Verbatim Minutes

May 21st, 2021. Kickoff our agenda, first thing is roll call. Rachel, is everyone here today or do we have anyone missing?

- Deanna, was Ed planning on being at this meeting? Or are we working with the four people present?
- We should be fine with the four people present. I thought he was going to, but he may have forgotten.
- [Ed] Deanna?
- [Deanna] Ah, can you hear me?
- [Ed] She's on but...
- [Computer voice] The host would like you to unmute your microphone, you can press start "star + 6" to unmute.
- [Deanna] I'm sorry, it wouldn't unmute me . I'm sorry, Ed, I thought he was going to be on the meeting but we do have a quorum without him.
- [Ed] Okay. And are you recording the Zoom?
- [Deanna] Yes.
- [Ed] Okay. Then we're good.

- All right, so first we need to have a motion in regards to our meeting, of approval of minutes from our March 17th, meeting. So someone want to make a motion in regards to that?

- I'll make a motion to approve those minutes.

- Is there a second?

- Second. All in favor, say, all right, are we... We'll just say, aye, on this one, okay? If that's okay, Rachel? Everybody say, "Aye".

- Aye.

- Aye.

- Aye.

- Aye.

- Opposed? Motion passes unanimously. So we're going to hear a first appeal, which is Mr. Gregory Mattern. Are you here, Mr. Mattern?

- We need to go over the agenda, as well as the minutes.

- Oh, I'm sorry, to approve the agenda? Okay. So can I have a motion to approve the agenda, please?

- I make a motion to approve the agenda.

- Is there a second?

- I'll second.

- All in favor, say, "Aye".

- Aye.

- Aye.

- Aye.

- Aye.

- Opposed? Resolution passes unanimously. So our first appeal is, Gregory Mattern. Mr. Mattern, are you here?

- Yes, I am.

- Okay, Mr. Mattern, we're here to hear your appeal today. Let me just bring it up again. And you wish to move to 2057 Harold Street, apartment number four, is that correct, sir?

- Yes, it is.

- Okay, so what's going to happen today, we're going to hear your appeal first and we're gonna ask you to describe your offense, what happened and how you were convicted. In addition, sir, then you will have an opportunity to discuss the reasons you want to let the board know, why you should be allowed to live in Green Bay. We may ask questions during that time, but we'll try to stay quiet and listen to you, holding on, and then we'll go round the board and they will ask questions of you. You will have a chance to respond to those things. And then after that, we may ask questions in regards to your tribunal program. And I'm going to ask you right now, if we do ask questions that is, that something you want to go into private session with or would you be okay with being in public session if we discussed the whole thing?

- It's fine in public.

- Okay, all right sir, I'm going to go ahead and leave the floor to you. So again, we wanna understand your, what happened in your case, how you came to be known, how were you convicted, and any information as to why you should be allowed to live in Green Bay? Go ahead.

- Okay. To begin with, I was on social media, Kik Messenger, and I was talking to people and it ended up that I got invited to a room. And when I entered that room it ended up being child pornography. And you know, I, I mean, I tried getting out of the room as fast as I could, but it, I didn't understand the app too well. And it ended up, I got stuck with loading on the screen and I was trying to not, you know, I was trying to get out of the room and not understand what was going on. And then I got out of that and I still stayed on Kik Messenger, but not in the aspect of going for that type of material. And then the conviction shows up as a police officer or I do believe, a special agent, shows up at my work to discuss with me what happened and whatnot. And then at that, I was arrested because there was multiple people in this room and ended up being, you know, that type of stuff was on my phone and I, I really didn't know it.

- Okay. Sir, do you want to tell us why you should be allowed to live in Green Bay?

- Well, because my wife lives here, my step son, and I've lived here my whole life. I know nothing beyond Green Bay.

- So right now, you're, I understand you're at the TLP. Is that correct, sir?

- No, I'm at my wife's residence.

- Okay, are you currently living there?

- No, I am not.

- Okay. Sure, quickly here, is our officer online here today?

- [Paul] Yes, I'm on, if you can hear me.

- Oh, there you are, Paul. Paul, just reviewing the record in terms of his assessment, is that what was written into the record, or is there anything different?

- [Paul] According to the criminal complaints, Mr. Mattern later stated, I'm reading from the criminal complaints, "That he had participated in inappropriate Kik activity, but it was in the past, never used to be involved in any child pornography via Kik, because he was intrigued and curious". According to the criminal complaints, he had done it prior. And apparently it looks like, he may have shared videos and he had definitely received videos from Ernie, in Canada. And that's where we are, the investigation originated from.

- Okay, thank you. Sir, how do you respond to the officer, in terms of reading in the record? That's not quite what you are portrayed to us.
- I mean, I guess the fact is, is, you know I may have forgotten some of it, but I don't remember intentionally downloading that stuff and viewing it.
- Did you share it, as you indicated?
- Yes.
- You shared videos?
- From my understanding, it was only the one.
- Okay. So is there anything else you'd like to say before we go around and ask questions of you?
- Not that I can think of, sir.
- Okay, I'm just gonna open up the floor to any board members that would like to ask him questions.
- I do. It looks like you were convicted in 2019 and got a three-year sentence. When did you get released from prison?
- I got released on January of this year, to what I do believe was the 19th.
- And you've been at the TLP since then?
- Up until Saturday, and at the present moment I am homeless.
- Okay. Did you participate in any kind of treatment while you were incarcerated?
- No, I did not. When I spoke to the psychologist she said that I didn't need treatment.
- What was the age of the children that you were watching in the video?
- I have no clue on the honest age, I do believe they said it was prepubescent.
- Okay. And then in the forms that you had to fill out we asked the question, "How do you feel the sexual crime affected your victims?" And you put, "NA".
- Well, when I spoke to the judge, the judge had said that there really wasn't a victim.
- And do you believe that?
- No, I do not. I do believe the young baby that was in video was a victim. And you know...
- Then why didn't you fill out that question then?
- I wasn't sure on how to fill it out.

- Sorry, I would like to go back a little bit, in regards to what your original conversation was versus what the officer indicated. So it sounds like to me, that you were on this site or this porn portion of this website, more than once, versus you said it was up as a one-time only thing, and as soon as you saw it, you tried to get off. But yet at the same time you said you did share a video. So you know what I don't understand is that you said "Hey, I tried to get off right away, I didn't know what was going on, I didn't know anything was downloaded to my phone", but yet you actually shared the video. So you did know something was on your phone.

- Actually, when I was trying to get out, I did find out later that I shared it. I had no clue, like I said, I was just hitting buttons, trying to get out. And I found out that something was shared, I intentionally did not share any of that stuff. I did intentionally view adult women.

- Okay

- Can I ask what kind of conversation you had, with this group, that led to going into that site?

- Well, what led to that is, I was quite embarrassed that I have a ED issue. And at the time I wasn't very comfortable and open about it. I was trying to hide as much as possible trying to figure out different ways to take care of it. And you know, it, it got brought up on there and some guys were like, "Oh, well here, this'll help you". And I entered that room and it ended up being all that stuff on there.

- And are you still married?

- Yes, I am.

- But you're not going to live with your wife?

- Oh, I cannot, the landlord did not approve me to live here.

- And she won't come live with you?

- I don't know. She is still under the lease with here, she just moved in a few months ago.

- Okay, is there any more questions for him? Sir, do you have any more information you want to provide to us?

- Not that I can think of.

- All right, is there any just general discussion?

- There is a speaker who wanted to speak on this agenda item.

- Oh, sure, go ahead. Who is that?

- I was informed it was Jacqueline Mattern.

- Okay, she can go ahead. Go ahead, ma'am.

- Hi. Just want him to speak on behalf of my husband. We know that the charge is a very serious charge of nature, we are most certainly aware of that. How this all came about, obviously was a very difficult time for him. Unknown to me, until a later time, that this concern of an ED issue was going on. I am fully aware of the content that was viewed, was shared. One thing I would like to, hopefully be able to stress with the board is,

despite the events that led up to this, Greg has, the three years of incarceration, done very well. There were no tickets, his conduct was always very professional. We definitely have experienced a lot of hardship through this. There's been a lot of conversation. There's been a lot of trying to understand the events that took place. I believe that three years of incarceration has definitely led Greg to believe that this is serious. It cannot happen again. This young group of girls was victimized by the viewing and the sharing of the content. And definitely a lesson has been learned. He's got a wonderful support system, not only just with myself, but my step, or my son, his step-son, his daughter, my mother-in-law, my aunt, many friends and family that we have, that are supporting him. Congratulating him on getting a job shortly after release. Continuing to maintain that job. Has had no problems at the TLP or anywhere else in the community. So I would hope that the board would consider, that even though, yes, the charge is a serious one, that we have someone who is trying to follow the rules and follow the laws and be granted the opportunity to gain a residence. And hopefully later at a time when I can, I should be able to, and hopefully be able to, obtain a residency with him at some time.

- All right, does anybody have any questions for her? All right, ma'am, thank you for your time.

- Thank you.

- I do have one more question for Mr Mattern. Mr. Mattern, according to your judgment of conviction, it says that you are to comply with GPS monitoring. Are you currently on a bracelet?

- Yes, I am. But that was, I was told that was only because I was considered, because I was homeless now, that I'm on a GPS bracelet. As soon as I gain residency, that GPS bracelet is supposed to be gone, that I know of.

- Okay, thank you.

- All right, now we just open up to a general discussion of the board, if they want to share any their views and thoughts before we move to a vote.

- Oh, go ahead, Fay, I'm sorry, go ahead.

- I was going to say, the part that concerns me a little bit is that, the extra treatment was not recommended. But I'm not hearing a real understanding of the victim element. And I would feel a little bit better if, if treatment followed.

- I guess, Fay, I agree with you as well, in regards to the treatment. I think the bigger thing that bothers me the most, is obviously we gave Mr Mattern, a chance to indicate you know, what his crime was, and what came about, and it sounded, you know, in my opinion, when it happened, it happened you know, somewhat accidentally and he tried to get off it, you know relatively quickly and didn't want to view that type of pornography. And then based upon the officer's reading of the record, to me it seems like this had happened more than once. And obviously some, a file was shared, at least one file. So I have, I take issue with, you know managing the truth here. In regards to what he told us, versus what we heard from the officer. So those are two concerns I have.

- My question has to do with the landlord's letter, it's not signed, it's just typed out, like anybody could have did it. Can we accept that, as a landlord's letter?

- Rachel, is that a question? Is that a question for Rachel?

- Sure.

- I don't have the landlord's letter in front of me. Deanna, did we have a signed landlord letter for that one?

- [Deanna] I'm sorry, we don't. I'm familiar with this landlord, I can give him a call and just confirm that he did send this letter.
- So any motion on it, or approval, would have to be contingent upon getting that letter signed.
- Okay. Heidi, do you have anything you want to say?
- I understand your concerns about, you know, the not getting the treatment and it's not being ordered. I'm not sure, it looks like he's still on probation for three years. Whether or not, the agent can get him into treatment, I don't know. I guess the one thing that I do look at is, I'm going to guess, he is roughly about 52, 53 years old. Doesn't really have much of a criminal history, it took him a long time in life to get where he is at. So, I mean, I do kind of give him the credit for that. That I do think that this may have been a mistake. For someone who maybe doesn't use computers a lot, I can understand how you can get into an area and not knowing what you're doing, you know, being in your fifties, late forties. So that's kind of where I'm at right now.
- All right. Sir, do you want to say anything to the comments that were brought out of here by the board members, at all? Do you want to say anything?
- If, if my agent can get me into treatment, I would gladly seek treatment. I was at Winnebago Correctional, and there really was no treatment there, you know. But I would accept treatment if you know, it is put towards me.
- Okay, thank you. All right, so I'm going to go ahead and ask for a motion from a board member, in regards to you, Mr. Mattern. I'm going to make a motion to deny Mr. Mattern, at 2057 Harold Street, apartment number four. Is there a second?
- I second.
- Okay, Rachel, we have a motion to deny him, to 2057 Harold Street, apartment four. Could we get the vote up?
- If everyone is signed into their, to the board view account, then it should come up. I just sent it through. Otherwise we'll have to do a voice vote.
- I got mine.
- I have mine.
- I didn't.
- Would you, would you, cause that, this is to deny?
- Correct, deny. You'll end up saying yes, it's, you're agreeing with the motion. If you say no, I disagree, then you'd say, no.
- I didn't get it.
- Okay, now I'll have to take a voice vote.
- Heidi, go ahead.

- Oh, I'm sorry. So what, it's to deny? And what is it?
- So if you say yes, it denies the location, it's a yes. If you disagree with that motion.
- Yes.
- Yes, okay.
- Then the motion passes unanimously.
- Okay, sir, you've been denied residency at the location request to live within the city of Green Bay. It does not mean that you cannot in the future reapply, but at this time the board does not give you permission to live at that particular location. Do you understand that, sir?
- Yeah, I do.
- Okay, thank you very much for your time. All right, the next appeal is Mr. Tray Boerschinger. Did I pronounce that correctly?
- Yes, you did.
- All right, sir. We are here to hear your appeal to move to 2769 Daniel Court, in Green Bay. Is that correct?
- Yes.
- All right, sir, again, we are gonna go over your case. We're going to ask you to tell us what happened. How were you convicted and why you should be allowed to live at this particular location? In addition to that, if we want to talk about your treatment programs you have the right to have that in a private session or a public session, which would you prefer?
- I don't mind a public.
- Okay.
- I do have a question. Do we have to go through all of this? Because he was approved for 90 days and then he needs, needed to come back with documentation.
- No, we don't. We don't, I think that's actually right, we don't.
- Okay.
- I'm going to abstain from this one.
- Okay. So we needed proof of justice and proof the applicant is on a waiting list for the sex offender treatment, is that correct?
- Yep.
- Okay, here. I just have to see where that is, if that was included in our packet or not.

- [Deanna] Dean, it is, he was required to submit that before he could move into that address, so he did submit it. And then he submitted a letter from his treatment provider, that's in the packet.

- Okay.

- Okay, good, yep. I see it, yep. Okay. So are there any questions of him, that anybody wants to ask? Or sir, do you want to tell us anything?

- I would like to let you guys know, I am in Circles of Support, as well, as a secondary group, as a help. I think it's been very beneficial. So that way you guys have, I think you guys have a copy of the letter, from the leader of that. I just thought, you know you guys might want to know that at the time. I, I'm trying, you know, to get groups going, so...

- Okay. Sir, are you still employed, since the time you submitted the letter?

- At this time I am, but I am on a current leave. I am not on a schedule, is what I should say. I'm on, I'm having medical issues. I have vertigo and it's been causing some problems, but I am currently employed. I'm just not on schedule at this time.

- Okay.

- I did have a question. I'm sorry, did you say we could talk about your treatment in public or private?

- Public.

- Okay, it looks like you've been in treatment since March. Can you tell us what you kind of learned in that time? How often are you going?

- And actually it was February, he accidentally wrote the wrong date. I started in February, but yes, I, I enjoy the group actually. It's not as bad as people give it, you know I think it does help. I learned, you know, some of the stuff I learned was that I need to work on my boundaries. I do, I know I do. And they're going to help me with that. They're also gonna be helping me with learning to know what my triggers are and I'm going to work on that. I have been in the group since February, so I go every week. I either go over to one of my group members houses, or we do it over video, or I do it over my cell phone. So it's, and my PO's okay with that. She's actually expressed that she's glad I do that. So I think the group has been very beneficial as well. I noticed some of the things I used to think, you know, I'd be walking down the street and I'd see this, you know, cute girl, and I'd be, "Hey, what up?" You know? Now I just like, okay, well, am I, is it worth my time? Is it even worth me going back to jail? I, it, it got me thinking, about the way I should act and the way I shouldn't. So I believe that it has been beneficial.

- Can you explain some of the, you say you have trouble with your boundaries, can you give some examples?

- So I know a couple people that I've known for years and I say things that you know, are questionable. My friend's married, she, I've known her for years, her husband knows all about me, he knows all my crime and all that. And he understands that I, you know, have issues with this. But I do, I make jokes that I shouldn't, and I know I make them, and I know I shouldn't be. But I have a hard time controlling myself in doing that. But I'm working on getting better with this and making it to where I can control what I say and what I do.

- Do you need a chaperone when you go out and about in public?

- Only to certain places, like if I want to go to like the mall to shop, I have to have a chaperone, movie theaters. Otherwise for the most part, I'm relatively free to do what I need to. I do go grocery shopping whenever, stuff like that. But like when I'm going to like a mall, to go shopping I have to have a chaperone. Certain restaurants I can't go to because without a chaperone, because of, you know the play places and all that. But for the most part, if they have that, I'm just going through drive through. So it's, I try to be aware of that, as well.

- Okay, any other questions for him?

- Yes. Okay, you're living with your grandma and grandpa. What's the biggest challenge of living with your grandma and grandpa?

- As you might have just heard, following the rules. They want me to help with things and there's times where I'm just being lazy. And I shouldn't be, I know I shouldn't be, but I am. I'm 28, almost 28 years old, I should be learning not to be, but I do get lazy sometimes. And I definitely have a hard time doing some of the stuff they want me to do, without complaint. Eventually it gets done. It's just a matter of me complaining about it. So I try, you know, I try to help them as much as I can though. I believe that, you know, I have helped in a, you know with that in general, just to show that I'm really trying. And I, I just been to work, I've been doing whatever they need me to do whenever I have time.

- Then how do you fill your day, if you're not working? What are you doing?

- For the most part, if my grandparents are looking for help, I try to help them. Otherwise, I usually just, I take care of, we have a dog, a young puppy. So she's, she's a little wild, I keep an eye on her as well. But for the most part, we just, I'm usually the one that, I'll be out and about making dinner or something, or I'll even go over to like group member's houses and just, you know, just so I have people to keep me out of trouble and not to get, not to go and do stupid things. I try to find positive influences. So that kind of, is one thing that I do try to do. And someone's phone's going off. Sorry about that, my, somebody's phone's going off in the background. I think it's probably my grandma's. It, so she, so, you know, I try to do what I can to help them as much as possible. And that's usually what most of my day consists of, is helping them. On my day, on my normal days off, I go over to friend's houses to hang out, but that's about, most of my days are just helping them, as much as possible.

- Well, can I give you a suggestion? They're being very nice at letting you live there your grandparents, don't complain.

- Yeah, and as I said, I know I complain. I know I do it, I shouldn't be, but I do. I try to do as much as I can for them now, so...

- Okay. Any other, anything else from anybody else? Okay, does anybody want to make any comments before we move to a motion?

- I guess I'll just that he has done what we've asked him. He enrolled in the treatment. He actually did more by joining the Circles of Support, which kudo off to you, I think that's a great program. You know and providing us with the documentation of his job. You know we approved him 90 days, he hasn't had an issue. I'm okay.

- All right, me too. That's why I'm, where I'm at, kind of with this right now.

- Great.

- All right. Could I add a motion in regards to his location?

- I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Boerschinger, to 2769 Daniel Court, address specific.
- I'll second.
- I sent the vote through, so Heidi, if you're not seeing it, voting, yes?
- Yes.
- Motion passes unanimously.
- Okay, sir, you've been approved to permanently stay at this location. If you do move within the city of Green Bay, you will have to come in front of the board again, because it's address specific. We will send that notice to the current location you're at. All right?
- All right, all good. Thank you so much guys.
- All right, bye-bye.
- Yep, bye-bye.
- All right. Our next review is for Mr. Shawn McGowan. Mr. McGowan, are you here?
- Yes, sir. I am, how are you doing today?
- Good, good. Again, we're here to hear your review, I know that you had come before us prior, and this is looking at, after your 180 days, that's been, that we saw you last. And so one of the things is, we wanted to hear how your treatment programs are going. So we're, the first thing I have to ask you though, before we start that, are you okay to have that in public or do you want to move to a private session?
- Oh, public is absolutely okay with me. Thank you.
- Okay, go ahead, sir.
- Well, I'm still and currently in treatment with family services of Green Bay, with Dr. Jim Drake. That's going, that's going amazing. I was seeing a therapist before him, Jody Overett over at Brown County Community Treatment Center, before my probation agent, Maura Ladansky, encouraged me to see Dr. Jim Drake. And that was going okay but she wasn't touching base with my SO needs or, you know any deviancy's that I've been having in regards to. And since she's introduced me to Dr. Jim Drake and I've been working with him, this has been since I believe, September of 2019. And Dr. Jim Drake is just absolutely intense. He'll ask me a question and he wanted to response right away, he doesn't give me a chance to, you know think of anything or come up with any thing that, you know, to tell him what he wants to hear. I need to tell him everything and it's been going great. He's helped me address a lot of my issues with, you know, my issues with trust, consent, equality, stable relationships, you know, transparency, being open, and being honest. He's also helped me out with my issues pertaining to my borderline personality disorder and self-harm. It's just been going great. Both doctor Jim Drake, and my probation agent Maura Ladansky have been absolutely supportive, you know, with me on this since day one. And I can't ask for a better support network. These guys have just been phenomenal in helping me you know, getting my life back together. You know, just making better decisions, making better choices, engaging with pro-social others, just finding better avenues and channels, for my emotional triggers or distresses. You know, I'm currently...

- Shawn, has your social group changed at all, in terms of, you know in terms of the people you're spending your time with?

- Well, my social group is actually everybody that's just positive about it, they're supportive. They know about my criminal history and my background you know, we just, you know, we just get together and spend time together, whether it's working on music or artwork or jewelry crafting. I spend a lot of time with my family as well, too. So I don't, I don't have any time for getting into trouble or being around negative people which is something that I absolutely need. Because of my previous lifestyle choices, and decisions, and activities, that I'd been a part of, were not healthy at all. They were very, very destructive towards others and myself. And my previous thinking was all about and revolved around, self and instant gratification. If I got something out of it, it didn't matter, you know who I hurt, or what I affected, or anything like that. And that's not what I want. I have people in my life right now, that care for me, that love me, that support me. And to me, that's important. And for me to accept that I have to reconcile to exchange that back and forward. So for me, it just, everything has just been so positive for me. I'm very happy.

- Are you on current medication?

- Yes, sir, I am.

- Okay, and how long have you been on it?

- I've been on my medication since June, June or July of 2019. Do you need the medications that I'm on, or?

- No, I just want to know if you were still on them. We had asked that question before, I just wanted to see if you're still on that medication.

- Oh, yes sir, absolutely. I'm currently taking my mood stabilizers, anti-psychotics, and my attention deficit disorder medication too. All of those help with keeping me in line, helping me with my mood balancement, and stabilization, and keep me balanced. It really helps.

- Okay, I don't have any more questions for him. Does anybody else have any questions?

- No.

- All right. Does anybody have a general discussion they want to take place, before we need to a motion?

- I guess I'll just say, yeah, he's doing everything that is expected of him, above and beyond what we've asked. So I don't have an issue with what he's doing right now.

- Yeah, I feel that way too. I, you know, I think Jim Drake wrote, I think one of one of his most extensive letters, that I've seen in 10 plus years here, as well. So I don't know if he was having a good day or not when he wrote that letter, but that's the most I've seen from him in a long time. So I, again, the same like here. All right, I'm to go ahead and ask for a motion.

- Well, I'll make a motion to approve Mr. McGowan to 332 South Chestnut Avenue, address specific.

- I'll second that.

- All right, you should have the vote. Heidi, did it pop up for you?

- I'm a yes.

- Okay. Motion passes unanimously.
- All right, sir, you've been approved of, permanently, at your current location, for address specific. It's, we will send it to that location. If you do move within the city of Green Bay, you will have to come in front of the board again. Do you understand that?
- Yes, sir. Thank you guys again, very much for your time and consideration. That's, I really appreciate it.
- All right. The next appeal that we have is Mr. Peters. Mr. Peters, are you here?
- I'm here.
- All right. So last time we heard from you was July of '20.
- Yes, that's correct. I was living on 480 Downing Street at the time. I just currently moved to a different area. Just moved to a I've been homeless, but I just got a new place to live.
- When did you get into that place?
- March.
- Okay. All right. I'm just gonna look at one other thing here real quickly. Again, if we want to talk about your treatment program, sir are you okay with you moving that into public or a private session? What would you like?
- To do in public.
- All right. Okay, does anybody from the board have any questions of him?
- How long have you been at the Jefferson address?
- I just recently moved in here.
- You said March?
- Yeah, March.
- Before that March meeting, I guess is what I'm asking.
- Yeah, I before...
- After the March meeting?
- I didn't have no March meeting, I just appealed, like, as I get the forms from my PO, she finally sent me everything for that. Before she, before she transferred over. So I finally like filled in all the letters, that was back, I think it was sometime in March, I filled out that paperwork for the meeting.
- And why are you moving?
- I, my brother moved. He just get engaged to get married. And I had no other, he was moving in with his fiancé. So I had to move out. And I was in, I had to get this place when I was homeless, on the street. Yeah.

- Okay.
- Thanks, because he was moving out of his residence then. Because he was engaged, he was getting married to his, getting married, so he moved in with his fiancée.
- All right. Renee, any more questions?
- I do have, I guess it's a question for the board. I'm not seeing any documentation of any kind of treatment.
- Yeah, the treatment was back when I was on probation. It was part of my probation.
- Okay.
- And can you describe it, who was it with? Where did you have it?
- It was more at the family services. Because it was James, Jimmy Drake, I think his name was. That was back 25 years ago.
- And have you been in any other treatment since? Like anger management?
- An anger management program, which, that was with Amanda Captain, through the correctional services.
- Okay.
- How long have you been out of prison? When did you get out?
- My, I was out there of prison, I was on probation for three years. That might, that was quite a few years ago. I had no offenses ever since that, nor prior record of anything of this kind.
- I'm going to look again. I thought there was something in 1995, but...
- That was in '95, yeah. That was the only case, only record I had was in '95. Yeah, it was, '95 it was.
- So approximately when was treatment?
- That was when I was on probation. When I was charged for the crime, is when I had the treatment. I've been trying to get the records on that and so was my PO, and we couldn't find any records on it.
- And so now will you be living alone?
- Yeah, I'll be living alone, but I have my family supporting me and coming here, checking on me or calling you to make sure I'm doing okay. If everything's... So I have my mom here with me, to support me.
- Okay, is there any discussion anybody wants to add, before I ask for a motion?
- I'd just like to say, I mean, we approved him back in July to live with his brother. We didn't ask for any of this documentation at that time I'm assuming that was because the offense happened in 1995. I'm looking at his record, and he admitted at that time that he had the new pending charge, or the, you know, he had the dispute with his girlfriend at the time. We approved him, no issues then, I have no problems with him continuing on his own.

- Good points, Heidi. Anybody else have anything to say? All right, I'd like a motion please, in regards to Mr. Peters, requesting to move to 426 South Jefferson Street, apartment seven.
- I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Peters, to reside at 426 South Jefferson, apartment seven, address specific.
- I will second that motion.
- Right, Heidi, I assume, since it was your motion.
- I'm a yes.
- Okay. Motion passes unanimously.
- Right, sir, you've been approved to move to 426 South, was it Jefferson again, sorry?
- South Jefferson.
- Yep, address specific, apartment seven. There will be, do you want us to send that information to that location?
- Yes, please.
- All right, if you do move again within the city of Green Bay, we ask that you come in front of the board. And if you do plan, please try to get to us prior to you moving. Okay?
- Yes, sir.
- All right, thank you.
- Thank you.
- Next up is Mr. James Gosse.
- He's on here, he just needs to unmute himself.
- Mr. Gosse? Mr. Gosse, you're still muted. Mr. Gosse? Mr. Gosse, I'm going to ask that if you're ever having a problem, if you're having a technical problem. If you could at least bring up the chat box and type something in, to know that you're hearing us. Or that you're up or you're having a technical problem.
- It looks like he's calling in on a phone. He's not on the computer.
- Okay.
- Deanna, is there any that you can unmute, as the host?
- [Deanna] I've tried a couple times and it won't unmute him.
- All right, I'm going to make a motion to put Mr. Gosse at the end of our meeting, and hear the next appeal. And give him, allow him to maybe log off and then log back in, where he can hear us. Is there a second to that motion please?

- I'll second that.
- All in favor say, aye.
- Aye.
- Aye.
- Aye.
- Aye.
- Opposed? Motion so passes. All right, then we're going to go ahead and move to our last appeal of Mr. Robert Hass. Mr. Hass, are you on?
- [Robert] I'm here.
- All right, sir. Give me a quick second, I've just gotta bring your file up.
- [Robert] Okay.
- All right, sir, you're looking to move from 421 Cherry street to 1313 Saint George's, is that correct?
- [Robert] Yes, sir.
- Okay, obviously we saw you back in July of '20 I guess it's, the first thing to start off again, again, if you, we want to talk about any treatment program you have the right to do that in public or private.
- [Robert] Public's fine.
- Okay. All right with that. Why are you looking to move, sir
- [Robert] Because the director, because I live in a sort of living house right now, and the director of the place had told me, I believe before I move, moved in last year, he told me that he was allowing me to stay there until I get off of supervision. Which is coming up in three weeks. And I'd decided to look for a residence while I was on supervision still, because of, I could, you know, ask for help from my probation parole agent.
- Okay. And it looks like you're still employed at American Food Groups, is that correct?
- [Robert] Yes, sir.
- And you've had, it looks like, no issues with the law since you've been out. Is that correct?
- [Robert] Correct.
- Yep, that's what I see as well. Questions for him, anybody? All right, with no questions, does anybody want to make a motion in regards to this location change?
- Is there any discussion before the motion?

- Can I ask who you'll be living with?
- [Robert] Daniel, of Con Check, he's the owner of the residence I'm trying to move to.
- Do we have a letter?
- [Robert] Yes, I have submitted that with the application.
- Yep, I see it. It's on page four.
- Okay, thank you.
- Sorry I'm doing this on an iPad and it's darn slow. I need a second to get through all the pages.
- I can verify it's signed.
- Okay, thank you .
- Are there any other questions or discussion anybody wants?
- I guess I'll just make a comment that, you know, Mr. Hass has been before us on several occasions and we've pretty much approved him, every single time. There was the one instance where we didn't, and I can't really see why we denied him. But again, I have no issues moving forward with him going to this address.
- Okay, let's put that forward. Does anybody want to make a motion?
- I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Hass, to 1313 Saint George street, address specific.
- I will second.
- All right, that vote should be in front of you.
- I'm a, yes.
- Heidi, is that a yes?
- Yes.
- Okay. Motion passes unanimously.
- All right, sir, you've been approved to move into 1313 Saint George Street, Would you like the notice sent there or at your existing location?
- [Robert] Sent to the 1313 Saint George.
- All right, thank you very much.
- Yeah, thank you.
- Mr. Gosse, are you...

- [James] Hello, yeah, I'm sorry. I'm sorry, I apologize. I could not figure out how to unmute my phone, so I apologize.

- No, but that's why we, you know we did the interview, I didn't want to deny you. I wanted to make sure you on, to treat, to fix the technical problem.

- [James] Yeah, so I wasn't technical, I did not like that it was being technical with me.

- Okay, all right, sir. Right, we're here to hear your appeal to move to 1533 Leo Street, apartment three. Is that correct?

- [James] Yes, sir.

- Okay, why are you looking to move, sir.

- [James] I wanted to move, because my current landlord does not want to fix anything around here. The property is just in a horrible condition, in my opinion. I did find a new landlord, I did go look at his building and the property does look immaculate. And I took this apartment, when you guys approved it two years ago, because I was in my car, in the middle of winter, and it was like 20 degrees outside. So that is my reason for wanting to move, because it's not a very nice place and the other place is much better.

- Okay. I'm looking at your landlord letter that you sent to us. So looks, he just sent it to himself and then printed it for you. Is that what happened here?

- He sorry, he printed it off at the home portal, I believe. And then he like met up with him and handed it to me.

- Okay. This, I mean, I don't know if the board members are looking at it now, but he basically typed an email to himself, sent it, and then looks like it was printed.

- That was the landlord, the other landlord's letter. In fact, I believe so, same name.

- It is the same landlord, and I did call him. I forgot to put a note on this one. That, that's my fault.

- Okay.

- [James] Okay.

- All right, good, good, okay. Does anybody have any questions of him?

- Well, it says that your new apartment is not available until June 1st, so are you going to stay in that Badgers Street until then?

- Yes, ma'am.

- I don't have any questions for him, I'm okay with this particular change.

- I'm the same way.

- Don't mind.

- I am too.

- All right, so I'll make a motion to allow Mr. Gosse to move to 1533 Leo Street, apartment three, address specific. Is there a second?

- Second.

- All right to vote.

- Motion passes unanimously.

- Right sir, you've been approved to move to 1313 George Street apartment seven.

- [James] No, 1533.

- Oh, I'm sorry, no, 1533 Leo Street, apartment three, sorry.

- [James] That's okay.

- Do you want it to send to your existing address, since you're not going to move in until June 1st?

- [James] Yes, sir.

- All right. All right.

- [James] I've got one thing I'd like to say real quick. First of all, thank you very much for approving me. And I want to say thank you, Deanna, for helping me with everything. And also you guys for speaking with me on such short notice.

- No problem, thanks for following the rules. We appreciate that.

- [James] You are very welcome. Thank you. Bye.

- Bye-bye.

- All right, our next meeting is May the 19th, at 4:00 PM. I do want to make an announcement to everybody. I will be resigning from the board effective tomorrow. It's been a long run. It's 12, almost 13 years that I've been on the board. And so I'm starting a new chapter in my life. My wife and I finally sold our home and we're gonna move into Hobart. And my job is just really, really encompassing right now. And so I just felt it was time to, to turn the light on my load in several different things that I've been involved with over time. So I really appreciate everyone's time and patience with me. I've always tried to do my best. Although at times I can tell you I've been really inconsistent and I apologize for that. But all of you have been very kind to me through this time. So I, I very much appreciate it. I appreciate all the support from the law department over the years, too. This is not an easy task for them to get these meetings together every month and to deal with all the paperwork and the different situations that we've asked of them, as well as the police department. So I want to make sure on record, to thank them and the police department, for all their support of this board through the years that I've been here. So then, I would kind of add, I told Rachel that if they if they have an issue, finding someone in the short term, I will be back if they need to quorum or anything like that. So you may have not seen the last of me but at the same time, I needed to make a change.

- Thank you for your free years of service.

- Thank you, Dean.
- Yes, thank you very much.
- So don't be strangers, I'll be living in Hobart, in an apartment, we're going from 30 are square feet, to a whopping 1,100. So we'll see if my marriage can get to year 30, because we're on 29.
- You're actually cool, you can do that.
- I sure hope so. But okay, with that said, I'll ask for a motion to adjourn.
- First off, I am not going to be chairman. I'm telling you now.
- Fay is like, darn.
- I make a motion to adjourn, after having said that.
- I'll second that.
- All right, all in favor, say, aye.
- Aye.
- Aye.
- All right, thanks everybody.
- Thank you.
- Thank you, good luck.
- Bye bye.
- Thank you, good luck, bye.
