Verbatim Minutes

[Dean] For February 17, I'd like to start off the meeting with roll call.

- [Rachel] I can, I can capture that in the minutes. It's Fay, Heidi and Dean are present.
- [Dean] Alrighty. All right. We have the agenda for February 17th. Could I have a motion to approve that agenda?
- [Fay] I'll shall move.
- [Heidi] I'll Second.
- [Dean] All in favor of approving the agenda, say aye.
- [Fay] Aye.
- [Dean] Aye. Opposed? The agenda is still approved. Next up is approval of our minutes for January 20th of 2021. Does anybody have any questions or issues with minutes? Or else I'll make a motion to approve. I'll make a motion to approve those minutes. Is there a second?
- [Heidi] Second.
- [Dean] All in favor, say aye.
- [Fay] Aye.
- [Heidi] Aye.
- [Dean] Aye. Opposed? Minutes are approved for the meeting. Excuse me. For the last, last month's meeting. First appeal is for Isaac Vang. Mr. Vang, are you here?
- [Isaac] Yeah. Hello? Hello?
- [Dean] Yes. Mr. Vang. Okay, great. Last time we had you on our board-
- [Isaac] Yeah.
- We wanted your therapist to attend the February 17th meeting. Is that person here?
- [Isaac] Not sure, I didn't notify her about it. I don't know what's going on.
- [Deanna] There's a Lisa Gibson on the line. I can barely hear her. She just said she's here.
- [Isaac] Yeah.
- [Dean] Is that Ms. Gibson?
- [Lisa] Yes, it is.
- [Dean] Okay, great. Thank you. I appreciate your, you're attending. And for the record ma'am could you just state your position, that you currently hold?
- [Lisa] My name is Lisa Gibson. I'm a therapist in Lockett Enterprises.

- [Dean] Okay, thank you. Before we begin your testimony, I just want to reaffirm, Mr. Vang, you have the right, because we're here to talk about your treatment program, to have that in private or public session-public sessions. Which would you prefer?

- [Isaac] Private.

- [Dean] Okay. So I'm going to need a motion to move a private session. I'll make that motion. Is there a second?

- [Fay] Second.

- [Dean] All in favor, say aye.

- [Heidi] Aye.

- [Fay] Aye.

- [Deanna] Okay, just give me a moment. I just need to put one person into the waiting room and then pause the recording.

- [Dean] Okay.

- [Deanna] Okay. You may proceed.

- [Dean] All right, we just got out of a private session in which we were able to discuss Mr. Vang's treatment programs that he had. And he had indicated, excuse me, that he had his therapist in session and she gave us a synopsis of a treatment program. How, how he intended towards changing his attitude that the board had to listen to. So, before we move on to any other questions we may have with him, does anybody want to, I guess ask any additional questions before I ask for a vote?

- [Heidi] No.

- [Dean] Okay. So does anybody want to make a motion in regards to Mr. Vang?

- [Heidi] I'll make a motion to deny Mr. Vang to 1443 East Mason street.

- [Dean] Is there a second?

- [Fay] I will second.

- [Dean] Okay, before we take a vote, is- this is public comment status here as to why, why you're looking to deny him. Do you guys want to state your reasons? Please.

- [Heidi] Sure. I'm not comfortable that, I mean he has every right to appeal his case. That's fine. But to basically continsinuate that nothing happened. And I, unfortunately I wasn't here last months meeting, but it seemed like when he gave out the list of his crime, it really didn't match after Mr. Ebel confirmed that it was completely different. So I think he needs probably more treatment or at least wait until after the appeal case to figure out what actually happened.

- [Dean] Fay, any thoughts on your side?

- [Fay] Yes. I guess that, that I'm just concerned- that, you know even his, something that his counselor said too, I'm just not sure that- that he's truly remorseful and something must've happened. So, yeah, I'm concerned.

- Okay. So right now we have a motion to deny him. So all in favor of that motion, say aye.

- [Heidi] Aye.

- [Fay] Aye.

- [Dean] Aye. Opposed? Okay. Mr. Vang, you have been denied to, to the city of Green Bay. We will send you notice of that. Again, it doesn't mean that you cannot come back in the future, unless if any circumstances have changed or if your appeal is granted and, and there's a different ruling. So do you have any questions?

- [Isaac] No, I don't. Thank you guys for your time. Appreciate it.

- [Dean] All right, thank you very much.

- [Isaac] Yep. Bye, bye.

- [Dean] Okay. Let's move on to our next appeal. Sorry. I got kicked out of the city clerk. It's relogging back in. All right. Here. Our next appeal is for Jonathan Gretzinger. Mr. Gretzinger are you here?

- [Jonathan] Yes I am.

- [Dean] All right, Mr. Gretzinger, we heard your appeal back here to the last time. It's right in front of us. Just looking for your record here. So you're reappealing, last time we, we denied you. So I guess the first thing I'd like to do is, again, state that, as we talk about your case just please make sure that you understand to only use, refer to the person as a victim, not by any surname. So, I guess, what we first want to start out with, is what's changed since the last time we heard your, your appeal? I know your packet has a lot more information in it, in regards to people that are supportive of you.

- [Jonathan] Yep.

- [Dean] But is there anything else that you want to bring up? I'm gonna turn it over to you first.

- [Jonathan] Okay. Well, for, for one my risk level for my probation has recently been reduced since our last meeting. It got reduced a couple of weeks ago. Also, I, I'm now in a committed relationship with a woman. She's been interviewed by my probation officer and was approved for a relationship and as a chaperone. And she would be planning to move in with me into the duplex, if I'm approved to live there. And those are the two biggest things that are, that are new in my situation. And I, and I believe that you have gotten a copy of my competency evaluation as well.

- [Dean] Yes, that's correct. So could you, I guess elaborate a little bit on more on that and tell us in your own word.

- [Jonathan] With, with my competency evaluation or?

- [Dean] Yes, yes, please.

- [Jonathan] Okay. So I, I was evaluated by the PSU and staffing agent at Dodge when I was incarcerated and they had assigned me to- With the SL one there wasn't any treatment available for me when I was incarcerated. And- And they told me that I would be doing a one on one session when I, when I got out in the community. So, that's what I've been doing with my, my probation officer right now. I've been doing counseling with her since April. and any other treatment that would be available to me would be putting me with a higher risk level than what I was staffed at through the PSU and the staffing agent in Dodge. So- I, from what I understand, it would be more- it would hurt me more than help me if I went through any of that treatment at, at the higher risk level. And that's, you know, that's just pretty much where I'm at right now. So-

- [Dean] Do you have any plans to do any type of aficare treatments? Just in, in the Green Bay area here in terms of different programs.

- [Jonathan] I'd be willing to, you know, do what was available.

- [Dean] And sir, do you, do you, are, are you, I'm just looking back here in terms of employment, you actually, are you employed right now from the city of Green Bay?

- [Jonathan] Yes, I am. In Ashwaubenon. I work at Stein Garden and Home. And I'm a department leader.

- [Dean] You're a department leader, right?

- [Jonathan] Yep. Correct.

- [Dean] Okay. So how long are you on probation here?

- [Jonathan] I'll be on probation until October 21st, 2022.

- [Dean] Right. Okay. Does anybody have any additional questions for him?

- [Heidi] I just, can I ask about alcohol and drug or do you want to go into closed session for that?

- [Jonathan] No, that's fine. I can, I can answer those questions.

- [Heidi] Okay. I believe when your offense happened you had a substance abuse problem. Have you gone through for that?

- [Jonathan] I have. I- When I was incarcerated I went through a substance abuse program and completed it as part of my ERP. I believe the last time we met I had sent a certificate of completion for that. And also I've been going with, I've been talking with my probation officer about substance abuse and we've done, you know many exercises, behavior change, you know different things to keep me out of those situations. And I've, I've been drug-free, you know, since I've gotten out of prison.

- [Heidi] Okay. That was my only question.

- [Dean] Are you required with your PO to get drug tested and how often?

- [Jonathan] I am. I, we haven't had any office visits. They've only been over the Google Duo, the over the video, so- I haven't actually gotten a physical drug test, but when I start getting office visits again they will be doing that just because of the coronavirus, the coronavirus and everything. I haven't been actually, physically been able to go there.

- [Dean] Okay. All right. Fay do you have any questions?
- [Fay] I do not.
- [Dean] All right. Does anybody want to make a motion, in regards to him?
- [Fay] I will move for approval. At the, at the address requested. Address specifically.
- [Dean] So, just for the record, that, that is, 2641 West Point Road, Green Bay, Wisconsin. All right, does anybody want to second that?
- [Heidi] I'll second that.
- [Dean] Okay. Any comments prior to vote that you have or anybody want to bring up?
- [Heidi] I guess I'll just say that reason why I, I supported him the first time when he came here and the second time, he's taken full ownership of everything that he's done and admitted what he did was wrong. I get that, you know, they can't always get their treatment in when they're in the institutions, just because of the wait list form or the length of their stay. So, I also look at it that he has got several roots here in Green Bay and has some stability and support, that I wouldn't be concerned.
- [Dean] Okay. Thanks very much, Heidi. All right. I'm going to- Fay do you have anything or not or else we'll move to a vote?
- [Fay] No, I do not. I agree with Heidi.
- [Dean] Okay. All in favor of approving him to 2641 West Point Road address specific, say aye.
- [Heidi] Aye.
- [Fay] Aye.
- [Dean] Opposed? I am opposed. Sir, you have been approved to move to 2641 West Point Road in Green Bay. Would you like it sent there or would you like it sent to you?
- [Jonathan] You can send it to 3107.
- [Dean] Okay. Thank you very much.
- [Jonathan] Thank you very much.
- [Dean] All right. I Believe that as our last appeal for the day. Our next is- Is March 17th, 2021. Does anybody have any questions? Anything they'd like to add today? With that I'm going to make a motion for adjournment. Is there a second?
