VERBATIM MINUTES

I see Pete Shedlosky, Attorney Dominique McQueen and Heidi Michel are all present.

- [Heidi] Can I get a motion to approve the agenda for the December 15th meeting?

- I'll make a motion to accept.

- I'll second the motion.

- [Heidi] In favor, aye.

- Aye. Aye.

- [Heidi] Can I get a motion to approve the minutes from the November 17th meeting?

- I'll make a motion for that.

- [Heidi] Second, all in favor.

- Aye. Aye.

- Aye.

- [Heidi] Okay, we go down to regular business. Our first appeal is with Andy Stewart. Andy, are you present.

- [Deanna] Heidi, I do not see him on here. I did provide the Zoom instructions to the prison but I don't see him logged in here.
- [Heidi] Okay, so do we need to call there? Do we need to probably maybe just move him to the bottom of the agenda? Does anyone on the board have an idea of what they'd like to do? Well at this moment, I'm gonna make a motion to move Mr. Stewart to the bottom of the agenda in case the prison has something going on and can't get back in touch with us right away. Is there a second?
- I'll second that.
- [Heidi] Okay, all in favor, aye.
- Aye. Aye.
- [Heidi] All right. Next on the agenda is the appeal of Juan Zayas-Cortes who is present along with an interpreter, Mark Renald.
- [Deanna] Mr. Cortes, I need you to unmute yourself.
- Is there any particular button that he has to press or it's just phone?
- [Heidi] No, he's calling in from an institution. I wouldn't gather that social worker or somebody from the institution must be present with him.
- Okay. I just emailed his counselor at the prison to see if somebody can go unmute him. Okay, this is Deanna. I'm gonna step out of the room and call prison and see if I can get somebody to unmute Mr. Cortes.
- [Heidi] Okay.
- [Woman 1] Green Bay Prison, hi.
- [Deanna] Hi, this is Deanna DeBruler. Juan Zayas-Cortes
- [Deanna] Okay, do you want to try and dial in again?
- [Woman 1] Yeah .
- [Deanna] Thank you. Okay, they're gonna try and dial in again. There's not a button on the phone he's using to let him unmute. So if he's gonna try and dial back in.
- Hello. Hello.
- [Social Worker] Hi, this is social worker . I'm gonna try to transfer over to Mr. Cortes again.
- [Deanna] Great, thank you.
- Hello. Hi Mr. Cortes.
- Cortes.
- Yes. Okay. Mr. Cortes, you are appealing your decision to stay in Green Bay . You're looking to move to 750 Bellevue Street. Is that correct?

- Yes. Okay. He plans to live with his family?
- Yeah, they are the only person that I have.
- [Heidi] Okay, and when is he scheduled to get out of prison?
- January 4th, 2022.
- [Heidi] Okay, has he ever appeared before the board before?
- No.
- [Heidi] Okay, so what we're going to ask of him right now is, we want him to tell us what he was convicted of. We do not want him to mention the victim by name or relationship and we will have an opportunity treatment. And if you could please ask him if he would like to do that in public or in private session.
- I will feel more comfortable doing it private.
- [Heidi] Okay, so when we are ready to talk to him about his treatment, we'll make a motion to move into private session. And at that point, all the other participants will be removed from the Zoom call.
- I don't understand the process. Let me explain to him that. All right, perfect, I got it.
- [Heidi] Okay, so if you could ask him to please describe what he was arrested for and how it came about to the police.
- Honestly, the charges in English I don't know how to say. So basically what I was charged, accused and convicted for, allow a minor to watch a porno movie and catch the person inappropriately in the private parts.
- [Heidi] And how did the police get to know all of that?
- Well, I don't know exactly how I may be able to view this but I think he was seducing a minor.
- [Heidi] Okay, and why did he do it?
- Honestly, I'm gonna be honest with you. Sincerely, it wasn't really something that I did on purpose. Unfortunately, I took advantage of that trust that it was given to me.
- [Heidi] And how old was he?
- I was 40.
- [Heidi] And the victim was how old?
- Without mistaking, I think he was 11 or 12 years of age.
- [Heidi] Commander Ebel, is that pretty accurate as to what was described, as to what he was charged with?
- [Ebel] We were unable to get much .
- Sorry about that.
- [Ebel] We were unable to get anything out of Puerto Rico.

- We are talking about it in Puerto Rico?
- [Heidi] No, the charges here in Brown County, he was charged, it looks like in 2000, over child enticement. Commander, you wouldn't have access to that?
- [Ebel] No, we thought that bills or convictions were Puerto Rico. I'd have to look at the case.
- [Heidi] Okay. Does the board have any other questions for him regarding his case? Could you ask him, so he has been in custody for how many years?
- I was sentenced for five years of prison and nine year supervision.
- [Heidi] Okay, could you ask him why are his the case that he served 13 months for this case?
- I was 30 miles of Brown County jail. I was waiting for the day that I wouldn't have the sentence. He was at prison at nine years per supervision.
- [Heidi] Okay, did he complete this application on his own?
- Which application?
- [Heidi] The appeal form?
- No. I don't know how to write or read in English but my social worker was the one who I filled out the paperwork. I was present there too.
- [Heidi] All right. Does the board have any other questions for him? Otherwise, I would like to get a motion to go into private session four so we can discuss the treatment.
- Nothing here.
- [Heidi] Can I get a motion to move into private session?
- I make a motion.
- [Heidi] Is there a second?
- I second the motion.
- [Heidi] Okay, all in favor, aye.
- Aye. Aye.
- [Heidi] Okay, excuse everybody?
- [Deanna] Yep, let me get everybody moved to the waiting room. Just bear with me. I will let you know when we're in the waiting room. Everyone is back in the room, Heidi.
- [Heidi] Okay, so we wanted to find a session to talk about treatment, we're back in. Well, first up is Mr. Cortes have anybody that wants to speak on his behalf?
- I don't have anybody really here in prison who will do that for me.

- [Heidi] Okay, does the board have any further questions or would anyone want to entertain a motion?
- No question. I was wondering did he have a job lined up in transportation?
- Is that a question?
- Yes. Oh, I'm sorry. Can you repeat that for me, please?
- Yeah, so I was wondering if he has a job lined up in transportation?
- Well, with all due respect, I wanna come back to the job that I had before. So my family has offered to transportation to go to wherever I need to go, where they store everything else. Because I think I'm not allowed to drive at this point anyway.
- Okay, thank you.
- [Heidi] Anything further from the board? So does anyone want to discuss a possible motion or make a motion? Okay, well I'm gonna give you my opinion. At this point, I'm not comfortable approving Mr. Cortes to move to 750 Bellevue Street. And my reasoning for that is, he has need to have treatment. And specifically on his application, he indicates that he needs to fix himself and be better. I don't think he's able to be set back in the community, that's my opinion.
- All right. Can I say something?
- [Heidi] Sure.
- Can I say something?
- [Heidi] Yes, he can.
- Humble family and with all my respect, I want to address the board. I understand and I accept the fact that I commit and I regret it very much. I want and I would like to do everything that is in my power to become a better person. My family needs me home. My mother person and she actually is taking care of my two disabled brothers but I know they me. Sometimes you do also need something you wanna incentivate you to move forward. That is, they are that incentive in the purpose. I understand, I know that the community will never trust me as a person. But at least I need one opportunity, one chance to show you that I can be a better person. Just one, that's all I ask and want.
- [Heidi] Okay, thank you. We still need a board. I'm just offering my opinion. We do have two other board members here and may have a different opinion.
- Okay, my apologies.
- [Heidi] Okay, so do any of the other board members have anything they would like to say or make a motion?
- Another question. He said he plans on attending a church. I was wondering what church that would be.
- I don't know exactly the name but it's publican church and that's what I wanna attend.
- Okay and thank you.
- [Heidi] Any other questions or a motion?

- I'd like to make a motion, to be address specific for 60 days after his release to come back to show us that he is doing a treatment program and that his job is working out. And also that he's attending the church.
- Definitely whatever, it's just that.
- [Heidi] We need a second for that motion.
- I'll second that motion.
- [Heidi] All right, we'll take a vote. All in favor, aye.
- Aye. Aye.
- [Heidi] Oppose? Opposed. Okay, at this point, Mr. Cortes has been approved to reside at 750 Bellevue Street for a period of 60 days at which time he will need to return before the board with documentation that he is in treatment and attending church. And Pete, I'm sorry, did you say employed?
- Yes. And employed.
- So he is accepted, you said, right, to be cleared?
- [Heidi] Yes, he is.
- Okay. I will do that.
- What is the anticipated review state? I just wanna make sure that we have a come back on the record.
- [Heidi] January 4th is his release date.
- Okay, so we'll have him come back to the March meeting?
- [Heidi] Yeah. Okay.
- [Heidi] Okay, we're done with him. He can leave. And Marino, I thank you for your services.
- You're welcome. "Thank you very much," he says.
- [Heidi] You're welcome. Good bye. Bye-bye.
- [Heidi] Bye, next on the agenda is the appeal of Harlen Kalbus. Which I see Harlen is on here. Harlen, you are requesting to move to 834 Day Street. Is that correct?
- That is correct.
- [Heidi] Okay, and you've never been before the board, correct?
- Correct, I've never been before the board.
- [Heidi] Okay, so as I indicated earlier, we're gonna ask you to tell us what you were convicted off. And please don't mention your relationship to the victim or the victim by name.
- Okay. Okay, please go ahead.

- I was convicted of sexual assault of a child, 15 year old female.
- [Heidi] How old were you?
- I was 17 At the time.
- [Heidi] You're not in prison for this right now, are you?
- I am not.
- [Heidi] Okay, so you served five years in prison?
- I did. Okay. And are you still on supervision for this case?
- Yes ma'am.
- [Heidi] Okay, so you said that you had sexual assault of a 15 year old. What exactly did you do?
- I sodomized her.
- [Heidi] Okay, and how did it get brought to the police's attention?
- I believe she told she was going to the Boys and Girls Club that night. She poked somebody in there. I do believe that's how it went down.
- [Heidi] Okay, and was this a one time incident or did you repeatedly do this?
- It stated it was going on for a year and a half.
- [Heidi] And every time was it the same thing that you did? That you grabbed Emily, sodomized her?
- Right.
- [Heidi] You never did anything else?
- No ma'am. Okay. Commander Ebel, do you have a copy of his judgment of conviction?
- [Ebel] Yes, I do have external complaint and he's actually accurate in self description.
- [Heidi] Okay, thank you. But does the board have any questions regarding his offense?
- None here.
- No. Okay. All right. Harlen, would you like to discuss your treatment in private or public session?
- Private would be fine.
- [Heidi] You want it in private?
- Yes. Okay, I will ask all the other parties to accept Harlen's treatment.
- [Deanna] Let me put everybody in the waiting room. I will let you know when-

- Can we get a motion to ?
- [Heidi] Yes, can we make a motion.
- I'll make a motion.
- [Heidi] I'll second that. All in favor, aye.
- Aye.
- [Deanna] Just give me a moment. Everyone's back in.
- [Heidi] Okay, so what we talked to Harlen about his treatment. We're now back into public session. And I guess Harlen, I do have a question. So you have been out of prison since, I'm guessing, approximately 2006.
- I actually got revoked. I just got out last year again.
- [Heidi] Okay, so when did you get revoked?
- I got revoked, when was that? When was that? Out of last year, I did four years on revocation and I figured out .
- [Heidi] Why were you revoked.
- Rule violation. I was staying with my father and my stepmother and my niece was over. I wasn't alone with her but she was there and they said that I wasn't supposed to. I have unsupervised contact with minors and I did. But that's what they got, rule violation.
- [Heidi] Okay, and you plan on living with who when you get out? Well, if we get a problem?
- My friend, Patrick's father David Klimek, he owns that home. I'll be renting a room from him and helping him. He's actually disabled. I'm just helping him around the house as much as possible with different things.
- [Heidi] And do Patrick and Amy both live there?
- They both live upstairs. It's a two family home, yeah.
- [Heidi] All right. And you are employed at where?
- At Taco Bell on Main Street.
- [Heidi] How long have you been there?
- I've been there five months, six months. So yeah, I've been there for awhile. I actually enjoy what I do, be by the people and I'm actually happier than I've been in a long time.
- [Heidi] Does the board have any further questions or would anyone like to discuss anything before we make a motion?
- Nothing here.

- No. Okay. Well, here's my opinion. So Harlen, I had a little bit of reservations just going through two bouts of treatment. The first one is a little bit more concerning for me but I do think you're potentially at that point, assaulting your victim while you were still attending your treatment or very shortly thereafter. However, it seems like you have gained some insight from your second bout of treatment with family services. You really haven't had any further law violations other than being revoked in or sent back the prison. So at this point, I don't have any issues of you're residing here in Day Street but I'll leave it up to the rest of the board to see what they think.

- Heidi, I think that there are people who want to speak on this agenda.

- [Heidi] Oh, I'm sorry, is it? Do you have somebody who wants to speak on your behalf, Harlen?

- Yes, my friend Patrick and Amy both are coming. Patrick Morgan would have something to say I do believe.

- [Heidi] Oh, sure. Patrick, are you here?

- [Deanna] He's on here. We just need him to unmute.

- [Patrick] Yeah ma'am.

- [Heidi] Okay Patrick, could just state your name and address for the record, please.

- [Patrick] Yeah, my name is Patrick Klimek. Last name is K-L-I-M-E-K. The address is 834 and a half Day Street 'cause I'm in the upper apartment.

- [Heidi] Okay, and what do you have to say about Harlen?

- [Patrick] Well I've known him for quite a long time now. I first met him probably when I was like eight years old. And then we re-acquainted back when I was about 17. He was like 13 at the time. We're four years apart in age. And been friends since. He's a good guy as far as I'm concerned, very smart in a lot of areas. He goes to church with us every Sunday and I know he loves that. He's definitely a person of God. So really all I can say, I know he's good at helping my dad, even helps me and my wife at times 'cause I'm on disability and myself and if we need help, he helps. He's a good person.

- [Heidi] Did you maintain a relationship with him while he was in prison?

- [Patrick] Yes. Okay. All right, thank you.

- [Patrick] Yep.

- [Heidi] Did Amy also wanna speak?

- [Amy] Yeah, I can speak to for him.

- [Heidi] Could you please state your name and address for the record?

- [Amy] My name is Amy Klimek. My address is 834 and a half at Day Street.

- [Heidi] And what did you like to say?

- [Amy] I would just make the, I've known Harlen for last five years. He's been a good guy. He's put me in contact person in prison. I am very proud of him. He's been on his job. He does well at his job. I know he likes going to church. He's got a good support system. He's not only got me and my husband, he's got my father-in-

law and we have other friends that are very good support system for him. I think he's moving in the right direction with a lot of things right now. And this would be one more step forward for him.

- Okay. Okay, thank you. Is there anyone else or there's only those two? Kalbus, is that correct that those two are

- That's correct, these same two, yes.

- [Heidi] Okay, thank you. Does the board have any further questions or anything like maybe make a motion?

- Yeah, so I'd like to make motion.

- [Heidi] All right, go a head.

- That we accept for address specific.

- [Heidi] 834 Day Street?

- Yes.

- [Heidi] Okay, is there a second?

- I second that motion.

- [Heidi] Okay, all in favor, aye.

- Aye. Aye.

- [Heidi] Okay, Harlen, you've been approved to reside at 834 Day Street. Would you like us to mail that letter to you at that address or would you like us to mail it to the Shadow Avenue?

- I have a question. When would I be able to move in there?

- [Heidi] Harlen, you can in as soon as today.

- Okay, just mail it to the 834 Days Street.

- [Deanna] Okay, that's where I'll send it.

- [Heidi] Okay, thank you. Just so you know, Harlen, if you do decide to move, you do need to come back before the board.

- Even though you already approved me, I have to come or if I moved from there, right?

- [Heidi] Move from the Day Street.

- Okay, yes. I understand that.

- [Heidi] All right, well thank you. Have a good night.

- Thank you, I will.

- Bye-bye. Bye.

- [Heidi] Next on the agenda. It looks like we have the appeal of Alvin Counard requesting to move to 418. Is that Northern?
- [Deanna] Yes.
- [Heidi] Okay, Northern Avenue and Alvin is here. Alvin, have you been before the board before?
- [Alvin] Yes.
- [Heidi] Yeah, looks like you were here back in July of 2020, is that correct?
- [Alvin] It's corrects.
- [Heidi] Okay, and at that time, it looks like we approved you to live on Finger Road.
- [Alvin] 4760, that's corrects.
- [Heidi] And why are you deciding to move now?
- [Alvin] Well, the landlord passed away, Gene Milkore and all the kids decided to sell the duplex, three duplexes that she owned on Finger Road here. And what happened is, some young man stepped forward, Mr. Brooks Renner and bought the place. And November 15th, he called me and said, "You have to move because I'm gonna live on your side of the duplex." So at that point, I was shocked but I called on the Madison, Consumer Protection Agency and they said he can't do that until he signs his papers, which he did on December 3rd, he signed papers. At that point, he gave me 30 days to move. So we got to everybody's saga to get out of here. We're both 78 years old, my wife and myself and we're struggling. And so the boys stepped forward, my two sons and nephew and bought a house in Northern Avenue So we're requested to move to Northern and I guess that's it, I've done this.
- [Heidi] Okay, your children bought the home that you're gonna leave in?
- [Alvin] My two boys and nephew. They're signing papers on January 15th. We're getting the keys tomorrow. They allowed us to pay \$30 a day rent to them. Plus we gotta pay \$500 for the rest of this month. So January 3rd to the new owner of the duplex. I know it sounds like a mess but it's getting straightened out but we need permission to move.
- [Heidi] All right. It's been a while since you have been here before the board. I do wanna talk about what you were convicted of. So if you could just talk about what you were convicted of and how it was brought to light.
- [Alvin] Well, it was six years ago and I was down to Kansas City, Johnson County. I was visiting my oldest granddaughter.
- [Heidi] Please, don't talk about the victim by a name or relationship.
- [Alvin] But it's a matter of touching. That was what it was. And Kansas law is 25 years in prison if you touched somebody under 14. So it was brought to the board here. It happened 2015 to 2017, Brown County Judge dismissed it, and the State of Wisconsin Judge dismissed it. And two years later, the U.S. Marshals picked me up in front of my house threw me in jail. I did not know Kansas wanted to talk to me so the next day or the next couple of days or whatever it was, my son, myself, my wife and his wife drove down to Kansas and I surrendered and they threw me in jail for four months and they let me go on February 7th, 2020. But then COVID hit so we couldn't get back to sentencing until August. And I see Martha once a month now. She moved it up. I've been moving with her for about 16, 15 months on probation so she only wants to see me

once a month now. And I went to family services with Jim Drake and he sees me every two weeks. So process the work and everything else.

- [Heidi] I'm gonna just quick ask, if we do wanna talk to you about your treatment, do you wanna do that in public session or private session?

- [Alvin] Well, I don't care.

- [Heidi] All right, we will do in a public session then. So you would have been seeing Jim Drake since when?

- [Alvin] I have no idea. I think you'd have to ask him but I think it's been four months.

- [Heidi] Since about July of this year?

- [Alvin] I'm pretty sure it's been four months now. Pretty closer to that anyway.

- [Heidi] So when we saw you back in July of 2020, you weren't convicted at that point, were you?

- [Alvin] No, I wasn't sentenced until August '21. Three years probation.

- [Heidi] Commander Ebel, I don't really need to ask you any questions about this 'cause it appears that we actually had a copy of the criminal complaint in there but I thank you for being present.

- [Alvin] And I will be living with my wife. My wife is 60 years.

- [Heidi] Okay. Sorry, I just have to stop and think here for a moment unless the other board members have some questions that they wanna of ask you while I'm thinking.

- Nothing here.

- [Heidi] Does anyone have any thoughts about making a motion? Alvin, is your wife there with you?

- [Alvin] Yeah.

- [Heidi] Does she wanna speak on your behalf or would she be willing to answer some questions?

- [Alvin] Yes, right here.

- [Heidi] Okay. Ma'am, could you just state your name and address for the record?

- [Diane] Diane M. Counard 2760 Finger Road, Green Bay, Wisconsin 54302.

- [Heidi] So were you aware of the incident that took place with your husband?

- [Diane] When we were visiting.

- [Heidi] Okay, so you knew that it took place?

- [Diane] No.

- [Heidi] Not until the police showed up?

- [Diane] Right, right. Well, no, not until the state had looked it over the City Green Bay or whatever, Brown County had looked it over and they had left it go. But Kansas is, I'm trying to think of the lie it is. Jessica's lie, I believe it is. And when we talked to a lawyer, he said the sentence would be the same as first degree, intentional murder and I just broke down. I said, "He's not a a bad man. I don't know how it happened. I still don't know but he's not a bad man. I've married to him as we dated in high school and I don't know." He can't be alone with anybody and that's okay. Our grandkids come and see us and stuff like that but myself and our two sons are both sponsors for him. I don't know anything more to say. I begged to go outside and I said, "I want to be with him."

- [Heidi] When you say that you're sponsor for him, are you meaning you're chaperone?

- [Diane] Yes. No, they said he can go places alone but he can't be around children or anything.

- [Heidi] Okay, so would you let him go to the grocery store by himself?

- [Diane] I let him go to the gas station and things like that but he doesn't use the bathroom or anything like that. We love each other but it's hard to be with somebody 24/7.

- [Heidi] I understand. Does the board have any questions for Mrs. Counard? No. I'm sorry, Alvin, did you say that we could discuss your treatment in public or did you want private?

- [Alvin] My treatment should be private, yes.

- [Heidi] Okay, although there was nobody left on the call but maybe just make a motion to move into private session, please.

- Make a motion.

- I'll second it.

- [Heidi] All in favor, aye.

- Aye. Aye.

- [Heidi] Okay, now we're gonna go back into public session. The only other individuals that are joining us other than the board is Commander Paul Ebel from the Green Bay Police Department.

- [Deanna] We're back in open. He's back in.

- [Heidi] Thank you.

- [Deanna] You're welcome.

- [Heidi] Does the board have any questions they would like to ask Alvin?

- Not here.

- [Heidi] Okay, I guess I'll give you my opinion before a motion is made. Typically, I like to see somebody that has a little bit more treatment before I approve them to reside in the community. But you've seen him nine times. One thing that I've taken into consideration is your age factor with your first offense. And you obviously are getting help for it. Try not mechanize why it happened. So I don't have an issue with you residing at the Northern address, 418 Northern Avenue. And I guess I'd just like to hear what the board members like the think.

- I feel like I'm in agreement with you.
- Heidi, the only thing I'd like to mention, I just wanted to say that I do know Alvin. I've known him for quite a few years and I do agree with what you're saying. And I'd like to make a motion to a specific address to accept.
- [Heidi] Attorney, do you feel that that's a considered a conflict of interest that you know him? Should you be voting on whether or not he should reside somewhere?
- Well, he's more of an acquaintance. I haven't seen him in quite a few years. Like I said, I do know him.
- The decision about whether to abstain or not comes down to whether the relationship renders Pete incapable or capable of making a fair and unbiased decision. That's up to Pete to determine whether he can impartially make this decision, make a vote on this matter. If he's saying that Mr. Counard is this an acquaintance, and there's no personal gain to be had by voting on this agenda item, then it wouldn't be inappropriate to vote on that agenda item.
- [Heidi] Okay, sorry, I just wanted clarification. Pete, you can go ahead.
- Yes, I'd like to make a motion to accept address specific for 418 Northern Avenue.
- [Heidi] Is there a second?
- I'll second the motion.
- [Heidi] Okay, all in favor, aye.
- Aye. Aye.
- [Heidi] Okay, Mr. Counard, you've been approved to reside at 418 Northern Avenue. But if you decide to move from that location, you will need to come back before the board. Would you like us to mail that to that address or to your current address?
- [Alvin] The current, please, 2760.
- [Heidi] Okay, we will do that.
- [Alvin] Thank you. You're welcome.
- [Diane] Thank you .
- [Heidi] Yup. The next appeal we have is the appeal of Andy Stewart, requesting to move to 1237 St. Clair Street. Deanna, does it appear that he's still present?
- [Deanna] No, I did get a hold of someone at the prison. They were having some issues connecting to Zoom so we will need to reschedule him.
- [Heidi] Okay, so at this moment, I will need a motion to do so.
- I'll make a motion that we reschedule his appeal.
- I'll second.

- [Heidi] Do we need to have a specific timeframe for that, Deanna?
- [Deanna] I'm looking to see when he's scheduled to be released. I haven't heard back from his PO 'cause she was already gone. I had to speak with somebody in records. It looks like his scheduled release date is January 18th. And I don't know if they're gonna continue to have connection issues. We had someone last month that appeared from Oshkosh Correctional and we didn't have any issues, but apparently this month, we did.
- Does the motion then to hold until the January meeting?
- [Deanna] January meeting is the 19th.
- [Heidi] And he's released the date before that.
- [Deanna] Correct. So I don't know if his PO will sending to the TLP for a day or two or at least until he can appear in front of the board.
- [Heidi] Sure, all right. But do we wanna be specific in the motion as to which meeting?
- Yes, please.
- [Heidi] Yeah. Do you wanna rephrase your motion?
- Sure, I'll make a motion that we reschedule his appeal to the February meeting.
- [Heidi] Do we wanna do it to the January meeting since he's released on January 18? Or do you wanna wait until February?
- I'm just concerned but I've seen it with people that get out of jail before court date but he might not have the information.
- [Heidi] Okay, so we have a motion that you want to reschedule him until the February meeting, which will be February 16th. Is there a second?
- I'll second that.
- [Heidi] All in favor, aye.
- Aye. Aye.
- [Heidi] Okay, I guess Deanna, if you could please notify Mr. Stewart and the agent that he'll have to come before us in February.
- [Deanna] I will. Okay.
- [Deanna] I should hear from her in the morning as long as she's in.
- [Heidi] All right. So that looks like the end of our appeals. Our next meeting is scheduled for January 19th at 4:00 PM. Is there any new business that anybody would like to discuss?
- I would just like to encourage continued discussion before motions are made, just sharing where you're at. If you're supportive of approving, why are you supportive? If you're leaning towards denial, why are you leaning towards denial? So just continue that dialogue before the motions are made so that we can create that record in case someone has questions about why the board made the decision that it made.

- [Heidi] Thank you. Commander Ebel, thank you for your presence today.
- [Ebel] All right. Indeed I realized that one, you have a Brown County case.
- [Heidi] It's all good. And then I guess I'll just need a motion to adjourn the meeting.
- I'll make a motion to adjourn.
- I'll second the motion.
- [Heidi] All in favor, aye.
- Aye. Aye.
- Aye.
- [Heidi] Okay, the meeting is adjourned. I hope everyone has a Merry Christmas and I'll see you next year.
- [Deanna] Thank you, you too.
- Thanks. Goodnight everybody.
- You too. Goodnight.
- Yeah, Merry Christmas.
- Merry Christmas. Happy new year.
