VERBATIM MINUTES

- Chris?
- Yeah.
- We're ready.
- [Alder Eck] I believe that Chris is on.
- Oh yeah.
- Just waiting for Dan to give me the old nod, actually. All right. Thank you. All right, the Parks Committee Meeting of January 25th will come to order. Note that all members are present, Alder Campbell, Alder Wery, Alder Steuer, Alder Eck. Approval of the agenda.
- [Alder Eck] Motion to approve.
- Second.
- Motion by Alder Eck, second by Alder Steuer, to approve the agenda. Any changes there? Those in favor?
- [Alders] Aye.
- Opposed? Motion carried. We need an approval of the minutes.
- [Alder Eck] Motion to approve.
- Second.
- Motion by Alder Eck, seconded by Alder Campbell, to approve. Any discussion? Those in favor?
- [Alders] Aye.
- Opposed? Motion carried. Item number one. Consideration with possible action on the request by Alder Wery for the creation of a flagpole policy. City owned flagpoles shall only fly the United States, State of Wisconsin, Green Bay flags. Guidelines located in the federal flag code. And I appreciate Attorney Bungert for passing on her write up for it. And it was at her request that it come to this committee. So it wasn't my request. I did rewrite it a little bit because the original request was all flagpoles, not just the flagpole at City Hall. And I passed it out to the members of the committee, and I'll read it, it's not much difference. All city owned or managed flagpoles shall only display the following flags: the United States Flag, the State of Wisconsin Flag, the City of Green Bay Flag, and the POW/MIA Flag. No other flags shall be flown, unless otherwise directed by law. If more than three flags will be displayed at the same time on one pole, the US Flag being the topmost flag. The US Flag shall be respected in the manner prescribed in Section 8 of Title 4 of the United States Code. Exemption is the flag display at Leicht Park. Flags may be flown that represent the nations from which immigrants to the city of Green Bay originated from. Any discussion on this?
- I will say that there are some members of the public who are here who we may wish to speak on this. If you'd like, you can either open the floor for comments, or you can reach out to Attorney Bungert and ask any specific questions for her.
- I think we'll start with that first. Attorney Bungert, I think I may have emailed it to you, and then I sent, I gave it to you before the meeting. Is there any issue with how it's written?

- Right. So making sure we're on, yep. So with the changes that are being proposed, I would recommend this actually being referred back to staff. And the reasoning is, to kind of backtrack, the reason that this policy did come to Parks was, and I do understand your communication and your intention is for it to be citywide. My understanding from the council meeting where this was discussed, the majority of the discussion was centered on the platform from the City Hall, which is obviously under the purview of Parks, so it made most sense for it to come to the Parks Committee board for discussion. If the committee's wishes are for this to expand to all city owned flagpoles, we're gonna need to do a little bit of more research as to whether council has specific authority with respect to certain locations, such as water utility, transit, police department, fire stations, as that might be a little distinct. Secondly, with the exemption, which I understand is purposely for Leicht Park, with respect to flying the other nations' flags, it is my understanding that there are a number of other flagpoles at that park. There is a yearly display where other nations' flags are flown. We need to do a little bit of research just to make sure we're not abutting any First Amendment issues and we're not in a contrary position to any laws regarding government speech, because we are flying other country flags. So we need to do a little bit of research on that, because that wasn't part of the original communication. And third is more of a question, and a little bit of direction from that, is the policy as you provided is restricted to only three flags at one time. However, four flags are noted, as far as which flags can be flown. So if that's the intention, that's fine. But then we're gonna have to come up with a mechanism by which is determining which flags fly at what time, and who decides that and how that gets decided. Unless you want to change it to flying four flags at one time, then that makes that simpler. But with respect to the other two things, we do need a little bit of opportunity to research it, just to make sure we're not gonna be in violation of any constitutional issues.

- I appreciate that, Attorney Bungert. There's certainly no particular rush. I guess we want to make sure we do it right. It's unfortunate that, it was pretty clear in my communication, that it was meant in the city parks, it's even written, the city owned flagpoles. It doesn't say anything about City Hall. And then I did ask that I get a copy of what was being proposed before it came to committee, so that we could make sure it goes to the right committee. So I questioned why it was coming here, 'cause it didn't pertain only to City Hall flag, and I was advised, I think by yourself, but I'll bring it, well, now we're here, and we're really not working on it, we're sending it back. So these are the types of things that should be taken care of before. And I guess maybe, because now it looks kind of foolish and silly and it's certainly not on this committee. So I would welcome comments from the committee. I'm fine with whatever we do. I make to make sure it's done right. Alder Eck.

- I don't know if this has to be on, but okay. Yeah. All right. And that I think is a good point that Attorney Bungert brings up about the police and fire, because I believe they do have a police flag and a fire department flag there. So that's good for me.

- Go ahead, Alder Steuer.

- Thank you, Chair. I kind of mimic Alder Wery a little bit on this, 'cause I think the intention, the intention of this communication I think was pretty straightforward. But I do agree that we need to do this correctly. I think... Like I said, a lot of this happened because of the City Hall situation some months ago. But we do have quite a few areas where we do have flags, the various flags of the city and such. I like the idea of the four flags, the POW, because I don't think that's ever fully gone away yet. POW/MIA Flag, and as far as Leicht Park, I do understand that you gotta check that out. I think, they're all separate flagpoles, but they are also on city property. So I guess I would really make sure to bring that back so that we can look at it very easily and vote expeditiously on this. So that's what I've got.

- Thank you, Alder Steuer. Anything, Alder Campbell?

- And to add to that, I guess, since we're getting into detail on city owned property, Bay Beach, Sanctuary, all of our parks, fishing docks. So we don't want to have to come back to do this, so I would make a note that we might as well clarify everything, that, and do it. So we're not dragging this out any longer.

- Thank you, Alder Campbell. I would entertain a motion to refer this to staff, and then if people want to comment on it, they certainly can.
- I will say Alder Grant is on Zoom, if you wanted to give her a chance to speak, you wouldn't have to open the floor since she is an alder.
- Okay, does she wish to?
- Well, she isn't saying she wants to, but.
- Well she could speak before or after, however.
- Is it possible ever for us to be able to see who's on Zoom?
- When they speak it is.
- [Alder Eck] Okay
- I'll entertain a motion to refer this to staff.
- Does she want to-
- Well, which staff?
- The Law Department.
- Just one more clarification. Because we want this, and it sounds like the intent is for it to be across the board for all departments, all city properties, all city flagpoles, I would recommend for this to go to Protection and Policy (P&P), just so that that really would be, and I apologize for the confusion again, based on the discussion from council, I thought it was going to be centered for City Hall, but since it's gonna be for all the buildings, and across departments, I think P&P is probably gonna be the better fit for that. So if that could be part of the motion for, to refer to staff and to forward it onto P&P, that will take care of it.
- Perfect. Thank you, Attorney.
- Mm hm.
- Yeah, the motion I'd be looking for, would be that we refer this to staff and bring back to Protection and Policy, 'cause that's where it came through first, and it should go there.
- I will second it.
- Is there a motion?
- No, I thought-
- Motion by...
- Oh, I thought you'd motioned.
- No, I was entertaining it. I didn't make the motion.
- I'll make the motion.

- Okay, second.
- Motion by Alder Steuer, second by Alder Eck, to refer this item to staff to work out the details discussed and bring it back to Protection and Policy. Under discussion, is there anybody here or at home who wanted to talk about referring this back to staff?
- Motion to open the floor.
- Motion to open the floor by Alder Eck.

- Opposed? Motion carried. Thank you. Thanks, Attorney. Number two. Consideration with possible action on adopting a resolution in support of World Migratory Bird Day. Who doesn't like migratory birds? Well, I guess it depends on your point of view.
- It's not a complaint today.

- So, he's right there. We're on number two, Migratory Bird Day.

- Bird City Wisconsin is a statewide group that encourages all communities in Wisconsin to implement sound bird conservation practices by offering public recognition to those that succeed in enhancing the environment for birds and educating the public about the interactions between birds, people, and about the contributions birds make to a healthy community. There are currently over a hundred municipalities that are members of Bird City. Green Bay is one of them. So the Wildlife Sanctuary has taken the lead to satisfy their educational components to be considered a Bird City for this mission. And there is currently a local group that coordinates the required activities and fundraises annually to contribute and to support the city of Green Bay in our endeavors to remain a member. So there's only really a few requirements that Bird City Wisconsin requires in order to retain membership, one of which is for the municipality to adopt a resolution in support of World Migratory Bird Day. So the resolution is included in the agenda packet, and it provides statements indicating that the city council supports the importance of migratory birds and recognizes the value that they bring to the city. The resolution also proclaims that the city officially recognizes both Saturday May 13th and Saturday October 14th as World Migratory Bird Day in the city of Green Bay. That's for 2023, those dates change on a yearly basis. In the past, the city has adopted similar resolutions. We typically do on a yearly basis. Last year was the first year that we officially recognized two days versus one day, and that was by the recommendation of Bird City. So it's really only required to recognize one day, but I do see value in recognizing both days. So I would recommend that we do so in this situation, and that's how the resolution is currently worded. And then the other requirement is the city has to sponsor an annual event. So that's something that Wildlife Sanctuary will do. They've done so in the past. We haven't set a date for that event, but usually it's around the first day.

- Perfect. Thank you, Director. I was just gonna ask if we had an event, 'cause that means more if we prepare an event, that can actually be with this. Thank you. I think Alder Campbell, you had a question first, and then Alder Steuer.

- As long it doesn't encroach wildlife bird and goose season opening at some time. That will kind of contradict it. That's it.

- Thanks for that.

- Well, I guess the birds don't know what day. Just saying.

- Okay.

- Just saying.

- Thanks, Alder Campbell. Alder Steuer.

- Okay. I don't know, I was gonna-

- What do you call them?

- Important.

- Yeah. No, I know we've done this for a number of years. Green Bay, at one time, read your histories was as vital an environmental area as anywhere in North America. As far as the wetlands, the flora, the fauna, the animals, everything, and the birds. So I realize that things have changed a bit, but I still think it's a very important area. I think we should honor that. So I'm all for two days.

- Alder Eck, anything?

- [Alder Eck] Like, do you have a match tournament?
- No.
- Okay.
- Okay, if no other discussion, anybody here for this item?
- A little flight preparation map.
- No, just, so there's no cost to it or anything like that? I didn't see anything added, so.
- There is no cost in relation to the resolution itself. Obviously there's cost involved with the event that we're gonna host at the Sanctuary, and there's also additional costs. But like I'd mentioned, there is a user group that teams up with the city, and usually they fundraise for the bulk of those costs.
- Okay, thank you.
- Alder Campbell.
- I know we talked about tracking antenna.
- Mm hm.
- How far off is that again? I thought that was gonna-
- It's coming up. It's not installed yet. It'll be installed hopefully this spring.
- Make that as part of that event?
- Yeah, that's a great idea. Use some of that data to-
- Being that it's in my district, then there'd be a bunch of, with the champagne.
- This is life with Alder Campbell.
- A little cold outta the fridge.
- But that's for discussion as movement.
- It's a great idea.
- If that comes out then...
- Yeah.
- That would be very cool.
- Done? All right. Thanks, Alder Campbell. Any other discussion? Alder Eck.
- I think Director Ditscheit, was there something else you were gonna say about it?

- No, that covers it.
- I was just wanting, one comment. Director were you saying something about an event possibly. Have we had those in the past? I can't remember any.
- Yeah, we have them every year at the Sanctuary. It's usually one time a year. It usually falls in May around the first date. It's not always on the same date as the first day we recognize, but it's usually right around there.
- So is there sort of a name for it at all? The name of the event the last year? Do you remember?
- There is a name, but I can't think of it off the top of my head.
- I suppose there'd be a Packer infringement, if the Bird is the Word for the Month.
- I like that one.
- The Bird is the Word, yeah. I make a motion to approve.
- Motion by Alder Eck to approve.
- Second.
- Second by Alder Steuer. Yeah, I don't think, maybe we could make it a requirement that Dan or James or Ann can dress up as a bird. I think Ann, 'cause she's a bird. All right those in favor?
- [Alders] Aye.
- Opposed? Motion carried. And I was remiss, everything tonight that we do reports to council, I think it's February 7th, correct?
- Yes.
- From tonight's, it's a recommendation to council that it-
- There's so little people...
- For everybody here, hello? Hello? Number three, consideration with possible action on the request and approving... it looks to be. Pardon me, consideration with possible action on approving the request by the U.S. Geological Survey Upper Midwest Water Science Center, the USGS UMWSC, to install a Remote Water Quality Monitoring Station on park property just north of East High School, west of North Baird.
- How do we read that?
- [Dan] There's a typo, it's actually east of Baird, not west of Baird.
- Oh.
- There is a map.
- There's a map included in the agenda packet, along with a letter from the U.S. Geological Survey, and also some photographs showing what this station will look like. So the U.S. Geological Survey recently contacted the Parks Department and requested to install this, the water quality monitoring station, on park property. We did work with their organization to find a location that was acceptable to both entities. And if it's

approved, it'll be placed on park property adjacent to the East River Trail, just north of East High School, which is east of Baird Street. And the stream gauge monitoring station will provide the public real-time meteorological data of the East River, as well as valuable water quality data which will be used for various research opportunities. So the site location will be funded for a minimum of five years, and it might even go on beyond that if they can get additional funding. So this is somewhat a long-term installation solution. If it's approved, the Law department will work with the U.S. Geological Survey to create an easement to allow them to place this on park property. And there will be language in that easement provided in there so that if the city does want to opt out, there'll be that option, 'cause that is such a long-term lease. We're not giving an indefinite term to this. So the ideal installation time for the equipment is in the spring. So if this is approved, they do want to jump on the installation, because the data for spring runoff is pretty important to their research. And so there is somebody here from the public. I'm not sure if they are here to speak on this issue. Nope? And I don't think there's anybody online from the U.S. Geological Survey. So if you have any questions, I'd be happy to answer them.

- Thanks, Director. Any costs to the city?

- There is no cost to the city.

- Questions from the committee?

- I just-

- Alder Eck.

- Oh, thank you. The letter is very difficult for us. None of us can read it.

- Okay. I can provide a hard copy for you. It showed up on my draft.

- Yeah.

- Just real garbled. I don't know how to-

- We could do it. It would take a day, but we could do it.

- It's kind of like a hieroglyphic.

- If we had a magnifying glass, and I don't know.

- I'll make sure to get a higher quality image in the council packet.

- Okay, thank you.

- All right, appreciate it. Thank you.

- Yeah. So that's what it's gonna look like.

- Yeah, and really, just the letter in summary, it just requests approval to place it there. It's a very standard letter.

- Sure. Well, I have no questions.

- Any motions?

- Motion to approve.

- By Alder Steuer to approve.

- Second.

- Second by Alder Campbell. Discussion? Those in favor?

- [Alders] Aye.

- Opposed? Motion carried. Informational. Director's Report. You're gonna tell us we are fully staffed for all positions next summer, right?

- Hopefully we'll be able to report that in the near future, but that's not on my report today. Just a few things to mention. Just after Christmas, Triangle Hill was open for two days for tubing and skiing. Unfortunately that was all we were open. And then the snow quickly melted, and we had to close the facility. So it hasn't been open since. But I will tell you, our new lift was installed, and the public really seemed to enjoy that. And it seemed to be a much better system than the cable system we had prior to it. So that was a good purchase. It also hasn't been cold enough to make outdoor ice yet. So we're hoping that, with the upcoming cold stretch, that we'll be able to get a few sheets of ice open, and we can get some ice skating in our parks. Right now we haven't had a single day with ice, due into the weather. And then I'll just kind go over a couple of events that we have going on in the parks. So the Frenzy on the Fox was held on January 13th, and there was 130 people that participated. So this was a 5K fun run, or walk or bike, on the Fox River Trail. And it was a collaborative effort between the Village of Allouez, the City of Green Bay, Brown County Parks, WELLO, Downtown Green Bay Inc., and the Friends of the Fox River Trail. So the post-race event was held on Washington Street on the surface parking lot, and it included a live band, food trucks, and a beverage. So it was a great event. A lot of good participation. And this was the first time that the weather really cooperated for us. In the past it's been very, very cold, as Ann can attest, 'cause she works that event every year. So this was really a nice event. Also, I want to mention that the Friends of the Bay Beach Wildlife Sanctuary was selected as one of 45 local nonprofits to take part in the Annual Give Big Green Bay Event. So this is a 24-hour period of giving, in partnership with the Green Bay Packers and the Greater Green Bay Community Foundation. So the event itself runs from noon on February 21st through noon on February 22nd. So it's a 24-hour event. People are able to donate towards the Wildlife Sanctuary or one of the other really good nonprofits that have been selected to be a participant. And then the Packers and the Greater Green Bay Community Foundation have a match to that. So it's a great way for the city and the Sanctuary to get a little bit of money to do some projects that they normally wouldn't be able to fund and move ahead with. So we're still-

- So it's paying sanctuary funding?

- Yeah, this is for the Sanctuary.

- It's not the Friends of Bay Beach?

- No, Friends of the Wildlife Sanctuary. So if I misspoke-

- Bay Beach.

- It's the Bay Beach Wildlife Sanctuary, so it's the FOWLS, Friends of the Wildlife Sanctuary. So they're the ones that are gonna be eligible. From the Bay Beach Amusement Park. They are two different groups.

- Right.

- [Alder Eck] Two different Bay Beach-

- Got it.
- Yeah. And they both have Bay Beach in the name, so it's kind of confusing.
- Well, it's first time I heard it.
- Yeah.
- Posted that way.
- Yeah. So anyway. It's a great 24-hour donation opportunity. We'll be doing a lot of press on it in the upcoming few weeks here. And this is the fourth year in a row that the sanctuary was selected as one of the nonprofits. So we're real proud of that. And its great event, and we usually get a lot of good things done at the Sanctuary with the funding that we get from it.
- I was gonna ask, what money is made or raised over time?
- It ranges from year to year. I believe last year, and don't quote me on this, I think we raised about \$20,000 last year. I think the first year we made more than that. But each year is a little different. But it's a great event. Yeah.
- How did they determine who gets chosen?
- The Packers and the Greater Green Bay Community Foundation select the nonprofits. So there is an application process, and then they have a press conference, which was held last week, where they announced the members that were selected, the nonprofits that were selected. I think that, based on what they indicated at the press conference last week, there was over a hundred applicants and so they had a tough time narrowing it down.
- When does that process normally happen?
- So the event is February 21st at noon to February 22nd.
- As far as, I was talking about the applications and that.
- The application process is about a month-long process.
- And it starts when?
- You submit the application, and then they review it for about a month before disclosing who the nonprofits will be.
- Do you know what timeframe that is? What month it is?
- I think the application is due in either late November or early December.
- Okay.
- The last thing I wanted to point out is we are planning a Frosty Family Fun Night at the Wildlife Sanctuary. So if you've never been to that, it's a great event. So there are night hikes, lit trails, along the waterfalls and the display areas. We have horse drawn carriage rides. We have live critters on display. Our gift shop will be open. There's a live band planned, along with games and crafts and food trucks, and finally, s'mores on an open fire.

So it's a great event. The fee is \$10 per carload. And it is held on, it'll be on Saturday, February 4th. So that's not this weekend, its next weekend, from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. So it's a great event. A fairly inexpensive way to get the family out there. If you've never been out there for the event, I highly encourage it, 'cause they go all out with the light displays and just making it look nice at nighttime.

- I just wanted to clarify for Alder Steuer, its lit trails, not get lit on the trails. It's lit trails, right?

- That's correct.

- Okay.

- I'll be here, so thank you.

- That's all I have for my report, but I'd be happy to answer any of the questions you had.

- Director, I was gonna ask, and maybe I can talk personally with you in your office, but as far as the plan, there was some plan that we were talking about with Perkins Park. No, it's not Colburn, it's another park.

- Ah, in your district.

- Yeah.

- Right. But we were talking about the tree issue and such.

- I will check with staff and see where we sit with that process, and then I'll set up a meeting with you to review it.

- Okay. Sounds good.

- That one's before.
