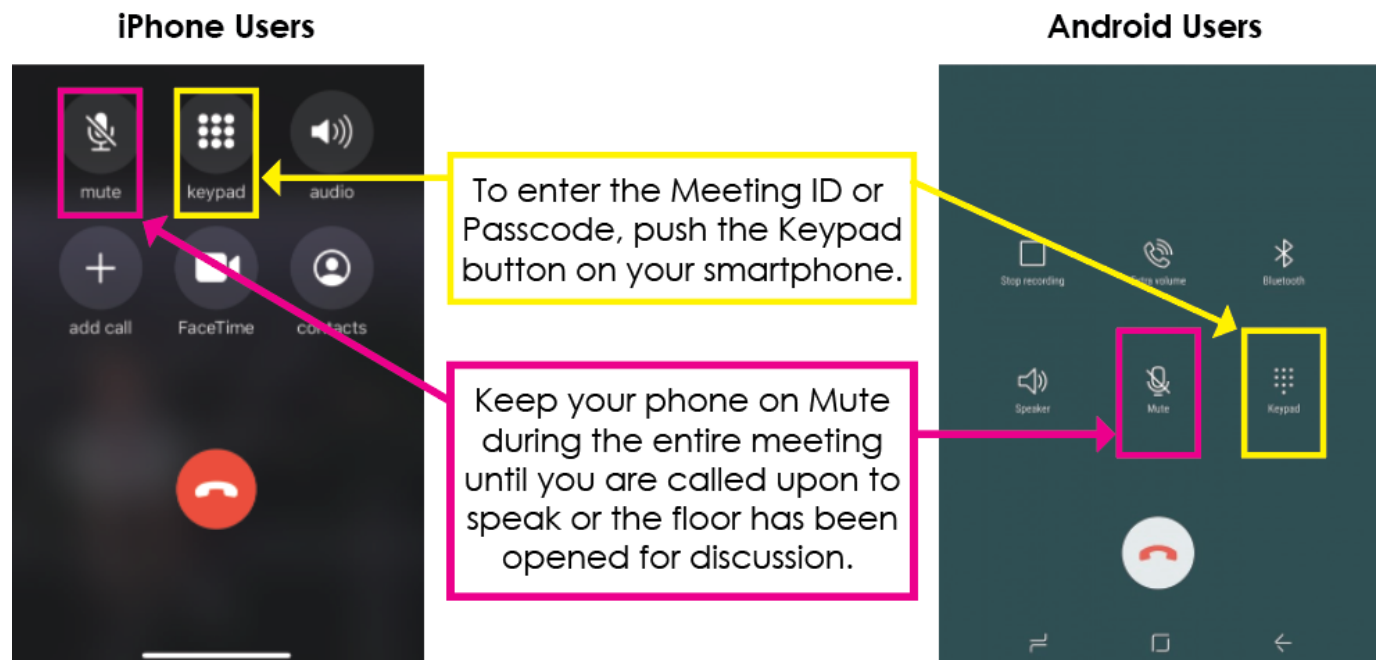
Additional Information

1. Wisconsin Open Meetings Law still applies
 - a. Persons interested in speaking to an item must give their name and address
 - b. Committee/Commission/Board members will still follow *Roberts Rules of Order*
2. Please log into the Zoom meeting 10 minutes before the meeting starts to ensure proper technology is working.
 - a. If you are a Board Member, please log into [CivicClerk](#) with a computer, laptop, or tablet device.
3. Once you are in the meeting please mute yourselves.
 - a. You may unmute yourself when you are called upon to speak.
4. Waiting room
 - a. When you call in, all callers/participants will be placed in a “waiting room.”
 - b. Persons on the agenda will be admitted to the meeting, and then once the item is concluded, the host will permanently mute you from the meeting (you can still hear the meeting).
5. Using Zoom with a tablet or computer
 - a. Tablet - Download the app either with the Apple Store or the Play Store
 - b. Computer - You may download the app or click on the link to open Zoom in your web browser.
6. Registering
 - a. The host may ask you to register for the meeting. A registration link will be sent to you along with the invite. You'll receive another email confirming that you're registered for the meeting.
 - b. If you're using a phone, your registration will still be tied to an email.
7. Raising your hand

Summary of Licenses Granted and Issued for Available Liquor Licenses:

The City of Green Bay has a quota of **172** Class B Combination Liquor and Beer licenses under state law.

The City of Green Bay has issued **155 of the 172** available Class B Combination Liquor and Beer licenses.

The City of Green Bay cannot take anymore applications at this time for available liquor licenses. The City has 6 available licenses that have been granted, but not issued (see page 1). There are 5 licenses that have pending applications.

There are 6 available liquor licenses that Council will take action on August 2, 2022. If Council approves to have these licenses be released into the pool of available licenses, the City Clerk's Office may begin to take available liquor license applications starting August 3, 2022 at 7:30 a.m.

The City of Green Bay set forth by resolution that available liquor licenses are considered to those who apply with fully completed applications and first in time.

The Clerk's Office shall only accept the number of applications that we have available licenses.

Summary of Licenses Granted and Issued for Reserve Liquor Licenses:

The City of Green Bay has a quota of 23 Class B Combination Liquor and Beer Reserve licenses under state law.

The City of Green Bay has 1 Class B Combination Liquor and Beer Reserve issued.

The difference between a Reserve and available liquor license is that a reserve is at a cost of a one-time non-refundable \$10,000 issuance fee (plus license fee). The license shall not be transferred or surrendered.
