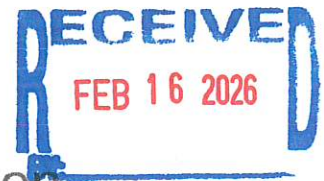

You Honor, people of the committee,

Daisy dog does not attack people or show any kind of aggression towards anyone. To people she is shy and timid, the issue is other dogs that are aggressive toward her. Unfortunately she is 90 pounds and can hold her own. Please don't take her size and your fear on her fate. I can prove without a reasonable doubt she's not aggressive. People are safe around her, it's just some dogs that are aggressive provoke her.

In both occasions she was on her own property. In either case it has yet to be proven beyond a reasonable doubt that she did bite a human. In the first case no citation, nothing to fight against. I met with Ms. Skully and making payments to her and we are good.

This new accusation. I have not gotten any proof at all. My son heard a guy hollering outside so he ran out the house, I followed in stocking feet and saw a guy holding Daisy by her collar and she was sitting on her back haunches and he was reaching in his pocket for a knife threatening to stab my son, dog, then me. He wouldn't let go of Daisy until I threatened to hit him and he realized he had one hand in his pocket and one holding my dog, so he let go of Daisy. We got Daisy in the house so I went out to talk to him and he was on 911 and he was yelling holding a pocket knife swinging it at me, I was backing up as he came towards me hollering that I was after him. I got in the house and shut the door. He continued hollering and swinging his knife, no dogs anywhere, his dogs were gone.

I have seen no pictures of statements or anything, just the cops come over in the middle of the night and demand I pull Daisy out of my son's bed and bring her to the Humane Society.


To sum it all up. Daisy is not aggressive. She will not attack people under any situation and is non aggressive. She was provoked on her property. She was not running around loose. She was in her yard. I have family, friends, and neighbors who will testify she is not dangerous.

On Monday morning at 9:49 am the humane society called and left a message that I was free to pick Daisy up and quarantine her at my home. An officer came to talk to me and I was unable to come to the door so I went downtown to pick up the report and talk to Humane Officer Mallory Meves. At that point she saw me and deemed my dog dangerous.

I am appealing the decision. I have witnesses to the incident and I am calling the police.

173.21 Holding animals for cause.

- (1) **GROUNDS.** A political subdivision may withhold, or direct a person contracting under s. 173.15 (1) to withhold, an animal in custody from an owner who makes an otherwise adequate claim for the animal under s. 173.23 (1) on any of the following grounds:
- (a) There are reasonable grounds to believe that the owner has used the animal in a crime under s. 944.18 or ch. 951 or that the animal constitutes evidence of a crime under s. 944.18 or ch. 951.
 - (b) There are reasonable grounds to believe that the animal poses a significant threat to public health, safety or welfare.

174.02 Owner's liability for damage caused by dog; penalties; court order to kill a dog.

(1) **LIABILITY FOR INJURY.**

- (a) *Without notice.* Subject to s. 895.045 and except as provided in s. 895.57 (4), the owner of a dog is liable for the full amount of damages caused by the dog injuring or causing injury to a person, domestic animal or property.
- (b) *After notice.* Subject to s. 895.045 and except as provided in s. 895.57 (4), the owner of a dog is liable for 2 times the full amount of damages caused by the dog biting a person with sufficient force to break the skin and cause permanent physical scarring or disfigurement if the owner was notified or knew that the dog had previously, without provocation, bitten a person with sufficient force to break the skin and cause permanent physical scarring or disfigurement.

(2) **PENALTIES IMPOSED ON OWNER OF DOG CAUSING DAMAGE.**

- (a) *Without notice.* The owner of a dog shall forfeit not less than \$50 nor more than \$2,500 if the dog injures or causes injury to a person, domestic animal, property, deer, game birds or the nests or eggs of game birds.
- (b) *After notice.* The owner of a dog shall forfeit not less than \$200 nor more than \$5,000 if the dog injures or causes injury to a person, domestic animal, property, deer, game birds or the nests or eggs of game birds, and if the owner was notified or knew that the dog previously injured or caused injury to a person, domestic animal, property, deer, game birds or the nests or eggs of game birds.

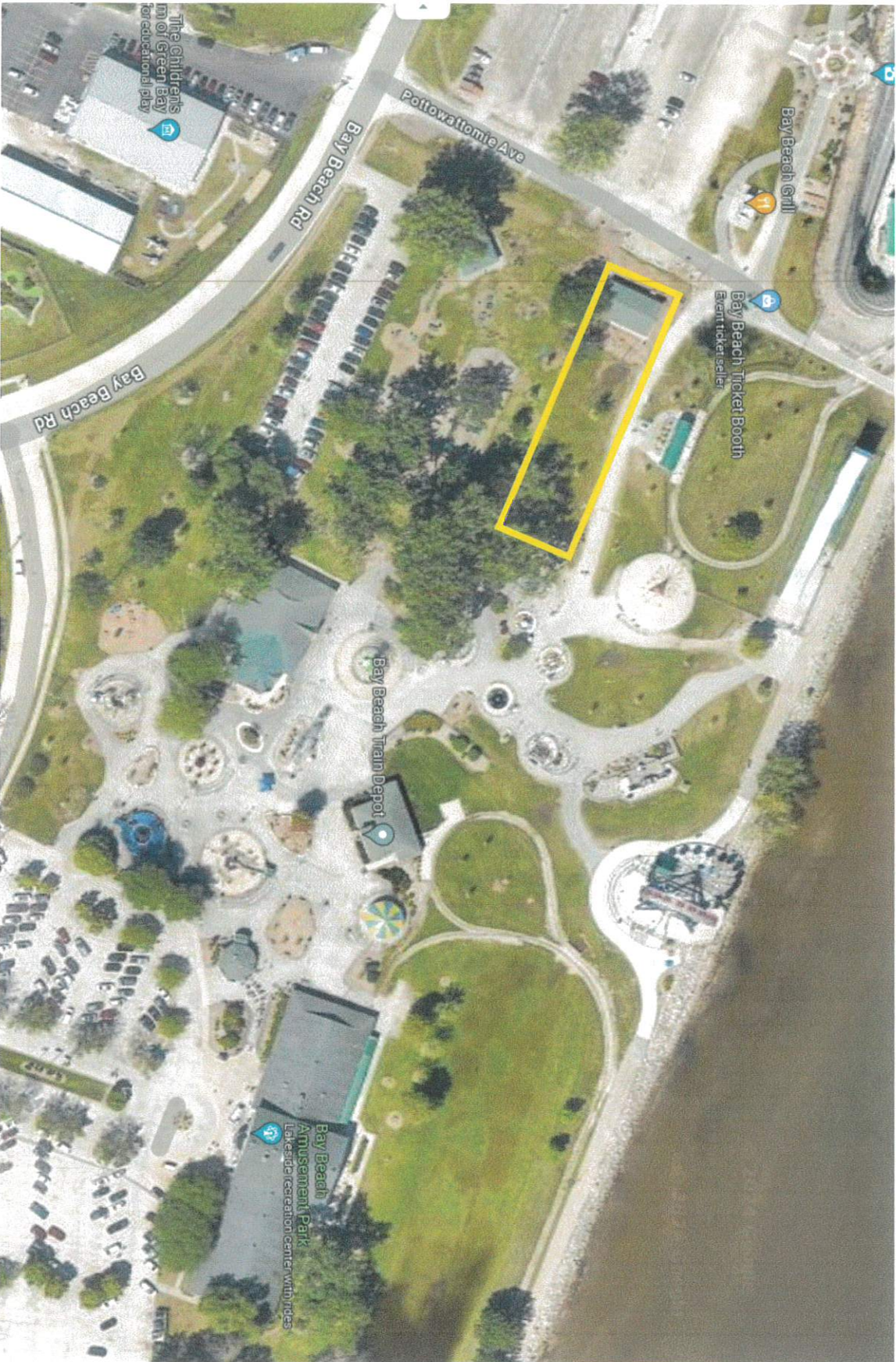

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GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 06-26

**AN ORDINANCE
CREATING SECTION 4-13,
GREEN BAY MUNICIPAL CODE,
RELATING TO DESIGNATED OUTDOOR REFRESHMENT AREA**

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREEN BAY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 4-13, Green Bay Municipal Code, is hereby created to read:

Sec. 4-13. Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area

- (a) *Purpose and Intent.* The purpose of this section is to create a designated outdoor refreshment area (DORA) to enhance the downtown experience for visitors and tourists by allowing the responsible consumption of alcohol beverages (beverages containing alcohol) outdoors and within specified boundaries. This initiative aims to promote economic activity and support local businesses in the City's downtown district.
- (b) *Definitions.*
- (1) *Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA)* means a specific area within the City where alcoholic beverages purchased from participating establishments may be carried and consumed outdoors in compliance with this section.
 - (2) *Participating establishments* means licensed businesses within the DORA authorized to sell alcoholic beverages in approved containers for outdoor consumption.
- (c) *Designation of the DORA.*
- (1) The DORA boundaries shall encompass the area shown on Exhibit A attached to the ordinance codified in this section.
 - (2) The boundaries may be amended by the Common Council.
 - (3) The DORA will operate annually from May 1st through September 30th.
 - (4) The DORA will operate during the following days and hours (Central Time):
 - a. Thursday from 3:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.
 - b. Friday from 3:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.
 - c. Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.
 - d. Sunday from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.
- (d) *Permitted Activities within the DORA.*
- (1) Alcohol beverages purchased from participating establishments may be carried and consumed within the DORA, subject to restrictions (see subsection (e) of this section).
 - (2) All alcohol beverages must be served in City-approved, plastic, and transparent containers marked with a City-approved label.

- (3) Patrons must remain within the defined boundaries of the DORA while consuming alcohol beverages purchased at participating establishments.
- (e) *Restrictions within the DORA.*
- (1) Consumption of alcohol beverages is only permitted within the boundaries of the DORA.
 - (2) Consumption of alcohol beverages is prohibited on private property without the owner's explicit consent.
 - (3) Consumption of alcohol beverages in glass containers served by participating establishments is strictly prohibited. All consumption of alcoholic beverages outside in the DORA that were purchased from participating establishments must be consumed from plastic containers.
 - (4) Patrons may not bring alcohol beverages into establishments that serve alcoholic beverages, food, or both, unless the alcohol beverage was purchased at that establishment.
 - (5) All State and local laws regarding the legal drinking age, public intoxication, and disorderly conduct remain in effect.
- (f) *Permit Application and Compliance.* Participating establishments must apply for a DORA permit and adhere to the following requirements:
- (1) *Application.* All establishments wishing to participate in the DORA shall submit a complete application and permit fee to the Clerk's office for review. The Clerk shall notify the establishments as to whether their application has been approved or rejected. Incomplete applications shall be rejected. The fee for the DORA permit shall be as provided in the City Fee Schedule.
 - (2) *Compliance.* Once approved, all establishments shall:
 - a. Use approved containers and labels for alcohol beverages.
 - b. Display their permit in a clear and visible area, and have clear signage indicating participation in the DORA program.
 - c. Educate staff about DORA restrictions.
- (g) *City Responsibilities.*
- (1) The Clerk shall maintain a registry of participating establishments and issue permits upon verification of an appropriate and valid alcohol license.
 - (2) The Clerk shall provide labels to participating establishments. Labels shall be picked up by an authorized agent of the establishment from the Clerk during City Hall hours.
 - (3) Waste disposal and recycling receptacles shall be located throughout the DORA.
 - (4) The City retains the right to suspend or terminate the DORA temporarily or permanently in response to public safety concerns or noncompliance.
- (h) *Violations.*
- (1) *Violation by Individuals.* A violation by an individual shall be punishable by a forfeiture of not more than \$100.00 for each offense.

- (2) Violation by Participating and Licensed Business. A violation by a business that possesses a valid DORA permit shall be punishable by a forfeiture of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$500.00 for each offense.
- (3) Violation by Non-Licensed Business. A violation by a business that does not possess a valid DORA permit shall be punishable by a forfeiture of not less than \$500.00 and not more than \$1,000 for each offense.
- (4) Any business failing to comply with DORA requirements may have its permit revoked.
 - a. Notice. Participating establishments shall be notified by the Clerk in writing of the date, time, and reasons for a revocation hearing.
 - b. Hearing. A hearing shall be conducted before the Protection and Policy Committee. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Committee shall recommend to deny the revocation or approve the revocation.
 - c. Common Council Approval. The recommendation from the Protection and Policy Committee shall be subject to the approval of the Common Council.
 - d. Election to not be Governed by Wis. Stat. Ch. 68. The City of Green Bay, having established procedures for administrative review of municipal determinations, elects to not be governed by Wis. Stat. Ch. 68 in its entirety.
 - e. Effect of Revocation. Any establishment who has their permit revoked, shall be ineligible to apply for another permit for a period of one year from the date that the Common Council approves the revocation.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect on and after its passage and publication.

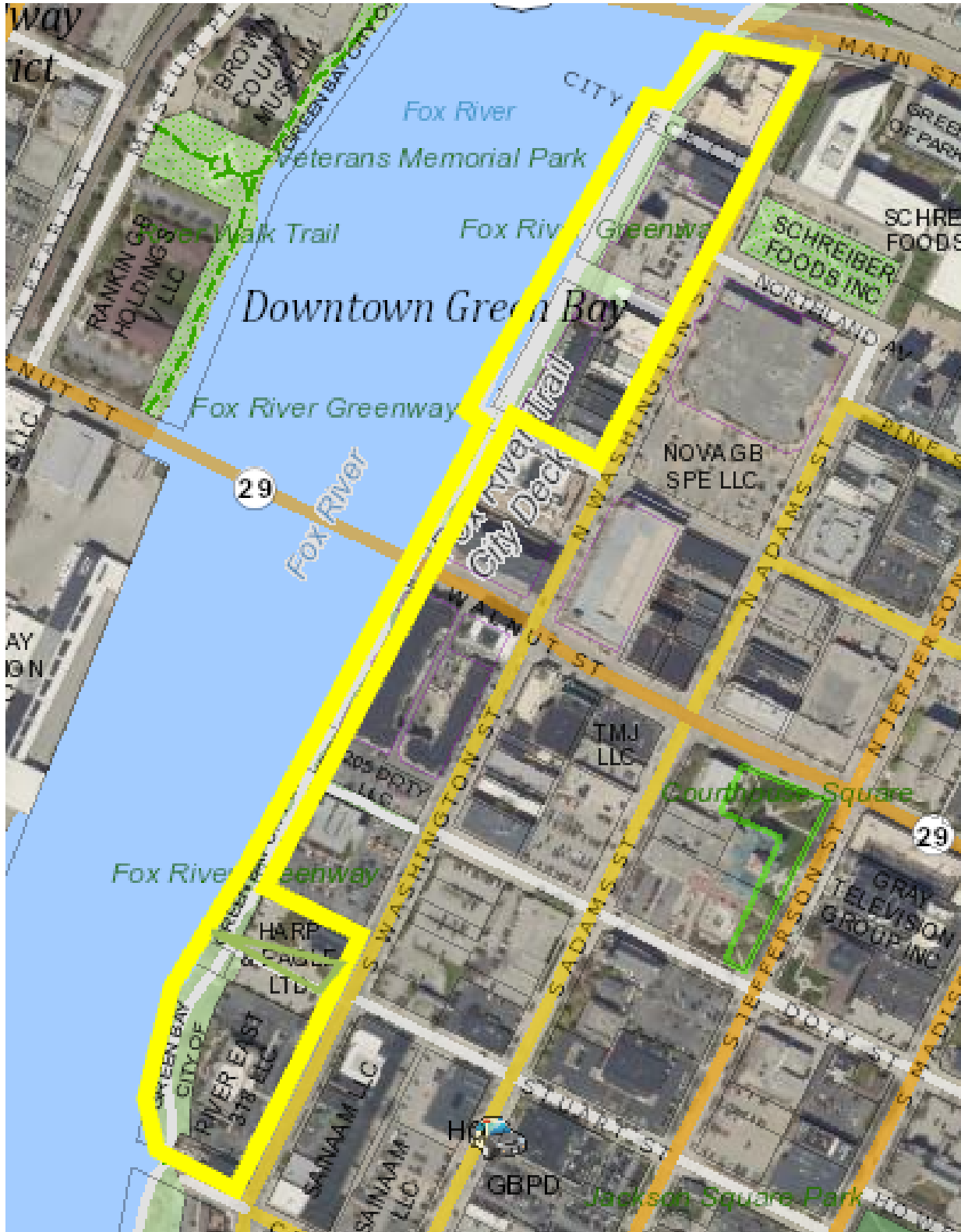
