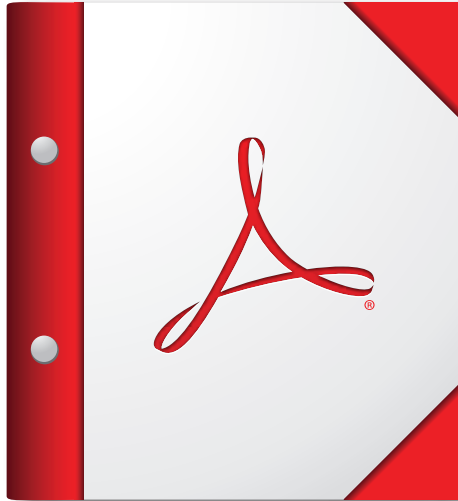

Text of Communication	Referral to Staff Subject: Establishing a Communication Process for Appointed Commission and Committee Members I am referring to staff the matter of reviewing and, if necessary, amending the City of Green Bay’s current ordinances and governing procedures to establish a clear pathway for members of City commissions and committees to submit communications directly to the commission or committee on which they serve. Members of our City commissions and committees are appointed and approved to serve in these roles as representatives of the community. They should have a clear and consistent process that allows them to bring forward matters, concerns, recommendations, or other communications related to the work of the body on which they serve. I believe the City should provide specific ordinance language and procedures that outline how an individual commissioner or committee member may submit a communication for consideration by the body they serve on. This process should clearly identify how communications are submitted, any applicable deadlines, how they are placed on an agenda or otherwise distributed to members, and any limitations necessary to remain consistent with Wisconsin open meetings and public records requirements. The intent of this referral is not to circumvent the role of the chair, city staff, or established parliamentary procedures, but rather to ensure that individual members have an established and transparent mechanism to bring forward issues and communications in their official capacity. I respectfully ask staff to review the current ordinance and related policies and return with proposed language or recommendations that would establish this process for all City commissions and committees. Requested Action: Refer this matter to the appropriate City staff for review and development of proposed ordinance or policy language establishing a clear process for commission and committee members to submit communications to the body on which they serve.
