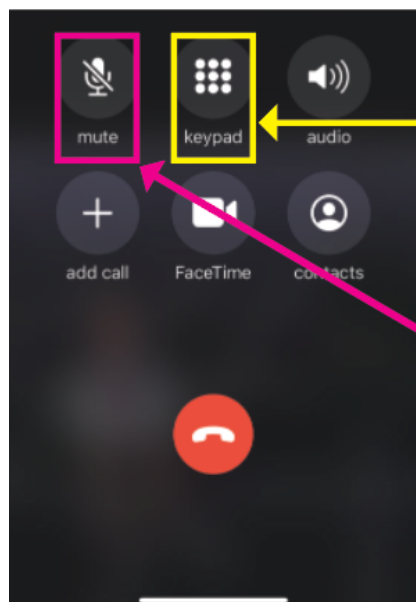

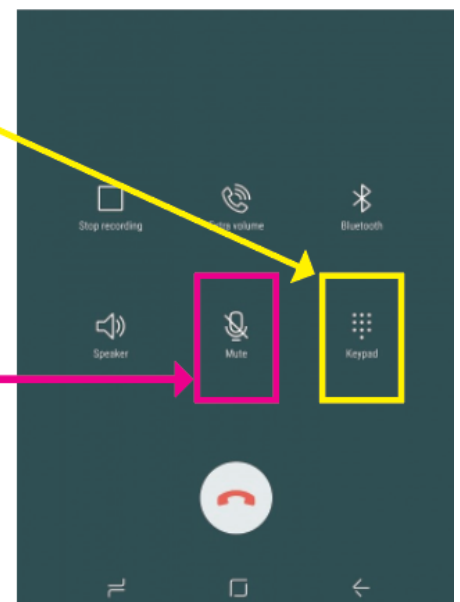

Consideration with possible action on the 2023 & 2024 proposed vegetation installation, monitoring, and maintenance of the Webster Avenue Depressed Vegetative Boulevards by NES Ecological Services.

BACKGROUND

During the reconstruction of N Webster Avenue in 2018, a series of Depressed Vegetative Boulevards (swales) were constructed between Radisson Street and Harvey Street. The purpose of the swales is to provide stormwater quantity and quality benefits by promoting infiltration and removing pollutants such as total suspended solids (TSS) and total phosphorus (TP) regulated by the DNR in the City's MS4 permit.

The swales were originally planted with a "no mow" mix of fescue grasses which were regularly mown similar to turf grass. Since the functionality of the swales is reliant maintaining appropriate vegetation, in 2022 NES Ecological Services was contracted by the City to evaluate and maintain the vegetation growing within the swales and install pilot plantings of native vegetation within the swale between Klaus Street and Berner Street. The 2023 & 2024 proposal is a continuation of this project and includes installation of vegetation in the remaining swales north of Eastman Avenue in 2023 and south of Eastman Avenue in 2024.

RECOMMENDATION

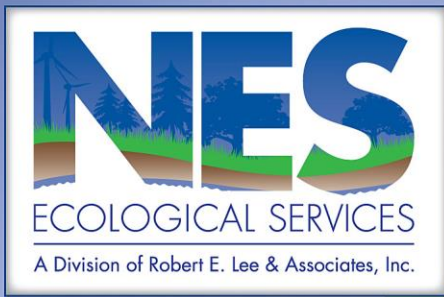

INTRODUCTION – NARRATIVE SUMMARY

NES Ecological Services, A Division of Robert E. Lee & Associates, Inc. is pleased to submit this proposal to assist with the installation, monitoring and maintenance of native vegetation within six newly constructed boulevard swales located within the Webster Avenue median. The proposal prioritizes the recommended activities based on correspondence with City of Green Bay staff.

NES ecologists will be responsible for providing the following services:

- Inspections, both terrestrial & aquatic, to Assess Condition of Stormwater Facilities
- Meetings, Consultations, Correspondence, and/or reports if necessary
- Apply Herbicide to control Broad-leaf Terrestrial & Emergent Invasive and Aggressive Plant Species (secure permits if necessary)
- Submit Proper Herbicide Treatment Documentation to WDNR and the City of Green Bay
- Mowing Activities for Vegetation Management
- Site Preparation, including Broad-leaf Herbicide Applications
- Provide, Install & Maintain Native Plant Plugs in Swales
- Overseed Sideslopes with Native Species
- Periodically Inspect the Webster Avenue Swales

PROJECT TEAM

The primary contact person to coordinate the project for NES will be James Havel, Senior Ecologist and Project Manager, while Nick Kintopf, Restoration Ecologist, will be the lead field ecologist for the project. The City of Green Bay will be a key part of the project team. It is the intent of NES to work as an extension of the city and with city staff to ensure the stormwater facilities are managed appropriately.

NES's ecological staff has extensive experience in monitoring native landscapes; site preparation; installing seeds, live plants, biologists, herbivore fencing, and erosion control measures; and maintenance through mowing, prescribed burns and herbicide applications. Our team will strive to conduct the proposed work in an efficient manner to reduce project costs while achieving the desired goals.

As mentioned above, James Havel will be the project leader. Mr. Havel will be the prime contact person for the city. Mr. Kintopf will be in charge of conducting the annual facility inspection visits and assessment reports. Mr. Kintopf or Dustin Sablich (Restoration Ecologist) will be responsible for leading aspects of the annual field operations. He will be the manager of, and a participant in, the fieldwork. Mr. Kintopf and Mr. Sablich along with Ian Mueller (Restoration Ecologist) will also participate in the maintenance, installation and site preparation work. NES/REL also has several full-time and seasonal staff that have worked with our ecologists and are available when needed.

PROJECT RECOMMENDATIONS

Task 1. Provide Facility Inspection and Consultation

Prior to conducting any maintenance activities, NES will assess the overall condition of the communities at each stormwater facility. Nick Kintopf will be the primary person from NES performing this task; however, Ian Mueller and Dustin Sablich will also participate since they will be responsible for leading field activities. These facility site inspections will be used to determine preliminary maintenance activities. We will not prepare a report after this assessment, but we will conduct future maintenance

activities accordingly based upon this visit. If there are any major issues, NES will notify the City of Green Bay.

In addition to the early season inspection, NES ecologists will periodically review the swales. To more accurately track conditions and activities conducted by our ecologists, a Stormwater Facility Inspection Form will be completed each time NES performs maintenance activities or the site is reviewed. The following information will be recorded:

- 1) Native and invasive species found on-site so their presence and relative level of occurrence can be tracked over time along with the success of previous maintenance activities, if conducted. The information will be used to determine future maintenance activities and performance schedules.
- 2) Plant and/or structural damage from herbivores.
- 3) Site conditions by taking photos from the same vantage point each visit.

These forms will be provided to the city as a means of tracking progress throughout the year.

At the end of each month in which the facility is visited, NES will provide a summary report of the vegetation conditions. At a minimum the report will include:

- 1) Maintenance activities that were conducted – both vegetation (herbicide application, mowing, etc.) and non-vegetation (debris removal, erosion repair, etc.) related.
- 2) Professional opinion regarding the current condition of the swales and associated vegetation communities.
- 3) Recommendations for future maintenance activities.
- 4) Issues or potential issues such as herbivore damage, erosion within or around the swales, lack of vegetation establishment, illicit discharges, and structural problems.
- 5) Site photos.

Herbicide Application Records, which will include the species targeted, will also be included with these reports if applications occurred during that month.

If there are issues we believe should be addressed prior to sending the monthly report, NES will notify the City of Green Bay immediately.

NES will also provide an annual report by August of each year that:

- 1) Summarizes activities performed in the current year.
- 2) Provides recommended maintenance activities for the following growing season.
- 3) Reviews the overall condition of the stormwater management facility.

All reports will be provided in a format acceptable to the City of Green Bay so they can be posted on the city's website for residents.

Task 2. Provide Miscellaneous Consultations and Meetings

This task will be performed by one of our ecologists, when the need for special consultations and meetings arise. Prior to conducting this task, NES will coordinate with city personnel, and any other parties needing to attend, to determine a mutually convenient date to meet/consult. NES will only perform this task with special authorization and request by the city.

NES ecologists have worked with clients from all sector types. These include private landowners, residential clients, municipal officials, commercial property managers, business owners, government officials, and many others. We have experienced many situations with individuals that require significant communication, partnership, and education as to the reasons for utilizing functional native landscapes. Often the native landscapes are utilized in conjunction with traditional lawns and hardscapes, both for functionality and traditional landscape values. Our ecologists are qualified and comfortable in these situations. If and when these meetings occur, NES will come prepared to each with appropriate background information from past visits, field efforts, and up-to-date information for the situation at hand. NES will also provide a written memo to the city documenting discussions and any recommendations made during the meeting/consultation. The ecologist involved will provide this information within one week.

Due to the spontaneous nature of this item, a specific schedule does not apply. NES will be responsive and meet the required time frames for this task when it arises.

Task 3. Apply Herbicide

As outlined in the Detention Basin Assessment Report – 2022, invasive species within the wetland and upland plant communities in the swales will be treated with herbicide through various methods. NES has accounted for likely treatment methods and herbicides that could be used for this project. The goal is to promote the existing grass; therefore, a broad-leaf herbicide will be used to control undesirable weeds. A non-selective herbicide (e.g., Roundup Custom®) may also be utilized to control undesirable grasses such as reed canary grass (*Phalaris arundinacea*) and other perennial species identified within the 2022 swale native planting. Spring/early summer, mid-summer and fall applications are recommended.

Task 5. Mow Vegetation to 6"-8" Height & Spot Mowing

As outlined in the Detention Basin Assessment Report – 2022, mowing activities will be conducted to control undesirable vegetation and to assist with renewal of the native plantings where prescribed burns cannot be utilized. NES anticipates spot mowing in mid-summer to assist with undesirable weed growth, particularly within the 2022 boulevard planting.

Task 8. Site Preparation Herbicide

Site preparation activities will occur within the bottom portion of the Boulevard #1, #3 and #4 swales in 2023 (three remaining swales north of Eastman Avenue - Boulevard #2 swale was planted in 2022), while Boulevards #5-7 will be prepared in 2024. These activities will ensure the vegetation found within these areas are controlled.

Task 9. Furnish and Install Side Slope Prairie Seed

A native seed mix will be installed per the recommendations outlined in the Detention Basin Assessment Report – 2022. This task will focus on the inclusion of native, pollinator species within the grass side slopes. Boulevards #1, #3 and #4 would be overseeded in the fall of 2023, while the remaining boulevards (#5-7) would be sown in the fall of 2024.

Task 10. Furnish, Install & Maintain Plant Plugs

Live plants will be installed in the lower portion of Boulevards #1, #3 and #4 in the summer of 2023 and #5-7 in 2024. The combination of site conditions, salt and vegetation height requirements limit the choice of native species available. A review of the 2022 planting success will help determine plant species chosen in future planting years. Once the plants are installed, periodic watering may be required to ensure their survival. Watering will be conducted during the first 4 to 6 weeks after planting if <1" of precipitation is received during a given week.

Per correspondence with City staff, traffic control for planting and watering activities will be provided by the City. NES will work closely with City staff to coordinate those efforts.

COST ESTIMATE

An itemized cost breakdown for anticipated maintenance services within the swales are located below. To help with budget decisions, an annual cost estimate for each anticipated task is provided for each facility. Annual assessments will help determine remaining priorities.

Webster Avenue Boulevards

Prioritized tasks for 2023 are as follows:

- 1) Facility Inspection and Reporting (Task #1)
- 2) Broad-leaf Species Control (Tasks #3 & #5)
- 3) Herbicide Application for Site Preparation (Task #8)
- 4) Dormant Seed Native Species on Side Slopes (Task #9)
- 5) Install & Water Live Plants (Task #10)

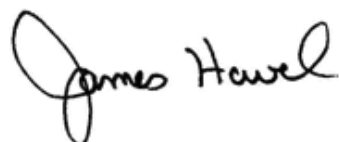

Report of the Purchasing Agent:

BACKGROUND

The City has to annually acquire traffic signal poles and hardware to replace damaged and/or outdated hardware, as well as to provide new hardware for traffic signals being replaced at intersections identified in our Capital Improvement Program under Traffic Signal Repairs. The Purchasing Agent receives a summary of equipment needed to accomplish these objectives and places requests for bids to their vendor network. Once the bids have been received, individual line items are compared and recommended for award to the respective low responsible bidders.

As part of the pedestrian/bicycle safety upgrades approved by the Common Council, Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB) will be installed at various locations around the City. Similarly to the traffic signal poles and hardware, the Purchasing Agent procures bids from vendors, and compares individual line items to recommend an award to the low responsible bidders.
