## **VERBATIM MINUTES**

[Heidi] Under our residency board meeting. We'll first take role call. Everyone's here. You need us to say anything, Rachel.

- No, I didn't capture who was here in the minutes.

- [Heidi] Okay, all right. Then we need approval, an approval for the agenda for the June 16th meeting.

- I make the motion to approve the agenda.

- I will second.

- [Heidi] Okay, all in favor?

- I.

- I.

- [Heidi] All right, then we need an approval of the minutes from the May 19th 2021 meeting.
- Heidi, when you do the voice vote, can you at least ask for any names, just in case? We got four people. I just wanna make sure we don't miss anybody.
- [Heidi] Sure. We need an approval for the minutes from the May 19th 2021 meeting.
- I'll make that motion to approve those minutes.
- And I will second.
- [Heidi] Okay, all in favor, I?
- I.
- I.
- [Heidi] Any nays? Okay, we'll go on to our regular business. The first appeal that we're going to hear is Christopher Charlier. Christopher, are you here?
- Yes, I am.
- [Heidi] Okay. And you are requesting to move to 334 in Hansel Chestnut. Correct?
- Correct.
- [Heidi] Okay. And it looks like you were just here in May. And we approved you to stay there for a period of 30 days. Is that correct?
- Correct.
- Yep.
- [Heidi] And then we asked for you to come back. What have you've been up, and how are things going?
- Good, good. I dropped off a form, hopefully that's good proof for my SOT program that I was in.
- [Heidi] Oh, yeah. Does everyone have that in their packet?
- Yes.
- Yes.
- [Heidi] Okay. If we would like to discuss your treatment, would you like us to go into private session, or remain in public?
- Public's fine.
- [Heidi] Okay. Does anyone have any questions about his treatment that he submitted to us?
- I don't.
- I have none.

- [Heidi] Okay, I guess I do. It looks like you completed that in an institution, correct?

- Correct.

- [Heidi] You have not gotten any treatment outside of the institution?

- Correct.

- [Heidi] Okay. And you're not going to be any, doing any treatment outside?

- I asked for a after care program when I got out, just to help a little bit more. But my PO recommended instead, she said she didn't think I needed it at that moment. And I guess you need a referral. So, that's only thing that I wanted to do that, was not an option at the time.

- And I guess I have a question, why, you would like to do it? You feel the need for it?

- I don't necessarily feel the need, but I just, I don't know, I kind of thought it might had been a good idea at the time when I came out. Just to kind of prevent, you know, make sure that I was good to go.

- And your PO just said, "No."

- Yeah, yeah, my PO, I talked to my PO about it, and she said at this time, she said she'll look into it, which I don't think she ever did. But she said she'll look into it. And she doesn't think it's necessarily the best option for me. She don't think I need it at the moment, because I'm such a low risk. Same with that "Thinking for Change" class. I was supposed to take that, too. But then she said that I need more than one referral to take the "Thinking for Change" class. Because I'm a low risk right now. If that makes sense.

- [Heidi] So you're not getting any kind of treatment, even though you would like some kind of a treatment?

- Well, I am seeing personal counseling. Or, I was seeing personal counseling. I used up my free counseling sessions with them. So I seeked treatment myself. I also seeked parenting classes and stuff like that to help me out with just my personal self, so. But as far as the sex offense thing, I haven't received any additional treatments since I've been out, and all.

- [Heidi] And are you still working at American Foods?

- Yes, I am, yep.

- Okay. And do they offer insurance for like an EAP for you there?

- Yep, I took advantage of that for personal counseling. My free assessment just ended about a month or so ago.

- [Heidi] Okay, and they don't offer any other kind of benefit for you to seek counseling elsewhere?

- I did not look into that, no.

- [Heidi] All right, I understand that you're saying that you're kind of a low risk, and that's why not you're not getting into any treatment.

- Well, what she, I'm sorry, to correct my statement, what she said is that I would have to pay for it on my end, as well. But she could recommend me to them, I would actually have to pay for it on my end.

- [Heidi] And did you look into the cost of those classes?

- I did not, no.

- [Heidi] I mean, I'm just gonna speak to the bar at AMFU at this moment. I'm kind of concerned. I understand that you don't, you know, they're saying that you're a low risk, and you don't need it. But I'm hearing some hesitation in your voice, that you kind of feel maybe you should have it, and it would be a good idea. I'm not so comfortable with that.

- No, I'm sorry. When I first came out of prison, I completed my SOT about a month or so ago. And I felt good. But, I don't feel the hesitation like I'm going to recommit a felony again, or a crime. I just wanna check my X's and check my O's and just make sure that everything's perfect, you know? I don't wanna fall back in the same thing that I did before. So that's why I was looking for any kind of help that I could get. I was looking at counseling, psychiatry help, stuff like that. Just anything to kind of help me out, you know? 'Cause I'm not saying I needed it, but I just thought I didn't.

- [Heidi] Do you make pretty? Oh, go ahead.

- Which is why I, when I first got out of prison, that's the first thing I was thinking of, is maybe it won't be a bad idea if I did this, you know? Or at least ask her about it. And see, I heard from the guys when I was in prison, saying that I needed to, or that most likely than not, I needed to take an after-care program, the low-risk one. And that's why I asked her about it.

- [Heidi] Do you make pretty decent money at your job?

- I do, yeah.

- [Heidi] Okay. So, would it be a problem for you to look into how much you would have those classes, and maybe at least-

- Two of them.

- [Heidi] Choose one of them, "Thinking for Change" or the-

- Yep, I actually... Sorry, I don't mean to interrupt. But, I actually talked to my PO just last week. I think it was last week, Wednesday. And she recommended that I look into "Thinking for Change" and, 'cause I would have to pay for it myself, so I needed more than one referral. So that is definitely something I am going to pursue, is looking at "Thinking for Change" classes.

- [Heidi] Okay.

- 'Cause I knew that was a recommendation when I was in prison, but I didn't have enough time to complete it, so.

- [Heidi] Okay. So you say-

- I just got lucky, I got lucky, due to the grant, that I was able to get in, so.

- So what you're saying is, that you can't get into "Thinking for Change" without a second recommendation?

- Correct, yeah. That's what my understanding was when she told me that. Maybe I misunderstood, but that's the way it sounded.

- Also, do you have health insurance?

- I do, yes.

- Because I would think that, did you go, you went to the EPA for the free counseling?

- Yes.

- Then usually they recommend, what they sometimes do is, then they decide and recommend you for their counseling.

- Okay.

- And that's usually, so what did your, what did that person say at the end of your counseling session?

- She got me to just to continue counseling, maybe for depression and stuff like that. So I am going to contact my old counselor, where I was before I got arrested. And he was gonna recommend me to her. But he hadn't recommended me for "Thinking for Change". That topic actually never came up, so.

- [Heidi] Does anyone on the board have any other questions?

- Well, I'm just reading the SOPI recommendations. And he said, "Overall, Mr. Charlier "has shown a great deal of improvement throughout sessions. "He showed a great deal of insight "in acknowledging his need for continued counseling, "to strengthen his ability to cope with stress, "and depressive symptoms. "And he would benefit from continued growth "in his communication skills and confidence." So, I'm just trying to, so, the counseling that you went to on your own, was that for the depression?

- Correct. He got.

- I don't know, I have a concern that if you're feeling the need for an after care or something, then I think, and maybe just not a need, but to fill the box as you said. I think that's something you should do.

- I can definitely do it, if that's the recommendation. I can definitely do it, I'll look into it right away. I mean, if that's what you recommend. I don't, I mean I feel great. So I haven't, I've been doing everything I'm supposed to, so, you know.

- [Heidi] It voiced those concerns to us in the beginning when you first came out, and I think, at least, by the two of us, that's alarming for us.

- Well I guess-

- [Heidi] Oh, go ahead.

- I don't necessarily know if you're really understanding me. 'Cause when I got out of prison, that was my concern. It's not necessarily my concern now. But when I got out prison, I didn't wanna, you know, obviously go back. So I asked my PO about any other options there are, when I got out. I said, "Is there anything I can do "just to make sure I don't recommit? "To make sure that I don't fall into the same places "that I did before," and stuff like that. So that was when I first got out. I mean, that's not now. I don't have concerns about how my well-being is now.

- Okay though, but you expressed those concerns, and the PO said, "No, you don't need anything"?

- My PO?

- Correct. Well you just said you were expressing-

- Right. No, she recommended that I go seek counseling at the time. 'Cause I told her about, you know, I'm still depressed and stuff like that. So she did recommend me seeing counseling.

- Just not sex offender counseling?

- Yep.

- [Heidi] I mean, we just saw you a month ago, and I really don't remember you voicing any of these concerns at that point. Because I think at that point, that maybe you would had been a little bit less hesitant to, or more hesitant to approve you. And I mean, so when did you get out of prison?

- I got out of prison last June.

- Oh so, you've been out of prison for over a year?

- Correct, yes. And I haven't felt the need to pursue sex offender treatment because I've been doing so well. I mean I got the stable job. I've been, I've only been seeing counseling due to depression, you know? I talked to my PO once a month. I haven't missed any appointments. I've been doing everything I need to be doing. I've been working really, really hard. And I have a good support system. You can even ask my PO that. She knows I have a good support system. Yeah, so it's-

- Can I just ask, where did you live when you got out of jail, if you just came to us last month?

- I lived with my dad from about a couple of months, six months, I wanna say? And then, he had to move, because they sold the place. So then I lived in a hotel, at the Economy Inn.

- [Heidi] Where was the first six months with your dad?

- That was on Laipple Street.

- [Heidi] Oh, Allouez.

- Yep, Allouez, yeah.

- [Heidi] Okay. So why?

- I will keep it up with the sex offender registry. And stuff like that, so.

- So right now, all of your counseling has stopped?

- Yep, yeah right now it has. But I am definitely going to continue, 'cause I gotta call me old counselor, because I really liked her. And I wanna call her and get set up with her, too, so. And I can also call "Thinking for Change", I'll do that. I'll do anything I have to do. I just wanna get back, you know, I just wanna keep on the right path. And I've done a really good job so far since I've been out.

- I would like to make a motion that we approve for 90 days at this address, specific. And then you would come back and just tell us, what counseling you've been able to participate in.

- Okay.

- And, possibly bring something from the counseling person for them to verify health.
- Okay, do I need kind of proof again?
- Yes.
- Do I, would I drop that out to the office again, like I did the last time, or?
- Yes.
- Okay.
- Is there a second for that motion?
- I will second that.
- [Heidi] All in favor, I?
- I.
- I.
- [Heidi] Opposed? Okay, so Mr. Charlier, you're approved for the 90 days. We'll send you that letter. And you'll need to bring that documentation, that you're in "Thinking for Change", or counseling, and come see us in 90 days.
- Okay, sounds good, thank you.
- [Heidi] Okay, thank you.
- Bye.
- [Heidi] All right, the next appeal is Eddie Broadnax, by a to move to 1200 Laura Lane, Number Two. Mr. Broadnax, are you there?
- Was earlier.
- [Heidi] I see him on there.
- [Eddie] Hello?
- [Heidi] Yep, you hear us?
- [Eddie] Yes.
- [Heidi] Okay, all right. So Mr. Broadnax, you've been here several, several times before the board. The last time we saw you was back in March of 2020. Which, at that time we approved you to live at 1238 Weisey Street, correct?
- [Eddie] Correct.
- [Heidi] It looks like your current address is 1808 Gene Street.

- [Eddie] Yes, it's temporary, getting approval of this place.
- [Heidi] But you're requesting to move to 1200 Laura Lane, Number Two.
- [Eddie] Correct.
- [Heidi] So, how long have you been staying at 1808 Gene Street?
- [Eddie] Maybe a month, a month or so.
- [Heidi] Oh.
- [Eddie] I literally, I got the ankle monitoring bracelet on, so I've kind of been like flapping from family member to family member. And it'll be, I've been trying to find a place for almost a year now. And I finally got an opportunity, so.
- [Heidi] So how? When did you move out the Weissey Street?
- [Eddie] Let me see, probably June or July of last year.
- [Heidi] So you were only in there for a couple of months?
- [Eddie] Correct.
- [Heidi] What happened?
- [Eddie] Just, we had different opinions as far as the relationship went. We were better off friends.
- [Heidi] Oh, okay. All right, so you were moving in with a girlfriend?
- [Eddie] Correct.
- [Heidi] Okay. All right. So I know, like you said, you've been here several times. Would everybody like him to kind of go over his charges again? I know Peter, you probably would like that, right?
- Yes.
- [Heidi] Okay, so Eddie, we're gonna just ask you to explain to us what you were convicted of. How it came about, but again remember, we don't want you to use the victim's name, or talk about the victim, you know, relationship like, if they were a sibling, or cousin, or whatever, okay?
- [Eddie] Okay, okay.
- [Heidi] Go ahead.
- [Eddie] All right, I was convicted of second degree sexual assault. We were both young at the time. There was a kid involved. I later on found out, 'cause of the kid situation, is how I found out that she was younger than what I had known. And uh, the kid was not mine. Yeah, that's how all of this came about.
- [Heidi] Okay. And then you were sentenced to prison, when was that? Did you get prison time off of that?
- [Eddie] No, I got three years probation.

- [Heidi] Yeah.

- [Eddie] And I'm not proud to admit it, but once I found out the kid was mine, or wasn't mine, I kind of spiraled out.

- [Heidi] What do you mean by that?

- [Eddie] Well, as I said I got the probation for it. And once I found out that the kid wasn't mine, I don't know, I guess I just lashed out at probation, and then I ended up getting revoked. I had violations, alcohol violations, not sex offender, or anything like that. There was no other, never any other incident, as far as any sex violations, or anything, no.

- [Heidi] Okay. Yeah, it looks like you have a drinking problem with an OWI sex offense.

- [Eddie] I have, I have been working on that for about, about a good solid four years now. But I've been working on it for about eight, but a solid four now, going on five.

- [Heidi] Okay. I'm just sorry, I should of asked you, and we talked about any kind of treatment, do you wish to do that in closed session, or are you okay to remain in public session?

- [Eddie] Public is fine.

- [Heidi] Okay, all right. Does anyone have questions about his, they said he was convicted of.

- No, not of what he was convicted of, no.

- [Heidi] Any? You had something else, Renee?

- I wanna understand, you say you have been going from family member to family member, living, but you say you're living alone on Laura Lane, correct?

- [Eddie] Correct.

- So you went there before you came to us?

- [Eddie] I'm sorry. I got approval from the landlord pending approval from the board. I don't live there.

- Oh, you're not living there now?

- [Eddie] No, no, no, no.

- Okay. So you've been-

- [Eddie] Depending on how this goes, I can possibly, well, actually I have to work tonight, so I won't be able to get to sign my lease until tomorrow. If I get approved here today, I can sign my lease tomorrow. And move in tomorrow.

- [Heidi] Okay, all right.

- And you're not at the Gene Street right now, either?

- [Eddie] Actually, well I mean, that's my address that I was basically using for this. But I mean, I have spent time there.

- Okay. I just wasn't understanding that, so thank you for clarifying.

- [Eddie] Well, from what I know as far as with counseling goes, or what Green Bay, you asked like two weeks to report to a landlord, or an owner, or whatever, if you have another person in your residence. So that's why I've been hopping around from family member to family member. And also I have the GPS bracelet on, as well. I've had that on for about, I wanna say maybe two, two and a half months now. So, 'cause that was a condition as far as me not having a set address. Is having the GPS bracelet on.

- [Heidi] Will that get removed then, once you, if we approve you for this address?

- [Eddie] Yeah, that's the only reason why I'm on it, is because I didn't have a residence. So I'm assuming that it should be off in a couple days.

- [Heidi] Okay.

- [Eddie] Like I said, I gotta work tonight, so I know it's not gonna, I'm not gonna be able to set up anything tonight. So the earliest I'll be able to do it be tomorrow morning when I get back from work.

- [Heidi] Where are you working at right now?

- [Eddie] I work at Waupaca Foundry.

- [Heidi] Oh, that's a far drive.

- I was gonna say that.

- [Eddie] Yes, it's a blessing that I've got two of my nephews working with me.

- [Heidi] Okay, okay.

- [Eddie] You know.

- [Heidi] Okay. Does anyone else have any other questions, or would like to make any statements?

- So Heidi, I just wanted to pass along that Alder Weary did forward some feedback from a neighbor. So I'm just gonna read it. It's like two sentences long.

- [Heidi] Sure.

- But it's neighbor feedback that he received from one of his constituents. So Alder Weary forwarded it on. "I 200 Laura Lane is next to one of my properties, "and right across from Franklin Middle School. "Not a good place for a sex offender." That's what the constituent sent to Alder Weary.

- [Heidi] Okay. I guess I'd like to maybe just make a comment on how I feel about where I'm gonna go with the voting, and kind of on that statement. So Mr. Broadnax's offense was back in 2004. He was placed on probation, he wasn't even sent to prison for it. Other than that, he threw a revocation. He has not had any sex offense since then. Obviously, he does have some drinking issues, but the number of OWIs that he has, but I really am leaning towards approving him for the address. It was close of age. He thought that she got pregnant. So that's where I am. I don't know how anybody else feels.

- I agree, I was concerned with the drinking. But, the sex offender, yes, that was ongoing, there has not been a problem since. That's, I'm following along on your line of thinking, Heidi.

- [Heidi] Okay. Fay or Peter?

- I was gonna say, I feel, I agree, I feel the same way. And he was 22 at that time. So it's quite a few years since that happened.

- [Eddie] I'm sorry.

- Go ahead.

- [Eddie] That was one of my concerns that I had asked about, in my probation, is the is right across the street from the school. But I also was like, you know, the address that I had before, you know, was around schools and parks, and I got approved, and you know, this was one-time thing. Never ever gonna happen again in my life. I'm one million percent sure of that. And she told me that, you know, I probably wouldn't have anything to worry about.

- [Heidi] Well, we'll take, does anyone wanna make a motion?

- Yes, I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Broadnax, 1200 Laura Avenue, address-specific.

- Could we just clarify Laura Lane?

- Did I say avenue? I meant Laura Lane Street.

- [Eddie] Actually, it's pronounced Lori Lane.

- Okay, Lori Lane.

- [Eddie] Yes, it's pronounced Lori Lane.

- All right.

- I'll second the motion.

- [Heidi] Okay. Pardon me, Peter?

- I'll second it.

- [Heidi] All right. Okay, all in favor, say I?

- I.

- I.

- [Heidi] Opposed? Okay, Mr. Broadnax, you are approved to move to 1200 Lori Lane, Number Two, address-specific. If you do move from there, you do need to come back before the board.

- [Eddie] Yes ma'am, thank you.

- [Heidi] Okay, thank you.

- [Eddie] Bye-bye.

- Bye, now.

- [Heidi] All right, the next appeal is Robert LeBotte, requesting to move to 1199 1/2 Shonnel Avenue. All right. And let's see here, Mr. LeBotte, you, the last time we saw you, looks like it was back in 2016. And we approved you to live at Ricky Drive.

- Yes.

- [Heidi] Okay. So what happened from 2016 to now?

- I, in 2017 I got revoked on parole violations, I was not following my rules. I was in a relationship with a female, and she got pregnant, and I did not have it approved by my probation officer. That's why I got revoked. I got out of prison in 2019. During that prison sentence, here's my verification, I was able to take "Thinking for Change", which is one of the roles that I am striving, a sex offender class, and I did not get into it, because it was not recommended. But since I have been out of prison, the TOP, or state division, I have been homeless since, I'm living in a vehicle, or just crashing on a friend's couch, or basement. I have currently, that's what happened from there until, that's why I lost the place to live.

- [Heidi] Okay. Because it's been so long since you've been here, could you go over your charges again, and tell us how everything came about, and remember not to say the victim's name, or the relationship of the victim.

- Yes. Back in, I got charged with second degree sexual assault of a child back in '99. That got dropped down to causing alarm to a child. I assaulted and manipulated a female at a party to have sexual relations with me. And in 2000, I did the same thing. They're both 15. And then, in 2005, I got sentenced to prison 14 years. It's a weird sentence, because of the watching from 99 to 2000. So I originally got sentenced to a total of, would of been 21 years. I was sentence of seven years, ran concurrent, and then when I got revoked in 2005 for forcing sexual assault, which was talking to a minor for the consequences of having sexual relations with an older person. I can't say the names or relationships, so I'm gonna keep that away. But I was talking to them, and it was, and I did not know it was against the law at the time, until it came out, and I told my probation officer, and it ended up being against the law, so I went back for eight and a half years, and that's when I got released in 2013. 2013, I was off, 2013, I went back for an ATR for I think, six months. And then for like, it was 2014, 2017, I was out. And I went back in two years for a little violation, and then I've been out since 2019.

- [Heidi] Since 2019, you've been out?

- Yes.

- Where have you lived since then?

- In 2000, when I got out, originally released, I was in TOP for 60 days. And then after that, I have been living in a vehicle, or just my friends let me crash on the couch, once in a while, in their basement. So I really have been living in a vehicle.

- [Heidi] If we wanna talk about your treatment that you've received, or not received, are we able to do that in public, or private session?

- Public's fine.

- [Heidi] Okay. So it does appear that you are currently in a sex offender treatment. Is that correct?

- I am.

- [Heidi] And who is that with?
- That is through Hanger Enterprises. My facilitator is Pablo Certa.
- And how long you've been with him?
- I was with him before the COVID stuff happened. But then we, everything got canceled for awhile. And then we started, I was able to get back into group with him back in February.
- [Heidi] Okay.
- And how long had you seen him before COVID? When did you start that?
- Oh, it would have been, I wanna say it was like November, December, I started with him before COVID. But, with everything, stuff was going on and stuff, and when I got back in anywhere, I mean in February, we just started the whole program all over. So I started just the whole program over, so I'm starting from scratch.
- How often do you Zoom?
- The program?
- Correct, yep.
- It's a weekly meeting, I go face-to-face with them. There's a, it's a five person group. I actually, I had it today. And he let me leave early so I could attend this meeting.
- So it's weekly?
- Yes, it's weekly.
- Are you working at all?
- Yes, I am. I am working third shift and Weyland Auto Foods. The work fill plant. From 9 p.m. until 5 a.m.
- And did you say you've been living alone, or with somebody? I will be living alone. It's an upper/lower duplex. There is a gentleman, an older gentleman, a couple years older than I am that lives upstairs. He's , and he's actually the owner of the place. And he's so, so I'll be moving upstairs from him. Which is duplex, but I will be living alone.
- [Heidi] or anybody else?
- Alder Weary received feedback from the same constituent of this request. The feedback that was forwarded to our office was 1199 Charlotte Avenue, is just down the block from Lincoln Elementary. Again, not a good place for a sex offender.
- [Heidi] What I see on the screen here about the law department, is that the actual re-named police officer?
- [Deanna] No, that's me, that's Deanna. I had to log in to two computers. So I'm on my laptop and on a computer in City Hall.
- [Heidi] Okay, okay. All right. Does anyone have any comments about the email from the Alder person?

- So it's from the same person?

- Yes, the previous person.

- [Heidi] Yes, the same person forwarded feedback for both the last item and this item to Alder Weary. And Alder Weary forwarded that information on to the law department.

- This is, just kind of like thinking, and wondering if we might consider, let's say a 90 day approval? It's not a motion, I'm just kind of talking. Because he's actually relatively, short time that he's been back to the offender program. And that we might like to see how that continues.

- [Heidi] I can see that point of view. I guess I also look at it, I mean, he has offenses from 99, 2000, two of them in 2000. And even though he spent some time in prison, you know, the rule violation that he had to go back to prison, I mean that's just my opinion, but I, I mean he was in a relationship that he didn't get approval of. And I can see where an appeal would be concerned. But is that, in my opinion, prison worthy? I'm not sure.

- Has it all been said, the age of that person you were in a relationship with?

- She was 26, and a little daughter. I was 30, I just turned 41, so I was 37? 38? Somewhere in there. We have a three-year-old daughter together. So, a lot of pain.

- Okay, thank you, I'm sorry that I had to ask that.

- [Heidi] Nope, nope, that was the question. Well, would anybody else have comments on how they're feeling? Or, wanna make a motion?

- I would move to approve for 90 days, address specific. And request that Robert come back with more information about in how he's doing in the SOT program. And with documentation from his facilitator.

- [Heidi] Is there a second?

- I'll second that.

- [Heidi] All in favor?

- I.

- I.

- [Heidi] Opposed?

- Opposed.

- [Heidi] Okay. Mr. LeBotte, you're approved for 90 days to stay at that address. Which at that time, you'll have to come back, and you'll need to provide us documentation about your treatment. And we'll probably be asking you how you're doing in treatment.

- Okay.

- [Heidi] All right?

- Yep.

- [Heidi] Okay, thank you.
- Thank you.
- [Heidi] All right.
- Goodbye.
- [Heidi] Bye.
- Thank you.
- [Heidi] Okay, so the next thing, unless anybody, does anybody have any new business?
- I do not.
- [Heidi] Okay. Our next meeting is scheduled for July 21st at 4 p.m., for right now. And then, if we can get a motion to adjourn the meeting?
- I'll make that motion to adjourn the meeting.
- I will second.
- [Heidi] All in favor?
- I.
- I.
- [Heidi] Okay. All right, well, good luck, thank you.
- Thank you.
