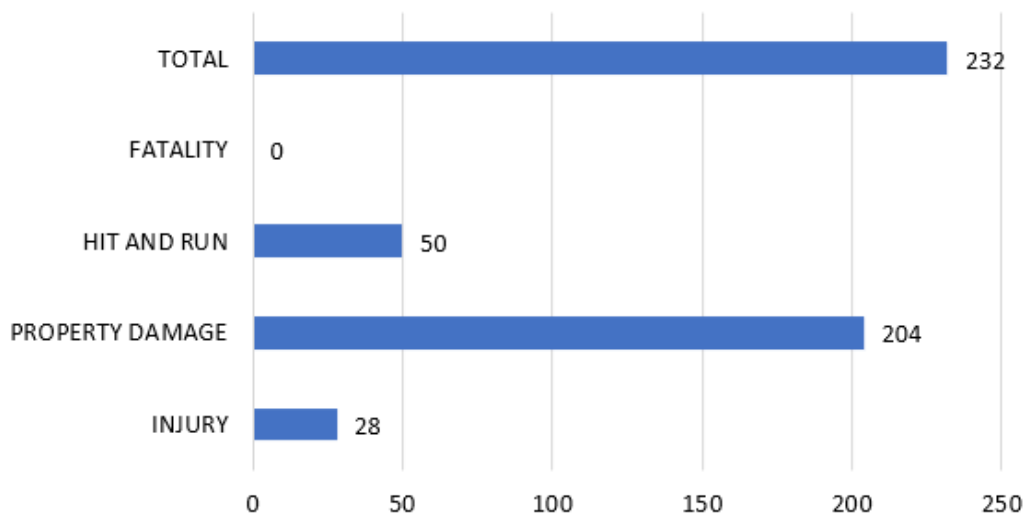

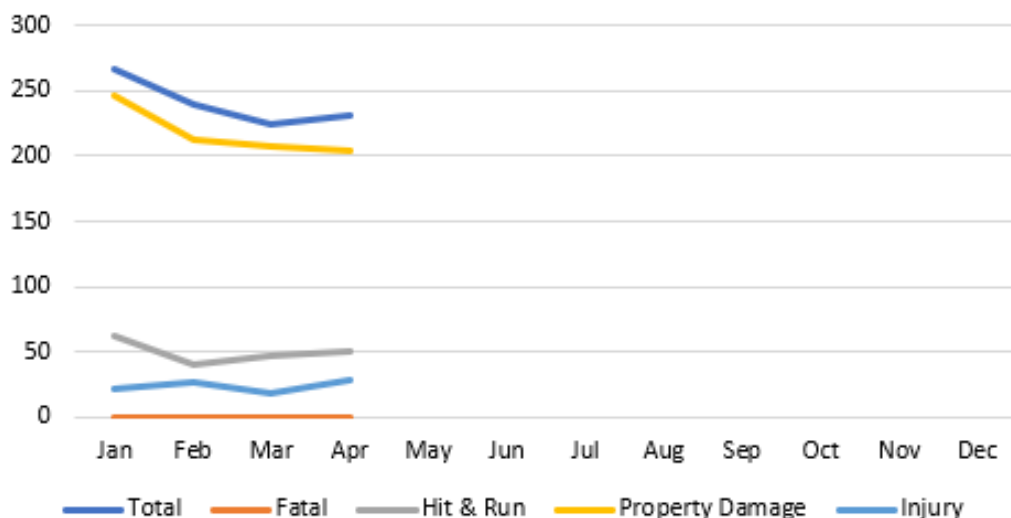
Traffic Safety Plan

With a goal of reducing traffic crashes, property damage, injury and death on Green Bay's roadways, the police department will use a data driven approach for traffic enforcement. Data analytics from crash data, citizens complaints and speed boards will be used to identify traffic emphasis areas. 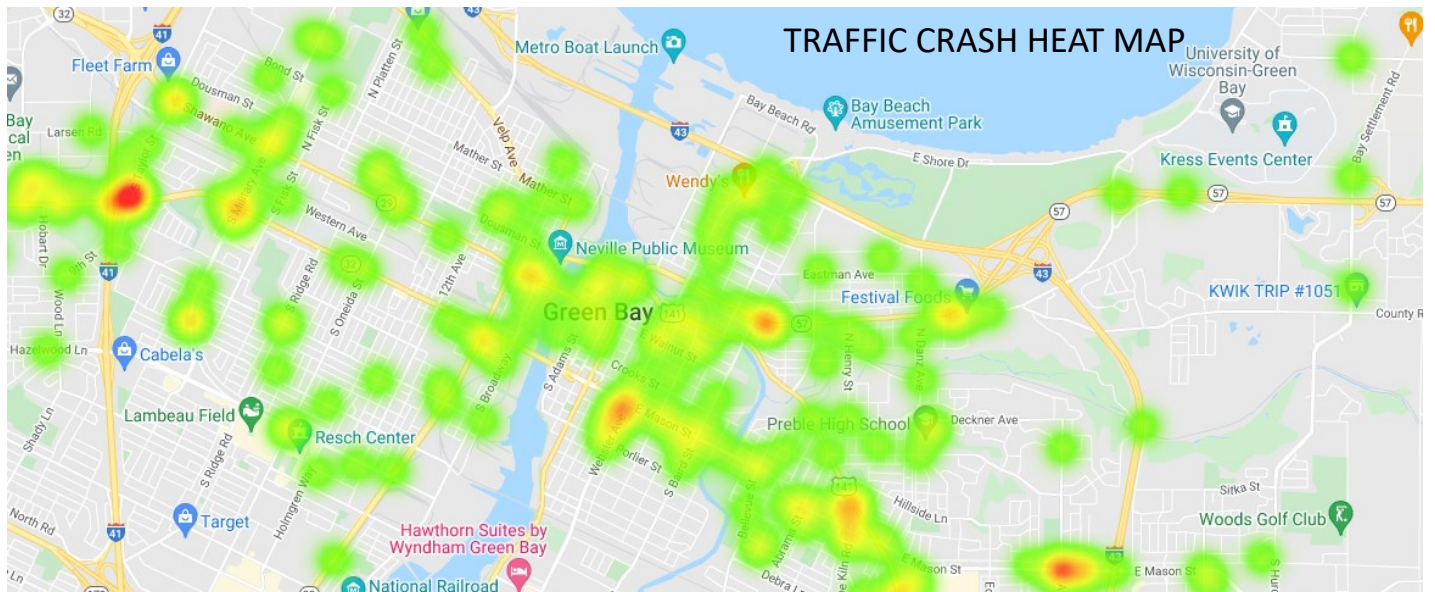
APRIL 2022 CRASH DATA



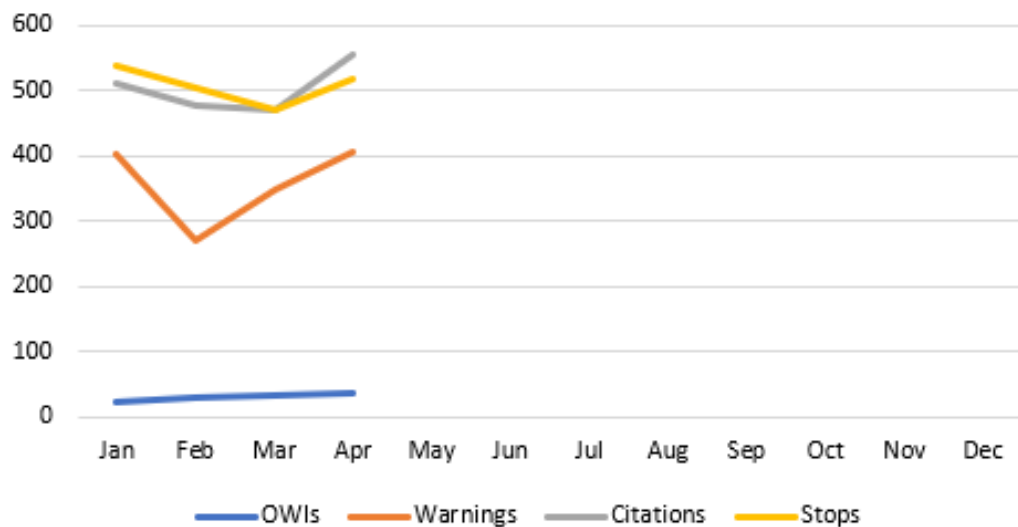
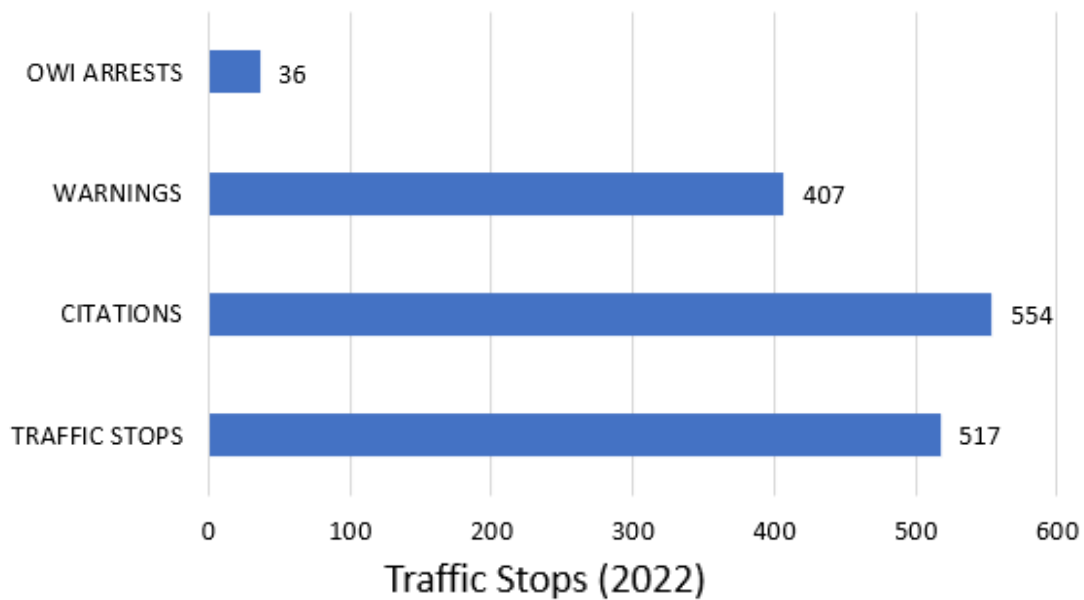
Crashes (2022)

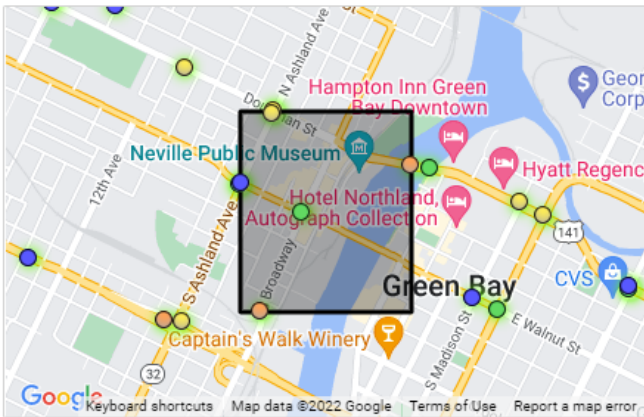


Analysis Area #1: GREEN BAY (C)

Initial Request: Consideration with possible action to establish a NO STOPPING OR STANDING zone on the north side of Emmett Street from Lincoln Street to west of Shea Street. (Ald. Scannell - District 7)

BACKGROUND

Trucks destined to and leaving the Weston Foods plant will park and idle in the middle of the night, creating a quality of life concern for residents on Emmett St. Establishing the parking restriction would either eliminate the idling issue altogether or push it west toward Columbia Ave away from the residential area. Unsuccessful attempts to resolve the issue have occurred, with staff contacting Weston Foods representatives requesting they ask the drivers to move.
