- What if I had to run the meeting once?
- What's the worst that could happen, right?
- Don't say that.
- We'll find out.
- Okay, it's four o'clock. You can start the meeting.
- All right, I will call this meeting to order. This is the Sex Offender Residency Board of the City of Green Bay, December 21st, 2022 at four o'clock. First, we'll start out with roll call. And looks like we have everyone but Heidi. Is there anything else that we need to do for roll call?
- No, I'll document it in the minutes.
- All right, so looking forward, approval of the agenda. Is there a motion? Is there a second?
- I'll second.
- Okay, motion made by Mr. Coleman. All those in favor, say aye.

- Opposed? Motion carries unanimously. We're going to approval of the minutes of the November 16th, 2022 Sex Offender Residency Board. Is there a motion to approve?

- Opposed? The motion carries unanimously. Moving on to the appeal of Adam Poquette requesting to move with to 702 Crooks Street. Is Mr. Poquette in the audience?

- I am.

- All right. And so, Mr. Poquette, it looks like you've been in front of this board before. So anyone on the board, have you gone through the packets? Do you have any questions you wanted to go over? His offense again or treatment? Because if there are no questions or any desire to go over his cases or treatment, does anyone want make a motion or how do you want to handle it?

- I don't have any questions.

- Done.

- Okay.

- There is someone who indicated that they wanted to speak on his behalf.

- You can go ahead and state your name and address for the record and then whatever you'd like to say.

- My name's Kevin Van Pay. I am the current resident at 702 Crooks. I am also currently Mr. Poquette's employer. I own and operate Van Pay Home Improvement. I work with a lot of local contractors in town. My specialty is windows and doors. And I just want to say how much I appreciate having Adam on board with my team, and I hope he's allowed temporary residence at my house until he can get himself back on his feet and find a little more permanent residence.

- Okay. So Mr. Poquette, you expect this to be temporary relocation?

- Yeah, I believe the landlord approved six months.

- Okay. All right. Any questions from the board?
- None here.
- None here.

- Anybody want to make a motion?
- Motion to approve that very specific.
- I'll second.
- All right. All in favor say aye.
- Aye.

- Opposed? And that motion carries unanimously. Mr. Poquette, you are approved to move to 702 Crooks Street. We can send you a letter either to your current location or 702 or email. What would you prefer?
- My email would be fine.
- Email, okay. And then if you do move again within the City of Green Bay, just make sure to check with our legal team to see if you're in an area that will require another meeting before this board.
- Okay.
- All right?
- Yep.
- Thank you and have a good evening.
- Thank you. All right, we'll move on to the appeal of William E. Webster requesting to move to 1242 Cass Street. And is Mr. Webster in the audience?
- I am.
- Okay. I believe this is the first time that you are appearing before this report.
- Yes.
- So with that, we're gonna ask you to tell us what you were convicted of. Please do not identify the victim by name or relationship.
- Okay.
- And then how did this get to the police's attention? So we'll start with that. Go ahead.

- I had just officially moved to Pennsylvania. Like I was kind of couch surfing for a while, but I got an actual place there. I had contacted one of my friends that I had just moved there. He had mentioned that he had a friend that he went to school with that lived close to me and thought that we would get along. I was 24, this kid was 19. He sent me her information. I was checking it out. Name, age, what she wants to do with her life, stuff like that was there, but her age had said that was 19, so I was always cautious but not like super, super duper cautious, so I was just, you know, is your age correct? Like, are you really this old? Yeah. All right, cool. We talked for a little bit. Around 12:00, one o'clock in the morning, she invited me over. So, I went over. We were watching TV, talking. I felt her hand touch my leg. I asked if she wanted, like, are you sure you want to do this? Yeah. I proceeded to undress her and penetrate her vaginally with my, yeah. We hung out for a little bit longer. I started to fall asleep on the couch. She asked me to stay over, so I did. I get woken up being told to go in the closet, which I did. And her mom comes in talking to her. As she goes to leave, she sees me there, asks what I was doing. I proclaimed, I didn't know, you didn't know I was here. She said, leave now and I won't call the cops. Not a problem. Gather my stuff, off and left. From what I understand, she had called the pastor and the pastor had convinced her to call the police because I would do this over and over and over again, which is how the police was notified of what happened.

- All right. Do we have anybody from the Green Bay Police Department there? I can't see in the video.

- They are not here. He was going to attempt to get on Zoom. He didn't know if he would have a signal. What information we were able to get was fairly limited.

- Okay, all right. It's just a typical question we ask of them to try to verify your account of this story. Any questions from the board in terms of the incident? And this has happened one time, Mr. Webster?

- This was November, I can't remember the exact day. November, 2009.

- Okay.

- And it was one event?

- Yes.

- Okay. All right. And so now you live in Green Bay or you're looking to move to Green Bay?

- I moved to Green Bay. Mind you, I can't call to find out exactly what my requirements are before moving here, so I didn't know I was gonna have to go through everything I'm going through. So I moved into 1242 the day I got out here. My son's mom suggested it as a place to go. Her friend owns it. I moved all the way out here to be here for my son who's only six months. I wanted to be present in his life and be an active, decent dad.

- All right. And where do you work?

- Rosati's Pizza as a delivery person. I was out here not even a week and I got hired. When I got out here, I did everything I was supposed to do. I reported in, got a job, everything to try and get myself settled in.

- Okay. When we talk about treatment for your sex offense, you have the option of discussing that in public or closed session. Do you have a preference?

- I'm the only person here, so I'm pretty sure public's okay.

- Well, you are being recorded. It will be publicly available.

- I'm not worried about that at this point.

- Okay. All right.

- I was gonna ask--

- Yeah?

- Was there time served for this and how much time?

- It was a total of four charges, two felonies and two misdemeanors. I got 11 and a half to 23 months for the two felonies, two years probation for the one misdemeanor, and four years probation for the second misdemeanor. I am completely off paper.

- Thank you.

- Okay. So in terms of treatment, what treatment have you received or are currently going under?

- I'm not currently undergoing any treatment. When I was in prison, I wasn't forced to take any treatment. I volunteered for Thinking For A Change. I took the class twice. The first time, I had to go into protective custody for fear of my life, which canceled the class. The second time going through it, I missed the last class because I was released a week early due to overcrowding.

- Go ahead.

- I also, while in protective custody, they did a mental health course. It wasn't really a course. You didn't get a certificate for it, but I did go through the mental health classes for a good four or five months until I got put into a dorm where I learned forgiveness, I did NA, AA, the 12 Step Program for co-dependency 'cause I felt like I might be a little co-dependent, so that supposedly was to help with that, which it did. And while on probation, I did do sex offender treatment. I didn't complete it because I had a probation violation where I chose to just max my time out in prison. And it was just a condition of probation. So once I was released, they no longer required me to go to treatment. Granted, I didn't complete it, but I did learn a lot in it while attending.

- Okay. And then with your treatment programs, what are some of the key takeaways that you got from those programs?

- Between those and having a volunteer life coach, not to make decisions based off emotion. Look at all possible avenues before making any decisions. That basically when it comes to the whole sex offender counseling thing, recognizing, I can't think of the word I want to use, I'm sorry, traits inside myself like urges, recognizing what they are, and noticing the pattern, and learning how to control that. And that I feel like applies to pretty much anything even with any mental health issues I have such as like borderline, recognizing any of the patterns for paranoia, or anxiety, or things like that, and learning how to kind of stop it in its tracks to be able to behave better or make better decisions.

- All right, good. Any questions from your board about treatment?

- None here.

- None for treatment, but I was curious, you served your time in Pennsylvania?

- Yes.

- Whereabouts in Pennsylvania?

- York, Pennsylvania.
- Right in York?
- Yep, York City. I was in York County prison.
- Okay. What part of town did you live in in York?
- It varied. It was always in York city. It was either east side, west side, a little bit of the parkway area, south side. It all depended.
- Okay. Are you originally from there, or?
- No, I'm from Baltimore, Maryland.
- Okay. Thank you.
- All right, Mr. Webster, is there anyone there to speak for you on your behalf?
- Sadly, no. My son's mom is home with him and his sister who is sick and he has a double ear infection.
- I feel you. Okay. Any other questions from the board?
- None here.
- Yeah, I've got another question. How did you meet your son's mom?
- Through a game that we play.
- So, online?
- Yeah.
- She lives here in Green Bay?
- Yes.
- Okay.
- I met her back in 2018. We met in person for the first time last year. We had started dating four or five months beforehand.
- Okay.
- We are still on really good terms. It's like she's my best friend.
- Have any plans on getting married?
- I don't think either one of us are ready for a relationship right now, but when we are, I think we're gonna give it a go and hopefully it goes well. The only reason why it ended was 'cause I was in Baltimore and she physically needed me here to like hold her if she was upset and I wasn't able to do it and it caused strain.

- Okay.
- So she pushed me away.
- Do you or her have any connections here in town with any churches or any groups?
- I'm not sure about her. She's been here her whole life. I don't know what her connections are. I mean, I don't really want to put her religious things out there or anything like that, so.
- Okay, thank you.
- Any other questions from board? If not, anyone here make a motion?
- Well, I'm not big fan of people from out of state or out of our community moving here, but he did have a reason, he's here to take care of his son, and he's gone through some treatments, so I'm gonna vote in favor the motion to approve that address specific.
- Is there a second? All right. Dominique, you were on mute and I believe you seconded.
- No, sorry, I second.
- No worries. All those who vote in favor, say aye.
- Aye.

- Okay, we'll move on to item E3, review of possible action under revised sex offender residence board appeal form. So I assume somebody from legal will take that over.

- I suppose I will. We just made a slight change on here. We added in the personal information area the email address if applicable. I've been finding that some of the applicants, they might move and not get the appeal letter and then they're coming in at the last minute asking for a copy of it. So I figured if we can ask for an email address, that'll save us on postage and paper and they're getting it in their email so then they can easily pull it up and take a look and see when they have to be here. We may make more changes at another time, but the ordinance does require that the appeal form be approved by the board.

- Okay. All right, any questions? Seems pretty straightforward. We'll make a motion.
