VERBATIM MINUTES

[Heidi] Order, we'll take roll call.

- [Rachel] I will capture. I see Heidi, Deanna, Dominique area all on the call.

- [Heidi] Okay, can I get a motion to approve the agenda for the January 19th, 2022 meeting?

- I will so move.

- [Heidi] Did somebody make a motion. Is that our motion Fay?

- Yeah.

- [Heidi] Okay. Is there a second?

- I second it.

- [Heidi] All in favor, aye. Okay, we need a motion to approve the minutes from the December 15th, 2021 meeting. I'll make a motion to accept those minutes from the December 15th meeting. Is there a second?

- Fay will second.

- [Heidi] Okay, all in favor, aye.

- Aye.

- [Heidi] Okay, the first appeal, our agenda is Hyrum Ricketts. Mr. Ricketts is that the proper way to say your name? You have to unmute yourself.

- Yes, Ma'am, that's my name.

- Okay.

- Sorry, about that.

- [Heidi] All right. So Mr. Ricketts, it appears that this is your first time appearing before the board, is that correct?

- Yes.

- Okay. So we're going to go ahead and ask you several questions. We're gonna have you first describe what you are arrested for, convicted of, and then you're gonna tell us about the offense and how the police got involved. When you talk about your offense, we don't want you to name the victim or the relationship with the victim. Okay?

- Okay.

- [Heidi] All right. And then I'm gonna ask you ahead of time. There'll be a point in your talk that we are gonna wanna talk about your treatment, whether it be sex offender treatment, AODA treatment, any kind of treatment you may have had you have the option to do that in public session or private session. What would you like to use?

- I can do it in public, it's fine.

- [Heidi] Okay, all right. So then why don't you go ahead and tell us what you were convicted of?

- Okay, so my case is a little different. I was charged with two cases under the same case. So I was charged with fourth degree sexual assault and I did nine months in County and I had 18 months on extended supervision. Now see the terms with this, whereas a DGA, a Deferred Judgment Agreement, and the terms were to complete my extended supervision, which didn't happen, I got revoked and which brought the felony up. And I was charged with a felony, which gave me nine years, a total of five years in prison incarceration and four years on extended supervision. And that's where I'm at right now, what I was charged for. So yeah, so in my case, I assaulted my victim for a few years. It happened several times. It was never any penetration. It was me just touching the vagina, private part, sorry, private parts. And I did it when she was asleep. So and it happened from around from like 2008, 2009 to about 2012, 2013. So it happened throughout the years. It happened from at least from 20 to 40 times, or maybe 20 to 50 times. Sorry about that. So, yeah. And that's where I was charged with the felony case, all that brought the felony up. So if you guys were wondering, so.

- [Heidi] And how old were you at the time? I was 13 years old.
- [Heidi] You were 13?
- Yes.
- [Heidi] Deanna and Rachel, should we be talking about this, if he was a juvenile?
- [Rachel] What was that 948 offense that you were convicted of?
- Yeah, so I believe that 948 offense, was repeated sexual assault, the felony.
- [Deanna] I have it hear. Sorry, this is Deanna. I have it here, it's in CCAP. So I believe he was charged as an adult.
- [Heidi] Okay. Mr. Ricketts, were you charged as an adult?
- Yes.
- [Heidi] Okay, okay.
- Sorry about that.
- [Heidi] Okay, so you were 13 and how old was the victim at the time?
- I believe nine.
- [Heidi] Okay. All right. And then how did the police get involved in this?
- So, yes. Okay, so the police got involved to explain the exact day that it happened public police got involved I got off of work. I was staying at the residency of my victim and the cops came there where the residency I was at and they arrested me and they brought me- Well, they brought me down town for the questioning, and that's where they arrested me. And they brought me to the County from there.
- [Heidi] Okay, so you don't know, like she didn't have, did she tell like a school person?
- Oh yeah, yeah. Yeah, so she told, yeah, I believe she told her mom sorry about that she told her mom and her mom talked to other people and I believe made the decision to report the police.
- Captain Abel. Is his story accurate?
- [Abel] Yes, it is a correct. recollection is that exactly critical looking best .
- [Heidi] Okay, perfect, thank you. Okay, Mr. Ricketts. So then you indicated you got 18 months and you were also placed on a deferred prosecution agreement, correct?
- Yes.
- [Heidi] Okay and so why did you get revoked?
- So, yes, I got revoked for, well, I've had several opportunities and I had an ATR and I came up dirty and I was drinking and all that stuff like added up for me getting revoked. And I got my probation office downtown that's when, sorry about that.

- Okay. So you then got revolt and you went to prison for, did you say nine years?
- No, I'm sorry. I got a total of nine years. I got a total of nine years, five years incarceration and four years on extended supervision. A total of nine years on the felony.
- [Heidi] Okay. And so when did you get out of prison?
- I got out of prison November 16th of last year, 2021.
- [Heidi] Okay, and are you on any kind of electronic bracelet?
- Yes, I'm on a TLP halfway house bracelet.
- [Heidi] But if you leave the TLP, you will not be on a GPS unit.
- Yes, I will be on it, if I don't get approved for residency. Yes, I'll be on a GPS.
- Okay. All right. Does any of the board have any questions regarding his case?
- If you will for the South Oakland will you still be on a bracelet?
- No, I believe if I get approved, I would be taken off the bracelet.
- All right, are you working?
- Yes, ma'am. I've got a job the second week I was out of prison.
- And what are you doing?
- So I work at American Foods Group. It's a meat packaging company and I work about 10 hours a day. I worked six days out the week, Monday through Saturday and Sundays I'm off and I get paid weekly so.
- [Heidi] Did you complete the application yourself?
- Yes, I did, yes, ma'am.
- [Heidi] Okay, 'cause you didn't really list anything about your networking. Your church, friends, your support system.
- Yeah, I'm sorry about that. Yeah, I did not complete the application. You mean for the Zoom?
- [Heidi] No. Yeah, yeah. You've completed the application, you filled out where you wanted to move to, you wrote down your offenses, what you've been convicted of, your treatment and then you left that area blank.
- Yeah, for the application for my job.
- [Heidi] No, the application to be before us today.
- Yeah, I might've left that out on accident, I'm so sorry if I did, if you wanna ask me anything about it, I'm more than happy to answer it.
- [Heidi] Do you have family that live around here?

- Yes, I have family. So I have family that lives in Green Bay. Mostly my mother's side of my family lives in Green Bay and I have, yep. I have brothers and sisters. It's total of nine of us.

- [Heidi] How long have you lived in Green Bay?

- I lived in green bay since about 2001, 2002.

- [Heidi] All right. And do you have any other support system?

- Yes, I also go to a resource center. It's called "We All Rise" it's on Webster in Green Bay and yeah, I go there and basically they help me with anything that I'm trying to do. Any productive things that I have going on as far as finding a place and going out application for a job when I was looking for a job and yes, they support me.

- [Heidi] Okay. All right. So we received after the fact with your application, some certification and that you completed some programs, one of them being Cognitive Behavioral Program, Thinking for Change completed at Columbia Correctional Institute. And then it looks like you also completed an SO Two at I'm assuming, is at Jackson?

- Yes.

- [Heidi] Okay, so why don't you tell us what you learned as a Sex Offender Treatment?

- So, yeah, I did the sex offender treatment. It was about nine months and I've learned a lot. I've actually learned things that I haven't known about myself. I've learned how to process my thoughts before I react. I've learned how to accept my emotions and how to deal with my emotions. I've also learned the pain and suffering that what I had 'cause of my crime to my victim and other people as well. And if I would have never went to that class, I would have never known the tools that I've learned today. Well learn in class us and to be able to use the tools that I've learned in society. And this will be a great start for that.

- [Heidi] Okay.

- Will you be living alone or with someone else?

- Yes, I'll be living with my grandma and I believe my uncle as well stays there.

- [Heidi] Did your agent approve your address?

- Yes.

- [Heidi] And who is your agent?

- Josh, Joshua.

- [Heidi] All right. Oh, go ahead. Did somebody have a question? Okay. It seems on your application that you indicated you have participated in AODA classes. Do you have any concerns with alcohol and drugs?

- No, see, yeah. That was also a great class as well. Well, from being in kept my sobriety for over five years and I plan to keeping it that way. I also changed my life around, I don't smoke. I don't drink, I don't smoke cigarettes. What I do do is my hobby is fitness. I like to work out a lot. So I'm into healthy lifestyle some of the things that's in the past and I would not wanna go back to that again.

- [Heidi] Okay. Does the board have any further questions for Mr. Ricketts?
- None here.
- No.
- [Heidi] All right, would anybody like to have a discussion or make a motion?
- I would move to approve from address specific?
- [Heidi] Is there a second for that?
- I'll second that.
- [Heidi] All right all in favor, aye.
- Aye.
- Aye.
- [Heidi] Opposed? Okay. Mr. Ricketts, you have been approved to reside at 919 South Oakland street. If you do decide to move from that location, you will need to come back before the board.
- Okay.
- Okay. Would you like us to mail that to your current address or to the South Oakland address? If you can mail it to my current address, that'd be perfect.
- [Heidi] Okay, we will do that. Thank you.
- Excuse me. Is it possible if you can mail it to my probation officer?
- [Deanna] He will get a copy of it. I can also email him and let him know.
- Okay.
- [Heidi] All right. Next on the agenda is the appeal of Anthony Reed. Mr. Reed is requesting to move to 900 Eastman avenue. Mr. Reed you're present.
- Yes.
- Yep. It looks like you were here before the board in November and you were requested to return in 60 days. We wanted to see a report or documentation for your treatment. I don't see that being provided to us. Did you provide that to us?
- Yes, I dropped it off in your office.
- [Deanna] Heidi.
- Of two and a half months ago.
- [Deanna] There was a sex offender treatment evaluation in the packet and then.

- [Heidi] Yeah, I saw that, but that's the Department of Corrections is not a treatment program. Is that correct Mr. Reed?

- Yeah, I'm enrolled, it says right here-

- [Deanna] Heidi, his treatment program hasn't started yet. I do have something from agent Trilling. He has the same agent as the previous gentleman.

- [Heidi] Okay.

- He says he does have the documentation for the assessment, which I provided. And the treatment provider has given a date for the program to start again.

- [Heidi] Oh, okay, I see. Okay. Go ahead, Mr. Reed.

- Yeah, his name is Pablo. I believe. I don't know his name of the company.

- [Heidi] No that's okay. So I was not present for that meeting and it appears that neither was Dominique. Is that correct, Dominique? It doesn't look like you weren't here for that meeting back in November?

- That's correct.

- [Heidi] Okay, so do you want to hear, you know Mr. Reed's story? Do we want to spend- Fay and Pete were there

- Give me two minutes.

- [Heidi] Pardon me?

- I was just talking to my friend.

- [Heidi] Oh, or do we want to make another motion that this is maybe delayed due to not having what we need? What does everybody feel right now?

- I guess I have a question. Where are you living right now?

- 900 Eastman Avenue, apartment number three.

- [Heidi] Which it appears that you guys approved him to do that, but he had to return in 60 days and we had to see a report or documentation for treatment. So yes, we have the assessment completed, but he has not started any kind of treatment.

- [Deanna] And Heidi and board per his agent, the provider has not given them a start date yet, just so you know.

- [Heidi] Okay. Well, I was not present for that November meeting. And so I would really like to kind of hear all the details, Mr. Reed, about your offense and what you were convicted of. Again, as you heard me tell the previous gentleman, please don't name the victim or state in the relationship of the victim.

- Okay. Well, it all started like one morning, my girlfriend cooking breakfast and I was sleeping in the bed and was in the room. She woke me up and started messing with me. Told me to get up and mom was cooking food. And I was already aroused when I woke up. I told her to get out, Started to get up. She said, no. And then went under the covers started trying to wake me up, that's when I like pushed her head down. She put

her mouth on my private said, she popped up and said, mom is coming that's what happened. And I told her, no, she stopped I stopped, that's rest went to a kitchen outside to smoke. That's when I was like, that felt nauseous, very sick with myself, but sitting there listening to still feel that way today. I think about my nieces and nephew, my family what they think about it. Yeah, just I feel so much regret because of one bad choice, but I'm trying to keep my mind on a new start. I just had so much guilt ever since and its been on my head.

- [Heidi] And did that occur one time? Was it multiple occasions?

- No, it was just time. They said it was twice, but it was only once.

- And how old was the victim?

- I believe five that's then.

- And you were how old? I'm sorry, what?

- 29.

- [Heidi] 29?

- 29, 30 there about.

- [Heidi] And how did the police get involved?

- I believe her mom took her to the doctor's one day to get her assessment with that. I had known she had previous encounters when she was on younger. So she was going through counseling and all that so of her mom took her back to counseling. They were talking about it and that's how.

- [Heidi] Sorry, when you say she had previous encounters, are you referring that the previously assaulted?

- Yeah, I believe by her father's side, one of the kids.

- [Heidi] And according to the documentation from that November 17th meeting, our commander Abel was present for that also. And he indicated that this did happen more than once, but you're saying it did not.

- Yeah, this happened at one time.

- [Heidi] And I see Commander Abel is gone. So why do you think it would be a narrative saying that it happened twice?

- They said it had been in the living room and the kitchen, I believe. And the mom was in kitchen. We weren't even in the living room. So none of that even done it wasn't even accurate so.

- [Heidi] Okay.

- This all happened in the bedroom.

- [Heidi] Okay and then so you did you plead guilty?

- No.

- [Heidi] You took it to trial?

- No, I've tried to take it as far as I can and I tried to fight it at first. 'Cause I didn't want this over my head, my family, I tried to fight it and I finally gave up.

- [Heidi] Okay. So then you were sentenced to six years in the prison and 10 years I extended supervision. Is that correct?

- Correct.

- [Heidi] And when did you get out of prison then?

- September 7th, 2021.

- [Heidi] Does the board have any questions about his offense?

- None here.

- No.

- [Heidi] Mr. Reed, if we want to discuss your treatment, do you want to do that in closed or a public session?

- A public session.

- [Heidi] Okay, so it looks like according to your location, you have not had any sex offender treatment?

- No, no. When I was incarcerated the pandemic bit and it was a total shutdown for 18 months and I was finally started getting back to track. It never gave me an opportunity, but what I did was drug packets and sub one. And things like that.

- [Heidi] Okay. All right, does the board have any further questions about that treatment?

- I guess I would like to move them. We extend another 60 days so that we know that Mr. Reed is actually in treatment and we have some information.

- [Heidi] Is there a second on that? It appears that motion has failed. Is there a different motion?

- Sorry, I was on mute. I'll second that.

- [Heidi] oh, okay. I understand. Okay, so we have Fay making a motion, Dominique seconding it. All I this favor.

- [Rachel] I just want to make sure before we vote, that I've got the motion correct. It's a motion to approve address specific for 60 days ending returning the documentation.

- Yes.

- [Rachel] Okay,

- [Heidi] All in favor aye.

- Aye.

- Aye.

- [Heidi] Opposed. Opposed. Okay Mr. Reed have been approved to stay there for an additional 60 days. We'll need to come back with documentation. I will tell you that as why I denied you to leave there is because you have not had any treatment whatsoever. So hopefully when you come back, you'll have received some treatment.

- Okay and if I need to move from that location, then I would run it through you guys.

- [Heidi] Yep, you'll need to give us the new address that you would be wanting to reside at.

- Okay.

- [Heidi] You want us to mail that to your 900 Eastman Avenue?

- Yeah, can you make sure it has apartment number three apartment number one is

- [Heidi] All right, we've got that bit logged.

- And that did open up a P.O Box, which was made by Joshua. If you guys wanted that too.

- [Deanna] That's fine. Otherwise I can put number three, if you prefer the P.O box, I can take that.

- Yeah, I'd prefer the P.O.Box 'cause I just don't trust.

- [Deanne] Okay, what is the P.O Box number?

- 17 02 54 305, P.O.Box.

- [Deanna] Got it, okay.

- Let me just check that address because my mail coming out missing. So that does. Yep 54305.

- [Deanna] Got it, I'll send the letter there.

- Okay, I appreciate it.

- [Deanne] Thank you.

- [Heidi] Okay, thank you. All right, next on the agenda? Is it PLRT Tejon Cleveland requesting to move to 2436 Hillsides Lane. Mr. Cleveland, you have appeared before us in the past.

- However, it has been many, many years. So as you know, we'll ask you to go ahead and kind of give us up synopsis of your offense and what you were convicted of, how it got brought to the police's attention. And then remember, don't talk about the victim by name or relationship.

- In this.

- Excuse me.

- [Heidi] Yes.

- I would like to re recuse myself from this one.

- [Heidi] Does that have to be a motion, Rachel?

- [Rachel] No, it doesn't have to be a motion. She just can't vote on the item. So during the vote I'll just mark her as abstaining.

- [Heidi] Okay, thank you. All right, Mr. Cleveland, proceed please.

- All right, I did commit the charge of second degree sexual assault with the age being 16, a minor it came to light because back in the day it was in 1996 I committed the crime. I was out driving around after getting into an argument with my wife at the time we had a three month baby at home and I was drinking and doing drugs back then, smoking marijuana, just out of control. And I ended up picking her up. She said that she needed a ride home. I proceeded to say that I knew the area that she lived in. That was from the West side Green Bay, took to driving around. She's smoked a little bit of weed with me and I used that to manipulate her into kind of getting her curl on to stay this a little bit longer. And then she asked if she could drive in my car. So I let her for a little bit. And then I started driving and getting like the part. And that's where decided to start sexually assaulting her. After she turned my advances down and it came to light in 2000, when I was getting released from Adam Moraine on an unrelated charge, I borrowed a car from my friend and took it out to North Dakota and she reported I got arrested in the vehicle. When I was getting released in Adam Moraine they did a DNA test on me and that's when the charges came along. I was working for Garrett at the time with my dad. He was a supervisor within lines of premises, arrested me and took hair follicles from me and might be

- [Heidi] So in 1996, how old were you? Mr. Cleveland?

- I cannot hear anybody.

- [Heidi] Can you hear me now?

- Yes, I can hear you .

- [Heidi] Okay, I think you froze there for a second. How old were you in 1996.

- I was pointing to just turning 21 that when I was 20 years old and she was 15.

- Okay. And when you say that you took her to a car and she turned down your advances and you sexually assaulted her, what did you actually do?

- I chased her out of my car. I penetrated her inside my car with my fingers. I chased her out of my car out pushed her down onto the ground. And that's where I proceeded to insert myself into her where I raped her.

- [Heidi] And after you were done, what happened if you just let her go?

- No, well, yeah, I let her go. She asked me to take her home and everything. And rather than doing that, I threw her clothes to her and she ended up walking down the road who called the police and went to the hospital. I wasn't following until four years later, when my DNA came up that time, when I was after that, before my other conviction for the car, I was just spinning out of control. I was doing drugs, trying to run from that and run from my obligations at home.

- [Heidi] Does any of the board members have any questions about his offense?

- None here.

- [Heidi] Okay. And it appears that, I mean, I know you've gone through this and first, I guess I just wanna say it's been a long time since you've been in trouble, correct?

- Indeed yes, I have not been arrested for anything since 2001, I went to prison. I ended up doing 13 years six month prison sentence. It was under all that they gave me 20 years during that time and we'll discuss this in a little bit about the treatments that I went through, but I did do my MR there and I have now successfully completed as of December 4th, my parole sentence.

- [Heidi] Okay, so you're no longer on any kind of paper supervision whatsoever?

- No, ma'am.

- [Heidi] Okay. So you got out of prison in what, 2014?

- '15.

- '15? Okay. And it looks like the very first time we saw you was in 2015. And at that time you were approved to live at Hubbard Street. Is that correct?

- The first apartment that I got after I got released from the eighth. It was the halfway houses around Shona Avenue, which week after that got out of Oshkosh Prison. I ended up getting a job at doing a construction company, doing concrete. And then after that, the following week I ended up getting my own license, getting a car and they approved me living at that address.

- [Heidi] Okay. So then you lived there approximately four years and then you came back before us again, to move to 324 15th avenue. Is that correct?

- There was one move in between there. I ended up moving over to Cormier in a swab and I went there I just went in Philip Board. I looked forward.

- Okay.

- So I lived at that address for like a year, a year and a half, maybe a year. And then I moved to a

- [Heidi] All right and then so you've been living at 324, 15th Avenue since 2019?

- Yes, lived there for years.

- [Heidi] All right and why is it that you're wanting to move?

- Because in the time of me being on supervision, I've done nothing but try to better myself and better the community around me. I did a lot of charity work while I was in prison. And now I'm done with parole. I'm getting in contact with Oshkosh, so I can go back inside because the other inmates and everything about what I've done since I've been out and that everything, if you stick your mind to it, you can achieve it. I ended up getting involved with a female, Jennifer Collins, probably about a year and a half after I was out. And me and her I've known her since she was 17 and I was eight. We never dated or anything like that. But we hooked up, it was the best thing that happened in my life. Because from that point on, we were saving, we were planning. We got married a year after we got together, been married for three years now, and we've been saving to make our dream home and just get situated with this behind the scenes. She's been with me by my side the whole time since I've been out of prison and circumstances came to where we were able to buy a house a lot sooner than anticipated. And it went a lot faster than we had thought it was going through. And therefore they ended up coming down there like two weeks ago or the last three to submit the paperwork for that.

- [Heidi] Okay. And where are you currently working at?

- I now work for it's SJ Martin and previous to this job we've been there for a year as a lead ceramic tile and scholar. My wife has just got home, she;s joining us. Is that all right?

- [Heidi] Yep, that's fine. She gonna wanna be speaking on your behalf?

- [Jennifer] Sure.

- Yes, yes.

- [Heidi] Okay, go ahead, finish talking.

- Okay, I worked for a lot construction for approximately four years and I was the lead man ability finisher of the construction on property then I had been working for SJ Martin ever since I had as well as off locked for three months. And I started there a year ago on the 18th. So I've been there for a year and I have my own company van and drive the sister paid, doing expensive ceramic tiles in homes and stuff.

- [Heidi] Okay. Does the board have any other questions before we maybe have his wife speak on his behalf?

- None here.

- [Heidi] Okay. Go ahead Ms. Cleveland. You can not state your name and address for the record please.

- Jennifer Jean Cleveland. 24356 Hillside lane, Green bay 5430.
