- On to approval of the agenda.
- Move to approve.
- [Alder Veronica] Second.
- Motion by Alder Dorff, seconded by Alder Lefebvre. All in favor will signify by saying, aye.
- [Group] Aye.
- Oppose, nay. The ayes have it. The agenda has been approved. It's a short one. Committee, the whole item to designate our polling locations for the February 16, 2021 election. So there is a resolution here that we need to adopt but I think we'll just ask Ms. Jeffreys to first share her screen so that we can have our newly designated Deputy Clerk Jamie Fuge, walk us through the designated polling locations.

- [Woman] So here I'm-

- [Jaime] Mr. Mayor.

- [Woman] Here we have the polling location-

- [Eric] I'm hearing somebody very, very quietly.

- [Alder Lefebvre] Mayor it's Alder Lefebvre.

- [Eric] Yes, Alder.

- [Alder Lefebvre] Because I cannot get on Zoom, I'm calling in, I've got civic clerk up. So if he can also not just talk about 'em. Each one.

- [Eric] Yeah, we could walk through.

- [Alder Lefebvre] Yeah, please.

- [Eric] So we've got some technical difficulties. So Jamie's joining me here, in my office. And she'll walk through the polling locations.

- [Jaime] Hi everyone. So we have a 22 polling locations that were assigned, going back to some of the pre COVID-19 area. Yes, February will be a smaller election. So we have had areas kind of just assigned to where they previously were in the past.

- [Eric] And Alder Lefebvre, you want me to just walk through them real quickly, since you're not on Zoom?

- [Alder Lefebvre] So you're going back to where they were before you said?

- [Jaime] In most scenarios. So UWDB was normally at Wards one, two and three. So they were there. We have Crist of the Bay Lutheran Church, 4 and 19. Five and eight will be at Atonement. Six and seven will be at fire station 5. Green Bay Metro we do have, normally it was just Wards 21 and 27. We have added Wards 9 and 14 in that as well. We have a big area in that section. St. Bernard Parish, we have 10 and 18; that would be where it was normally at. 11 and 12 will be the Central Assembly of God; which would be where they were in November as well. 15 would be First United Church of Christ. Wildlife Sanctuary, we're gonna have Wards 13, 20, 16, 17, 22 and 23. And in November we had five polling locations. And this time we will be having six. And Ward 24 we have the Green Bay Labor Temple. Neighborhood Works will be Ward 26, which was how we had it in November. First Presbyterian will be Wards 28 and 30, where we had it in February of 2020. Trinity Lutheran is going to be Wards 29, which is where we had it in February of 2020. St. Joseph Church's Wards 31 and 34, for 2020. Redeemer Lutheran Church, normally that was just Ward 32, but we've added 25. But we also are going to go in their gymnasium, which is quite bigger. And that will accommodate. Calvary Lutheran Church, no change there from previous elections. Would be Wards 33 and 35. Seventh Day Adventists would be Wards 36 and 37. We had that last time in February of 2020. St. Paul Methodist Church has been our polling location for Ward 38 for the last four elections last year. St. Jude, normally that was just Ward 40 but we have added Ward 39. They're very close together. And once again, we're using their cafeteria. So it's a bigger location. And Botanical Gardens, we're gonna be doing Wards 41, 45 and 47. And the area being put into a bigger location. And then Bridge Point Church as well. We do have Wards 44 and 46. And they're allowing us to use an extra room if needed. And then also Living Hope Church and Wards 42 and 43, where we had it like in February of 2020.

- [Alder Lefebvre] This is Alder Lefebvre again. Can you send that out as an email?

- [Jaime] Sure, I did email it this morning, but I'd be more than happy if you didn't get it to do that again.

- [Alder Lefebvre] Ah, okay, thank you. Appreciate it.

- [Eric] Any other questions from Alders for our deputy clerk?
- This, Alder Dorff.
- [Eric] Yep, go ahead.
- Good job. Very good job in getting these set up so quickly. Thank you very much.
