Verbatim Minutes

So, since we don't have a chair right now, that's our first agenda item. Who wants to get us started?

- Do you want me to call the meeting to order?

- Sure.
- All right, we'll call the Green Bay Sex Offender Residency Board to order. Now we'll take roll call.
- Okay, I see Heidi, Renee, and Fay all here. All right.
- Can we get an approval for the agenda for the May 19th, 2021st meeting.
- I'll make that motion.
- I will second.
- All in favor?
- Aye.
- Aye.
- Aye.
- All right, that motion carries unanimously.
- Okay. The first order of business is nomination and election of the chairperson of the Sex Offender Residency Board.
- Oh, we need the agenda and the minutes.
- Oh, sorry, I missed that. All right, can I get approval of the minutes from the April 21st, 2021 meeting?
- I'll make that motion.
- And I will second.
- All in favor?
- [All] Aye.
- All right, the motion passes unanimously.
- Regular business is nomination and election of the chairperson of the Sex Offender Residency Board.
- Heidi, I'd be forever in your debt if you would accept the nomination.
- And I would second that too.
- Excuse me, can anybody hear me? I can't hear anything.
- Yeah, we can hear you, Alder.
- I checked out my end, and it's all good. Can anybody hear me?
- Yes.

- Yes.
- Okay. I can't hear anything. I'll try going out and back in.
- Okay, so, nobody else is interested?
- No.
- No, I am not. You know I'm not.
- And I am not.
- Well, I guess if you're all okay with it, I'll accept that.
- Very okay.
- Good.
- Okay, so was that a motion from Renee and a second by Fay?
- Yes.
- Yes.
- All right.
- I'm sending you flowers, Heidi.
- Sure thing.
- Can we ask him to get a voice vote?
- [All] Aye.
- All right, that motion passes unanimously.
- All right. Okay, then the first order of business is the appeal of James Stenberg, requesting to move to 421 Cherry Street. Is Mr. Stenberg present?
- I do not see Mr. Stenberg.
- [Deanna] There is a James Marker on here. I just asked him to unmute, I think that may be him.
- [James] No, it's not.
- [Deanna] It's not? Okay, thank you.
- Okay.
- [Deanna] He does not appear to be on the call then.
- All right. Would somebody like to make a motion?

- I'll make that motion to deny Mr. Stenberg, address specific, 421 Cherry Street.
- I will second.
- All in favor?
- [All] Aye.
- Okay. Next is the appeal of Christopher Charlier, requesting to move to 334-1/2 South Chestnut Avenue. Mr. Charlier, are you present?
- Yes I am.
- Okay. So you're currently asking to move to 334-1/2 South Chestnut. You're currently residing at 1704 South Ashland, apartment 205?
- Correct, yep.
- Okay. We'll ask you to go into detail and tell us about what you were convicted of. And then the board may ask you some questions. We do have the option to ask you questions regarding your treatment. Would you like that in private session or public session?
- It could be public, that's fine.
- Okay. So if you could tell us about your crime that you were convicted of?
- Yeah, sure. In 2017, January of 2017, I went online looking for sex on Craigslist. And it was an underage child, a 15 year old kid that I was talking to. And I was talking to them for about a week. And then I ended up planning to meet up with her at Willow Creek Bowling Lanes in Green Bay. And the police officers ended up arresting me there. So it was an online talk with a teenager that got me in trouble.
- And you knew that she was 15?
- I did, yes.
- And how old were you?
- I was 32, I would say.
- And--
- Were you--
- Go ahead.
- Were you specifically looking for someone underage?
- I was not specifically looking for someone underage, no. But she contacted me, and when she told me her age, I just kept going with it.
- Okay.
- And when you went to meet her, what were you thinking was going to happen?

- When I went to go meet her I was thinking that, I was thinking that, I guess I was really nervous at the time, so I didn't know. I never thought that it was a police officer that would have, I would have been talking to at the time. So I really thought I was meeting up with a 15 year old woman. And planned on, who knows where it could've went at that time, but... I hoped that answered your question, sorry.

- Well, if you were online looking for sex, is that what you were hoping was going to happen?

- Correct.

- You'd kind of want to hear that.

- Yes. Yes. When I was online, yes, I was looking for sex. And although I was not looking for an underage woman, I didn't stop myself when she told me she was 15. I was still gonna continue with it.

- Even though, you knew that was against the law?

- Correct, yes.

- Okay. Thank you.

- And then you were sentenced to two and a half years in the state prison, is that correct?

- Yep, two and a half in and seven and a half out.

- So you're currently on a bracelet?

- No, I am not on a bracelet.

- Just supervision?

- Just supervision, yep.

- Okay. I do have a question regarding where you're currently living. It appears this is your first time before the board.

- Yeah.

- How are you living at that location?

- This is the Economy Inn.

- [Deanna] Heidi, this is Deanna. I checked and it's not in the restricted area. It's over in that little pocket on Ashland.

- Okay. Okay.

- Yeah, that's what my probation officer said too.

- Okay. All right.

- Have you participated in any treatment?

- Yes. When I was incarcerated I did SO-2, I completed that fully. I also am currently signed up for Thinking For Change. I'm waiting for an email from them on when an opening can happen. I also took a bunch of a voluntary workshops while I was in prison as well, as far as coping skills and anger management and stuff like that. I am also just finished a parenting class as well, to help me with my children, with my own children.

- Do you have any documentation for the SOT?

- I don't have it with me, no, because I could not find the documentation, but I do have, I did complete it. So my P.O should have documentation of that as well.

- And you're currently employed?

- Correct. I work at American Foods. I work there six days a week and I've worked there since July of, I got out last June, and about a month later I started working at American Foods.

- Okay.

- And are you living alone, will you be living alone?

- Yes, I will be living alone, yes.

- Oh yeah, okay.

- Does anyone have any further questions?

- I do not.

- I'll just say, how are things different now from before?

- They're different now because I feel like I have more of a supporting character than I did before. And I am obligating myself or making myself feel responsible for what happened and trying to better myself anyway I can. Which is why I wanted to sign up for that Make a Change class, because I know that would, there was a minimum risk of assignment that they wanted me to do in prison, but I never, I didn't have enough time to complete it. So that's why I wanted to do it on the outside. Oh, and I also said I'm taking personal counseling as well, I forgot to mention that. So I'm just trying to stay on the course and I've been working since I got out. I've been trying to be a model citizen and stuff since I've gotten out. So I think things will be completely different. And I have options now. I mean, I had options before, but I never recognized them, and now I do.

- When were you released from prison?

- Last June, June of 2020, June 16th.

- Have you been in any trouble since?

- No. No. No, this was also the first time I've been in trouble as well.

- What prison did you do your SOT at?

- I did at Redgranite Correctional Institution.

- Okay.

- Do we have any--

- And again--
- Oh, I'm sorry, go ahead.
- I finished it and, so I got out in June, I finished it, I believe it was March. So a couple months before I got out is when I finished it.
- Do we have anybody from the police department?
- Yep, that's me. Lieutenant Vanegeren.
- Okay. Is his version of the offense accurate?
- Yeah, for the most part. I think one part that he didn't talk about that probably should be noted is that he had asked who he thought was this 15 year old to send pictures of her breasts, and he also had sent pictures of his penis to her. So I think that should also be noted, that he didn't bring that part up. But yeah, the rest of it's accurate.
- Okay.
- Sorry about that.
- Okay, anything else from the board?
- I have no other questions, but that's.
- Okay. All right. Do we want to talk about anything before we make a motion?
- I guess my only thing is I would like to see documentation of the sex offender treatment, that's...
- And I have the same thoughts. I'd like to see documentation.
- Okay.
- And I agree. 'Cause I know typically it seems that when they're in prison for a short amount of stay, they're not usually eligible for the SOT, that's why I was curious where you'd get it at. Because a lot of them, there's a pretty big waiting list it seems.
- Right. I was very surprised as well when it happened, 'cause I heard the same thing. But then I got notice about it, then I just completed it.
- Okay. All right. So based on that, does somebody wants to make a motion?
- I'll make a motion to allow Mr. Charlier to stay at 334-1/2 South Chestnut Avenue for 30 days, but to come back with the documentation and the Thinking of Change, all of it.
- Okay. What do you want? I'm sorry, what do you want for the Thinking For Change? Do you want proof that I'm in it, 'cause I'm not gonna have it completed by then.
- No. Yeah, proof that you're in it. If you're attending they can, you know.
- Just something like an email or something like that?

- Yep, just send documentation from them.
- Okay.
- Renee, would it be fair to characterize your motion as approval for 30 days, address specific, to provide proof of any treatment completed or enrolled in?
- Yes.
- And I will second.
- Okay. We'll take a vote. All in favor?
- [All] Aye.
- Are we not, do we not have little--
- Yeah?
- Fay was the only one who was logged in to CivicClerk when the meeting started so we can just do the voice vote. I can capture it.
- Okay. Okay, perfect. Okay.
- That--
- That will be--
- Yep, motion passed unanimously.
- Okay. So Mr. Charlier, we will mail you a letter approving you for the 30 days, indicating that you need to come back with that documentation. Where would you like us to mail you that?
- Can you mail it at 354 Huth, H-U-T-H, Street. That's my brother's address. Green Bay, 54301, I believe.
- Deanna, did you get that?
- [Deanna] I got it. Thank you.
- Okay.
- So then I'm allowed to move in right away, but for 30 days, or does this start, 'cause I might not be able to get in there until the 1st, so would it start after the 1st?
- You're approved for 30 days and you have to come to next month's meeting with the proof of treatment.
- Okay.
- And then at that point the board will decide whether you're approved or denied going forward.
- All right. Do I have to send anything into you or do you guys just send me something to get ready?

- We'll send you something.
- [Deanna] We'll send you a letter, and if you can drop off the documents here at City Hall. Or you could have somebody email them to me.
- You said City Hall?
- [Deanna] Yes, to the Law Department on the 2nd floor. To Deanna.
- Okay. All right.
- All right, thank you.
- Thank you. So I can just go, or do I?
- Pardon me?
- Am I free to go then, or?
- Yeah.
- Yep.
- Yep.
- All right. Next on the agenda is Nathaniel White requesting to move to 930 Elmore Street.
- Yep, I'm here.
- Okay. Welcome.
- [Deanna] And board members, this is Deanna--
- It looks like-
- [Deanna] Sorry, board members, this is Deanna. Did you get the email from me earlier with the two treatment letters for Mr. White?
- I got them.
- [Deanna] Okay. Thank you.
- I did, too.
- Okay.
- So it looks like you were here in March, and it looks like we approved you, but we wanted to see you again with an update on your progress and treatment. Are you okay if we talk about your treatment in public or would you prefer a private session?
- Public is okay.
- Okay. So does the board want him to repeat his offense and talk about that?

- I don't need to.

- I don't either.

- Okay. So Mr. White, why don't you tell us how treatment's been going and what you're working on?

- Okay. So it's about, we'd go to treatment every week, and now it's every other week. And we talk about how like remorseful I am, how it's my fault, not theirs. I've been going through a lot of help with it, like going through therapy and everything, just to talk about it with them. And it's been going good. I would talk about like what might happen if an underaged female tries to talk to me. And he says it's going good. And we talk about healthy relationships, how like being nice or, I can't explain it, like, I mean, yeah, pretty much being nice to a female. Like not stepping boundaries, yeah, that's it, not stepping boundaries or over boundaries. We talk about that every time we meet.

- Are you still going to your grandma's on the weekend?

- Yeah.

- Do you have any interaction with your neighbors?

- All my neighbors, the neighbors around are our family.

- Your family?

- Yeah.

- No, not at your grandma's, at where you're staying?

- No, no, no interaction.

- Okay.

- Can you tell me if a minor female would approach you and want to talk to you, how would you handle that? What would you do?

- I would ask for their age, and if it's underage, I just won't talk to them.

- And what do you consider underage?

- 18 and under.

- And are you working?

- I help out at the group home I'm staying at I help them mow lawns and stuff.

- Okay. And all of the people at the group home are adults?

- Yes. The Adult County Group Home.

- Okay.

- And are you still monitored 24/7?

- Yeah. Every day.
- Okay.
- I didn't hear that last. Did somebody make a comment or statement?
- I just asked if he was still being monitored 24/7, like when he went somewhere or whatever.
- Yep. Okay. And are you still seeing Dr. Atkins?
- Yes.
- Okay.
- Is that who you see that has changed every other week?
- That's with SOT. With Tober it's every month, we switch every month.
- Okay.
- Mm hm.
- Anybody else have other questions?
- I do not.
- Fay?
- No, I don't either.
- Okay. Would we like to have any discussion?
- Is there anyone that wants to speak?
- Oh, is there?
- I didn't see that there was a speaker listed.
- [Deanna] I think it looks like Alder Scannell may want to.
- Alder Scannell.
- [Deanna] You'll need to unmute yourself.
- Yep yep. Thank you. I'd just like to let you know that I have been in contact with Genuine Hearts, the company's that working with him 24/7, a couple of times. And we've talked about his status, his progress, and their program, and their confidence in him. And I just feel that there, I've done some checking on that group. They're very good. So I know there's not many sex offenders in my district. And I think with the program he's in, I just want to let you know that I as an alder have no fear for the safety of my constituents. So, just wanted to let you know that.
- Thank you.

- Yes, thank you.

- I guess I'll give you my opinion. I know we were a little bit nervous last time because we didn't feel that we had enough on his treatment and if he was actually genuine about it. But he has done everything that we've asked. I do feel that, knowing that he is monitored 24/7, at the group home, and to have the alderperson speak on his behalf, I think that also helps us. So that's just my opinion.

- I would also say I agree.

- Okay.

- Would anyone like to make a motion?

- I would move that we approve, address specific, 930 Elmore Street.

- I'll second.

- All right. All in favor?

- [All] Aye.

- Okay, Mr. White, you're approved to move to 930, well, to stay there, at 930 Elmore Street. If you end up relocating, you do need to come back before the board.

- Okay, sounds good.

- Okay. Thank you.

- All right. Thank you. Bye.

- Bye bye.

- I would just like to say I've got another meeting I gotta run to, but I really appreciate the work you're doing. And thank you very much.

- Thank you.

- Thank you, Alderman.

- Okay, next we have the appeal of Sydney Leyse, requesting to move to 1740 Newberry Avenue, apartment number four.

- Yes.

- Okay. Welcome.

- Welcome, thank you.

- And let's see, it looks like you appeared before us back in January of this year. And, oh, now you're just, why did we have you come back?

- I was not in treatment at that time. And they wanted some more information and things.

- [Deanna] Heidi, he was denied in January, so that's why he's coming back again.
- Okay. So, you have provided us documentation?
- I have.
- Okay. I see that. And are you currently still, first, before I go any further, are you okay to talk about your treatment in public or would you prefer private session?
- Public is fine, ma'am.
- Okay. Thank you. So you're currently at Family Services, is that correct?
- That is correct. I was talking with Dr. James Gray.
- Okay. Could you just tell us how your treatment is going and what you're working on?
- Well, we're working on a problem solving and decision-making and some of my triggers as to what caused me to commit my crime in the first place. We haven't had very many meetings due to COVID. We didn't start it till April. And the last meeting we had he had to cancel because he had some federal lie detective business to take care of. So I have not seen him this last week. However, we do at least have a phone conversation. Usually every other week we get together and talk. I enjoy talking with gentlemen. He actually listens to what I have to say and he doesn't just hear me and make notes. He gives me good feedback on what I'm saying.
- Can you tell us what your triggers are?
- Boredom. Loneliness. Looking for excitement. I spent a lot of years in the Military. And the excitement and the danger was always there for me, and I kinda miss that. I was also a roller coaster fanatic, so I like that too. So right now, what I try to do, when I'm in the, I don't have a computer anymore either. I don't have any device that interacts with the Internet at all. But if I do have a thought about something like that, I try to engage in other positive activities. I like to read some fiction. I have some friends who gives me religious books to read. I read my scriptures. I call friends and talk with them about it. I can talk to my wife. I like to listen to calming music. I have several CDs of things like waves and forest sounds, and I can just close myself in and listen to that and calm down. Unfortunately, I've had a few health problems that I don't get as much physical activity as I need to. And I'm hoping to correct that before this summer so that maybe I can get on the golf course and expend some positive energy there.
- Are you still attending church?
- Yes, ma'am.
- And that's going okay? From the last time we had that letter saying where they had you sit and?
- Mm hm.
- That's still going good?
- Yes.
- I can speak to that if you'd like or maybe not?
- That's my Bishop, Bishop Marker.

- Okay. Before we get to you, Bishop, is there any other questions the board would like to ask of Mr. Leyse?
- I don't have any.
- No, I don't have any.
- Okay. I did just have one. And you may have, I don't remember that from the last time, but you don't live with your wife, correct?
- That's correct. The landlord she had did not want me there. He called it a business decision, but I believe it was due to my crime.
- Okay. Does your wife have any anticipation to move in with you?
- We are currently looking for another place. He recently sold the duplex to another gentleman. That gentleman wants to have both tenants of it move out so he can gut it and redo the entire thing. So we're looking to move her either into another place that we could both move into, and then I'll come in front of the board again or a place just for her temporarily.
- Okay. All right. Okay. I'm sorry, Bishop, go ahead if you would like to speak on his behalf.
- Thank you for allowing me to be here. You clearly have an important job and role here, and I very much respect that. I just want to comment on, as far as the church attendance, Mr. Leyse has been two or three times, and he had some very specific stipulations, as you probably all know. And he has followed them. He just comes into our chapel, attends, and goes back to his car. And we have, his wife is his chaperone. We have a backup chaperone as well. I guess I would just like to say that I feel like Mr. Leyse has worked so hard since he got out to find a peace and housing. As you are probably well aware, not easy, lots of rejection right off the bat. And he just worked really hard. And he's been able to just keep at it despite all the discouragement and rejection. And so again, I respect what you do. You have to do what you do. But it would sure be wonderful if we could get him finally settled. If you have any questions, I'm happy to take those as well.
- I don't have anything.
- I do not either.
- I do not.
- Okay. Thank you. All right. Does anyone have anything they'd like to talk about before we make a motion?
- No. I did have questions the last time he was in. And just hearing you talk this time about your triggers and your faith and all that helps me in my decision.
- Thank you, ma'am.
- I would have to agree with you, Renee. I wasn't there for that meeting. But he's able to talk to us about what he's been doing in treatment and how it's been going. And that's all we ask of them.
- I do have a question. Are you able to go to Bay Beach?
- No.
- 'Cause there's the Pippin 10 year anniversary on Friday.

- I'm not allowed to go to Bay Beach because of my rules, unfortunately.
- Oh, I'm sorry.
- And maybe when I'm off probation, maybe it'll still be up there and I can take a ride on it.
- Yeah, it better be.
- It's a good thrill for a dollar.
- Yeah, it's a very good ride for a dollar. It's been that way since I was a kid.
- Okay. Does anyone want to make a motion?
- I will move approval, address specific, to 1740 Newberry, apartment four.
- I will second that.
- Okay. All in favor?
- [All] Aye.
- Okay, Mr. Leyse, you've been approved to remain at the address, 1740 Newberry Avenue, apartment four. If you do decide to move, you do need to come back before us.
- Yes, ma'am. Thank you very much.
- Thank you.
- Thank you.
- Good luck.
- Thank you, Bishop.
- Thank you.
- Okay. Next on the agenda is Kevin Jicha, requesting to move to 842 Tommark Street.
- Yes.
- All right. And it also appears, let's see, you were here back in 2019 with us.
- Yes, I was.
- So it's been quite some time. I think I'd personally like you to kind of go over your crime again.
- Okay. Back in... I forgot when it was. When my offense occurred, I got drunk. I was at my stepdaughter's birthday party. And I was drinking all day. Nighttime came, and I crawled into bed with her and I started fondling her and touching your breasts and buttocks. And her mother called the police. And I was arrested. And I sat 10 years in prison. I got 20 years of supervision. And I've been doing good ever since I've been out.

- How long have you been out?
- Well, this July will be two years.
- Okay. And you're still on the Oakland Avenue. Is that correct?
- Yes, I am.
- Okay. Okay.
- Why are you looking to move?
- Yeah, my landlord raised my rent and plus I just got an eviction notice from her yesterday, in the mail, giving me till the end of June to find another place to live, which was a shocker to me.
- Now, I guess I'm looking for some clarification. It looks like you are purchasing this.
- No, I plan on moving in with my partner who is buying the house, who bought the house.
- Got it, okay.
- It'll be closing on the 28th of this month.
- Okay.
- Okay. If we talk about your treatment, would you like to talk about that in private or public session?
- Public is fine.
- Okay, so it looks like you completed treatment while you were in custody, is that correct?
- Yes, it is.
- And you didn't need any further treatment after you were released?
- No, I do not.
- Okay. When you were here back in 2019, you were attending AA meetings. Are you still doing that?
- Yes, I am.
- Okay. How often do you do that?
- Two, twice a week. Just because of my work schedule. I've work six days a week, six o'clock in the morning till two or three o'clock in the afternoon. And so when I get home, I'm kind of, I wake up at four o'clock in the morning, so I try to get there at least twice a week, just because the other days I just like to get home and relax.
- And how long have you been sober now?
- Well, ever since I was incarcerated, so that was 10 years. And then since I've been out, I haven't had a drink. I haven't done any drugs. I haven't done anything.

- Good for you.
- Good.
- Does your partner drink?
- No.
- Okay.
- And my partner knows my whole history, everything that I've been in trouble with. I'm very open with him and he understands and he's been by my side since I've met him.
- Okay.
- And you said you, on the appeal form, you stated another person you would be living with?
- Yes, Jeff Connor. And he does not drink. He stopped drinking years ago. So I'm happy about that.
- Okay.
- Can you talk to us about your work? How long you've been there?
- Well, I got out of prison in July of 2019. I got the job at the end of July through a temp agency. I got hired on with the company in October of 2019. And I started out there as a case packer because we do meat packaging, so I started at like, I think it was \$12 an hour. And I worked my way up as a machine operator making \$22 an hour or \$20 an hour.
- Wonderful.
- So I'm doing good. I must be doing something good.
- Okay. Anything else from the board?
- No.
- I don't have any.
- Okay. Any comments before we go for a motion?
- Well, I guess my only comment is that we did approve him back in 2019 to live at Oakland. He's been fine since. So I do not see any reason to not approve him this time. That's my thought.
- Yeah. I would agree with you, Renee.
- And I would agree too.
- Yeah. Okay. So we'll take a motion.
- I'll make the motion to approve Mr. Jicha to 842 Tommark Street, Green Bay, address specific.
- I second.

- All in favor.
- [All] Aye.
- Okay. All right, Mr. Jicha, you've been approved. We'll send that to your, which address would you like us to send that to?
- You can send it to the 521 South Oakland.
- Okay. All right. Good luck.
- Okay. Thank you very much. I appreciate it.
- Yep.
- Is there somebody else on the call with that 410158? No?
- [Deanna] Yeah. I don't know who that is. Can you speak if you're on here, please?
- Hmm, guess not.
- Is there anybody on here who has the set number 410158 showing up as your user?
- [Deanna] Rachel, I don't even see an option to mute or unmute them, there's nothing there for that. Hmm.
- Yeah, that is weird.
- [Deanna] And they haven't been on here for very long.
- Right.
- Yeah. Do we just ignore it?
- I mean, we've tried to make contact. Let me put something in the chat and see if... I don't even see anybody typing. So I don't know what's going on there.
- I guess we just ignore it then. Okay. All right. Is there any other things we need to discuss before we move for adjournment?
- Just that the next meeting date is June 16th at 4:00 PM.
- Okay. Anyone--
- Anything else, yeah, anything else anybody else needs to talk about?
- Nope. I'm good.
- I'm good.
- I guess I do have one quick question. Is Ed going to remain on as a regular board member versus just the alternate?

- Yeah, we have that conversation with him. Because he was just nominated for Police and Fire Commission, he wants to remain on as an alternate. He just had a conflict today that he couldn't appear. So he's planning on sticking around as an alternate.

- Police and Fire are taking all our people.

- I know, right?

- We get them all trained up and warmed up and ready to go. And they poach them. But if anyone knows anyone who has any interest in joining the board, we've got two openings. So it'd be nice to have some relevant experience, whether that's law enforcement, therapy, someone who understands the system, helping prisoners, re-assimilate, any kind of experience like that would be beneficial. But we've got spots to fill. So beggars can't be choosers. And I'm sure that some of you are going to be going on summer vacations at some point, so the sooner we can get somebody on board or at least expressing interest, the better.

- And I should say, I talked to two people in our church who are part of our jail ministry group. And neither said no.

- Oh.

- Okay.

- So I'm going to have, they want more information and things like that.

- [Deanna] Fay, I sent you a link.

- I think that there is an option on the City's website, if you're interested in joining a board, that you can submit your information.

- [Deanna] I emailed Fay a link to that.

- Yeah, Deanna gave me some of that information.

- Okay, perfect.

- And I think they both want to, and they' like, sort of knowing how, they want to see one so they know what they're getting into.

- Okay. I thought I would reach out to some of my former ATTIC employees, the ones that also work with the 980 sex offenders to see if they might be interested.

- That's good.

- That's good, yeah.

- All right.

- Hopefully we can scrounge up a couple of willing volunteers

- Right.

- Yep.

- All right. Is there a motion to adjourn?
- So moved.
- Second.
- All in favor?
- [All] Aye.
- All right. We'll see everyone next month, on the 16th.
