VERBATIM MINUTES

Green Bay Sex Offender Residency Board to meet and we need to get. Can I get a motion for the approval of the agenda for the August 18th meeting?

- I so move.

- Is there a second?

- I'll second.

- All in favor, aye?

- Aye.
- Opposed? Okay . Then, can we get an approval of the minutes from the July 21st meeting of the Sex Offender Residency Board?
- I will move. So move.
- Is there a second?
- I second.
- All in favor? Aye.
- Aye.
- Aye.
- Opposed? Okay . The first regular business that we have is the appeal of Ja'Cari Myles, requesting to move to 1061 Clayton Place. Ja'Cari, are you on here?
- [Ja'Cari] Yes ma'am.
- Okay . So, we're gonna be asking you some questions. It appears this as your first time before the Board, is that correct?
- [Ja'Cari] Yes ma'am.
- Okay. So when we're gonna ask you the circumstances surrounding your arrest, we ask that you refer. You know, don't refer to the victim as a name or relationship. And then we'll have an opportunity to discuss any treatment, you have the opportunity to do that in closed or public session. Would you like to make that decision right now?
- [Ja'Cari] Yes ma'am.
- What would you like to do, closed or public?
- [Ja'Cari] Public I guess.
- Okay. All right, so you are currently living at 1761 Shauna Avenue, requesting to move to 1061 Clayton Place. Is that correct?
- [Ja'Cari] Yes ma'am.
- Okay, and can you tell us what you were arrested for and how it all came about?
- [Ja'Cari] I was arrested for exposition or child pornography by a person under 18. How the charges came about. A girl down in Winnebago County, she sent me some nude photos of her and I posted the nude photos on Facebook. This happened in 28th. So, that's how I came about the charges. I got charged when I was 17 years old.
- Did you know the girl?
- [Ja'Cari] Yes ma'am.

- Okay and why would you post them on Facebook?

- [Ja'Cari] It was just really just a childish, immature thing of me to do. I really can't explain it to this day. I was just young at the time and just didn't know no better.

- Okay . So then how did you get arrested for that?

- [Ja'Cari] I had a warrant out for my arrest, but I never knew I had the warrant out for my arrest. Until I got. Until I got arrested for another case and then that's when I found out I had the warrant out for my arrest. But I never knew I had the warrant out for my arrest until 2019 when I. I got locked a year later.

- So you don't know how the police got involved?

- [Ja'Cari] No ma'am. I'm pretty sure the victim. She had her mother call the police, if I'm not mistaken. Down in Winnebago.

- Okay. And what were you sentenced to on that?

- [Ja'Cari] I was sentenced to 18 months of probation.

- Okay. Any of the Board Members have any questions regarding his case?

- I do. Would he have been required to have treatment?

- Let's see here. A court at conviction, it just says counseling as deemed appropriate. We can talk about his treatment. Mr. Myles, have you had any kind of sex offender treatment?

- [Ja'Cari] No, ma'am. I just got out of prison back in June 29 and all the programs were shut down due to COVID. So, couldn't nobody get into the program at the time that I was incarcerated.

- And were you actually serving a prison sentence for the substantial battery or the armed robbery?

- [Ja'Cari] Yes ma'am.

- Okay. All right. I see Commander Ebel is on here. Not sure, do you have access to his Winnebago case, if what he's telling us is accurate?

- [Paul] I have access to the verbal complaint from Winnebago County and he is actually accurate from his description of of his crime.

- Okay, thank you. All right. Does any of the Board Members have any questions for him? Okay Mr. Myles, are you working anywhere?

- [Ja'Cari] Yes ma'am.

- Okay, where are you working?

- [Ja'Cari] I work at Boneworks.

- I'm sorry, what is it?

- [Ja'Cari] Boneworks.

- How long have you been working there?
- [Ja'Cari] I've been working there since I've got out of prison about a month and a half.
- All right . And it looks like you're going to be living with your mother, is that correct?
- [Ja'Cari] Yes ma'am.
- Okay. Is your mother here to talk on your behalf at all?
- [Ja'Cari] Yes, ma'am.
- [Jameela] Hello?
- Hi, could you just state your name and address for the record, please?
- [Jameela] My name is Jameela Walker. My address is 1061 Clayton Place, Green Bay, Wisconsin.
- Okay. Obviously you're aware of what your son did and that he has to register as a sex offender and you're all right with that?
- [Jameela] Yes ma'am.
- Okay. And do your neighbors know about this?
- [Jameela] Yes ma'am. They do.
- And they're okay?
- Yes ma'am, the two on the. The one on the left and the one right are very aware. They're very involved in Ja'Cari, 'cause they grasped some things. So they do know what's going on and they understand.
- Okay . All right. Any Board Members?
- I'd like to ask Ja'Cari's mom. How do you see this working or how do you support that he should live with you? How do you feel about it?
- [Jameela] I know Jakarta since he's gotten into the trouble he's gotten in as a teenager and him spending in jail, the time he spent in jail. I see a lot of growth in him. I see change in him. I see him trying to change and do the better. Do things for the better, help out around the community. He's been helping me and doing a little odds and ends work for my neighbors. So I do see him growing and a lot of things he did was, I think just him being an adolescent and being the child. Sitting in jail, I can really say helped him a whole lot. As far as growth, he been working and he makes sure he don't miss work. He just been doing things that adults should do without me telling him. 'Cause when he did go to jail, he was still a child and now he's an adult so. It's like, I see that change that I don't have to drill him, stay on him about things that he know he needs to do. He just does it.
- Ja'Cari, do you have a high school diploma?
- [Ja'Cari] Yes ma'am.
- Okay, anything else from the Board Members?

- Yes, I have a question. Ja'Cari, do you have any good male influences around you?
- [Ja'Cari] Yes sir. I actually, work with a mentor. I'm pretty sure you've heard of them. I go to My Brother's Keeper, I go to Harry Sydney.
- Yes.
- Okay, before I entertain anybody asking for, if they wanna make a motion to approve or deny this address. I guess I just would like to say, my opinion is I understand that he hasn't had treatment, it wasn't court ordered according to the JLC and was only counseling as deemed necessary. He got 18 months probation out of it. Typically I do not approve people from out of county because I feel that we have enough of our own inmates or population that need housing here. However, because he has the other cases out of Brown County that I'm sure he's on probation for, I would be okay with allowing him to, you know, stay at this address, 1061 Clayton Street. That's just my opinion. Anybody else have a thought? Does anyone wanna make a motion to approve or deny?
- I would make a motion to approve address specific to Clayton Place.
- Is there a second?
- I'll second it.
- Okay, all in favor. Aye.
- [Together] Aye.
- Opposed? Okay. Mr. Myles, you've been approved to reside at 1061 Clayton Place. Where would you like us to send that letter?
- [Ja'Cari] You could send it to 1061 Clayton Place?
- Okay, thank you.
- [Ja'Cari] All right, thank you.
- All right, . Next on the agenda is the appeal of Myles Whitman, requesting to move to 531 South Van Buren. Mr. Whitman, are you present?
- He's on here. He just needs to unmute.
- Okay. Mr. Whitman?
- Mr. Whitman, you need to unmute your phone please.
- [Roy] He's working on it I'm with him.
- Okay, okay.
- [Myles] Did it work?
- [Roy] No, it didn't work. Let me see your phone.

- [Myles] It shows the speaker on your smart phone, but that's forbidden.
- We're working on it.
- Is he able to just join you on your screen?
- [Myles] I'm here.
- Is he coming through?
- You are, yes. Well he is too. So we can hear you--
- Oh legally he's. He's not supposed to be on the internet, but he could speak through my phone. He doesn't really have. Oh, the speaker will pick up. Is that okay Myles?
- [Myles] I'm here.
- Okay. So Mr. Whitman, as you heard earlier we're gonna ask you about your. What you were convicted of. When you talk about the victim, we just ask that you don't indicate the name or the relationship of the victim. And then you'll have the opportunity to talk about treatment. Would you like to do that in closed or public session?
- Public.
- Okay. So, why don't you go ahead and tell us what you were convicted of?
- [Myles] I was convicted of child pornography.
- Okay and what happened? What were you doing?
- [Myles] I downloaded two pictures online on my phone.
- Okay, and how did you get caught?
- [Myles] Google at the time. Google informed the law enforcement of what I was doing.
- Okay. And were you on a particular site and then all of a sudden you saw these images or were you searching for these images?
- [Myles] I was searching for them images.
- Okay, and how old were the children in the pictures?
- [Myles] Eight years old.
- And why were you searching for them?
- [Myles] At the time I wasn't on any medication and I was depressed. So I was just searching.
- Commander Ebel, is that correct?
- [Myles] Huh?

- Sorry, I'm asking the police department if that's correct.
- [Paul] As far as the Google information he's correct. That is correct. They did an internal complaint and during hearing he said that he made out approximately 30 images of young girls that he had to sent. But that stops Google complaint. It's not listed in the criminal complaint.
- So he admitted that he had sent 30 pictures that Google couldn't find them?
- [Paul] It wasn't. It's not listed in the criminal complaint, whether or not they were able to. The investigators were able to locate those images. He's actually correct that the images were flagged by Google and tip was sent to the Brown County Sheriff's Department, the Pulaski Police Department, where the IP address came back to.
- Okay . And so Mr. Whitman, how much time did you get for that?
- [Myles] I got nine months all together, 'cause I spent two years in county jail.
- Okay. But you really were sentenced to three years, is that correct?
- [Myles] Yes.
- Okay and when did you get out of prison?
- [Myles] April 16th, 2019.
- Is it because you had so much time served?
- [Myles] Yes ma'am.
- Okay. So, where have you been residing since 2019?
- [Myles] I used to live in Wood County, Wisconsin Rapids area. And I moved back to Green Bay and now I'm living at the 1617. 1761 Cornel Avenue.
- Okay.
- Is that the TLP?
- [Myles] Yes ma'am.
- So your agent allowed you to transfer from Wood County, is that correct?
- [Myles] Yes.
- Yeah, even without having a secure residence? Meaning she was okay? Like what happens if we don't approve you? How long would you stay at the TLP?
- [Myles] It's usually two months.
- Okay, so if we wouldn't approve you, then do you have to go back to Wood County?
- [Myles] I'm not sure, 'cause I haven't talked to my old agent at the time.

- Okay.
- [Myles] Because I got transferred.
- Okay.
- So where did the. Where did your crime take place?
- [Myles] Brown County.
- But you were arrested and in jail in Wood County?
- [Myles] I was there in the Wood County jail for two months and then they transferred me back here and then I went to Dodge until March of this year.
- So, how long were you actually in prison?
- [Myles] The second time I was there for a year.
- And explain the first time.
- [Myles] The first time I was there nine months.
- So was this the only offense?
- [Myles] It was, yes.
- It seems to be unusual that order. Where did you. So you started at Dodge or you started in jail and then went to Dodge?
- [Myles] Yeah.
- So I'm gonna gather that you had a pretty high cash bond, that's why you sat that much time in jail before going to prison?
- [Myles] Yes ma'am, I had a \$10,000 cash bond.
- Are you. I'm sorry did you say we can talk about your treatment in public? Or did you want that in private?
- [Myles] I can talk about it in public.
- Okay, so it looks like you're currently receiving some kind of a treatment right now, is that correct?
- [Myles] Yes, ma'am.
- And who's that through?
- [Myles] That's through Marshall Kirkpatrick and Associates.
- Okay and what kind of treatment are you getting right now?
- [Myles] The SOT-4 treatment.

- Okay, is this your first time receiving treatment?
- [Myles] No ma'am, it's my second time. I failed the first time and this is my second treatment.
- When was the first time that you took your treatment?
- [Myles] In Wood County.
- And who did you do that through down there?
- [Myles] I can't remember the name off-hand.
- And what timeframe was it that you did the treatment down there?
- [Myles] The time I got out till 2020.
- Okay and why did you fail?
- [Myles] I kept missing meetings and wasn't doing my homework. And wasn't honest with the facilitator about my crime and so they failed me on that.
- And then you started treatment here?
- [Myles] Yes ma'am.
- Okay and how long have you been going there?
- [Myles] Since April 29, 2021.
- And have you missed any classes?
- [Myles] No, ma'am. We just started in-person. It was over the phone now it's in-person.
- Did you miss any over the phone session?
- [Myles] No.
- Okay, so tell us what you're learning in treatment right now.
- They have me doing something new. It's a lot easier for me. I have to do the daily journal and explain and follow what it says in the daily journal. Like if I'm glad, sad, angry, fear. You know, and then, you know what my fantasies are and everything like that.
- And then you share that with the group or you just share that with your counselor?
- [Myles] I share that with the whole group.
- Have you learned why you did what you did?
- [Myles] I did, yes.
- Okay and why was that?

- [Myles] I was like. I knew it was wrong and I shouldn't have done it. You know and I feel remorse about it.
- But why did you do it?
- [Myles] I wasn't on any medication at the time.
- And what do you take medications for?
- [Myles] Depression, anger and anxiety.
- And you've been taking those?
- [Myles] Yes ma'am.
- What's to stop you from stop not taking your meds anymore?
- [Myles] If I don't have the money to pay for them, I would have to figure out a way to get it.
- Are you working that you would be able to buy your medications?
- [Myles] I'm on disability.
- And do you have enough each month to pay for rent and your medications?
- [Myles] I do, yes.
- Okay. So by not having money, isn't the reason why you would stop taking your meds then?
- [Myles] No.
- Any-
- Any body have-- Go ahead Fay.
- The address you wish to move to, is it like an apartment? Is it a house? What is it? What is it?
- [Myles] It's a four apartment building. And the apartment I'm requesting is upstairs.
- Is it like a one bedroom, a studio or?
- [Myles] It's a one bedroom.
- Do you have some people that will support you?
- [Myles] I have. Roy from Circles of Support and Chris from the sex offender treatment and support group, with me.
- Do they wanna speak on your behalf right now?
- [Myles] They do, yes.
- Okay.

- Hello.
- Hi if you can just state your name and address for the record please?
- Roy DeRuyter address 1079 Butternut Lane, Woolworth, Wisconsin.
- Okay, what would you like to say about Mr. Whitman?
- Since he's joined Circles, he's attended group I think he missed once and that was it. But he's been there ever since he started attending and that's been over two months now. He's cooperative and in group shares, talks about his issues.
- Do you do anything with them outside of the group?
- I helped him find his apartment. We went and looked at it together, he needed a ride so I gave him a ride for that. Outside of that, I haven't done anything like go for a meal or anything. But I do that on occasion with, with different people that are member of Circles and that may happen someday.
- Okay. All right.
- And what is your role in Circles of Support?
- I'm a volunteer. We have a weekly meeting. Our members come in and talk about their week, what's happening. We listen. Usually there's other members there that share advice. We ask them for a goal for the week, with Circle this week. You know, just a place for them to come and you know, talk about things and get it off their chest.
- Anyone else have any questions for Roy?
- Yeah, I'd like to know what kind of training he has?
- Well, initially six years ago when I joined, we were associated with Goodwill and they had training programs for us and there'd be ongoing training and we'd get invited to seminars, we'd go attend seminars. I attended the NAMI seminar down in Appleton a couple of different times, when that was going on before COVID. Because Circles was based in Appleton. But I have no formal training. I'm not a counselor or anything like that.
- Okay, thank you.
- Was there somebody else that wanted to speak on his behalf with you?
- Yes.
- Okay.
- Hello.
- Hi, if you could just state your name and address for the record please.
- Chris Oatman, 1969 Eastman Ave. apartment Five.
- Okay and how do you know Myles?
- He is in my group. I'm in the same sex offender group as he is.

- And what do you know about him?

- When he first came to the group, he was kind of like everybody is. He's nervous and don't wanna talk or say anything, but like he said, he hasn't missed any days, he's been on the phone with us. And then now we've been in-person probably about four weeks, five weeks now. And he's been. He has, when I say this, a different kind of a homework than everybody else because of his disability and stuff. So I don't know exactly how it works, but I'm kind of interested in it. And I've even talked to the counselor Fitzpatrick, and to try to, you know, maybe learn his way of learning how to do it too. Because that might be helpful in my own stuff. But he's been doing good. What he said, he's there on time, he's sharing his homework and stuff. He's talking about his feelings and he has that journal. So he presents that to everybody and shows, you know, what these feelings are. And he's even reached out to other members when he has urges, feelings, about kids or anything. And he's talked to people and he's done. He's actually shown that he does stuff instead of just sitting there, instead of whatever he used to do. So now he's reaching out to people, contacting them, and getting a hold of people and doing the right thing.

- Okay, thank you. Anybody have questions for him? Mr. Whitman, had you ever done this before, and this was just the first time you ever got caught?

- This is the first time I've been caught.

- How many times had you done that, looking at porn before?

- 2011.

- And you did that on the internet also?

- Yes.

- Okay, and was that children also?

- It was.

- What are you on disability for?

- I was born premature and they put me on disability when I was an infant.

- All right. Does the Board have any other questions or any comments they would like to make?

- A thought I have is maybe putting him on 90 days and then have him check back. He hasn't been in treatment that long or out that long, to make sure everything's going well.

- I guess I wouldn't have a problem with something like that. You know, he does say that, you know, what he did was wrong and he does have the remorse for it. It sounds like he is taking his treatment serious this time around. But you're right, he's only been in it for a couple months. Let alone only a few for a short time in-person. So, I could see that. Anybody else? Is there anybody that would like to make a motion?

- Yeah I'd like to make a motion.

- All right Peter.

- To revisit in 90 days.

- But would you approve it for 90 days? Is that what you're saying?
- Yes.
- Address specific?
- Yes.
- Okay. So we have a motion to approve Mr. Whitman for 90 days, address specific. And then Peter, is there anything you'd like him to do when he comes back?
- If he just could bring back people that he's working with or possibly some documentation to verify that he has been going to the meetings, and doing all this homework.
- Okay. Is there a second for that motion?
- I will second.
- All in favor, aye?
- Aye.
- Opposed? Okay. Mr. Whitman you've been approved to reside at 531 South Van Buren for 90 Days. And then you will need to come back to that meeting and provide us some documentation of your treatment. And if you're, you know, working with anybody, if they could speak on your behalf.
- Okay.
- All right.
- Yeah, thank you.
- Yes, where would you like us to mail that letter?
- 1761 Tranel avenue, 16B.
- Okay, thank you.
- You're welcome.
- Okay, next on the agenda is the appeal of Jarod Cole requesting to move to 521 South Oakland. Mr. Cole, you're present? Mr. Cole?
- He's here, we just need him to unmute.
- Yeah I see that, there we go.
- Can you hear me now?
- Yes.
- And Rachel, it looks like Renee is here now.

- Ma'am, I have been here. I cannot get into the agenda. So I can't log in, but I've been listening. But I didn't wanna go in the middle.

- Okay. All right. Mr. Cole, so again we're gonna ask you to give us the circumstances surrounding your arrest and what you were charged with. We do not want you to do speak of the victim by name or relationship. And then again you'll have the opportunity to talk about your treatment. Would you like that in closed or public session?

- [Jarod] I'll have it in public?

- Okay, so why don't we start with what you were convicted of and what happened?

- [Jarod] I was charged with second degree sexual assault of a child. When I was 24 this girl, who I won't talk about the relationship I'm sorry. Was underage came over and when things were rough , she would smoke to calm down and whatnot. And we were both under the influence at the time and we weren't really thinking when we had ended up fooling around. She only came around like three times. But there was never any other girl that had come over. I believe that I caused her great mental stress and harm. And I do believe that it is completely my fault. I definitely should've taken a different course of action, rather than having helped her delinquency.

- Okay, so when you say fool around, what exactly did you do?

- [Jarod] It was mutual intercourse, but we didn't actually have sex. I ended up masturbating her and she ended up jerking me out.

- And you said that only occurred on three occasions?

- [Jarod] Two occasions. She came around three times. She came around three times, but nothing happened the first night.

- Okay, and she was how old?

- [Jarod] 14.

- And you were 24. You knew she was 14 years old?

- [Jarod] I did.

- So why would you think that it's okay to do something like that?

- [Jarod] I again, was under the influence. I do not think it was okay.

- And when you say smoking and under the influence, are we talking marijuana or drinking?

- [Jarod] Marijuana.

- Okay .

- When you said she came around, like did she live in the neighborhood or did she know someone in your house? How did that happen?

- [Jarod] She knew somebody else in the household.

- And was that person present?
- [Jarod] They were not present, no.
- Was it a child or an adult that she knew?
- [Jarod] It was an adult. They knew each other through horseback riding.
- And the other party that lived with you didn't know that this was occurring between you and her?
- [Jarod] No.
- How did the police get involved?
- [Jarod] She ended up going to her counselor because she caught an STD from somebody else in school. And she had told, told about her. She talked about four other relationships she had as well.
- Commander Ebel, is that accurate information?
- [Paul] Yes, what he said is accurate. He was cooperative according to the complaint and admitted to his relationship with the victim.
- Okay, thank you . Does the Board have any question regarding his offense?
- Yes, I have a question. Jarod, what would keep you from doing this again?
- [Jarod] I do not wish to be put back in or be incarcerated ever again. This was a very meaningful lesson and I am not prepared to ever have that happen again.
- Do you have any support people around you?
- [Jarod] I have my girlfriend who lives in Seymour, but she works way too often. She's not able to be here with us, but I also have my grandmother here on the phone.
- Do you have any male support?
- [Jarod] Well, as far as male support, I would say my boss. But he's not currently with us either. He works too much as well.
- Thank you.
- So Jared, have you gone through any kind of treatment?
- [Jarod] I have not gone through any kind of treatment, I am currently going to be evaluated tomorrow at 11 for SOT-2. It's going to be over the phone and the reason that I haven't taken treatment was because of the COVID during my incarceration.
- Okay.
- When were you released?
- [Jarod] I was released on May 11th of this year, 2021.

- And you've been residing at the TLP that entire time?
- [Jarod] Ever since, yes. Any comments or questions from the Board?
- For me I can't see it, So I don't know .
- Are you residing alone?
- [Jarod] Yes, I'm residing alone.
- So right now, do you have. You're not in treatment, are you in any support groups or something like that?
- [Jarod] I'm in no support groups or no counseling or any kind of treatment currently at this moment?
- Well, I'm just gonna give you my opinion here. You know, typically we require people to have treatment at least to see how they're doing. I understand that they never offered treatment while you were in custody because of COVID. You have been out for a couple months, I don't know why it's taken so long for you to get the assessment. But I am a tad bit, not nervous but I mean I would prefer that you would have some treatment before we would go ahead and just let you loose in the community. I mean, I do appreciate your honesty about what came about, how everything happened. It sounds that you're somewhat sincere that this was your first arrest and you took it pretty serious. And so that's kind of where I am, kind of standing right now. I'm not really quite sure about I need you to stay at this address at this moment.
- [Jarod] Okay.
- How does the Board feel?
- Yeah, I would like to see him back after his evaluation. See what his evaluation is, what they suggest and go from there.
- Mm-hmm.
- For me.
- That's how I feel also.
- Was there anyone who wanted to speak either for or against Mr.Cole?
- Oh, okay. I'm sorry, I see there's a Donna out there waving. Okay Donna, if you can just unmute. And then if you wanna state your name and address for the record, please?
- Can you hear me? Can you hear me?
- Oh .
- Sure what's going on .
- know why that is happening?
- You might wanna leave and come back in.
- Jarod, is that your mom or your grandma?

- [Jarod] That's my grandmother.

- Or are you right next to her?

- [Jarod] No. That's my mom.

- Is there a way for you to communicate to them what's going on?

- [Jarod] Hold on one second.

- Can you hear me?

- Oh yes.

- That's better.

- Okay, I'm on my iPhone too. If one doesn't work, I'm ready for another.

- Okay.

- Yes, I'm grandma. Jarod has lived with me a couple of times. I have been his support system through all of this, and we have talked and texted every single day for two years including now that he's out. I feel that he will never do this again. He's very remorseful. We had talked about it, he was not raised this way at all. He's had a good upbringing. And I feel very confident and I can. I'll swear to it that if he is released into the community, he can be trusted. I've had lengthy conversations with him. My sister that passed away four years ago, or four months ago was a drug and alcohol abuse counselor. He has counseled with her. She was also a former judge. And so, we've had support that way. I live at. My name is Donna Cole, I live at 9458 Madison Ave, Briton New York. I live, I'm upstate near Canada. And so the area we live in, I have a raised ranch. And again, he's lived here. I helped him get on his feet, get a driver's license, get a job with U-Haul. You know, kind of was there for the whole thing. He wanted to move to Wisconsin, then he got transferred out there. He became general manager of the whole hub for over a year, two years. Now since he's been released May 11, he's kept his nose clean. He got a job in three weeks. He would call me and he'd be walking and I'd say, "Green Bay is beautiful I'll be there." And so in three weeks he got a job at the carwash and he recently got a promotion as--

- [Jarod] The assistant manager.

- Well, it's assistant manager quality control of the front end. He's also bought a car. He used his stocks from U-Haul and he bought a 2007 Mazda. He got a phone and he's also put a deposit down on an apartment which they approved him for, because he's been trying to do this for months. And he finally was able to get approved, with a deposit. I've also helped, supported him financially as well. So, when this all happened. Well I'll tell you, I took a second mortgage out on my home and paid for his lawyer, because I had that much faith in him that he would pull through. So, I will vouch for him anytime. And there again, you know, I've given him a faith and just helped him over these past couple of years. And I know that he will not ever be a repeat offender. I know that from the bottom of my heart. I know him inside out and backwards. So, that's what I wanna tell you, and he's not a harm to anyone, you know. And he would really like to develop this relationship with his girlfriend that he's known for a couple of years now. You know, they would like to move forward with their lives together and build a life. And I do plan on coming out and visiting him. With the COVID, I just don't know when that would be, you know. But, and I know that his evaluation will be fine. Totally fine. So, his mom is here. If you'd like to hear from her as well.

- Yes, does she want to speak on his behalf?

- She pretty much. My mom pretty much said it all. I will tell you that he is my first born child and he is. He's just a very responsible person. I know that this thing that, that happened, that occurred. I was completely just blown away. It's not. We couldn't believe it. We were like, "This isn't. This isn't Derek, this isn't who he is." So you know, it, unfortunately, you know he did smoke some pot. He was under the influence and that's what happened. And he's, you know, I feel that he has, you know. That he's really, really, really. And he's definitely, you know, changed. How should I put it? Oh, he just. It's just not him. I don't know what else to say other than the fact that I love my son. I will always have faith in my son. I will love him unconditionally no matter what. And I know like she said, he is not a harm to anyone at all. That is not who Jarod is.

- I'm sorry, could you just state your name for the record?

- Sure, it's Carey C-A-R-E-Y. Cole, C-O-L-E.

- Okay. And then we need that address.

- I live the same address. The 90--

- Same as the grandma?

- Yes, 9458 Madison Ave, yes.

- Okay, thank you.

- And Jarod does have two younger brothers as well. He has a 22 year old brother and he has a six year old brother.

- Okay. All right. Does the Board have any questions for either one of them?

- No .

- Okay, does anyone want to make a motion or have discussion?

- I have one more question for Jarod.

- Go ahead Peter.

- Do you still smoke pot or plan on it?

- [Jarod] I do not smoke pot anymore, because it's brought so much pain and anxiety in my life. And I'm done with doing anything. It's only when I just want to stay on the right path, build my career and work on getting my credit rebuilt.

- Thank you.

- Your grandma mentioned you wanted to build your life with your girlfriend, she lives in Seymour. Are you thinking of moving there or?

- [Jarod] At this moment, no. Because I wanna make sure I'm getting on my feet by myself currently, before I can continue and develop this relationship further.

- And how old is your girlfriend?

- [Jarod] She is 26.

- Any other questions or anyone want to make a motion? Anybody have comments that they'd like to talk about? What they're thinking?
- I have a question. If I may. He put a deposit down to hold this apartment and I know he said something about eval tomorrow, would this after the eval, is it all gonna depend on whether he can move to this place or not?
- Well right now, we're trying to decide how everybody feels about whether, they want him to maybe get this evaluation first and then come back before the Board. And there's a lot of options that we have. We could approve him for a period of time and then he would need to come back. We could deny him and then he could reapply later on in the future after he has gone through the eval and maybe some treatment. So it's really up to the Board right now, what they're going to decide. So right now we're waiting for somebody to make a motion, to see if we're going to either approve or deny him.
- Let's say I would move for 90 days and then we would get the results of the evaluation and hopefully he would have been able to start a treatment program and we'd have some documentation regarding that.
- Okay and how long of a treatment program do you think he would require?
- Donna, we're gonna try to take the vote first. To see if there's even anyone who's gonna second that motion.
- Okay.
- Yeah, so.
- Donna, we've got a motion on the floor, so this isn't an ongoing conversation. The Board has to vote now.
- I see, okay.
- All right, so Fay made the motion for 90 days, address specific. And what were the conditions Fay?
- That we get. He have the evaluation and we get some information about what was recommended. And if treatment is recommended. that he's in treatment, bring us some documentation, about how he's doing or how often he's attending.
- Is there a second?
- I will second that.
- And just to have a complete record Fay, you didn't use the magic word approve. You said, to 90 days.
- Approve for 90 days, yes thank you.
- Okay.
- And I second that.
- Okay. All in favor of that motion, aye?
- [Together] Aye.
- Opposed?

- Okay, Jarod you're approved for 90 days. You will need to come back and you will need to provide us documentation of your evaluation and that you're in and how that's going.

- [Jarod] Okay. Do I send that to the city clerk?

- They don't. You don't need to reapply, correct?

- He does not. If he could just bring me, any of the treatment documents and his evaluation. This is Deanna from the law department. So we were at City Hall on the second floor.

- [Jarod] Okay.

- All right, and then do you want us to mail to the Oakland add or the Shawano add?

- [Jarod] Will do the Oakland add please.

- Okay, thank you.

- [Jarod] Thank you.

- All right . All right, next on the agenda is the appeal of Alphonso Hodges requesting to move to 1744, 14th Avenue. Mr. Hodges are you here?

- Yeah.

- Yeah, okay. Now you have been before the Board several occasions. I know that we do have a lot of new Board Members right now. So I'm gathering, they're gonna wanna hear about your previous. Your offense. Am I correct with the rest of the Board feeling that way?

- Yes.

- Yes.

- Yes.

- Okay, so Alphonso we're gonna ask that you talk about what you were convicted of, how it became known to everybody. And if we wanna talk about your treatment, can we do that in public or private session?

- [Alphonso] Public is okay.

- Okay, so again, please don't name the victim by name or relationship.

- Okay.

- So tell us what happened.

- [Alphonso] Yeah, it was. This happened 20 years ago, 2001. I was convicted of second degree sexual assault. I think it was two counts I think. I just went to my buddy's house to go pick him up to go to the bar. And he had people there that I didn't even know. Ended up staying, drinking, and ended up having sex with girls that I didn't. That I didn't even know. I went home. And the next morning I got picked up.

- Okay.

- Did I just . Girls plural or girl?
- [Alphonso] Girls, I got convicted of second degree sexual assault on two counts ma'am.
- Okay, thank you. Continue, I'm sorry.
- [Alphonso] And I ended up. I ended up going home and when I woke up the next morning. The cops were at my door and I was arrested then.
- And did you plead guilty to that?
- [Alphonso] Yes ma'am.
- Okay and how much time did you get for that offense?
- [Alphonso] I believe it was 30 days.
- Okay, and then probation?
- Yeah, I took probation and I completed my sexual. My sexual treatment courses. I have not. I have not re-offended. I did get arrested again for not. For not complying or something like that. I got kicked out of my house from my girlfriend. I wrote a letter, sent the letter. They said they did. They said that they never got the letter. And then I ended up. I ended up going to court for that. Nothing. I didn't get convicted or anything of of the not compliance whatever. The judge put me in jail for child support. I think I did like 60 or 90 days for that. And then. Then I've been . I moved in to. I moved in. I moved into a place, didn't know I had to register. Cops showed up at my door, telling me I had to go through the committee. He ended up watching my house and found out that I was doing nothing. There was nothing illegal going on. There was no girls coming in and out, nothing like that. I lived at that place for eight years, no problem. Moved out of there and I've been with my girlfriend or fiancé now, after that. We live at. We live at 1942 Woodlane right now, and we've been here for three years with no problems as well. We just bought a house at 1744, 14th. I'm excited, 'cause I'm a first time home owner. I've held steady jobs. Right now I've been at my job for a year and a half almost two years now. And I'm just trying to be a. I'm just trying to get my life together and just move ahead. Like it says it's been 20 years and I've never re-offended and I don't plan on re-offending. I'm very sorry it happened, it's just one of the things that you gotta grow on and learn from.
- Where are you working now?
- [Alphonso] I'm working at Tower Palace.
- And I mean, I know it's been 20 years. I didn't really see documentation of treatment, correct? And I'm assuming that's because it's not accessible?
- [Alphonso] I don't know. Like I said, it's been 20 years and I did do sexual assault. I think it was sexual assault drug and drug and alcohol with something. I don't know. But I completed it.
- Where did you complete it?
- [Alphonso] I can't remember. I can't remember what the name of the place was, but we all. It was way before COVID and all this. And I can't remember where it was, I'm sorry.
- It wasn't in prison, it was after?

- [Alphonso] Yes, it was after. I never went to prison. Never, I've never been in prison in my life. I don't plan on going to prison . So, it's just not what I meant.

- Can I ask why you didn't fill out the community ties and support part of the packet?

- [Alphonso] I went through with the lady and the lady walked me through the stuff that that needed to be filled out, I did. If there was something that I missed, like I said, she walked me through it I don't know. What would you like to know ma'am?

- Do you have any support from the community or how long have you lived in Green Bay ?

- [Alphonso] I've lived in Green Bay over 20 years. The last time I was at or the last time I went to this meeting before we moved here, I had a brother speak for me. I'm with my fiance and she's. She's gonna speak on my behalf, whenever you guys would like her to.

- And having been before us, you know we have to approve where you're gonna live. You understand you're taking a risk on buying a house without our approval, correct?

- Yes ma'am. But I think my past record speaks for itself. I've not re-offended. I've not done. I haven't even got a speeding ticket, I've done nothing unlawful. I'm just trying to move on with my life, ma'am and be a productive member of the community. And just, I wanna buy a house, you know. I wanna start my life.

- Does anyone have or want to speak on your behalf?

- [Alphonso] Yes, I have. I have my fiance Carrie here.

- Okay. Carrie if you could just state your full name and address for the record, please?

- [Carrie] Okay. Carrie Verhagen, 1942 Woodlane.

- What would you like to ?

- [Carrie] I expect things of him. I'm strict with him. We've talked about this before. He knows where I stand on the issue. I don't approve. I never will approve of any activity like that. I expect him to go to work every day, and the sale of the house is not final yet. Still have some bank approval stuff and everything. So, we're not quite there yet. We wanted to buy this house so that we can make our life together there. But like I said, it's not final yet. I believe in Al, he has showed me that he can toe the line. He doesn't go out to drink and party and all that kind of stuff. He stays home with me. I guess, I guess I believe in him. I can't imagine so.

- Are you both .

- [Carrie] Yes, the house is in my name, but he pays me every week, like a rent.

- Okay.

- [Carrie] He pays me \$325 a week.

- Okay. Thank you.

- [Carrie] Is that it then?

- Yeah, unless the Board has any questions for her?

- Okay.
- Okay.
- [Carrie] Thank you.
- Thank you. Does the Board have any other questions or comments they would like to make for Mr. Alphonso?
- I do.
- Okay, yes Peter?
- Well Al, when do you plan on getting married?
- [Alphonso] We're planning to get married in 22.
- Congratulations.
- [Alphonso] All right, thank you.
- [Carrie] Thank you.
- [Alphonso] Carrie says thank you as well.
- Yes.
- Okay, I'm just going to throw out my opinion for the Board. Obviously this offense happened over 20 years ago. We've approved him to reside at Woodlane. I mean it looks like he's been living there the past since 2000, 08
- 18--
- 18 yeah.
- So and he has not had any other offenses during that timeframe. So I would. And I understand we don't have treatment documentation, but I'm sure part of that is because of the time-lapse that has gone through. So for me personally, I don't have an issue with him residing at this address. Anybody else have thoughts?
- I'm agreeing with you. I agree, it's been 20 years and yes, he has not been in trouble.
- I also agree.
- Same here.
- All right. Is there anybody that would like to make a motion?
- I'll make a motion to approve Mr. Hodges to 1744, 14th avenue address specific.
- Is there a second?
- I will second.

- All in favor?
- [Together] Aye.
- Opposed? Okay Mr. Hodges, you've been approved to, I guess purchase. Finish purchasing 1744, 14 Avenue--
- [Alphonso] All right, thank you.
- Okay, would you like us to mail it to that address or would you like us to mail it to the Woodlane address?
- [Alphonso] Mail it to the Woodlane address please.
- Okay, will do. Thank you.
- All right, thank you.
- All right. Okay. Next on the agenda is the appeal of Ronald Munyon. Ronald are you here?
- Yes.
- Okay.
- Yes I am.
- All right, I see that. And it looks like Mr. Munyon, you have been before the Board on a couple of different occasions, correct?
- Yes ma'am, correct.
- Okay. So we're gonna just have you go over your offense once again. And again, please don't talk about the victim by name or relationship. And then the situation came to light. Okay?
- Okay. The happened July 18th, 1999. I got divorced that day and I was drinking early in the morning. And drinking isn't an excuse. I know this, I learned that from Jim Drake and family services through I've been at focus group. What I'm telling you is I was drinking that day, and then I went to hang out with my friend and she had to go somewhere, asked me to stay there and watch Heather for her--
- Please don't say names.
- I'm sorry. Anyway, go watch the victim. And I said, "Yes, that's fine." And we were just hanging out and I was drinking beer. Which I shouldn't have been. And basically she was doing things that she wasn't on the internet. And I told her, "You shouldn't be doing that." And then she asked me like, "Let me see your penis." And I told her I couldn't do that. And she said, "Why not?" You know, And I said, "Because it's not right." And she basically convinced me that she had a crush on me and stuff. And I told her that, "We can't do this." And she said, she wouldn't tell if I didn't tell. And I should've never did it. I should've never, you know. I screwed up. I made a poor choice a long time ago. And my rehabilitation with Jim Drake at Family Services, basically reminded me that drinking was a big problem in my life. and I quit drinking back in 2003. And I do not touch alcohol anymore. That has nothing to do with the offense, it is one of the things that I determined. Me and Jim Drake determined in family services. So basically, I talked to her mother and her mother's deceased now, but back then. And she told me that I did her wrong And I did to her family wrong? And my victim had to have additional counseling. And I felt very remorseful about that, because, you know, I shouldn't have never made that choice. That's all I can say. I did not go to prison. I turned myself in, I did 90 days in jail and eight years on probation. I had Lydia Ching, I had. What was the other girl's name? I can't remember. I was released from

probation on September 10th, 2012. And I have not been in any trouble since. I've been working. I work in De Pere at graphics. I'm not the same man today that I was 20 years ago. I've grown a lot from this. I wish I had my wife here to speak on my behalf, but she got called into work early today. So it's just me by myself. I do apologize about that.

- Okay.

- But I feel that I've grown a lot. Go ahead I'm sorry.

- Yeah, you said you were on probation for eight years?

- Yes, I was on probation for eight years because the judge said he might not suspect . But he gave me a prison sentence of six years in the penitentiary, however, he gave me a state imposed sentence and I didn't understand it other than I had to do 90 days in jail at Brown County Jail and I did it under the Hebrew program. And I had to go through denial focus group phase one, which was beginners, denial focus group intermediate and denial focus group aftercare. I went through a SOT, I went through AODA counseling, 'cause I did smoke a little marijuana back then. I shouldn't have done that either. But you know, I had to go through the counseling to understand why I did this. And what I learned over the years is that I used to let myself medicate and you can't self-medicate in reality, you have to be about. What is it? You have to be conscious of your decisions. You have to realize that life is not a party. And I realized life's not a party. Like I said, I'm not the same man I was 21 years ago. I want to say 1999. And I'm just asking for approval. I did receive approval like six years ago from the Board, and we couldn't find a place my wife and I. So we ended up settling for roommate living in De Pere, Wisconsin. Unfortunately last year, our roommates decided they had to move and we couldn't afford the place ourselves. So we had to basically . Now I have tried to comply every which way possible. I talked to City Hall, City Hall said I have to find somebody that's willing to rent to me and then I have to get an affidavit from him that states that he's willing to rent to me and then I had to go down to City Hall and go through that process. So I did that. And again all I'm asking for is approval to live here at 1144 Stewart Street because I have to live somewhere. I don't wanna be homeless. I do work for a living. I'm a very responsible individual. I wasn't way back then. And that's what--

- You're currently not living in De Pere? You got kicked out?

- The lease was up in July 31st and I stayed . I called probation and parole and told them that, the landlord gave me approval, I don't know what they're doing as far as setting up an appointment for the approval, but I did receive approval six years ago and I thought that was okay. So I moved in here, I even called SORB. I reported to SORB that I moved in here with my wife. And we're just waiting to hear from Green Bay 'cause, I can't be homeless.

- Right.

- You know, I'm a very responsible individual. I can't be homeless. And it took me forever to find one person to rent to us. Just one person that was cost effective, 'cause I can't afford \$1,000 month. So that's why I'm asking the Board, is there any way to give me another opportunity to reside here at 1144 Stuart Street. If not I'm gonna be homeless I have no other choice. Nobody will rent to me.

- Okay, does the Board have any questions? And I apologize Mr. Munyon, I didn't really ask you about your treatment. If we could do that in public or private? You just kind of chose to continue talking about it a little bit and--

- Oh, that's all right.

- I'd like to start I hope you're okay with that?

- Yeah, it's public knowledge anyway. I am on the sex offender registry, you know. And I guess I'm just trying to comply the best I can, and with COVID it's becoming a little harder.

- Sure.

- So, if my wife could be here, she would be here, but she got called to work. So I do apologize.

- It's okay. Do any of the Board Members have any questions for him or any comments?

- I do have a question. In my notes, I have that there was a second sexual assault in 2003, but not listed under sexual offense. I apologize--

- I don't know.

- I can't see that right now. So, I'm just wondering about that. If anyone looking through their packet. Do you see anything about that? I did this like last week, so I don't remember.

- Yes, there was a 2003. But I think. Let me see, I don't recall if there was a second.

- This is Deanna. I think it may be the same offense, because he wrote on the top he was convicted in '03.

- That's what I was thinking too. I can't see another document of conviction on that.

- It looks like Mr. Munyon wants to--

- Yeah, say something?

- I just wanted to say--

- okay, go ahead.

- Go ahead Ron.

- It was one conviction. It was one conviction. The incident happened in 1999. On July 18th, 1999. And I turned myself I'm sure. I think it was in 2001 and they said they would let me know in . They said two weeks, they would let me know if Brown County was gonna do anything and it took them like nine months before they said that they were gonna charge me with sexual assault. And then I went through the court process for like another year and a half. They kept delaying court. And finally I was convicted in 2003. So, that's what that is.

- All right.

- If that helps you.

- Yes it does, thank you.

- Okay. Any other questions or comments from the Board?

- I guess I also have a comment to make. You said that you'd been to us before, so you thought it was okay now that you could just move into Stuart Street and that's not the case. You do have to come and be approved before you go to any address. Like if you move, you have to come back to us. Because we approved you to one address, do you continue to just be approved. Do you understand that?

- I do apologize. Yes, I do apologize about that. I did go to the Board like I said, about six years ago. And when I was approved, I thought I was approved I could come back. Well, it's been too long, you have to go through City Hall again. So again, I apologize.

- It's just like we addressed. Time has nothing to do with it.

- Okay.

- Do we have any other comments from the Board? Ron I'm sorry, did you wanna say something else?

- I was gonna say if I can't get approval, I have to sleep in my truck. I don't know what else to do.

- Ron, we're gonna talk about that right now.

- Fair enough.

- Okay, any comments from the Board? I'll give you my opinion again. So my opinion is again, if this happened back in 1999. Again, I know we don't have treatment records, but he was able to let us know of all the different programs that he has participated in. He has not had really any issues since that arrest. Again and like he said, he's been working, he's been addressed. So I don't have a problem with him staying at this Stuart Street address. Anybody else have any thoughts?

- I agree.

- I agree also.

- All right, is there anyone who would like to make a motion?

- I move that Ron be approved address specific 1144 Stuart Street.

- Is there a second?

- I second.

- All in favor, aye?

- [Together] Aye.

- Opposed?

- Opposed.

- Is that one opposed? Okay. All right Mr. Munyon, you have reside at 1144 Stuart Street, address specific. Again, if you do decide to move from that address, you do have to come back before the Board again.

- Okay.

- Okay.

- Thank you very much, and god bless you.

- Would you like us to mail that to the Stuart Street or the De Pere address?

- Stewart Street would be great. I 144 Stuart upper. I don't know if the address is upper of a half. The mailbox shows upper, the post office said it was a half. All I know is that it's in upper.

- Okay, all right thank you.

- God bless, you all. Have a great day.

- You too.

- All right, next on the agenda is Daniel Hebb. Requesting to move to 1006 Dousman Street. Daniel, I see you there. Daniel you have been before the Board on multiple occasions. And let's see, the last time you were January of this year, requesting to move to 1904 Carlin Avenue. We approved you for that address, and now you're looking to move again?

- Correct.

- Is there a reason why you're moving so soon?

- Yes, I have. Circumstances, because it's actually the woman that I'm living with my girlfriend. It's actually her residence and her son was residing in that residence and he is actually moving out of State. So, we decided to see if we can move in there together. And my probation officer agreed and now I'm here, seeing if you guys will.

- Okay. Again, I know we have some new Board Members and I don't know if you read his information or if you would like him to go over his. What he was convicted of. Would you like him to do that Board Members?

- If he could briefly just go over--

- Okay, sure. Daniel, if you can just go ahead and tell us what you were charged with and convicted of and give us the circumstances. But again, don't talk about the victim by name.

- All right. I was convicted in 2008 of first degree sexual assault and repeated sexual assault of a minor under the age of 12. At the time it was. The woman that I was dating it was her daughter. It started out when she was approximately eight years old, and it went on for a four year period, when I was arrested. And then I was arrested, convicted. I didn't put no one through a trial, didn't fight it. I was convicted. Got sent to prison for 18 years all together. 10 years in confinement and eight years probation. I've been released since 2018.

- Were you told by your probation officer not to live with your girlfriend's son? Why were you waiting until he moved out?

- No, I was not. But her son is of age. So no, it was not. I just didn't want to live with her kid. He had at the time already and still does have dogs. So it was a better fit. And we were planning on. Still planning on buying another residence. So we didn't see this happening at this time. Just some circumstances came up and he's young and wants to move out of State. So she does not want to lose her residence. So I went in like I said, and asked my probation officer. She did a house evaluation through it, went to her supervisor, who gave us the green light and we're here.

- So, your girlfriend is the one who owns the home?

- Correct.

- Okay.

- And she would be here today but. She was here earlier, but she had to actually run her son to work so that she just stepped out, just like five minutes ago.

- And how long have the two of you been dating?

- Pretty much 2019, 2018 around there. Got through, went through the whole gambit of probation and parole, just coming out of prison. Being fresh out, jumped into a relationship. You know, they don't really see that as a, I guess a good thing. So, we had to go through some stuff through our end and prove that we were, that it was serious. She knows everything about my crime. She knows my three POs that I had, 'cause I got, I'm on my third one right now. So, Candy is my probation officer, they communicate. So yeah, that's about it.

- Okay. And then Daniel, if we wanna talk about your treatment, are you okay with talking about that in public or would you prefer private?

- Public is okay.

- Okay, so it looks like you have received sex offender treatment. Is that correct?

- That's correct.

- Okay and did you do some of that while you were incarcerated? Or did you do that after you got released from jail?

- I did both. I completed one at red, a seven month course they had there at the time. And then when I got released, I started with the DOC through Rebecca. They lost her contract and I went to Pablo, and basically started over with him. And I completed that treatment with him, with Pablo.

- And how long about were you with Pablo?

- Over probably maybe 13 months. I was in treatment right when I got out, when I first seen you guys in 2018, and then like I said, we got transferred or we had a different provider. So basically started over. I'm not really sure of the date, I think the date's on my letter I sent you guys.

- Yeah.

- Like when I did complete it.

- Yeah, we got that.

- Okay. Does the Board have any questions or comments for him?

- I have a question. Daniel, when are you planning on getting married?

- When do I plan on getting married?

- Yeah.

- Good question. I have a five-year plan in my head. A lot of things like getting work, getting stable. Working on myself with who my, like when I got out my AODA. My SOT groups. Just staying strong, positive. I have a lot of things to prove to a lot of individuals and that's including her. So, I gave myself a five-year plan. That's the thing. It's one of them, we have talked about it. But like I said, I have a lot to prove. It just doesn't happen overnight. But I believe since I've been out 2018, I've been doing excellent I would say. Been employed, I work

for George-Pacific right now. Been there. A blessing to get into that. Been there since January, so I'm going on 18 months or something or around there.

- Do you work full time?

- At George-Pacific?

- Yes.

- Correct.

- Thank you.

- You're welcome.

- And you haven't been in any other trouble?

- Well, I. In my early, I guess 18 when I first got out, I was at the time, I guess you would say the girlfriend that I was with was a chaperone and we decided to have a relationship without telling my probation officer and then we did tell her and she asked how long we were seeing each other. With that being said, I was. She took away for me seeing my son. And then she took away from me seeing my girlfriend at the time. They were like my biggest support group at the time, still are. I kind of went off the little deep end, and I ended up in the county jail. My appeal at the time was. I can't think of her name came in, they released me the next day and talked to me and you know. She didn't put blame on herself, but she said she could've probably handled it a little bit different because, she just said this and then threw me out the office and I didn't know at the time, how it really. I guess I kind of. Didn't know how to handle it and I went back to my other way of thinking. And when I got out we talked, I got back in the AODA treatment. Talked to Rebecca, at the time she was my facilitator. Went through another packet of just how to handle things when they do come up, instead of handling them like I used to handle them. And that has worked out by communicating with my probation officer, communicating with my support group, my father, my family, anyone that will listen and I can talk to. And that's what I do a lot. People say I talk too much sometimes, but you live and learn. And since then, I've had no bumps in the road. No violations or any. And everything's been going really well since then.

- Okay, thank you .

- All right, anything else from the Board? Well again, here's my opinion. So I will have no issue approving him. Especially looking back at his history with us. When he got out of prison, I mean we pretty much approved him right away to live in the city on Oakland street and then a couple of different times within that apartment building and then we approved them for Farlin Avenue. So, I think that kind of shows a good track record for him. I mean, he did provide us the documentation for all the treatment that he received. So, I don't have any concerns with him. Anybody else?

- I agree. The history is good.

- I agree also.

- Okay.

- Same here.

- So, I'll make a motion to approve to 1006 Dousman, I'm assuming that's right. Address specific.

- Okay, is there a second?

- I'll second.
- Second.
- All in favor?
- [Together] Aye.
- Opposed.
- Aye.
- Okay Mr. Hebb, you've been approved to move to 1006 Dousman. Again, if you decide to move from there, you know you need to come back before us.
- Correct.
- Okay, and then would you like us to mail this to that address or to the Farlin address?
- address please.
- Okay.
- Can I get off? Can I or do I have to sit to the end?
- No, you can get off.
- Okay, all right.
- Okay, thank you.
- Thank you. You guys have a good day.
- You too. Okay next on the agenda is the appeal of 421220, 8th Street. I see Cody is here. Cody, you have a been before us on multiple occasions again. So, we will just have you kind of go over, and then we have some new Board Members. So, if you could just go over your offense and what you were convicted of. Again, don't say the victim's name or relationship.
- Okay, in 2007. I was . I was at a party and ended up sleeping with a 14 year old girl. I didn't know how old she was at the time, but I think that doesn't even matter. But, okay so then. Yeah, and it was my friend's babysitter. It's been a long time since I actually thought about it. I go through . It was a . It was a friend's babysitter. And I was drinking. It's . Is there anything else? I mean I'm nervous or not actually .
- I'm sorry, so what did you do with this 14 year old?
- We had sex. I sexually assaulted her. And I mean since. Yeah I mean, that's the crime. I mean, I.
- And that was a one time deal, you didn't--
- Yeah, no. I never met her before that, I never seen her ever after that either.
- Okay, and then how did the police get involved?

- Well, I mean. The night that it happened I. After, it had happened, I didn't know how old she was. So like my friend came up and I was, and I had no idea. So I was like, "Hey bro." I said, "Hey man, I slept with your babysitter." And then he told me how old she was. And then so, that night I went home and I was, I was. I was freaking out. And honestly I was just hoping. I was like, "Wow, what an idiot." I just hoped and prayed that this just blows over. And not in terms of it. Well, three months later I got a letter in the mail, they charged me through the mail. And then I took the. The court process took another two years almost to get convicted and then I was convicted in 2009.

- All right. Okay, do you wish to talk about your treatment at all in public or private session?

- I can do it in public, it doesn't matter, yeah.

- And have you received treatment?

- Yes, I did the SOT-2 program in Oshkosh correction mostly. I think that would have been in 2010 or 11. One or two of them.

- Okay.

- Between the right in there area.

- All right.

- You know, I did see Jim Drake on the streets also. But while I was on probation, I did five years on probation. But after about a year of sex offender treatment on the streets, my PO said. She said she doesn't think that I need anymore treatment at all. So she took me out of it. Jim Drake agreed to take me out of it.

- Okay. And maybe I'm messing up but did you turn in any documentation? 'Cause I guess I'm not seeing any. Or if I did I'm missing it.

- Yeah, I mean it's next to the dog. I don't remember if I got my PO to add it, I'm not a neighbor anymore, but I mean I think I showed you guys .

- Yeah and that's what I was gonna say, I know that we have approved you several times, which we wouldn't had we not seen documentation regarding your treatment. Okay, so why are you looking at moving?

- Well, my girlfriend or ex wife, fiancé, whatever you wanna call it, 14 years we've been together on and off. She bought a house and since I can't have lived there right now, I've been staying at my sister's house, until I could get approved here. She's here too to talk if you need to talk to her.

- Your, it's your girlfriend or your wife?

- She's actually my ex-wife.

- Legally we're divorced.

- Yeah.

- In 2009 when he went to prison, we did divorce but, within a couple of days of him being released we have gotten back together. And he's been living within like, three of my addresses for the last 14 years, kind of back and forth between when I move and stuff like that. So we're just kinda going to the next phase. I bought this house and I'd like him to move in with me.

- Okay I'm sorry, could you just state your name and your address for the record?
- Kristin Brodhagen, 1220, 8th Street.
- Okay. All right, so what would you like to say about Cody?
- He's been doing really well, he's had a little issues in the past and we have broken up a few times, but right now everything is good. He's trying to start some businesses and stuff like that. I'm trying to do the right thing. And right now, we're kind of living apart and would like to you know, live together again.
- In my notes I have, will step-daughter reside with them? I apologize, this was done a while ago. So I'm not exactly sure why I wrote that. Do you have a daughter separate from Cody?
- Yes, I have a 16 year old daughter with another ex-boyfriend and he at times did not allow him to live with me. So at times he would have to move out just of anger. He doesn't have any right to my daughter, he's not even on the birth certificate I don't even think. And he's just caused some issues over the years, but now she since COVID, moved in with with my sister to help with my nephew. And she has just decided to stay there this time. So at this time there is no child living in my home.
- Okay. I just wasn't sure why, now that you say that I remember reading about her dad. Her dad not liking it.
- Yeah, he's caused a lot of problems in the past, but he shouldn't be an issue right now, as long as he gets accepted at my home.
- Okay.
- All right, does the Board have anything, any other question or comments they would like to make?
- I do have another question?
- Yes.
- I also have written down that in the court papers it said enroll in tech school for another line work? Can you explain that.
- It says what?
- It says enroll in tech school for another line of work. I'm sorry I can't look it up.
- He isn't going to tech school. I don't see.
- What are you--
- That was like in 2018. I have 2018 written there. Enroll in tech school for another line of work. It was like in the court papers, like what the judge said.
- I might I think that. I might've, I don't remember.
- Yeah, he might've been thinking about it but--
- Yeah, I don't think. I don't think I never did that there.

- And then in the papers it says you work for cash. What kind of work do you do?
- I work for cash. I do side jobs, little things for my. My sister owns a company, but I mean, I don't really have a full-time job there, I just go help her clean up if she just needed help really, so I mean, that's what she pays me.
- Like a handy man type thing or what?
- Well kind of when she has stuff to. She just pays me to do odd things around her house and stuff. Just snows when I needed money at the time. Right now, me and a friend of mine are in the process of starting a business doing roofing and siding. And you know, we've got everything purchased he says. So as soon as that's going, I'll be working full-time.
- Okay, any other comments or questions?
- I have one question. Do you plan on getting remarried?
- Once my child support is paid up, yes. But, we made that mistake. When we got married the first time, we were young, we were 24 years old and we got married, I still owed child support, they ended up taking all of her money out since. So I'm not gonna do that to her, I'm not gonna put her in a position where so.
- Thank you.
- He had to deal his child support before we got married.
- Yeah.
- All right, anything else? Well again, I really don't have an issue approving Cody. He has been out in the community for quite some time. His offense was quite a long time ago. I do know that, you know, you had in 2019, the failure to provide the sex offender information, which I'm gathering at that time where--
- We were broken up for a month or two.
- We were broken up and then I had a warrant to probation and parole, so I took off. And so I was absconding. And then so, I think I absconded for like two or three months and then I got. They charged me with that.
- Okay, all right. So yeah, I mean based on his past history, his approvals and you know, the treatment that we have received previously, I don't have an issue with him. Staying at this eighth street address. Anybody else have any other thoughts or opinions?
- Agreed, he answered the questions I had so.
- I agree too.
- Okay.
- Same here.
- Okay, would anyone like to make a motion?
- I will move approval address specific 1220, 8th Street.
- Is there a second?

- I'll second.
- Okay, all in favor aye?
- [Together] Aye.
- Opposed? Okay Cody, you're approved reside at the 1220, 8th Street. Address specific. Would you like us to mail that to that address or to the Shawano Avenue?
- I guess that 8th street.
- Okay.
- Thank you.
- Thank you. All right next on the agenda is the appeal on Jose Bautista requesting to move to 413 North Chestnut Avenue. Is Jose on here?
- [Jose] I am.
- Okay. All right, Jose you have been before us also in the past. It's been quite some time since you've been here. So, we're gonna just ask that you tell us about the offense, what you were convicted of. And please don't state the victim's name or your relationship?
- [Jose] Well, when I was 18 years old, I had sexual intercourse with 15 year. I met her at a party in the neighborhood. It was the September 16th, . We were in. I was in high school at the time. There's this group of high schoolers and it was just you know, smoking pot and just basically partying. You know I was young. I was just reckless at the time and we ended up having sexual intercourse. And then, about a week and a half later I got arrested, so.
- All right. Do you know how? Did she tell somebody what happened?
- [Jose] She was reported as a runaway and she must. I think her aunt reported it. That me and her had sexual intercourse. And I really don't know how it happened, because under the police report it says that she was a runaway and she said she was in like a. She didn't participate in the crime or she did. And you know. She didn't, wasn't a victim of any sort. And then a week later. it came out that me and her had sexual intercourse, because her mom found a hickey on her neck and then I was arrested after that.
- Okay, and how much time did you get for that?
- [Jose] I got 12 years of supervision. Two years incarcerated for a total of 14 years.
- Okay.
- [Jose] I've been on parole for 10 years. I accomplished a lot, you know. It's been a bumpy road, and I know I did ended up going back to jail, but not re-offending basically, just rule evasion smoking pot. And I ended up relapsing on marijuana and just. I got married to my. To Guadalupe Gomez. Which is now my ex-wife. We did not get along very well and domestic violence was involved and alcohol and drugs were used, after that I relapsed and now we're divorced and it's been five years. And everything's like, ever since I started moving out on my own and now I got kids, I got two girls. And then just like really remorseful, because now I have two daughters and it's like. I think back to what I caused and it's like. I definitely don't want my daughter's going through it. You know, I kind of failed as a man. I should've been more alert. And to be honest, I just, I was

really young and I was just dumb. My mentality wasn't fully developed, it was just like, whatever it is partying, just do whatever, you know.

- When do you get done with probation?

- [Jose] I get done at. I got two years left.

- Okay.

- [Jose] I think it said 2023. September 2023, I believe. I'm not sure of the date.

- Okay, that's okay. And I'm sorry, if we wanna talk about your treatment programs, can we talk about that during public session or do you wanna go in private session?

- [Jose] Public is fine.

- Okay. It doesn't look like you're. Oh yes, you did need to complete sex offender treatment according to your judgment of conviction. Did you do that while you were in custody?

- No, I actually did it while I was here.

- Oh, okay. Let me see, I may have missed that again.

- I dunno if you guys can see this. But I didn't have. I had my parole approval forward it to you guys, but I don't know if you guys got it. But this is my certificate for SOT-2.

- Oh, okay. When did you complete that?

- July 31st, of 2018.

- Okay. I'm sorry, I must've missed that then.

- I don't believe. I don't believe I received that. So, it wasn't in the package. 'cause I didn't get it.

- Oh, okay.

- Okay, it wasn't mistook.

- I apologize for that. When I filled out the application I couldn't. I couldn't remember what was the program that I took and finished. So, I had my probation parole officer forward that to you guys, I don't know if she did or not and if she didn't I apologize. That's why I kind of held it up, so you guys can see it. But I apologize for that.

- Yeah, okay.

- And are you working anywhere right now?

- Yes, I just became a general contractor. Which is typically here. General contracting certified from porch, DNI and city jobs, hotels like anything. So this is like a big changer for me. I've been running. I've been running a company Southshore Roofing.

- What is it called?

- Southshore Roofing, but it. They had a website two years ago, on southshoreroofing.com. They've got a website and all that stuff. All the jobs that are on there, I personally complete all those. And traveling for work and doing good, I'm just trying to move in with my fiancé. I got full custody of my kids. I am like basically a single father. The mothers are not in their lives and I got two. One a four year old and a three year old and I'm battling custody for the four year old right now. I've been having her for about three months now and I got full custody of my three-year-old. So, .

- Okay.

- Is there anyone who wants to speak on your behalf?

- There was, but my fiancé just actually walked out, 'cause my daughters are in their room fighting and--

- Okay.

- but I was like, "Don't worry about it." I'm like, you know. I can explain everything. She's okay with everything, my probation officer into the house. And she looked everything over. Right now am residing at 265 North Dans Avenue, but my lease is up. And I was gonna go get my own place again, because I have both my daughters, but my fiancé said, "Can we try to become family and live under the same roof?" And I was always scared about me doing that because of my past, like my ex-wife and how we fought and how I was getting kicked out of the house and it's just like, I was scared of it. And I said, "You know what, let's try it." Her name's Stephanie, my fiancé. She's been very supportive. Her whole family understands. I don't go anywhere unless I tell them about my case. I explained to everybody, you know. Of course, I'm not gonna go to a client and be explaining it to them, you know, 'cause that will like lose the business. But other than that, I'm very honest with people if they ask me. I've just I've been doing so well to be honest, like I accomplished a lot, I'm still in college and in College for electricity. So, it's like I'm moving forward with my life and trying to forget. But everyday, I still remember like what I caused, you know. What I paid for and I'm still paying. Like I did my prison sentence but, it's still like it's in the back of my head every day of my life like, I actually caused this and I fear that my kids can go through this, you know? And I have two daughters now. So it's like, "Are you freaking serious? Like, why would you do this? Why would you do that?" And now that I'm actually mature in my head it's like, kind of too. I wouldn't say too late, but it kind of like, it's always gonna be there, you know? And it's just, I'm moving on and you know, I just, I hope you guys can understand me and hope you guys take into consideration everything I've accomplished. And not a lot of people accomplish, what I've been accomplishing and that's all I have for you.

- I did, I just have a question. So, your daughters are gonna be living with you. Who are the other two people that are listed on your application?

- My--

- Stephanie's kids?

- Yeah, they're 18. Both of them are 18.

- Octavian is like 11, but has like has so he's handicapped. So, he's at basically half his age. But I mean, I have no problems around kids. It's just something that I caused and committed a crime you know, when I was 18. My rules doesn't state that I can be under. It only states that I can be. I can't be around girls 14 and 17, because of my crime. It doesn't state that I can't be around like boys or you know, or be around children because I do have full custody of my kids.

- Okay. All right, does the Board have any questions or comments that they would like to take care of right now?

- Did you just say you were going to school for, to be electrician?

- Yeah.

- Okay.

- And you did. I mean, one of the last times you were with us, you were working for Moss maybe?

- No, no, I was getting an interview for Moss and I was gonna get apprenticeship.

- Okay.

- My father passed away and I ended up paying for everything. It was just like one big hole just. My whole year was just negative that year and I had to exit out of school and I had to move everything, pay for his funeral. And that's kind of where I said, "You know what, this is enough." I've been doing roofing for a long time now. I install solar systems, solar panels. You know, I install gutters. So, I've been doing this and I accomplished all of this on parole, you know. And I just. It's just the very sad moments for me, those times emotionally and mentally because. My father, that was always the only person that used to support me is now gone. And now I found this like family that took me in and it's like, everybody's accepting me and they're giving me all their support, and this has been life changing for me. They love my kids, you know. They see my kids as their own family and it's just like a great whole change you know. Been out of trouble for over five years already. I have been positive building something to be a positive role model for the community.

- Thank you.

- All right, anything else from the Board?

- I'll make the motion.

- Okay, sure,

- Okay. To approve Mr. Bautista to 413 North Chestnut address specific.

- And I second.

- All right, all in favor?

- [Together] Aye.

- Opposed? Okay, Jose you've been approved to reside at 413 West Chestnut. You will need to come back before us. Okay, would you like us to mail that to the Chestnut or the Dan's Avenue?

- 413 North Chestnut will be fine.

- Okay, thank you.

- You guys have a good day.

- You too. All right, next time of the agenda, Oh, did someone say something? oh, okay. Next on the agenda is Bruce Verhaagh, requesting to move to 1331 Division Street. Bruce, you were just here last month. Which at that point we denied you to reside at that address. One of them was that was that, we didn't feel comfortable not having your treatment documentation and we wanted an opportunity to review it. We have received that treatment. First of all, can we talk about your treatment in public or would you prefer that to be in private?

- [Bruce] In public is okay.
- Okay. So, does the Board need him to go over his offense again? We just heard him last month?
- No.
- Okay, all right. Does anyone have any questions at all about the treatment documentation that was provided to us?
- Well, my one question I have from my notes is that it says that your father is not excited for you to live with him.
- I saw that too.
- [Bruce] Can you repeat that please?
- I saw in the documentation that says your father is not excited for you to live with him.
- [Bruce] Well, I don't know about that. I talked to my dad he wants me to live with him.
- What was that Bruce?
- [Bruce] I talked to my father and he said that he wants me to live with him. So I was . Hello?
- Raymond, I see you're on the phone. Can you hear us?
- [Raymond] Yes I can.
- Yes, okay. Could you just state your name and address for the record please?
- [Raymond] Raymond Verhaagh, 1331 Division Street.
- Okay, so one of the Board Members had made a comment that in your son's evaluation, you had indicated that you were not excited about him living with you. Do you remember having that conversation with his treatment team?
- [Raymond] No, I don't remember that.
- Okay.
- [Raymond] I don't think I made such a comment.
- Yeah, the exact comment was, this is what was documented. And this was back on May of 2020. His father said he has never thought of his son moving in with him and he does not know what to expect if Mr. Verhaagh were to do so.
- [Raymond] No, I don't recall that at all.
- Okay, do you remember during that time that your son informed you that he was still attracted to children?
- [Raymond] No.

- Are you worried that your son is attracted to children?
- [Raymond] No, I don't. I don't think he is because he always tells me that he isn't because of his treatment program.
- Okay. I had quite a bit of stuff highlighted in, that was provided to us. Bruce I'm just gonna be pretty honest with you. I'm not comfortable with it at all. There are several, several occasions throughout this document that was provided how, you're really not willing or able to show that you are fully transparent about your sexual functioning. That you lied on your polygraphs. You have underestimated the level of arousal that you experience when you see girls or boys on or on TV. How do you feel about that?
- [Bruce] I feel bad that I lied on the polygraph. I do feel good that I am being pretty honest now.
- Sure.
- [Bruce] And I believe I told my dad that I'm always gonna be attracted to kids. But now, I am attracted to women. Which is something that in the past I never thought was possible.
- Okay. How much right now are you currently using your ammonia inhalants?
- [Bruce] Well, when I see a child on TV, I inhale my ammonia, and does not re-offend.
- How often does that happen?
- [Bruce] Let's see. So, every other day. I don't even watch too much TV.
- So you still have an attraction to children?
- [Bruce] Yeah, I'm gonna be attracted to children till the day I die. that attraction to kids, they just go away. It's why we'll probably even get that.
- Bruce do you have--
- Go ahead what was that?
- [Bruce] For most of my life, I'm going to have to manage my arousal to kids, with the use of ammonia therapy. And I'm glad that my arousal to women is way up there, which would, helps me to be less attracted to children. But being attracted to children, that's never gonna go away. I just have to manage it, so I can keep it low.
- Are you required to take any more treatment or are you all done with treatment?
- [Bruce] Treatment? Oh no, no. But tomorrow at three o'clock with Shauna, I am going to start treatment with Steven. He's a therapist that helps sex offenders just like John Nemeck did. Well was, he died.
- Who is that through? 'Cause I though the sauna was like, where are you do your meditation and practice your Buddhism?
- [Bruce] Shauna is on the second floor of Power for Change.
- So it's Stephen through a Power for Change or a Steve through the Shauna?
- [Bruce] Both. Steven has nothing to do with the Shauna, but he works in the same building.

- It looks like Ms. Hyer is on the call, and is eager to provide some clarification.
- Yes, sure. If you can just state your name and address for the record.
- Okay, my is . My name is Lynn Hyer, I live at 1321 Garland Street, Green Bay, Wisconsin. The place where we practice, the Shauna our community is in the second floor. Originally, Bruce was seeing John Nemeck, unfortunately Mr.Nemeck has passed away. He died July 3rd. He had an emergency open heart surgery and he did not survive the surgery. So, Bruce and I were working together knowing that he needed transition of care, that it was very important. Steve Jeppcheck is one of the owners for Power for Change, and he worked closely with John Nemeck, who was also a counselor. And he had agreed then to do that transition up here for Bruce. That's what we have scheduled now is that he will meet Steve tomorrow so that they can make that initiation.
- Okay, thank you.
- Does the Board have anything they would like to ask or any comments that they would like to make?
- I have--
- Bruce where?
- Yes, Mr. Verhaagh, are you still on , and if you are how long are you gonna be on it?
- [Bruce] Well, I'll be on the for the rest of my life.
- Okay, thank you.
- Bruce, where are you living now?
- [Bruce] I'm living at 2111 New Franklin Street, New Franking, Wisconsin.
- And what you're saying, like could you continue living there?
- [Bruce] Well, I'm getting discharged and on the 27th is when I leave the house. So I'll be fully discharged. On a supervised release law.
- It's a state owned home for 980s, or people who are out on conditional release. To my knowledge.
- [Bruce] Well, why move me? When I leave the house, well I've already been discharged by the court or off of chapter 9E. The 27th is when I leave the house and I'm fully discharged.
- Okay, thank you.
- Did they help you find this address on Division Street?
- [Bruce] Did they help me ?
- Yes, did your home help you find this new apartment? You new address?
- [Bruce] I did not find the apartment. I looked for apartments, I've been turned down many times because I'm a sex offender, and I'm restricted to being homeless.
- That's his dad's house.

- Oh, I'm sorry. I'm sorry.

- Yeah.

- Okay, thank you.

- He'll be living with his dad.

- That's it, okay. Thank you.

- Yeah.

- [Bruce] Well I've been working really hard in treatment, I've been really working on being really honest with people. And I've been working hard with my ammonia therapy and my behavior therapy is how I gained attraction to women, which you know a while ago I thought could never ever happen. And I think that's really helpful. And you know, I know I'm going to be attracted to children for the rest of my life, but the thing is, I always gotta manage it with ammonia and behavior therapy. So that if it can get out of control then that's a challenge. That's one thing I never, ever want to do, is to molest another child.

- Yeah, I'm just gonna kind of be honest with everyone. Bruce, I'm very concerned about this report that was sent to us. And I have a lot of, a lot of concerns about you know, you were very deceitful to the reporter. You know, I think I told you last month when you came to us, my concern with you is you don't have just one preference. You have a preference to boys, and now you have a preference to women that, you know, you're telling us. I just, I still am not very comfortable at all reading the report that was provided to us. So that's kind of where I stand at this moment. I don't know how any of the other Board Members feel. They want to talk about it. Do any of the Board Members wanna talk about it? Or Bruce do you have something to say?

- [Bruce] Yeah so, it seems like to me that being also attracted to women is a concern?

- Well--

- Am I hearing wrong?

- It's just that. Sorry, hold on.

- [Bruce] I mean, I think being attracted to a woman, as long as you know, they're over 18 years old, I think that's a good thing. That's very helpful for me.

- I agree--

- I think its helpful.

- Yes, it is appropriate. But you have a lot of interests, ranging from boys to girls, to women. And for me that's concerning. The other Board Members may feel differently. I'm just giving you how I feel about it.

- And is, go ahead Shauna.

- Thank you. Just on Bruce's behalf, he has been working very hard and he was very open, he allowed me to read the report so that I would understand his issues. And he knows that he needs to be honest and part of his practice and the community is holding him accountable. I've heard that it's important for him to have strong male figures. There are several men in the community that are standing behind him. at work, they've been in treatment themselves and they have been very helpful with Bruce holding him accountable. We're reaching out

to Circles of Support, we know that he needs that kind of community. People that he can share with and be honest. So he is being brutally honest with and I'm really proud of him for doing that. But I understand your concerns, I understand the Board's concerns. However, we really strongly feel that if he doesn't have the support of his father and a place to stay where he's safe, he won't continue this progress. And so I just really, with all due respect, I hope you can understand that and understand that he does have limitations, but there are people that are very willing to support him. So thank you.

- Thank you.

- Does his dad have more to say about his on?

- [Raymond] Yes. The last time you were kind of interested if there were gonna be any rules. And I said, "Well, the only rule is that he doesn't go anywhere. That he stays home." Well, he does have to go to some places. But some of the rules that I've got is that there should be no kids in the house. No pictures of kids in the house. No TV programs with kids in them. If children come to the door, he should get me. If am not at home and they show up, do not answer the door. Bruce needs to be conscious of the media that he sees like on TV. Like avoiding image of the children, when they may show up.

- Do you have any grandchildren?

- [Raymond] Do I have no. Bruce is my only child.

- Okay.

- I guess I'm torn. Because I am very, very concerned about all of it. I don't know where he would live if he's not with his dad that's concerned. But yeah, that report was alarming to me.

- My thoughts are, I would not feel comfortable with a permanent approval.

- Yeah I feel the same way. Could they possibly do like a 60 or 90 day and then revisit again?

- What you would like to see out of that?

- Basically, if he's still going through the treatment or having people that he's working with, that they can come and speak on his behalf. And I know he's found a bracelet, so I know those are pretty restrictive. I don't know what else to look for.

- I was gonna say too if he starts treatment, that we get a report on how that's going and.

- Does someone wanna make that kind of a motion?

- Yes, I'd like to make that motion to be address specific for 1331 Division Street for 90 days.

- So you're making a motion to approve him for 90 days?

- Yes, and then come back--

- And what are gonna be the requirements when he comes back?

- Documentation that he's in treatment yet and verification that he does have support from other people.

- Okay.

- I would like to add that we speak to his dad again to just see how things are going day to day.
- [Raymond] Okay.
- A second for that motion?
- I'll second it.
- All in favor, aye?
- Aye.
- Aye.
- Opposed?
- Opposed.
- Opposed.
- So it appears it's three to two. So Bruce, you are approved to move to 1331 address specific. But you must come back here in 90 days with the information that the Board has requested of you.
- [Bruce] Yes I'll do that, Thank you.
- Okay, thank you.
- [Bruce] Thank you, bye.
- Okay, bye.
- All right, next on the agenda is the appeal of Albert Ruleford, requesting to move to a 445 Patton in Green Bay. Trying to see you here in Albert. Yeah, there you are. Okay, . So it has been a while since you have been before the Board. So I guess we'll just have you go through what you've been convicted of. And again, please don't speak on the victim by name or relationship.
- So back in 20. It was 2013. I had posted an ad on Craigslist for hookup with somebody, and an underage I think it was 15 years old responded to it. When after work, when I went to go meet him. It was an undercover officer and I was arrested at that time and I went to jail.
- Had you ever placed any ads before?
- I had. During the treatment that I've been doing right now? I think a lot of that of the ad, had to do with like loneliness for. Because I was. I just got done doing what's called a 40 lengths in my treatment, and as far as that public or private for the treatment and it's public. So I have no issue talking about it, everybody at work knows about it. All my friends, one of the first things I talk about, just so that they know. But yes, so leading up to that, I never really formed attachments to people because am afraid of being abandoned. So, I did post ads on Craigslist before that. And I think I got into a habit of it, because it was easier instead of going out to the bar because I'm a really big drinker and it was easier to be behind a screen than it was to deal with the rejection per se. And the 40 links that I just got done doing in treatment, that really helped open my eyes as far as what was going on in my life at the time. So, that was one of the big things was the antisocial behavior. Did I answer your question?

- It does, thank you.

- All right. Okay, and it looks like you're trying to purchase a home.

- Yes. Yeah, so I was really fortunate to get. The offer was accepted on Sunday and then I was frantic, because I knew that you guys met on Wednesday. So I called and got everything on Monday taken care of. And I just I. The info that I was able to get on here. I didn't want to have to wait till next month knowing that there was a possibility that it be denied. I don't want to. I didn't wanna go through all of that and then end up for it to be denied. So, I had like. I was very anxious the last few days, trying to make sure everything was taken care of, sent in to you. My PO knew about it. So things can be on the table, in front of you today.

- Are you buying this house alone?

- No well, it's gonna be under my name. But me and my partner are moving in together. I've been with him for a year and eight months now. And if you want to talk to him, he's in the other room. I told asked him if he wanted to talk and he said, sure. So, but he would be living with me. It is being purchased through my credit and the reason why , I've been trying to find a new place to live, but I have not had success in. When you go and look at the apartment and then everything goes through, either we haven't gotten. They haven't gotten back to us or if for some reason they deny it. And a few of them I think because of the offense. So they say, when you call them to fill out the form and then they run a background check and then it's denied when they do a background check. So I'm financially able to do it and I want to. I wanna move onto the next part of my life I guess, instead of renting I wanna actually own a home and move on from renting.

- Okay.

- How often are you seeing Pablo?

- Once a week on Tuesday that . So the COVID put a damper in that, I restarted it June. I restarted seeing him in June. So, I'm not sure exactly how many more like assignments I have for it, but I'm pretty sure I'm getting to the very end of it. But the whole COVID but a damper in that, and then me going. Since 2019 I started and when the COVID hit in 2020 it's been, it put it on hold.

- All right.

- Were you living with your partner before?

- Do you mean when I moved in here?

- Yeah on Harvey Street.

- No so, originally when I moved in here I moved in here alone. I met my partner in January, I had to go in front or talk to my probation officer, who's Jean and she approved the relationship. I think it was. I wanna say it was March. Like we started hanging out at home my events, talked to Jean in March. Jean was aware of it. I recently got a new probation officer I think, eight months ago now. So, but Jean was the one who approved the relationship. But no. But to answer your question no. He did not move in or he was not originally part of me moving in when I moved in here. That happened like eight months after I moved here.

- Okay. All right, any other questions from the Board or comments? Okay, does anyone want to make a motion?

- I will move approval address specific 445 Patton. Am I missing something?

- Is there a second on that?

- I'll second it.
- Second.
- All right, all in favor aye?
- [Together] Aye.
- Opposed? Okay Albert, you're approved to proceed with the purchase of your home.
- Thank you so much guys. And do you can send that Harvey Street address, just because everything doesn't go through until September 24th. So, you can just send it here so that I have it. That'd be great.
- Sure, will do.
- Okay--
- Thank you so much, guys.
- Yeah.
- You have a great day.
- You too. Okay, does anyone have any thing that they need to talk about? No.
- I just wanted to thank all of you for providing more input this meeting. We did have a request for the basis for a denial on one of our recent meetings. So the basis that we have and we have to provide the minutes and the minutes have to provide justification for why the Board either denied or approved somebody. Typically people don't contest the approvals. But if you're planning on voting to deny somebody it's really important that, that you put your rationale and the types of factors that you're looking at and how those tie into either, whether someone is remorseful, how they are or are not rehabilitated and whether those factors lead you to believe that they may re-offend. Those are kind of the things that the ordinance really looks at. So, thank you for providing more robust input during this meeting and please continue to do that as we go forward.
- Okay.
- I was gonna ask for the new members do we, like go too fast that you don't have time to ask questions or?
- Yeah, I feel like I do a lot of talking.
- that you get in.
- Sorry, .
- Okay.
- All right. Well then our next meeting is scheduled for September 15th, 2021 at 4:00 PM. If we can get a motion to adjourn the meeting.
- I'll make that motion.
- I'll second.

- Okay, all in favor, aye?
- [Together] Aye.
- Opposed? Okay, I will see you all next month.
- Yes.
- Thank you.
- Bye, have a good rest of your week.
- [Together] You too.
