did that, that, that was actually you know, a child abuse and I just didn't realize that. But now, after going through all this, I can see now that what I did that is, you know, considered child abuse and, and I feel horrible about it.

- Let me intercept, I just wanna jump on what you just said, because that, it struck me. You said it is considered child abuse. It is child abuse. It's child sexual abuse when you view.

- [Jonathan] I understand that, I'm sorry. It's probably was just a bad choice of words, but I, I, yes, it is child abuse.

- And you said you were only looking at pornography in general from a couple of months?

- [Jonathan] No, not in, not in general. I was just referencing the child pornography, but yeah, pornography I've been looking at longer, you know, throughout my life.

- And I'm sorry, what started you into downloading pornography?

- [Jonathan] I don't know. I just, I guess just being curious about, you know, things like that when I was younger. I can't really pinpoint one exact moment, you know, when I wanted to go out and do that. I think I would, you know, I was young and curious and I just wanted to see what was out there.

- Okay, but you, when you say young and curious, you were 32 when you were convicted of this.

- [Jonathan] Well, yeah, I'm sorry. I was just saying that when I first started looking at pornography way back, you know, when I was younger, a younger adult that's.

- How old were you?

- [Jonathan] 17 or 18.

- Okay, so, that's at least over 10 years, if not more. And for some reason you segue from adult pornography into child pornography.

- [Jonathan] Right, I, I was, I took a lot of adderall and just download a lot of different things and it just, you know, it just happened.

- Well, no, it doesn't just happen. You actually have to look for it on these different sites and in the dark web where they have it, and then you actually have to select different things, enter into search terms and click on things you like, and then download it. Okay, and I, well, isn't that what you did?

- [Jonathan] Yes.

- Okay, and then you didn't do it just one time, you did it multiple times, and then you kept that those images for a couple months.

- [Jonathan] Right.

- Okay, and, to transition from adult pornography to child pornography, there's a huge difference in what you're looking at, as far as the maturity of the individual's body. And, but, and my concern is that in reading a lot of the sentencing, they're all very great by the way. All of the character references, they were very, they're great, but it seems like they did not only understand what was going on, what you were doing and they didn't, and they seem to, kind of lay blame elsewhere. Blaming it on the adderall. Your dad blaming it on at the availability on the internet. When in fact, there's only one person who did all this, and that's you.

- [Jonathan] Right.

- Okay, and my concern is based on your statements today, that I don't think you fully appreciate the magnitude of what you did, the seriousness of what you did, and the harm that will continue to go on for pretty much ever, for those children who are depicted in those images. Because children can't make that choice. They can't, they're grooved in order to get them to comply. And that takes a while and sometimes they're just simply forced. And so I could tell you now, that I am not comfortable voting to approve you to that residence, simply based on the information you gave me. I give you so much credit for having a great work ethic. I give you credit for the fact that the people who work with you want you back, but that's not what we're here for. We're here because of the crime that you committed. Thank you.

- I just wanna make a statement.

- Okay.

- You know, when I read the transcript, I mean, the judge didn't even wanna sentence you to three years in prison, but he had to by law. He said he would have dissuaded you with six months in the County jail. So for a judge who has 28 years experience, I think he kinda realized potentially what you did. You took credit for it. And unfortunately he had to sentence you to three years. He said you are not a harm or threat to society. So, I mean, I'm trying to lean towards what a judge of that caliber has to say. It's just my opinion.

- I will say, just so it's out there. I prosecuted these cases for years. And unless somebody is a psychologist and actually works with individuals who prefer that type of material and seek it out, I don't think anybody's capable of saying whether or not someone is or isn't a threat. I don't, because there are people who we didn't think were threats, and people who we did, and we got it wrong. It's all pleading no contest. And knowing your, what sentence you're getting, is completely different than having to come to terms in your own mind, and admitting what you did, and having other people in your family that you love and love you, understand exactly what was depicted on those images. So I had with all due respect, I think judge Atkinson is wonderful, but I based on my experience, I don't agree with that conclusion.

- Okay, I appreciate everybody's comments. Do we have Rachel, do we have anybody who wants to speak for him or against him or else someone gonna ask for a motion.

- I'm not aware of anyone requesting to speak.

- Okay. Go ahead.

- [Barb] Hi.

- Ma'am, can I have a name and address before you begin.

- [Barb] Yes, my name is Barb Grossinger. My address is 3107 Deborah Way in Green Bay, Wisconsin.

- All right, go ahead.

- [Barb] I just wanted to let you know that I, I do, I do know John very obviously very well. We're very close. He's lived with me on and off. And I do know what kind of person he is. I know he feels horrible about what he did. I understand what he did. It was not a good thing. It was a horrible thing that he did. I think his really being incarcerated and going through what he's gone through. I think he, you know, totally understands the magnitude of it and the consequences of his actions. And he realizes, you know what, you know we've talked about it but you know, what he did and how it could, you know, really be affecting, you know, the victims in the situation. I just really feel, I know what kind of person he is. I, I don't feel that he is a threat. Obviously I'm his mother, but you know, I'm very close to him and he has a tremendous amount of support. Myself, his dad lives in Green Bay, and his brother, and he has uncles and aunts and cousins and stuff that live in Green Bay that want to support him. And I honestly think that, you know, right now, he's living with me and I think, you know, he wants to make a future. And obviously this is horrible and he's never gonna forget it, and he suffered greatly, I can tell you that. But you know, for him to be able to go forward and be a productive member of society, have his own place, you know, instead of living with his mother and being able to once again become, you know, a citizen of Green Bay where you know, he's got his own residence, you know, he can, he can turn a leaf, a new leaf and, and, you know, grow as a person. He has aspirations to own his own business. And you know, I think, you know, I think it would be really good for him to be able to go out on his own and, you know, just kind of build his future. I think living with me is fantastic. I love having him here. He's a great person, incredible person, and, you know, you know, I like having him here, but I think it's very important for him and his future to build, you know, to move on from this and be a productive person. He needs to be able to get out on his own and, you know, like prove himself. But I would support him. My fiance has been with me 17 years you know, his dad and his dad's fiance who he's been with for a long time that live in Green Bay and his brother, we're all here to support him, but I really feel you know, for him to be able to get out on his own again and, you know, move forward, I think is kind of important so.

- All right, does anybody wanna make a motion?

- I'm willing to approve at the specific address.

- All right, is there a second?

- I'll second.

- And just to be clear, the specific address being 2641 West Point Road, is that accurate, Fay?

- Correct, yes.

- Okay, thank you. Motion failed three to two.

- All right, sir, currently your motion has failed to allow you to live at the location that you requested.

- [Jonathan] Okay.

- And sir, she doesn't mean you cannot reapply at a future date, but at this time the board has rejected your application. Just from my standpoint, in terms of anything that would change, I think that you know, looked at the other case and your case. I think that, you know, getting that additional training and understanding I think is important for us to understand where you're at.

- [Jonathan] Okay.

- So, that's one thing that I personally would suggest you do before you come back. But again, it's up to you and I can't speak for the rest of the board members, I'm just speaking for myself.

- [Jonathan] Okay.

- I agree. I would feel much more comfortable if I knew that you were not only enrolled as an offender treatment that had been attending consistently for a period of time.

- All right, well, thank you very much for that.

- [Jonathan] Thank you.

- All right. Next is Tammy Bonface. Tammy, are you here?

- Yes I am.

- So Tammy, looks like you're looking to move to 319 13th Avenue, is that correct?

- Correct.

- All right Tammy, you've been in front of us several different times. First of all, why you are looking to move.

- Currently I'm in a two bedroom upper and I have two children plus myself there. And my 12 year old is getting old enough where she needs her own room instead of being in the room with me.

- Okay, and are you currently employed ma'am?

- Yes, I am. I'm working at Psalms Partners.

- Okay. And does this place meet with the expectation that you can afford?

- May to me is with everything that I can't afford.

- But you can't afford, right?

- Yeah.

- Okay. I didn't see any changes in any of your, you've had nothing with the law since last time we talked. So I, I don't have any questions unless somebody else does. All right, does anybody wanna make a motion?

- Motion to approve address specific.

- I'll second.

- I'll second specific to 319 13th Avenue.

- Yes, right there.

- Motion passes unanimously.

- Right, Ms. Bonfire, where would you like this sent?
- Can you send that to my current address where I'm at?
- Will do.
- All right, thank you very much. Have a good day.
- Thank you.
- Next is Keith Remit. Are you here?
- Yeah, Remit.
- Remit, sorry.
- Yeah.
- All right, Keith, looks like in your case, you're looking to move to 1232 East Walnut Street, apartment 2B?
- Correct.
- All right. And last time you were in front of us was April the 17th, is that correct?
- Yes.
- Okay, and why are you looking to move?
- Okay, I have my girlfriend, Joanne Ward, which is right here. I've been with her for the last February of last year, about a year and a half. Going on, the relationship has been going very well. And I feel like this is a big step for me to move forward in my life and commit myself to her. And I think it's a good move.
- Are you still employed, sir?
- Yes, at the same company, Wisconsin Plastics. I've moved up in level. I'm now overseeing my own building.
- Okay. Any questions for him from anybody else?
- Is this address, is your girlfriend, has she lived there, or are you both just moving into a new place?
- She's been here since August of.
- Did you say August of last year? You got cut off.
- Yes, that is correct.
- Okay.
- And, it looks like you're still seeing Mr. Drake in a sex offender treatment with Mr. Drake.

- Yes, I've been with Mr. Jim Drake for four years now. I started in 2016.
- Okay, thank you.
- How often do you see him?
- We were going every single week in the beginning. Now it's every other week. All in between the years I've had group. I was seeing him for three weeks. And now we're down to twice a month.
- Do you still feel you're getting value from him and what you've learnt?
- Yes, I'm always learning something from him. I've learned a lot from him. We use, I feel like I've gotten a lot of knowledge on how to deal with things. It's great. Whenever I go, you know, he always tells me to just open up and tell him, you know, everything, and I do. And it's a great feeling because it allows me to work on things and not, he said one of my issues was bottling things up, and like, when I talk to him, I open up and that's great.
- Okay, any other questions for him?
- Dean.
- Or does anybody wanna make a motion?
- Dean, his probation officer's on here. I don't know if she wanted to say anything.
- Yeah, my name's Amy. I'm Keith's probation officer. I have been from the beginning. Keith's been in compliance with all of his supervision and I was able to talk to Joanne's landlords before they agreed to allow him to live at the property so.
- Thank you for being here.
- Amy can I get your, can I get your full name and address just for the record.
- Yeah, for sure. So Amy is an Y last name is Kosmoski. K O S M as in Mary O S K I. And then, our office is at 125 South Jefferson Street, suite 301.
- Thank you.
- Yep.
- All right, does anybody wanna make a motion?
- Motion to approve address specific, which is 1319 street, no, I'm sorry. 1232 East Walnut street, Green Bay, apartment 2B.
- Is there a second?
- I'll second.
- Motion passes unanimously.
- All right, sir, which, which address would you like the notice sent to?

- Go ahead and send it to the new address, 1232 East Walnut.

- All right, thank you very much. You have a good day.

- Thank you.

- All right, next up is Mr. McCowen.

- Hello.

- All right, sir. We're here to, because you appealed to move to 332 South Chestnut Avenue, is that correct?

- Yes sir, that's correct.

- Okay.

- If I may, you were here on in August, correct?

- Yes ma'am, that's correct.

- And between August and today what's changed?

- Well, actually, it turns out that I have been in sex offender treatment since September of last year. I've been seeing Dr. Jim Drake over this course. However, when I went to the meeting here a couple of months ago, before hand I read the letter and it didn't mention anything about my sex offender treatment or my progress with that. And I didn't wanna misrepresent myself in any way. So, I declined to indicate if I was or wasn't. I wasn't entirely sure how that, like I said, I didn't wanna misrepresent myself. So I discounted it. I got some clarification from both my probation agent, Murtala Dansky, and from my therapist, Dr. Jim Drake, which they both concluded that yes in fact, I have been in sex offender treatment program since September of 2019. I see Jim Drake regularly once a week. We spend about an hour together. Phone right now because no contact. And he says I'm doing really well. I think I'm doing really well too. I've learned quite a bit from him mostly with transparency issues, intimacy and my emotions.

- So before we, I guess, follow up that we check to make sure that you're okay with the talking about your treatment program in public. Are you, I'm assuming you're okay with that?

- Oh absolutely, yes, sir.

- Okay. So, I guess, you know, thank you for the clarification. The last time, and a letter here from Mr. Drake. So just tell me, you know, you know when you, were you affected, you know, through a sexual offense that you've been happen. Tell me what was going on in your life then versus what's going on now and how you're able to, to manage changes that are happening versus before.

- Okay, yes, sir. I've had a of issues with intimacy, , trust. I've had some issues with drug and alcohol abuse. Just overall insecurity with myself, with other people. A lot of that then was about me, my own personal and instant gratifications. And I just had little to no empathy towards other people. Now, after spending 12 years in prison and being out for over a year, speaking with counselors, therapists, and just working to improve myself, I've learned a great deal about empathy, trust, intimacy and boundaries. I've been clean and sober for 13 years now. I haven't had any relapses, drugs abuse, anything at all like that. I'm regularly seeing my counseling, Jim Drake. I see Marta Lavansky, my probation agent regularly. And I'm engaging with pro-social others. I avoid risky situations, risky places. I've been in a stable relationship for over a year now. I've been living with the

person, the person that I want to move in with at Chesnut Avenue, Brian Blodgett, he was at the board a couple of months ago too with me. And we've talked about this the first time that they've had two people that wanted to live together in the same place. That's my partner. And just for the fact, I've been homeless since I've been out. And I've been staying with him for almost all this time, for the past year. So we do have, you know, a history, a history of living together, no issues there. I'm open, I'm transparent with him. We're very, how can I say this, we're very integral with each other. And I've learned a great deal of trust being with him. He's introduced me to positive people. I have my family again, and he's just very supportive of me. That's with staying clean, keeping myself intact, and he is very supportive with my therapy and sex offender treatment. He also recently graduated sex offender treatment program and he helps me with mine, with some of the notes that he took from his class, his group. And we discuss that regularly, you know, to keep me on board. We discuss my crime and how it impacted my victim and what I can do to prevent that from ever happening in the future.

- Okay. Anybody have any additional questions for him? All right.

- Go ahead.

- Go ahead if you have a question to ask.

- I do. Okay, so the last time you were before us, you said you were not in treatment or you were in treatment and you weren't at that time.

- I wasn't exactly sure the dynamics of the treatment program. It didn't say in my letter that I was, so I wasn't exactly certain as to, you know, how far my treatment was going that. So I just didn't acknowledge it, that I actually was working with it. I just wasn't entirely certain of it. And again, I didn't wanna misrepresent myself in any way or, you know, come across that I was in something when maybe I wasn't. My understanding of SO treatment was, you know, a little bit more in an open concept setting, like with a group, things like that, just like how my partner was in a group with, I think it was hangers group he was in. And I just didn't entirely you know, understand it or you know, have the bowl of value concepts behind it. I do know that, you know, for the past over a year now that I've been in it. Dr. Jim Drake and I have been talking every week about my crime and you know, how it affected my victim. I'm assuming responsibility and taking ownership.

- Did he alternate?

- No, that's enough.

- All right, does anybody wanna make a motion in regards to Mr. McCowell? I'd like to make a motion to approve Mr. McCowell address specific, for a term of six months at which time he'd have to come back to us and give us an additional update on his sex offender training that he's had with Mr. Drake.

- I'll second.

- All right, go ahead and vote.

- Just to be clear, the address specific is 332 South Chestnut Avenue?

- Yes.

- Okay. Motion passes four to one.

- All right, sir, you've been approved to 332 Chestnut Avenue, South, which you need to make sure that when we send a letter to you that you reappear in six months with documentation to prove that you've still been in consistent treatment.

- Yes, sir.

- And where that stands.

- Yes, sir. Could I have that letter sent to the Beaumont street mailing address please?

- I'll send it there.

- Thank you.

- You're welcome.

- Okay, next up is Mr. James Bellinger.

- He's on here. I just have to unmute him.

- Mr. Bellinger, you'll need to unmute yourself.

- [James] Can you hear me now?

- Yes.

- [James] Yes.

- All right, sir, the last time we heard from you was back in September of 2019. And so that time you were living at 900 School Place, correct?

- [James] Yes, it is.

- All right, you're looking to move to 1210 South Broadway, apartment 8?

- [James] Yes.

- Okay, can you tell us why you're looking to relocate, sir?

- [James] The relationship I had dissolved. We both had COVID for five weeks and we decided we didn't wanna be together anymore.

- Okay.

- [James] So it's her house, so I have to go elsewhere.

- All right, are you still employed, sir?

- [James] Yes.

- Where are you employed at?
- [James] Meat processors in Green Bay.
- And how long have you been there?
- [James] I believe about six months.
- Okay. I don't see anything from a standpoint of any additional altercations?
- [James] No, I, I just work and go home.
- Okay.
- Where were you working before the last time we saw you? Or where were you working last time we saw you?
- [James] I believe I was working at East Manufacturing, at a CNC shop. I didn't like how the whole atmosphere was, so I left. Went to a paper plant, and they shut down due to COVID and then I got this job and I've been there since.
- All right. Any additional questions for him? Does anybody wanna make a motion?
- I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Ballenger to 1210 South Broadway, apartment 8, address specific.
- I second it.
- Motion passes unanimously.
- All right, sir, where would you like this, this notice sent to?
- [James] The School Place address. I would not be able to move in until the first earliest.
- Okay, thank you.
- [James] All right, thank you guys very much.
- Yep. Our next meeting is scheduled for November 18th, at 4:00 PM.
- I will not be there.
- Okay.
- I am making note of this.
- And correct me, well, that's the day before thanksgiving, right?
- Week, the week before?
- Okay.

- Please tell me it's the week.

- It's the week before.

- It is.

- It's the week before, okay, okay, good. All right, is there anything else anybody needs to talk about, or I was gonna ask for a motion to adjourn. All right, I'll make a motion to adjourn.

- Motion to adjourn.

- I'll second to it.

- Okay.

- Okay, we need seconds all in favor.

- I.

- I.

- Thank you guys is all 100% there, Rachel.

- Think so.

- Bye.
