- I. Consideration with possible action on a request by Brewski's on Broadway at 1100 S. Broadway to extend their license premises to the parking lot for an event September 9-10, 2022 from 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. , subject to complaint and the renewal of the 2022-2023 liquor license).
2. Consideration with possible action on a request by Cole Ductan (Bay Area Burger Co.) at 126 S. Broadway to extend the issuance of his available "Class B" License to early August due to unanticipated delays (License granted by Council on 5/3/2022).

We've seen that our neighbors are benefiting by legalizing cannabis. Michigan legalized adult recreational marijuana in 2018 and now, what was previously illegal, is monitored and regulated. Not only is this giving adults more freedom to make their own personal choices, but it's ensuring safer and more predictable options while generating significant economic activity and public revenue. In March, Michigan sent more than \$42.2 million to 163 municipalities and counties as a part of the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marijuana Act.

Review with possible action city policy regarding use of city flagpoles and what types of flags may be flown from them and when. If the city does not have one, I would request we create a city flagpole policy.
PURPOSE:
To establish clear guidelines for:

l) the exhibition of the United States of America flag, the Wisconsin State flag, the City of Green Bay flag at City facilities and at City Hall

POLICY:

It is the policy of the City of Green Bay that flags should be displayed in conformance with Federal and State laws and policies, as stated in the Federal "The Flag" publication of the Congress, Title 4, Chapter, I of the United States Code, and the State of California Government Code Sections 430 and 437.

The City's flagpoles are not intended to serve as a forum for free expression by the public. The City will not display a ceremonial flag based on a request from a third party, nor will the City use its flagpoles to sponsor the expression of a third party.

PROCEDURE:

Federal, State, and City Flags

1. Outdoor flags will be flown at City facilities in the following order of precedence: first, the United States of America flag; second, the

Wisconsin State flag; third, the City of Green Bay flag;

2. The City of Green Bay flag will be flown wherever there are sufficient poles to do so. The City flag may be displayed on the same

pole with, and underneath the State flag, whenever the pole is of

sufficient height. The Federal, State, and City flags shall not be flown

on a single pole of any height.

3. Indoor flags will only consist of the U.S. Flag, State of Wisconsin Flag and City of Green Bay Flag and approved ceremonial flags.

Ceremonial Flags:

1. Flags of governments recognized by the United States may be

displayed in conjunction with an official government event.

2. The flags of any official Sister Cities of the City of Green Bay may be

displayed in conjunction with an event involving the Sister City or Cities.

3. Ceremonial flags of significance to the City's history may be displayed as designated by City Council by adoption of a resolution

in conjunction with official actions or proclamations of the City Council

13. Consideration with possible action on an appeal by Code 920, Inc. at 805 Klaus St. regarding the 2022-2023 renewal liquor license application (To start no earlier than 7 p.m.)

The Protection and Policy Committee may convene in closed session pursuant to 19.85(a), Wis. Stats., as a quasi-judicial body for the purpose of deliberating the Appeal by Mr. Jason Cowser regarding the 2022-2023 renewal application. The Protection and Policy Committee may thereafter reconvene in open session pursuant to 19.85(2) Wis. Stats. To report the results of the closed session and consider the balance of the agenda.
