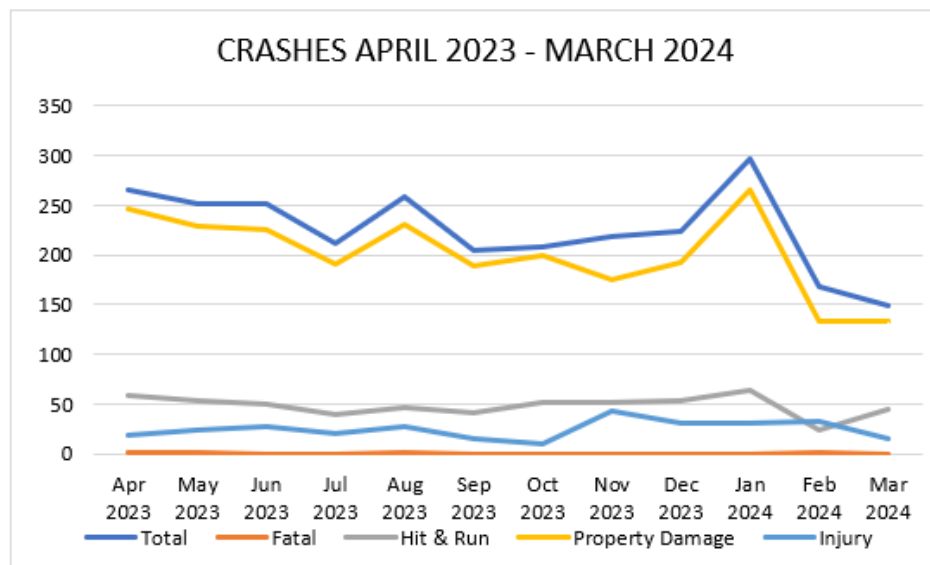

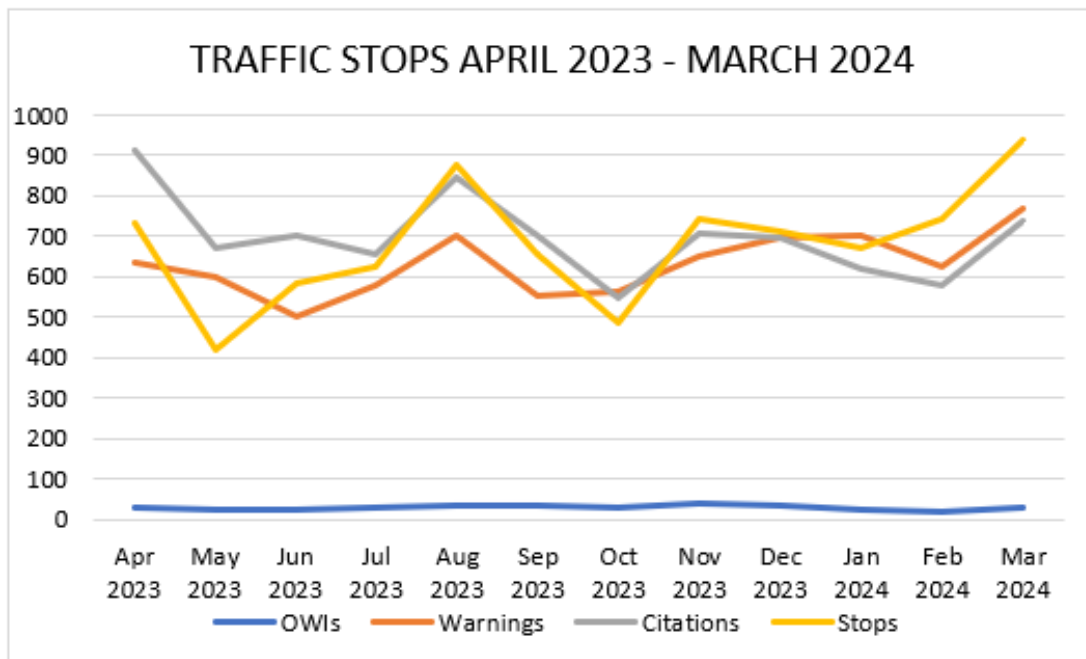
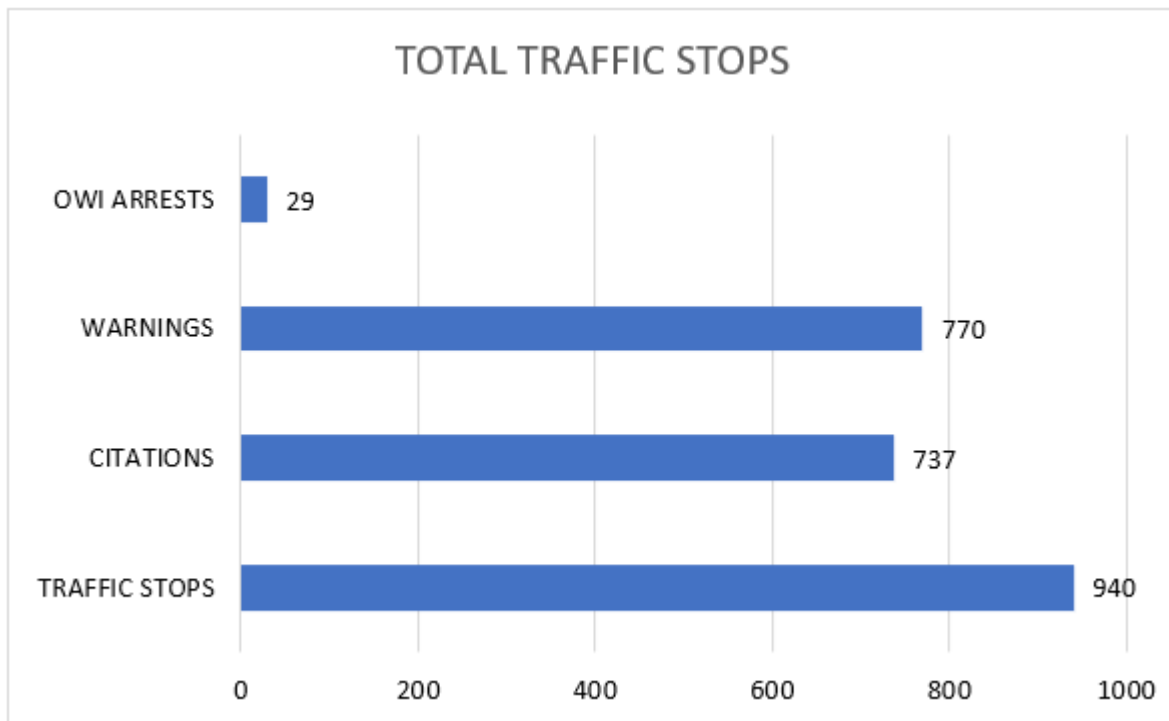
Traffic complaints are the #1 complaint made to the Green Bay Police Department and City Alderpersons. The police department is committed to safe travels for motorists, pedestrians and bicyclists. With a goal of reducing traffic crashes, property damage, injury and death on Green Bay's roadways, the police department will use a data driven approach for traffic enforcement. Data analytics from crash data, citizens complaints and speed boards (when in use) will be used to identify traffic emphasis areas. Each month's report will be posted on the police department's website and will be presented at the Traffic, Bicycle and Pedestrian Commission meeting.

- Don't scroll through social media or apps while driving. It can wait.



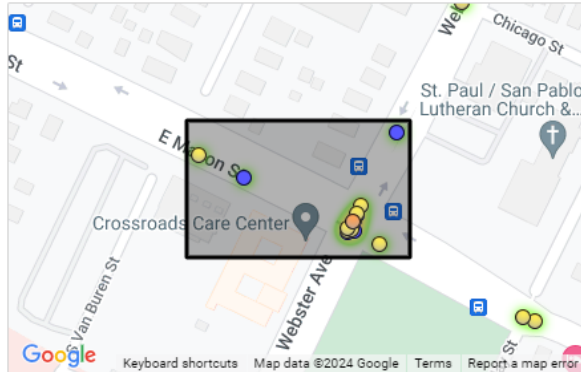

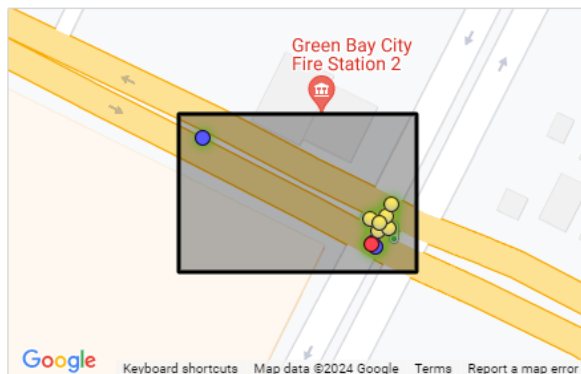

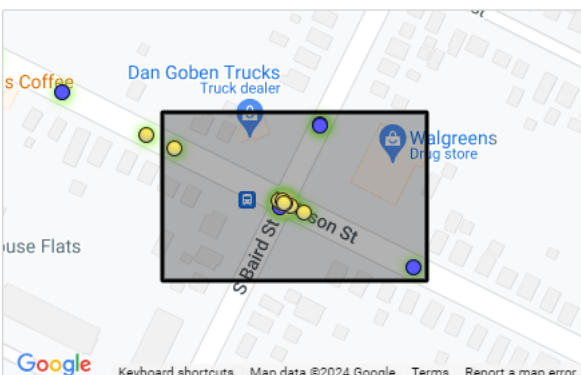

On Friday, February 2, 2024, at approximately 5:44am, a 55-year-old male was driving a Chevy Tahoe traveling northbound on Atkinson Drive. The vehicle struck the concrete barrier on the east side of the road, went to the west striking the raised concrete median causing the vehicle turn to the west striking the concrete barrier on the west side of the road. The vehicle came to a stop in the southbound lane. No other vehicles were involved. Incident was called in by passerby. The male driver passed due to injuries. Crash reconstruction was completed by GBPD.

GBPD Report #24-207689

On Wednesday, February 14, 2024, at approximately 6:11pm, a 82 year old female pedestrian and a 83 year old male pedestrian crossing Bellevue St from the east to the west were hit by a Kia Sedona driven by a 40-year-old male traveling in the southbound lane in the 700 block of Bellevue St. The female pedestrian passed away as a result of the crash. The male pedestrian was transported by medical personnel to the hospital for serious injuries. It was dark at the time of the crash and there is no marked crosswalk. The driver had been drinking, but speed or alcohol do not appear to be a factor in the crash. Crash reconstruction was completed by the Brown County Sheriff's Office.
