1. Wisconsin Open Meetings Law still applies

 - b. Committee/Commission/Board members will still follow *Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised 12th edition*.
2. Please log into the Zoom meeting at least 10 minutes before the meeting begins to ensure a proper connection and that your technology is working.
 - a. If you are a Board Member, please log into [CivicClerk](#) with a computer, laptop, or tablet device.
3. Once you are in the meeting please mute yourself.
 - a. You may unmute yourself when you are called upon to speak.
4. Waiting room
 - a. When you call in or connect via web or Zoom app, you will be placed in a “waiting room.”
 - b. The meeting host will then admit you to the meeting, and mute you upon entrance (you will still be able to hear and or otherwise observe the meeting).
5. Registering
 - a. The host may ask you to register for the meeting. A registration link will be sent to you along with the invite. You'll receive another email confirming that you're registered for the meeting.
 - b. If you're using a phone, your registration will be tied to an email.
6. Raising your hand
 - a. Committee/Commission/Board members—you can either use CivicClerk and request to speak or you can also utilize the “raise your hand” tool in the Zoom platform (you'd need to use a computer or tablet) to let the host know you would like to speak. You can also un-mute yourself and start speaking.
 - b. Persons with items on the agenda or other interested parties—you can also utilize the “raise your hand” tool on the Zoom platform via computer or mobile device. You will be allowed to speak once the committee, commission, or board has moved to “open the floor for interested parties to speak.” Once discussion on your agenda item has concluded, the host will mute you, unless the committee opens the floor again.
7. What devices should I use?
 - a. Smart phone (please see more detailed instructions on page 3)
 - b. Land line
 - c. Tablet—in advance of the meeting, please download the Zoom Meeting app by using either the Apple Store or the Play Store. You will be asked to input your name, to identify you for the meeting.
 - d. Computer—you can access the meeting through a web browser by clicking on the meeting link, or through the Zoom Meeting app. If using the app, please download it in advance of the meeting. You will be asked to input your name, to identify yourself for the meeting.
 - e. For tablet and computer users--if you download the app you may be asked to verify your email.

8. Zoom etiquette
 - a. Muting yourself when you're not speaking will prevent your background noise from interfering with others' ability to listen to and participate in the meeting.
 - b. If you're using a telephone, please identify yourself with your phone number and state your name and address before you speak. Zoom meeting hosts can see only your telephone number and will ask you to identify yourself.

Consideration with possible action to review and approve the proposed Mather Heights Park mural designs.

BACKGROUND

Mather Heights Neighborhood Association (MHNA) intends to install a mural panel on the back wall of the pool-maintenance building at Mather Heights Park, located at 1280 Richardson Street. The proposed mural wall faces the main park pavilion with a footpath connecting both buildings, and the wading pool entrance located on the adjacent side.

The small wading pool draws in many visitors during the summer and is an asset that the neighborhood association would like to highlight. By installing a mural in the park, MHNA wishes to add some character to the space, freshen the look and energy of the park, and provide a photo backdrop for all to engage with.

MHNA believes in supporting the local talents and aspirations of future generations and has been working closely with Annie Larsen, Green Bay West High School Arts Instructor, to facilitate this project. Larsen has kindly offered to incorporate this project into the spring curriculum. The kid-friendly and nature-inspired designs have been developed by students within the surrounding districts of the Mather Heights Neighborhood. Following the approval and selection of the final design, the mural will be completed by a class of selected students at Green Bay West High School.

The two designs are being presented for review and consideration by the Green Bay Public Arts Commission. The final design of the mural will be selected by MHNA. A mural celebration and a recognition plaque to complement the work will be unveiled upon project completion in late spring.

Statement of Intent: Mather Heights Neighborhood Association (MHNA) plans to install a kid-friendly, nature-inspired mural on the back face of the maintenance building at the wading pool at Mather Heights Park, off Richardson Street on Green Bay's West side. This side of the building faces the main park pavilion with the footpath running near-parallel, and with the entrance to the wading pool on the adjacent corner. This will allow for high visibility to the more popular side of the park. MHNA has received city letter of support, along with Green Bay Neighborhoods (GBN) mini-grant approval for funding.

The mural will be completed by a class of selected students at GB West High School. Our association has been working closely with Annie Larsen, West HS Arts, to facilitate this project. She has kindly offered to incorporate this project into her spring curriculum.

Our small wading pool is a treasured asset that continues to draw visitors all summer. We would like to add some character to the space to freshen the look and energy with something that can be a draw for photo backdrops and all those summer social media posts! We want to cultivate a message that our community supports local talents and aspirations of future generations, which is why a recognition plaque to complement the art piece is a priority for us.

The mural designs came directly from students within our surrounding districts. We offered guidance to ensure the pieces would be within our scope and vision, but also wanted to allow them some level of creative freedom to see what they desired to produce. Attached are the top two designs selected by MHNA.

1. Colorful Floral Design – this is our first pick. We believe the colors are bright and will pop against the landscape of the park, but still fit within our “nature inspired” theme.
2. “The Giving Tree” Design – this is our second pick. We love the concept and all that is incorporated into the design based on the book inspiration.

*Colors to be provided upon requests - MHNA will be providing the students with all materials, including paints. We will choose the tones/pallet appropriate for the park, with the help of Arts Teacher. Students will work on the project throughout the next several weeks. Annie Larsen will oversee the production of the piece through her class time. Upon install, we will organize a small reveal at the park.
